EXTREME WEATHER POLICY

The following outlines the extreme weather policies which the Glenelg Rebels Softball Club (GRSC) adheres to for all of its registered members.

1. GAMES AND OFFICIAL EVENTS

- a. For all events and activities conducted under the jurisdiction of Softball SA or the Adelaide Club Competition, the relevant hot weather policy for that competition, carnival tournament or other event will take priority over all other hot weather policies.

2. CLUB ACTIVITIES

- a. For the purpose of this document, club activities include but are not limited to;
 - i. Internal or intra-club trial games
 - ii. Team or specialised skill training sessions
 - iii. Special events
 - iv. Come and Try sessions

3. CANCELLATION OF ACTIVITIES

- a. The GRSC committee and any club appointed coaches, reserve the right to cancel a club activity in the event they feel the weather conditions pose a risk to the safety of our members. This includes but is not limited to;
 - i. Extreme hot weather
 - ii. Consecutive days of hot weather
 - iii. Rain
 - iv. Localised electrical storms
 - v. Dangerously high winds

- b. Extreme hot weather will be defined as follows;
 - i. Junior activities will be cancelled if the forecast maximum temperature on the day of the event is 38 degrees or higher.
 - 1. The temperature reading is taken at 7:00am on that day
 - 2. The temperature must be obtained from www.weatherzone.com.au using the Marion Postcode, 5043.
 - ii. Senior activities will be cancelled if the forecast maximum temperature on the day of the event is 40 degrees or higher.
 - 1. The temperature reading is taken at 7:00am on that day
 - 2. The temperature must be obtained from www.weatherzone.com.au using the Marion Postcode, 5043.
- c. The club will use appropriate communication methods to notify our members as quickly as possible when an activity has been cancelled.

Check the club website and/or Social Media sites if you have not received any notification.
