Kangaroos v Pt.Fairy

Pt. Fairy, who have been one of the form sides of the competition, had us on the back foot right from the start of the game with their clean skills and bigger bodies all over the ground. Every time we went forward, Sam Rudolph seemed to be there to intercept, mark or spoil.

The Seagulls went into with a thirty four point lead. The second term was better for us but again Port was more efficient with the footy. Our pressure was good, but we were unable to make the most of our opportunities; and went to the main break 44 points in arrears. The third quarter was our best for the day, the boys played with plenty of passion as we controlled the play for the majority of the term, until Pt. Fairy grabbed a couple of late goals to give them a fifty six point lead at three quarter time. In the final quarter we looked tired and with a six goal burst Port ran over the top of us. Kangaroos v Koroit

We embraced the challenge of playing Koroit who have been the benchmark of the competition for the past three years. Conditions weren't great with a 4-5 goal breeze favouring the club rooms end. We welcomed permit player Sammy Walsh-Bannam from Branhholme Wallacedale, into the side. Winning the toss and kicking to scoring end, our pressure was good, meeting our 'tackle target' while also having more 'inside 50s' than Koroit. The Saints were putting 'numbers' behind the footy, providing them with rebounds and making it hard for us to score. We went into the first break four points up. The second term started well for us, managing to keep Koroit goalless until the fifteen minute mark, however they finally slotted five majors which effectively shut us out of the game. In the final term we were competitive, but looked to be tiring. The Saints added a further four goals, while restricting us to a single to finish with a 79 point win. Jarrod O'Brien was our best player, while Chris Quinn and Taine Morris worked hard up forward. Angus Noske made a strong return to the senior side and young Lachie Dawson made our best players list again, his third from three games – a great effort from a sixteen year old.

With this being the last game for the season, I would like to thank all players, committee and supporters for all the help and encouragement we have received this year. It has been a challenging season, results wise, but I believe that the club is in a very healthy position with some fantastic young talent emerging within our ranks. Maddie's Vision

Following the tragic death of Maddie Riewoldt on 24th February, 2015, Maddie Riewoldt's Vision was founded by the Riewoldt family in June 2015. In collaboration with the Snowdome Foundation (an NFP that funds research into new treatments for blood cancers), Maddie Riewoldt's Visions aims to raise funds to #fightlikemaddie and find new treatments for Bone Marrow Failure.

WHAT IS BONE MARROW FAILURE SYNDROME (BMFS)?

- BMFS are a collection of medical conditions where the bone marrow stops working – resulting in abnormalities of the blood including severe anemia, increased risk of severe infections and bleeding.
- All BMFS are due to a failure of the bone marrow stem cells.
- BMFS may be acquired (affecting a previously normal marrow) or inherited.
- BMFS occurs when the bone marrow cells have been damaged or have been attacked by the immune system.

On 21st July this year the Hamilton Kangaroos Football Netball Club received an email from the Hampden Football League passing on a media release from TWP Sports in Geelong announcing their collaboration with the Maddie Riewoldt's Vision in the way of supplying MRV



football jumpers and Aline netball dresses to clubs to hire free of charge for the local 'Maddie Vision match'.

With this offer the HKFNC board approached the Hampden Football league CEO Michael Farrow and asked if they could hold a Maddie's Match on the last round of the season against Camperdown at home. We asked the CEO if he could contact Camperdown FNC, and all bodies agreed to this request instantly.

So this Saturday 27th August has been set aside to wear the MRV uniforms in the senior football and Open netball games.

We are hoping for a large crowd to support this wonderful foundation. We have received great support from one of our local business, the Hamilton Laundry in Gray St, who has offered to wash all the uniforms after the match before they are returned to TWP.

There will be a bucket at each gate entrance for a gold coin donation, as well as volunteers walking around at half time of the senior match for donations.

The HKFNC would like to thank the Maddie Riewoldt Vision for allowing us to support them by holding this game also the support of TWP Sports for supplying the uniforms and the support of Hampden Football League and the Camperdown Football Netball Club
