Celebrating history in our competitions

AFL Victoria's talent pathway has celebrated an exciting week, honouring players past and present for their achievements.

The Top 25 players from the 25-year history of the TAC Cup competition were revealed, with Chris Judd, Gary Ablett Jnr, Patrick Dangerfield and Adam Goodes just a few of the names selected as part of the star-studded list. It is amazing to think that each of these players developed their skills within Victoria's premier U18 competition. Credit must go to the junior clubs, coaches and staff within the TAC Cup regions for the role they have played in helping produce not only these 25 players, but the long list of over 1,000 AFL draftees that the pathway played a role in nurturing. We look forward to discovering who will be named No.1 from the list next Sunday (September 4) at the Morrish Medal vote count.

In an historic occasion last weekend, we recognised the first senior woman in Victoria to kick 100 goals in a season. St Kilda Shark and Collingwood marquee player Moana Hope recorded the milestone in the final round of the Swisse VFL Women's season, with the achievement celebrated with family members performing a haka on the field – surely a first for a 100-goal celebration.

Hope will now put that milestone behind her and start focusing on another goal, as her Sharks begin a finals campaign against the undefeated Darebin Falcons, Melbourne Uni and Eastern Devils in the inaugural VFL Women's Finals Series. Best of luck to all involved.

This weekend is the final home-and-away round of Peter Jackson VFL action, with top spot, a finals double-chance and eighth position to be decided. It will be an exciting finale to the season, and we look forward to the Legendairy VFL Finals Series beginning on the AFL-free weekend on September 3 – a fantastic opportunity for football fans to experience the best action on offer at state-league level.

The TAC Cup bottom four: season wrap

With the bottom four TAC Cup teams playing off on a standalone weekend of games before the finals begin, the AFL Victoria Record talks to each club's Talent Manager about the season that was.



GIPPSLAND POWER (comments from Talent Manager Peter Francis)

Wins: Rd 8 vs Northern (28 pts) / Rd 11 vs Western (43 pts) / Rd 14 vs Geelong (26 pts) / Rd 15 vs Calder (23 pts) / Rd 17 vs Northern (47 pts)

Season assessment: "We've been quite happy with the year in that we've got a reasonably young squad and a lot of U17 players played each week. Obviously the win-loss record might not look great, but we feel like the group's just kept improving from week to week. The results sort of show that – later in the year, we've won some games and had a lot of close games."

Season highlight: "Probably the win against Geelong. It was a really wet, cold day at Morwell – we even

had a little bit of snow earlier in the day. We were the bottom side that day and they were the top side, and to beat them was really great for the boys and their confidence. They'd been really building towards that."

Francis' 2016 draft prospects:

- Ben Ainsworth (midfielder/forward)
- Will Leslie (midfielder/defender)
- Josh Patullo (key-position/ruck)
- Sean Masterson (key-position)
- Kade Renooy (defender)

Surprise packet: "We brought Josh Patullo back as a 19-year-old and we think he's had a magnificent year. He was on the radar but had a bit of injury last year and AFL clubs said they really wanted to see him play in key-positions, back and forward. He did that and did it really well."

2017 prospects: "We've got a group of small players – Will Stephenson, Callan McKeon and Nick Hogan – who have been excellent. Aidan Quigley's had an interrupted year but has performed really well lately. Callum Porter's another one who's been fantastic through the midfield."

WESTERN JETS (comments from Talent Manager Shane Sexton)

Wins: Rd 1 vs Oakleigh (26 pts) / Rd 7 vs Bendigo (14 pts) / Rd 8 vs Calder (2 pts) / Rd 10 vs Oakleigh (33 pts) / Rd 16 vs Bendigo (32 pts)

Season assessment: “When we started off we were certainly aiming to play finals. I suppose we had some opportunities in the closer games we’ve had and couldn’t get it done, but I’d also say we’ve had a horrendous run with injuries – it was only a few weeks ago we had 23 kids to pick from. When we had a relatively full list, the first game of the year was a terrific win against Oakleigh and they were full-strength, and two weeks ago we defeated Bendigo with the best team we had available since then.”

