Finals fever in the air

The race to the finals across our competitions is coming to a close, with the TAC Cup and Swisse VFL Women's this weekend playing their final round, and the penultimate round in the Peter Jackson VFL to unfold.

While the finalists in the TAC Cup and VFL Women's have been known for a number of weeks, the week one finals' opponents will be decided by results this weekend. The Sharks will be hoping to help full forward Moana Hope to her 100th goal of the season, with the Collingwood marquee player needing just one major to create history in the inaugural VFL Women's season.

In the VFL, Essendon has two rounds left to keep the likes of the Box Hill Hawks and Richmond at bay, with the door yet to be closed on the top eight.

It is an exciting month coming up not only in our state league competitions, but across Victoria with junior finals being completed and senior finals to get underway.

Good luck to all teams at the pointy end of the season.

Hill's long climb to success

For a time, Frankston senior coach Patrick Hill thought he might never get the chance to celebrate a Peter Jackson VFL win with his team.



The Dolphins went through 2015 – his first season in charge – winless, and a 144-point defeat at the hands of the Casey Scorpions in Round 1 wasn't the most auspicious start to 2016.

It had Hill – previously an assistant coach at the Box Hill Hawks, including for their 2013 premiership year – thinking of good friend Austinn Jones, who coached the Bendigo Gold in the VFL for two years in 2013-14 without a win.

But a weight was lifted off Hill's shoulders when Frankston memorably knocked off Richmond by 13 points in Round 3, ending a 24-game losing streak stretching back to Round 16, 2014. Even for someone who had experienced the ultimate VFL success, this victory ranked as one of his most special moments.

"The overriding emotion was probably relief," Hill said.

"Austinn Jones did two years in the VFL without a win, and after some chats with him, I know he's not happy with that. Certainly after the shemozzle at Casey Fields in Round 1, those thoughts started to come in: 'What if I don't get a win?'"

"I had a pretty horrible off-season personally as well, losing my father, and then I lost my grandmother just before the season started. To get that win then was pretty special on the back of that."

"The other emotion was that you're just so happy for the players. They've stuck by the club and stuck by you as a coach, and you see all the work they've put in. To see the joy on their faces and to finally get some reward for their 18 months of hard work was a great thing to be involved in."

While the Dolphins have only added one more win since – defeating Coburg by five points in Round 5 – the signs of improvement from the disappointment of 2015 are there. They've been highly competitive in games against the likes of Williamstown, Collingwood and Footscray for three quarters but fallen away late.

Hill would like a few more wins on the board this year but said his team's consistency of performance through the season was ahead of where he thought it would be earlier in 2016.

"There's been a lot of development over the last 18 months to two years," Hill said. "The team is now getting an understanding of modern footy – our game plan, what it means, what their roles within it are and how what they do on the field affects other players."

"We're trying to get people to about 50 games, when they really start to understand how they fit into things and start to understand their own games."

"We're really excited about year three (2017), which is generally when you go from understanding the game plan to being able to do it in an unconscious fashion"



The draftable Dolphins

Frankston senior coach Patrick Hill gives his thoughts on the Dolphins most likely to be picked up by an AFL club this year and continue the club's enviable recent record of having eight players join AFL lists over the last seven years.

'The Recruit' contestant Jackson Sketcher: "I don't think I've ever seen a bigger change in attitude from one player in a positive way than I've seen from Jackson (since his early years). He was never a bad kid, but he's turned into probably the most engaged, switched-on, hardest-working, professional player at the club. He's been terrific with the young guys and he's felt quite free to share his stories of how he thinks he went wrong and how he assumed winning the Morrish Medal (alongside Dyson Heppell in 2010) would guarantee him getting drafted."

Ben Cavarra: "I think his game's gone to another level this year. He hasn't been at his fittest, but he's battling through and does what he needs to do to get up for each game. He's kicking more goals and I think he's a bit quicker. If some club takes a chance on him, I know he won't let them down. He'll do everything he can to be successful."

Josh Newman: "Josh – whose brother Nic is at Sydney – has had a pretty good year. He's a brazen half back flanker who loves to take the game on. He'd be right up there in our best and fairest."

