### **Matt Dunn Report**

#### **Kangaroos v Portland**

With the excitement of another night game, the boys were pretty pumped up and ready to go after a week off. We got off to a perfect start in the opening minute with a goal to Sam Quinn 'crumbing' a goal square pack. Unfortunately Portland then controlled the game for the next sixty minutes with near perfect ball movement and a potent forward line



to hold an eighty point lead at half-time. We were comprehensively outplayed. Our attack on the ball was good but, let down with poor skills, resulting in turnovers that more often than not led to Portland goals. At the main break, we spoke some home truths in looking for answers as to how we could turn around a poor half of football to get some respectability back on the scoreboard. The third quarter saw a small improvement, as our pressure increased we began to create more opportunities for ourselves, although Portland still won the quarter. Our focus for the final term was to play for some pride. We lifted a 'couple of gears' setting up more scoring chances, putting a stop to the Tigers dominance of play. Positives to come out of the game were Sam Quinn and Jarrod O'Brien's tackling and attack on the ball, setting a good example for their team mates. Taine Morris also showed some signs of his talent and continues to improve every week. Unfortunately we had a couple more injuries, Dakin Morris injuring his knee, probably keeping him out for 2-3 weeks and Michael McMeel requiring surgery as a result of an eye injury that looks likely to rule him out for the rest of the season. We wish both boys well with their recoveries.

#### Kangaroos v Terang Mortlake

We went to Terang with a positive mindset, giving ourselves a good chance to get our first win since our victory over the same side in round four. Although we had a very different side since the last time we played, our young group continues to learn and develop. We welcomed sixteen year old Cooper Henson in for his first senior game along with his good mate Dylan Godwin playing only his second at this level. Veteran Angus Brown was also brought in to give us some experience and direction, after playing consistently well in the reserves this season. The first half was relatively even. Terang Mortlake was on top in the first quarter before we were able to get back into the game during the second term. We aimed to take the game on, looking to utilise our leg speed. All the 'stats' indicated an even contest; with nine scoring shots from twenty forward fifty entries, while the Bloods had eight from twenty one. A pleasing tend for us was our control at the stoppages with our ruckmen competing strongly and onballers well structured. We went into the rooms at half time, confident, of our chances if we continued to back ourselves and play high pressure, hard running football. However the third quarter was disappointing. Turnovers let us down, missing targets by hand and foot, that Terang Mortlake capitalised on, their mid-field got on top and we lost confidence and the willingness to run and create. The Bloods kicked seven goals from 22 inside fifty's. In contrast we managed two goals from just six forward thrusts. We were disappointed that we opened the door for Terang Mortlake. At three quarter time, although our opponents held a forty two point lead, there was belief in the group that if we worked hard enough, we could 'give it a shake'. Controlling the game for the first half of the quarter meant we had clawed the deficit back to four goals at the fifteen minute mark. The boys were playing for each other, applying tremendous pressure on Terang when they had the football and willing to take the game on when we had possession.



As we were making our charge Terang Mortlake kicked a couple of goals and steadied their ship to finish off the game. It was disappointing to come away without a win, the third quarter lapse proving costly. Tom Feely led the way with a strong performance in the middle, while Jordan Murphy was solid across half-back. Our youngsters stood up well, Taine Morris worked hard to present a target at Centre half forward; Cooper Henson and Sean Barnes were influential on their 'wings' Also great credit is due to captain Hamish Waldron, who continues to battle hard, leading the way for his young team mates, despite carrying injuries each week that have really restricted him. On appositive note the things we had talked about, our attack on the ball and the will to play for each other, made for a pleasing display. After the game we reflected on the areas that need improvement, our focus for this week is to limit our turnovers.