Season highlight: “The highlight would be Daniel Venables, Brodie Romensky, Oscar Junker, Wilson Berry and Brock McGregor playing for Vic Metro. We hope we’ll get some boys drafted, and at the end of the day that’s what it’s about – providing

that opportunity for kids to meet their full potential and go on to bigger and better things.”

Surprise packet: “Bottom-ager Tristan Xerri is big key forward/ruck-type player who’s had a really good season (13 goals in 11 games). He wasn’t in our original squad and came in a little bit later.”

2017 prospects: “Luke Hitch and Nick Stuhldreier have been exceptional this year. Lachie Fogarty has only played a handful of games and Cam Rayner’s another one – both were only available at the start and end of the year. Rayner kicked seven goals in the Round 16 win against Bendigo and five last week against Calder.”



BENDIGO PIONEERS (comments from Talent Manager Stephen Sharp)

Wins: Rd 2 vs Gippsland (43 pts) / Rd 6 vs Eastern (21 pts) / Rd 8 vs Sandringham (34 pts) / Rd 14 vs Oakleigh (21 pts)

Season assessment: “We’ve made a lot of positive changes to the program. By last week we’d played possibly 33 bottom-age players for the season – opposed to last year when we only had 12 bottom-age players on our list. We extended our list from 50 to 70, so we’ve put development into another 20 kids. We’ve become more competitive too; we’ve won four games and have been in five other games that were decided by four goals or under.”

Season highlights: “I think the fact we had seven boys play at the U18 Championships, and getting back to play our home games at Queen Elizabeth Oval this year have been real positives for us. Also, I don’t think we’d beaten Oakleigh for quite a few years, and it might have been six to eight years

since we’d beaten Gippsland and Sandringham.”

Sharp’s 2016 draft prospects:

- Kobe Mutch (midfielder)
- Joseph Atley (midfielder)
- Kayle Kirby (forward)

Surprise packet: “Fergus Greene has played four games for us, but he hasn’t managed to string many together because he’s been injured or crook. He played two weeks ago and had a break-out first half (eight disposals, four marks, two goals) before he was hurt again. He’s pretty slight but he played a terrific game. He’s come under the eye a bit.”

2017 prospects: “We’re well positioned to be competitive next year. AFL Academy players include Jarrod Brander, Lochie O’Brien and Kane Farrell. We also have players like Paddy Dow, Angus Schumacher, Tom Campbell and Darby Henderson. We have greater depth in our bottom-age year than we did the year before.”

NORTHERN KNIGHTS (comments from Talent Manager Rhy Gieschen)

Wins: Rd 5 vs Tasmania (18 pts) / Rd 9 vs Western (23 pts) / Rd 11 vs Bendigo (24 pts)

Season assessment: "I think we didn't start the year the way we wanted to on the field, but we were really led by some of our top-age players who started the year quite well. To the playing group's credit they've stuck at it all year and continued to improve, and I guess the disappointing thing is we haven't translated that into winning on the scoreboard."

Season highlight: "We had a really memorable win against the Western Jets in Round 9. We went there with all of our private school players unavailable and came away with a win in the wet, and that was all due to endeavour and effort and players buying into the game plan. They deserved to win and they got one that day."

Surprise packet: "We probably unearthed Patrick Lipinski that day against Western, when he played in the midfield and had 30 touches. He wasn't on our list until this year as he's come from a basketball background."

2017 prospects: "We've been really pleased with the performances of our bottom-age group. Patrick Naish is one we're really excited about working with next year. Nick Coffield has had a really strong year and Ethan Penrith is an indigenous player who's really improved his footy out of sight. We've recently added Jack Petrucelle to our squad and he's probably the most exciting player on our list. He's an AIS basketball player who's turned his focus to footy and has been extremely exciting in two games with us."