Brandon Wood: "He'd be amongst the best clearance players in the VFL, if not the best. I wonder what he could do if he was a full-time footballer – he comes from a basketball background and didn't play footy until U19s. He's still got a lot of scope for improvement, but he's a very smart kid, learns very quickly and has a great footy brain."

– when it just becomes natural and they can actually start to develop some of the on-field stuff themselves. That'll be the next step for them."

Hill said his game plan this year has been based around playing a brand of football designed to bring people to watch his team play. Indeed, Frankston is averaging 35 more uncontested possessions per game in 2016 compared to 2015, with its lower kick-to-handball ratio (1.2-to-1 in 2016 from 1.4-to-1 in 2015) indicating a willingness to run the ball forward at speed.

While the Dolphins are conceding almost 25 fewer points per game this year than last year, Hill said team defence was still something his troops needed to work on, as well as fixing up costly turnovers in the back half.

He's excited about what 2017 has in store but admits he never thought his tenure would turn out the way it has when he first took on the role.

"Initially when I took on the job, I thought it was going to be a fine-tune," Hill said. "We'd add some players and with a couple of things I thought I could bring to

the group, that'd have us really close to finals in year one, if not in them.

"Unfortunately it didn't work out like that. It wasn't long into last year when we realised what we had was a long way off the pace.

"When I first joined, we had about 400 games of VFL experience on the whole list; right now we're sitting at about 900 and by the end of the year, I think we're going to have nine players over or close to 50 games and we started the year with one (Corey Buchan). It's starting to get to where you need to be."

The game plan is evolving, his players are becoming hardened with extra experience and even Hill's coaching methods are changing. This year he's gone back to basics, eschewing the large amounts of opposition analysis he brought from his time at Box Hill to focus more on his own team, and replacing electronic teaching means with the more traditional whiteboard and his own voice.

It hasn't been a smooth introduction to the VFL senior coaching caper for Hill, but the Dolphins coach is finally starting to get into the swim of things.

Building healthy muscles

Growing muscle and building strength are common goals for players, not only to improve their game but to keep them feeling fit off the field as well. This requires not only regular strength training sessions, but also a solid nutrition plan.

Increase energy intake

A higher-energy diet is required to grow muscle, and this generally means eating more healthy foods from a variety of food groups that will provide a mixture of carbohydrate, protein and fat in the right proportions.

Carbohydrates are especially important to provide fuels for muscles to train hard. Research has shown that a carbohydrate-rich meal or snack before training can increase the effectiveness of a workout, so you can lift heavier weights and perform more reps. Carbohydrate rich foods include fruit (fresh or tinned), grain foods like bread or breakfast cereal, a tub of yoghurt or flavoured milk.

Protein at the right time

Most people eat enough protein overall to support muscle growth. The key is to time protein intake to include multiple “spikes” throughout the day, which will continually stimulate muscle protein synthesis. For most players, dinner is likely to already include enough protein, so focus on protein-rich breakfast and lunch options to help balance intake.

After a workout is also a golden opportunity to have a meal or snack containing about 20-25g of protein – this will maximise muscle repair and rebuilding.

Quality protein

Building new muscle tissue requires the right combination of essential amino acids (the building blocks of protein). A high-quality protein contains all these essential amino acids, and usually comes from animal sources like milk, cheese, yoghurt, eggs, meat, chicken or fish.

Leucine is an amino acid that plays a key role in “switching on” muscle building. Whey protein – from dairy foods like milk, cheese or yoghurt – is rich in leucine.

These snacks each provide about 10g of high-quality protein. They can be mixed and matched to reach the target of 20-25g:

2 small eggs	40g (cooked) chicken
70g cottage cheese	1 cup (250ml) milk
40g (cooked) beef, lamb or pork	30g (1 ½ slices) cheese
50g grilled fish	1 cup (250mL) custard
200g yoghurt (plain or flavoured)	50g tinned salmon or tuna

Set realistic goals

It's important to set realistic individual goals, as everyone has different potential based on genetics to build muscle mass. It may also be more difficult to grow muscle during the competition season, especially if training and games leave little time for strength training and rest. The off-season or pre-season is likely to be a better time to focus on muscle growth.

