## **Matt Dunn Report**

#### Kangaroos v Koroit

Going into the game against Koroit, we knew we face a huge challenge, but felt that if we were able to 'tidy up' our use of the ball, that would give us a chance to compete. Unfortunately the Saints came strongly 'out of the blocks' and had a goal on the board in the opening minute. We



seemed to lose control of the play and Koroit made us pay taking a commanding 45 point lead at the first break. Our second quarter was more competitive, but once again we were punished for every mistake. Koroit's bigger bodies and experience enabled them to dictate terms; and though our boys continued to compete, Koroit's use of the ball was first rate. Half-time saw us enter the change rooms seventy eight points down and with an ankle injury to Chris Quinn. During the break we emphasised the need to increase the pressure, limit the opportunities on our opponents and create some of our own, and to the boys credit we managed to restrict them to 2 goals for the guarter, with the Saints first not coming until after the 16 minute mark. We had 5 scoring shots in that term, but only points resulted, however it was evenly contested period of play. In the third term, we lost Jarrod O'Brien to foot injury and Dakin Morris (heel) leaving us without rotations for the final term. The last quarter was our most effective, scoring wise, but Koroit also 'cashed in' with nine goals, making the full time margin 125 points. An interesting 'stat' for the game was that we had the ball in our forward fifty on 54 occasions but only managed to score four goals, while Koroit went in sixty one times for 24 majors. A pleasing note was Alroy Gilligan playing his best game since joining us a month ago, 'racking up' a heap of possessions across half-back and through the mid-field. Hamish Waldron again led from the front despite sustaining a knee injury in the second quarter.

#### Kangaroos v Camperdown

We went to Camperdown confident of bringing home the points if we stuck to our task for the full four quarters. The opening term saw us kicking into a 2-3 goal breeze. For twenty three minutes it was an even contest, then suddenly we allowed Camperdown to boot 5 goals in the remaining seven minutes of the quarter, giving them a 36 point lead. Our pressure and use of the footy in that period was the best it had been for the previous five weeks, so at quarter time we spoke about the things that were working well for us, reinforcing the need to work 'back hard' and be everyone accountable for their opponent. The second term was again a fairly even affair, but we didn't make the most of our opportunities in front of goal meaning Camperdown maintain a 39 point break. At the interval our focus was on ensuring that we were prepared to work hard for each other. We felt that we were still in the game, but needed to claw back a couple of goals to give ourselves a chance. In the third term we came out ready to play and controlled the first five minutes, keeping the ball in our forward fifty. The Camperdown took the ball from defence to attack, scoring a goal against the trend of play. Not much in this quarter, but

unfortunately the Magpies were more dangerous in attack, managing to score five goals to our two. The final term was one we'd rather forget, despite us continuing to compete, Camperdown were 'full of run' blowing the margin out by booting nine goals to one, which wasn't a true reflection of the overall game. To make matters worse Jack Pertzel limped off injured and Hamish Waldron suffered a heavy 'corky' taking him out of the equation for the last 20 minutes of the match. Jarrod O'Brien worked tirelessly through the mid-field to be our best 'four quarter player' while Dakin Morris provided some spark on his wing

#### **Kangaroos v South Warrnambool**

We went into the game against South Warrnambool with two changes, Josh Pepper returning to Mildura and Jack Pertzel out for 6-8 weeks with a broken bone in his left foot. On a brighter note we regained Tom Feely who played his first senior game in more than a year and Sam Quinn back from injury after two weeks out. Our focus was on playing four solid quarters of football. We got off to a dream start with Sam Hassell kicking a goal in the first 30 seconds, from a clean centre break. Another goal followed in the next few minutes, before our skill errors enabled 'South' to dominate the rest of the guarter, taking a thirty one point lead at the first break. In the second term we fought our way back into the game, in what was a fairly even quarter. While our ball use had improved, 'turnovers' still proved costly and as usual made us pay on the scoreboard. A pleasing 'stat' was the 23 tackles for that term, resulting from lift in pressure that led to six scoring shots of our own. At half-time we were down by thirty seven points, but showing more positive signs than earlier in the game. A disappointing incident late in the quarter saw Dakin Morris 'tunnelled' landing awkwardly on his head. Dakin had been working hard; and was our best player until injured. While Dakin suffered concussion, thankfully scans have cleared him of further complications. In the third quarter we managed to have an equal share of the 'footy' going into in to the forward fifty on 14 occasions but failed to score a goal, while 'South' kicked six from their fifteen entries. After our poor last quarters recently, our aim was to win the final quarter, there was a willingness to work hard for each other and once again our pressure was excellent, managing to lay nine tackles in our forward fifty, a 'stat' that will provide us with opportunities to score regardless of who we are playing. The final term was a quarter when we controlled the footy and reduced our turnovers. Sam Tooley played well attacking the ball off across the backline. Jack Sutherland gave our onballers first use out of the centre. Alroy Gilligan, although 'tagged' off his back flank, provided attack and spark, creating a number of scoring chances for us. As this game progressed we started to show more belief in a game plan that will work for us. We just need to take pride in our use of the football and the desired results will follow. On Saturday we again had an average age of only 20. While these losses hurt, the players are learning and will be better footballers for the experience. Coming up today is another big challenge this time current ladder leaders North Warrnambool. We look forward to taking on arguably the best team in the competition.