Recipes for recovery

For effective recovery after exercise, you need a snack that provides the right combination of carbohydrate and protein. This combination will ensure that amino acids from protein can get straight into muscles where they're needed for muscle repair, and also that muscle carbohydrate stores are refuelled.

Here are two recipes that provide at least 20g of high-quality protein and a source of carbohydrate.

Ricotta and cherry protein balls

Makes 50

Ingredients:

- ¼ cup oatbran
- ⅔ cup hazelnut meal
- 250g wedge firm ricotta cheese
- 2 tablespoons honey
- ¼ cup chopped dried pears (or other fruit)
- ¼ cup skim milk powder
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon (optional)
- ⅓ cup chia seeds

1. Mix oatbran, hazelnut meal, ricotta, honey, dried fruit, skim milk powder and cinnamon in a large bowl until well combined.
2. Using clean hands, roll heaped teaspoonfuls of ricotta mixture into balls and coat in the chia seeds.



Enjoy 5 or 6 of these with a glass of milk or flavoured milk or a tub of yoghurt.

These will keep refrigerated for up to three days. For easy coating, put chia seeds in a resealable container, add balls, seal and shake until coated.



Strawberry basil protein recovery smoothie

Serves 2

Ingredients:

- 250g punnet strawberries (hulled)
- 2 cups reduced fat milk
- 1 cup reduced fat strawberry yoghurt
- 15 basil leaves
- ½ cup ice cubes
- 60g skim milk powder

1. Blend all ingredients until smooth, pour into chilled glasses and serve immediately.

Captain Dan a key Essendon cog

Dan Coghlan could never have imagined where football would take him when he was spending winter on camping trips just six years ago.

In his late teens, Essendon's VFL captain was enjoying football season doing anything but playing the national game. The 25-year-old instead spent that time in the great outdoors and then played cricket over the warmer months.

He played junior football but didn't go through the TAC Cup under-age system and only came back to the sport when mates persuaded him to play at his local club Warburton-Millgrove in 2011.

The tough midfielder's rise through the football ranks has been swift from that point.

"I guess I came through the system a little bit differently," Coghlan said. "I didn't play any footy for two or three years (as a teenager) and was mainly playing cricket and not even going near footy. I was going away camping and stuff like that – a bit of a different winter to the normal footy season."

"I finally had some mates talk me into coming back to play at Warburton-Millgrove, and I played there for two years and got invited down to Essendon for the 2013 pre-season. In the four years since, I couldn't have imagined coming to be captain or playing for the VFL (in May's state game against SA).

"I just take everything as it comes and appreciate every moment, because it's not always going to last."

Indeed, Coghlan's four seasons with the Bombers has coincided with one of the most difficult periods in the club's history. The supplements saga came to a head earlier this year with 12 AFL-listed Essendon players being banned from playing in 2016 – a decision that's had flow-on effects for the VFL team.

The associated negative media attention might have been enough to drive players away from the turmoil, but

Coghlan has stuck by the club that gave him a chance.

"Compared to, say, Warburton-Millgrove, I guess Essendon was always going to be a bit different," Coghlan said. "It's had its ups and downs and all the media attention, but the VFL-listed guys are a little bit hidden to it. We just do our thing, control what we can control and enjoy our time while we're there."

"It went through some funny stages last pre-season when the club was probably a bit flat with the suspension decision, but then to have some new guys (the 10 Essendon top-up players) come in with plenty of excitement was really good."

"They've been good around the group – guys like Ryan Crowley who have that AFL experience and have played a few games with us throughout the year. For the younger VFL-listed guys coming up, it's been a pretty decent mix of teammates."

Some of the most pleasing moments of Coghlan's first season as skipper have involved seeing those young Bombers taking their VFL opportunities – players such as Nash Holmes, with whom Coghlan has worked closely on his midfield craft.