Ronke finds the fast lane

Ben Ronke hasn't followed a traditional path towards finding himself in NAB AFL Draft contention. But since the speedster finally secured a spot on the Calder Cannons list as an over-age player this year, his prospects have taken off.

Ronke, who turns 19 in December, had previously been part of Cannons development programs but never made the club's primary list. Not to be deterred, he continued playing in the VAFA at St Bernard's where he was part of an U19 premiership in 2014 and the Snowdogs' 2015 Premier Division flag triumph.

In 2016 though, 181cm Ronke has shone with his pace through Calder's midfield, played two games for Coburg's senior team in the VFL and scored an invite to October's Victorian State Combine.

He said much had changed personally since the Cannons first saw him several years ago.

"I guess back then I wasn't playing as confidently as I have been lately and I just didn't really have the dedication towards footy that I've had in the last three years," Ronke said.

"That feeling when I was expecting to get an invite to do a pre-season at Calder and not getting it – I suppose there's a few ways you can take it and I just tried to take it as a learning curve. It motivated me to prove people wrong and so I did as much work as I could off the field – diet-wise and fitness-wise – to get myself to where I wanted to be.

"I was planning on doing a pre-season with Footscray's VFL team (late last year) and then (Cannons Talent Manager) Ian Kyte got in contact and told me to come down for a pre-season there. He said they'd watched a little bit of my footy and saw I was playing alright at the senior level."

Last year, Ronke established himself in a St Bernard's senior team coached by former AFL 200-gamer Anthony Rock as a 17-year-old mid-forward. He described the thrilling eight-point premiership victory over Old Trinity as "the greatest thing" he's experienced, appreciating how lucky he was to be involved alongside a senior core that had put in years of work to achieve glory.

The physicality at senior level prepared Ronke well for a midfield role at Calder, where he's averaging 19 disposals, four tackles and over a goal per game across 13 matches in 2016.



But the generally quicker nature of TAC Cup football has better suited the strengths of someone who recorded the fastest 20m sprint time at the TAC Cup fitness testing day earlier this year.

"The physical side of playing seniors last year has helped me, but I've noticed the speed in the TAC Cup has definitely lifted," Ronke said. "Naturally I've had a bit of speed as I've grown up, so I've been able to adjust to that pace quicker than I thought I would.

"That speed, my physicality around the contest and my desire to win are my biggest strengths I guess. I probably just need to improve on my composure at times; I've done a bit of work on my kicking at the end of runs."

Those tearing runs have been a fairly common sight in Ronke's appearances for the Cannons and Coburg. But he also averaged 16 disposals and four tackles while kicking three goals in his two games with the Lions to show he hadn't lost the physicality required to perform at senior level.

Indeed, that combination of explosive speed and strength is a rare one, and Ronke will be hard to stop now he's finally found the fast lane of football development.

VFL and DL finals races

Essendon, the Box Hill Hawks and Richmond are competing for the last spot in the Peter Jackson VFL Legendairy finals series.

The eighth-placed Bombers (8-8, 99.1%) are one game ahead of both the Hawks (7-9, 104.8) and Tigers (7-9, 103.2) thanks to a crucial victory over Williamstown in Round 19, but are vulnerable due to their lower percentage.

They need to defeat two teams in the bottom five on the ladder – North Ballarat and the Northern Blues – in their remaining home-and-away games to be assured of September action. Box Hill must still face the current top two teams Collingwood and the Casey Scorpions, with Richmond to meet fourth-placed Sandringham and 11th-placed Coburg.

Meanwhile, six teams are still in the hunt for three Development League finals spots with two rounds remaining.

The Box Hill Hawks (12-3) have sealed top spot and the second-placed Casey Scorpions (9-5, 148.8%) appear safe due to their high percentage, but the other current top-four teams – Coburg (9-6, 97.3) and Port Melbourne (8-6, 105.2) – could still be unseated by reigning premier Williamstown (8-7, 94.4), Sandringham (7-7, 103.5) or the Northern Blues (7-7, 87.5).

The VU Western Spurs are finishing 2016 on a positive note after defeating Seaford by 52 points to record their seventh win of the season.

