Matt Dunn Report

Kangaroos v Cobden

We went into the game against Cobden with some confidence after a solid effort against Terang Mortlake the week before. Once again we took eight under 18.5 players into the match, one of them, Sean Nippress making his senior debut. The first half was an even contest. We were 'up and about' with good pressure and with the ball in hand



we backed ourselves to take the game on. After kicking with a slight breeze, Cobden was just one goal up at quarter time. In the second term the opposition was generally on top early, but our boys were 'up for the fight'; and a late major had us trailing by only six points at the main break. There was a positive vibe in the rooms, feeling that this was an opportunity to really 'step it up'. We focused on competing and playing the game on our terms. We managed to do that until the fifteen minute mark of that quarter, before the 'Bombers' gained control, kicking seven goals in ten minutes, to take the match away from us. The group was disappointed with their efforts and wanted to win back some respect in the final term. We did manage to play a good brand of football, but failed to make much impact on the scoreboard. The full time margin of 63 points, reflected the lapse in that important third quarter, when the game got away from us. Sean Barnes was deservedly named as our best player, Josh Meulendykes was his usual reliable self and James Whyte competed well against a class ruckman.

Kangaroos v Warrnambool

Travelling to Warrnambool, we were fully aware of the challenge in front of us. Conditions weren't great with a strong breeze favouring the city end and the centre-square a bog. We welcomed back Dakin Morris from a knee injury and introduced another debutant in sixteen year old Lachie Dawson, stepping up after some impressive performances in the u/18.5s, a strong preparation with the North Ballarat Rebels, the Vic Country under sixteen Squad; and more recently St. Pat's First Eighteen. Warrnambool had the use of wind the opening guarter, but we competed well to restrict them to four goals, and although we couldn't register a score ourselves, the energy and intensity was there, we just needed to sustain the pressure and be more effective with our ball use. In the second guarter, we had our opportunities but again failed to score a goal, while Warrnambool kicked three to hold a seven goal lead at half-time. In the third term we were a man down after Cooper Henson 'copped' an elbow to the head resulting in slight concussion and a bit of a headache. Our focus was on getting back in the game and not allowing the result to become a 'blowout' The Blues were able to post a another four goals, to our disappointing 2 points during the third quarter. In the final term we were even or on top in all the key 'stats', finally managing to kick two goals and chances to kick a few more. Warrnambool took out the game by seventy six points, we competed strongly, but our ball use op forward wasn't good enough to trouble the Warrnambool defence. This is an area we continue to work on, to try and create more opportunities to kick a winning score. Sean Barnes continued his 'stand-out' season with another best on ground performance, on a wing and across half-forward. Josh Meulendykes was again a steady influence in defence, while Lachie Dawson, looking like he had played fifty games, was terrific with his attack on the ball, clean hands and ability to bring others into the game.

Kangaroos v Cobden

We had a poor start, once again rushing and trying to force the ball needlessly. In contrast, Cobden came out powerfully, taking full advantage, of our lapses, with a huge sixteen goal first quarter to our six. In the second term we played a more controlled and patient game, our full court defensive



pressure increased enabling us to create some great turnovers. From that point our ball movement and driving down the court improved 100%, meaning we were able to deliver the ball safely to Tayarrah and Bec who finished off with some great goals. outscoring Cobden in that term 11 – 8, leaving the half-time scores at 17-24. Needing to keep that momentum up to reduce the margin, our work rate and intensity really lifted in the second half, playing with strength to keep possession . Once again we were able to outscore the opposition in the final quarter, but it was a case of 'too little too late', to our girls credit though, we kept fighting right to the final whistle, and even when things went wrong, kept their heads high and just got on with the task in front. It was a slow start for us in the first quarter, and although we were able to regroup to actually outscore Warrnambool in the second term, still faced a deficit of five goals at half-time. I pointed out following points to the girls - our defensive pressure had to really step up, hold strong; and as Warrnambool were a tough side, we had to get tough too. To our teams credit we did exactly that, coming out to play the patient, controlled game that is often talked about. Our girls put in a sensational 15-4 last quarter, sweeping us to a well-deserved 38-35 victory. The work rate lifted, didn't drop our heads, but just got on with the task in front of us. There were at least eight girls who I could have named as 'Best Player'. Well done girls, to come back from being 8 goals down at the final change and finish off so strongly was a fantastic team effort!