He also pointed to spirited comeback wins against Werribee in Round 11 and the Box Hill Hawks in Round 15 as memorable moments, while he's proud his new role seemingly hasn't affected his on-field output as Essendon's chief ball-winner at the contests.

Coghlan's next challenge is to help the Bombers secure a finals spot with victory over the Northern Blues on Saturday and attempt to surpass the team's run to a preliminary final last year.

From eighth position, it would be difficult – but Coghlan has tended to deal in surprises during his VFL career.

Telling facts: Richmond notched a fifth consecutive win by over-powering Sandringham in a rainy second half at Trevor Barker Beach Oval. The Zebras held a 21-point lead early in the third quarter, but the Tigers then reeled off seven of the next nine goals – including four to 23rd player Kayle Kirby of the Bendigo Pioneers – to stay in the finals hunt and cause Sandringham to drop out of the top four.

Telling facts: Port Melbourne stayed in the race for fourth position by blowing the Dolphins away in the first half at Frankston Oval. The Borough quickly had the first four goals of the game on the board and had built a 60-point lead by half time. Frankston limited the damage in the second half but couldn’t avoid a 12th straight defeat.

Telling facts: The winning streak has now stretched to 12 games for the Magpies, as they kicked eight unanswered goals from early in the first term until early in the third to sink the Hawks at Box Hill City Oval. Box Hill is now out of mathematical chances and will miss the VFL finals for the first time since 2008.

Telling facts: Geelong rallied from deficits of 27 points at half time and 16 points at three-quarter time at Simonds Stadium to end Casey’s four-match winning streak. The Cats held the Scorpions to a solitary goal and booted eight majors of their own in the second half to keep alive their hopes of snatching a top-four spot in next week’s final round.

The Bulldogs opened up a 27-point lead by quarter time and never looked back, with 2015 All Australian forward Jake Stringer kicking one goal after being dropped from the Western Bulldogs’ senior team.

Congratulations to Frankston's Brandon Wood, who has been voted the Peter Jackson VFL Wynstan Player of the Month for July.

Thanks to Wynstan – celebrating 48 years of transforming windows and doors in Australia – VFL fans had the chance to cast their vote for the VFL Wynstan Player of the Month on the VFL Facebook site.

The most creative answer among the votes for Wood was provided by Peter Maguire – 'Brandon Wood by a mile, glides across the grass, with extra touch of class, has to win, is only just' – who has won 1 x football signed by members of the 2016 Sydney Swans Football Club valued at \$500.

Wood is ranked in the top 10 for disposals in the competition and averaged 29 touches a game in July. Having played all 17 matches this season, he produced a season-high 37 disposals in Round 15 vs Collingwood – with 89 per cent efficiency for his 19 handballs in the game.

Five players were selected for their performances from Rounds 13-17: Tom Wilson (Northern Blues), Mitch Honeychurch (Footscray), Luke Ryan (Coburg), Aaron Heppell (Essendon) and Wood, who received the most Facebook votes with 384.

Tigers fighting for finals

Five straight wins has Richmond in contention to snatch a spot in the Peter Jackson VFL Legendairy Finals Series, but the Tigers need some luck in the final home-and-away round.

Ninth-placed Richmond (8-9, 103.70%) needs eighth-placed Essendon (9-8, 103.74%) to lose to the Northern Blues (13th) at Windy Hill on Saturday and must also defeat Coburg (11th) at Punt Road Oval on the same day to seal what once looked an unlikely September berth.

Meanwhile, three teams – Port Melbourne (11-6, 107.2%), Footscray (11-6, 105.7%) and Geelong (10-7, 136.6%) – are still in contention for the final top-four spot behind Collingwood, the Casey Scorpions and Williamstown. The fifth-placed Bulldogs can eliminate the Cats from contention with victory over Collingwood at VU Whitten Oval on Saturday, but if not, the defining game will be the Borough's clash with Geelong at the same venue on Sunday.