The Spurs out-ran and out-positioned the Tigerettes from start to finish, extending their lead at every break to win 12.9 (81) to 4.5 (29), as Callum O'Connor reports.

It didn't take long for the Spurs to have traffic running their way as Alyssa Mifsud led what was perhaps the Spurs' midfield's most impressive outing yet. Further afield, their forwards pushed hard to make space with Alex Quigley – quickly growing week by week into the role of a key forward – too fast and mobile. She finished with two goals and was a major ball-winner in her side's forward half.

An extraordinary three-bounce running goal from Kylie Nicolaci gave the Spurs a 14-point buffer at the first break but many amongst the home crowd were nervously awaiting a Seaford counter-attack.

Seaford found their run and carry in the second quarter as ruck-rover Kate Gillespie-Jones and Jess Eberle pushed through the Spurs' wall. Seaford had their chances late in the quarter but netted three behinds to leave the Spurs with a half-time lead of 30 points.

Round 16 Highlights

Rebels sneak into top four

The North Ballarat Rebels find themselves in the top four for the first time in 2016 after powering away from the Northern Knights to record a 50-point victory at Eureka Stadium in Round 16.

North Ballarat's quest for a finals double chance was also helped by the Sandringham Dragons – who previously occupied fourth spot – losing to the Oakleigh Chargers.

But the **Rebels** (11-5) had some nervous moments against the tenacious **Knights** (12th, 3-13), trailing early in the final quarter before piling on nine of the next 10 goals. Captain Jarrod Berry, prospective no.1 NAB AFL Draft pick Hugh McCluggage and Jamaine Jones each booted two majors in the late onslaught, while over-ager Cedric Cox was influential with 24 disposals and six inside-50s.

Meanwhile, the **Dragons** (5th, 10-5-1) fell outside the top four for the first time this season after being swamped by the **Chargers** (7th, 7-9) to the tune of 55 points at Warrawee Park.

Oakleigh slammed on eight unanswered goals before Sandringham put its first major on the board in the second quarter, but by then the match was as good as over. Dion Johnstone shone for the Chargers with five goals, while 19-year-old Lachlan Walker continued his fine season with 29 disposals, 10 inside-50s and two majors.

North Ballarat now faces the Eastern Ranges in the final home-and-away round as it attempts to seal a top-four position, while the Dragons need to defeat the Bendigo Pioneers and hope the Rebels fall in Round 17.

The **Dandenong Stingrays** (2nd, 13-3) shored up a top-two finish with a thrilling one-point triumph over the **Murray Bushrangers** (3rd, 11-4-1) at Shepley Oval.

The result was in the balance all match, with the Bushrangers appearing headed for victory when they took the lead approaching time-on in the final quarter. But the Stingrays rallied again, Hunter Clark becoming their hero when he produced the match-winning goal just seconds before the siren.

Murray's loss keeps it only one game ahead of

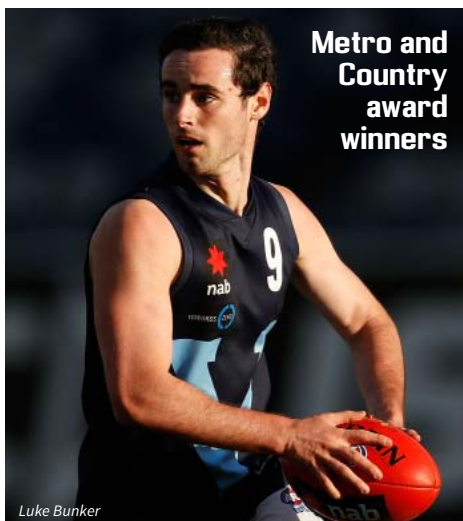


fifth-placed Sandringham but still 14 percentage points ahead of the Dragons with one game to play. Dandenong now meets the Geelong Falcons to decide which team claims the minor premiership.

The **Falcons** (1st, 13-3) were ruthless in defeating the **Calder Cannons** (8th, 7-9) by 90 points at Rams Arena on the weekend. The Cannons had four goals on the board and were within seven points of Geelong at quarter-time but the Falcons unleashed after that, Jackson McLachlan starring with four goals and Cassidy Parish a force in the middle with 26 disposals and nine clearances.