In the Development League, third-placed Port Melbourne effectively sealed its finals spot behind the Box Hill Hawks and Casey Scorpions with a win against Frankston last week, while fourth-placed Coburg needs to defeat the Borough at VU Whitten Oval on Sunday to be assured of September action. But if the Lions (9-6, 97.3%) lose, the final margin will determine whether Williamstown (9-7, 95.3% with a final-round bye) replaces them in the top four.

VFL Women's

This weekend the inaugural Swisse VFL Women's Finals Series begins, with a Semi Final and Elimination Final to be held at Box Hill City Oval on Sunday.

Callum O'Connor dissects the teams involved, with Darebin and St Kilda to face off in a Semi Final for a spot in the Grand Final on Sunday September 18 at Piranha Park (Coburg), while Melbourne Uni and the Eastern Devils will attempt to progress to a Preliminary Final with a win in the Elimination Final.

DAREBIN

Season Summary: Looking for a fourth straight premiership (after three in the VWFL), Darebin are now past measuring themselves by their peers' standards. Instead they redefine the barometers for success each season. The Falcons are determined to be the best they can be and 'complacency' is a dirty word for the team from AH Capp. The hallmark of the Falcons' game is to play the match on their terms and then rupture it in short bursts of skilful football. The challenge of the inaugural VFL Women's season was one they were ready for and they completed their third clean sweep of a home-and-away season in four years. Only Diamond Creek (17 points in Round 7) and Melbourne Uni (12 points, Round 8) pushed the Falcons all the way.

Players to Watch: It was hard to see how many of the Falcons' champions could improve on their games but several had their best seasons yet. Karen Paxman set a new benchmark for sheer endurance running through all lines, while ruckman Norieul Kinross seized the opportunity presented in the absence of the injured Aasta O'Connor. Power forward Katie Brennan was in world-beating touch in 2016. Although she came second in the goalkicking with 76 majors, Brennan wasn't necessarily limited to the forward line, often running on the ball when needed.

ST KILDA

Season Summary: The Sharks started over with a new coach, Shaun Smith, in 2016. The Sharks pride themselves on playing smart footy and there's been plenty to like in their ability to wrestle contests back their way. Clutch victories against the Devils and Melbourne Uni are a testament to the maturity of Smith's playing group, who have developed a strong core of experienced players boosted by the emergence of young stars half-back/midfielder Tilly Lucas-Rodd, ruck Rachel Achampong and midfielder Brianna Davey.



Players to Watch: All the attention will be on centurion Moana Hope, and the Sharks will probably want it to stay that way. It allows forward Jasmine Garner (41 goals) to fly under the radar for the Sharks, which will be a great weapon in the finals. St Kilda will also be looking towards a player who'll be giving attention instead of receiving it, tagger Ellie George. All three of the Sharks' finals opponents boast strong midfields so George –coming into her own as a tagger – will be an important player over the next few weeks.

MELBOURNE UNI

Season Summary: Melbourne Uni love to get numbers around contests and once they've won it they spread and switch as skilfully as anyone. All season their midfield has provided a mix of brute strength, excellent ball movement and pace... and it isn't even their best line. The Mugsars' defence was not merely the stingiest this season, they were the best on the counter-attack, turning half-back into a launching pad. However, a question mark does hang over their ability to adjust against their finals opponents, producing just one win and a draw from six matches.

Players to Watch: The combined brilliance of midfielders Ellie Blackburn and Emma Kearney is well documented, but in the second half of the season, the Muggers unveiled a key forward to capitalise on that midfield dominance in Jess Anderson. Anderson's straight-line, no-frills attack on the ball has seen her kick 27 goals and force opposition defenders to build their strategy around her. Moreover, Melbourne Uni have been practitioners of the belief that a side is only as strong as their bottom six, so players like Deanna Berry, Gabriella Pound, Maddie Keryk and Hannah Ibrahim could play vital roles come finals.

EASTERN DEVILS

Season Summary: The Devils were 2016's big improvers, recording six extra wins than last year. The midfield unit grew into a cohesive, fast, slick-moving group as the season progressed, intelligently coached by Brendan Major. Sophie Casey, Hannah Scott and Jaimee Lambert all rank among the very toughest of ball-winners, typifying the attack on the ball which is a primary focus of the Devils. Over the last five matches, their defence conceded the second-least points of all finals sides – an impressive stat when you consider veteran defender Meg Hutchins missed over two months with a knee injury but returns for finals.

Players to Watch: The Devils' strength is their team focus. Much of their defensive rebound comes from Jess Sibley and Bec Privitelli, who would have as many intercept possessions as any player going around. Elsewhere, bullocking Lauren Tesoriero plays every position like it's her best. And if a match looks like it will be decided by X-factor, don't take your eyes off Pepa Randall.

100 for Hope

St Kilda forward Moana Hope has written her name in the history books by becoming the first player in the Swisse VFL Women's competition – and in senior women's football in Victoria – to kick 100 goals, as Kate Withers reports.

Left stranded on 99 goals at the end of Round 17 after a 10-goal haul versus Cranbourne, the 28-year-old was forced to wait another week after converting just two of seven last-quarter scoring shots. It took just 11 minutes for Hope to kick the milestone goal in the final round against Seaford, on her way to five for the game.

She finished the home-and-away season on 104 goals, with her century including five hauls of 10 or more goals, including a season-high 16 against Knox in Round 7.

The only blemish in an otherwise flawless individual season was when she was kept goalless by Melbourne University in Round 8.

A three-time winner of the Victorian Women's Football League leading goalkicker award, Hope has controlled the forward line for over ten years. With loads of 68, 71 and 74 to her name, her previous season-best of 87 came in 2014.

Touted as one of the competition's best players, the gun goaler averaged 5.8 majors a game in 2016 and earned top plaudits last month when she was signed as a marquee player for the Collingwood Football Club Women's Team in the inaugural AFL Women's season for 2017.

Hope's 100 comes as the third-placed Sharks have secured a finals berth and prepare to take on Darebin in a semi final this week.

Round 17 Highlights

Rays rise to no. 1

The Dandenong Stingrays claimed the 2016 TAC Cup minor premiership following a see-sawing final-term battle with the Geelong Falcons in Round 17.

Both teams went into Sunday's match with records of 13-3 and their places in the top two assured ahead of finals, but with the Stingrays gunning for their first minor premiership since 1997 and the Falcons looking for the fourth in their history, a slog ensued at a wet Simonds Stadium.

Just 11 total goals were kicked until three-quarter time, but 10 majors were put on the board when the game opened up in a thrilling final stanza. Dandenong piled on five of the last six goals of the match in a rapid-fire onslaught once Geelong established a 10-point lead with eight minutes to play.

Dan Allsop and Myles Pohlke helped put the Stingrays back in front shortly after, before the Falcons answered to take the lead once again. But late majors to first-gamer Jarrod Smith, Reece Piper and Tom Murphy sealed Dandenong's 14-point triumph and a date with the Murray Bushrangers in a qualifying final in two weeks.

Meanwhile, Geelong will face the **North Ballarat Rebels** (12-5) in a qualifying final after the Rebels rose to third position with a 22-point victory over the **Eastern Ranges** (8th, 7-10) at Eureka Stadium.

In the first season of his second stint as North Ballarat head coach, Gerard FitzGerald guided his troops into the top four for the first time in 2016 last week and they rose again following Round 17, when Willem Drew starred for the Rebels with 30 disposals, nine tackles and seven clearances against the Ranges.