In Round 16's other games:

- Cameron Rayner kicked seven goals as the **Western Jets** (9th, 5-11) accounted for the **Bendigo Pioneers** (11th, 4-12) by 32 points at Queen Elizabeth Oval, and
- After leading by 36 points at the final break, the **Eastern Ranges** (6th, 7-9) held off a fast-finishing **Gippsland Power** (10th, 4-12) by 16 points at Morwell Recreation Reserve.

Vic Metro and Vic Country have named their Legendairy Coaches Award winners and MVPs from June's 2016 NAB AFL U18 Championships.

Northern Knights midfielder **Luke Bunker** won Vic Metro's Legendairy Coaches Award among a stellar team that went undefeated through the Championships. The 18-year-old St Mary's product averaged 22 disposals and five tackles per game across Metro's four matches.

Metro's MVP award was jointly won by **Sandringham Dragons** playmaker **Andrew McGrath** and **Eastern Ranges** captain **Dylan Clarke**. McGrath's shut-down role on goalkicker Ben Ainsworth in Metro's two-point triumph over Vic Country was pivotal in kick-starting his team's campaign, and the 18-year-old East Brighton product went on to average 24 disposals per game as a defender/midfielder. Clarke, a 17-year-old Knox product, was a constant in Metro's midfield, averaging 24 disposals and five clearances per game.

Meanwhile, **North Ballarat Rebels** midfielder **Hugh McCluggage** won Vic Country's Legendairy Coaches Award and MVP award. Minor premierships on line

The Geelong Falcons and Dandenong Stingrays will face off for the 2016 TAC Cup minor premiership at Simonds Stadium on Sunday.

Casey's ball hogs

It's no wonder the Casey Scorpions sit on top of the Peter Jackson VFL ladder – they've monopolised possession of the ball in most of their games this season.

They were at it again in a 105-point win against Werribee in Round 19, racking up 508 disposals – 216 more than the Tigers – with 11 players recording more than 20 touches.

Casey averages 405 disposals per game in 2016 – over 37 more per game than the next best team, Sandringham. As soon as the likes of Alex Neal-Bullen, Ben Newton and Jack Trengove win the ball in close, their teammates fan out to receive the ball by hand.

Indeed, the Scorpions average over 36 more handballs per game than any other team, with VFL-listers James Munro and Ed Morris a couple of the team's best exponents. They then feed designated kickers such as Jack Grimes and Viv Michie, who in turn drive the ball quickly into the VFL's highest-scoring forward line.

The attractive change in aligned AFL club Melbourne's style of play has filtered down to senior coach Justin Plapp's group at Casey, with the Scorpions never afraid to flick the ball around by hand and move it forward at speed.

Ominously for opponents, Casey is also the competition's no.1 tackling team, but they've been out-tackled in two of its three losses this year. Clearly, shutting down that manic ball movement with sustained pressure is the best recipe for shutting down the Scorpions.

How did Dandy do it?

The Dandenong Stingrays defied the stats to assure themselves a top-two finish with a thrilling one-point triumph over the Murray Bushrangers in Round 16.

The Stingrays have relied on their heart in big moments before in 2016 – think of the Round 13 win from 40 points down at three-quarter time against Oakleigh – and Saturday's encounter was another example of why they're in a position to win the minor premiership this week.

Dandenong lost every major statistical category recorded by Champion Data to the Bushrangers – except one. The winners lagged Murray in kicks, handballs, disposals, marks (contested and uncontested), contested and uncontested possessions, hitouts, clearances, tackles and free kicks won. However, the Stingrays still generated eight more inside-50s than their opponents.

The last of those entries resulted in a goal from bottom-age hero Hunter Clark to snatch victory with just seconds left. So much for the stats, hey?

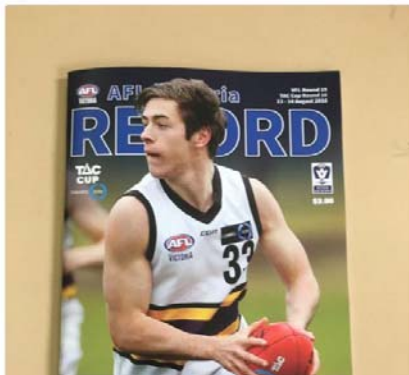

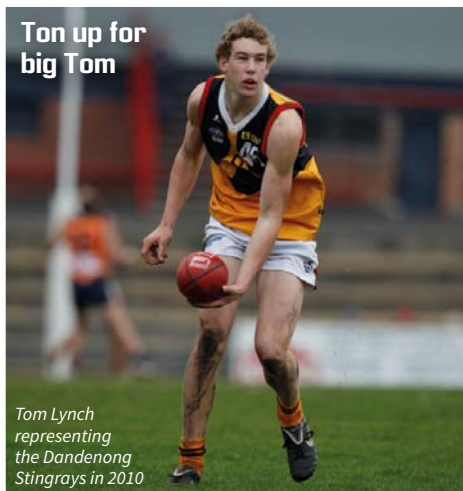

Ton up for big Tom

Former Dandenong Stingrays key forward Tom Lynch brought up his 100-game milestone in Gold Coast's loss to Essendon in Round 21 last week.

The 23-year-old has become one of the AFL's premier young talents since being selected by the Suns with pick no.11 in the 2010 NAB AFL Draft. Lynch has kicked 187 goals and was Gold Coast's leading goalkicker in 2014 and 2015, while he also won the club's best and fairest last year.

Another former **Dandenong** player played his 100th AFL game last week, when **Dylan Robertson** ran out in St Kilda's loss to Sydney. The 25-year-old defender was first selected by Fremantle with pick no.49 in the 2009 AFL Draft and played 37 games for the Dockers before crossing to St Kilda as a delisted free agent ahead of the 2013 season.

Ex-**Oakleigh Chargers** ruckman **Zac Clarke** also notched his 100th match in Fremantle's loss to Adelaide. The 26-year-old has taken a while to reach his milestone after being taken at pick no.37 in the 2008 AFL Draft, due to the dominance of Dockers no.1 ruckman Aaron Sandilands and several injuries.

Meanwhile, former **North Ballarat Rebels** defender **Matt Dea** finally reached his 50-game milestone in Essendon's victory over Gold Coast. The 24-year-old struggled for opportunity at Richmond after being selected by the Tigers with pick no.44 in the 2009 AFL Draft, but was signed by the Bombers as a top-up player this year and has played 19 games – the most of any of his seven AFL seasons.

Oscar rises for Dees

Former North Ballarat Rebels key defender Oscar McDonald earned the Round 21 NAB AFL Rising Star nomination for his stand-out performance in Melbourne's win against Port Adelaide.

The 20-year-old had 23 disposals at 74 per cent efficiency, nine marks and five rebound-50s against the Power.

McDonald was selected by the Demons with pick no.53 in the 2014 NAB AFL Draft following a season in which he won the TAC Cup Coaches Award and North Ballarat's best and fairest, and was named in the TAC Cup Team of the Year.

The younger brother of Melbourne teammate Tom McDonald, Oscar made his AFL debut in Round 22 last year and played the final two games of the home-and-away season. He has played 13 matches in 2016 and averaged 16 disposals and four marks per game.

Meanwhile, **Oakleigh Chargers** premiership player **David Cuningham** made his AFL debut for Carlton in Round 21.

The 19-year-old midfielder had seven disposals and eight tackles in the Blues' loss to Brisbane. He was selected with pick no.23 in the 2015 AFL Draft and is the fourth member of Oakleigh's 2015 flag-winning team to have debuted at the elite level in 2016, following Carlton teammate Jack Silvagni and Collingwood pair Ben Crocker and Tom Phillips.

Former **North Ballarat Rebels** forward **Jesse Palmer** also played his first AFL game last week, recording 12 disposals in Port Adelaide's loss to Melbourne. The 19-year-old was taken by the Power at pick no.78 in the 2014 AFL Draft.

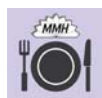

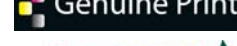