Murray's first-year head coach Leon Higgins also steered the **Bushrangers** (4th, 11-5-1) into a qualifying final, despite their 14-point loss to the **Oakleigh Chargers** (6th, 8-9) at Norm Minns Oval.

Murray trailed by just four points at the last break, but couldn't stop the Chargers recording a third straight win to end the home-and-away season. Oakleigh was led again by bottom-ager Jack Higgins (31 disposals, one goal), while Louis Cunningham (24 disposals, eight rebound-50s) was also influential against the Bushrangers.

The Chargers will now face the **Calder Cannons** (7th, 8-9) in an elimination final after the Cannons pipped the **Western Jets** (10th, 5-12) by seven points at Rams Arena.

Western tied the scores at the 28-minute mark of the final quarter before Calder's Ben Ronke (31 disposals, three goals) kicked a point from the next centre bounce and then Jean-Luc Velissaris scored his third major to seal victory.

The **Sandringham Dragons** (5th, 11-5-1) needed a monumental win against the **Bendigo Pioneers** (11th, 4-13) to overtake fourth-placed Murray on percentage, but eventually finished three percentage points outside the top four after 'only' rolling the Pioneers by 96 points at Trevor Barker Beach Oval.

Vic Metro representatives Tim Taranto, Oliver Florent and Andrew McGrath were all instrumental for the Dragons as they now prepare for an elimination final clash with Eastern.

In Round 17's other match:

- The **Gippsland Power** (9th, 5-12) moved up to their highest position of the season after defeating the **Northern Knights** (12th, 3-14) by 47 points at Preston City Oval.

Dynamic Bendigo Pioneers forward Kayle Kirby booted five goals in his VFL debut as a 23rd player to help fire Richmond to a nine-point triumph over Sandringham last week.

The 181cm 17-year-old scored three majors in the crucial third quarter when the Tigers set up victory with a run of six unanswered goals. Kirby has kicked 32 majors in 13 TAC Cup appearances this year, while averaging 12 disposals and three tackles per game. He also represented Vic Country in one match at the 2016 NAB AFL U18 Championships.

Northern Knights captain **Mason Blakey** also made his debut at VFL level in Round 20, picking up 14 disposals and kicking a goal in Northern's 55-point loss to Williamstown. The 2016 Vic Metro representative is averaging 21 disposals per game as a rebounding defender across his 15 TAC Cup matches this year.

Geelong's goalkicking guns

As the saying goes, bad kicking is bad football. And good kicking in front of goal is never more important than in finals.

Recent AFL history is littered with stories of finals heartbreak caused by inaccurate goalkicking. One club that perhaps knows most about the topic is Geelong, which had nine more scoring shots than Hawthorn but lost the 2008 Grand Final by 26 points and had three fewer scoring shots than St Kilda but won the 2009 decider by 12 points.

Well, it turns out the 2016 VFL Cats are the best goalkicking team in the competition, recording a scoring accuracy of 61.9% so far this season – almost three per cent higher than the next-best finals contender, Collingwood (59.1%).

Geelong certainly proved the value of good goalkicking against the Casey Scorpions in Round 20, losing every key statistical category recorded by Champion Data but still claiming an 11-point win. The Cats booted 13.5 to Casey's 10.12, with the Scorpions the fourth-best finals-contending team for scoring accuracy on 57.3%.

Above them on the list is Essendon (58.1%), while below them the order goes: Port Melbourne (55.9%), Williamstown (55.6%), Sandringham (54.8%), Richmond (54.7%) and then Footscray on 50.6% – an 11 per cent less likely proposition to put the ball through the big sticks than the dead-eyes from Geelong.

7 Alex Boyse has made a big impact for **Essendon** since making his VFL debut two weeks ago, kicking seven total goals in crucial victories over Williamstown and then North Ballarat. The 189cm 22-year-old booted four straight majors from 16 disposals and nine marks against the Roosters, helping his team stay one win clear inside the top eight.

46 Calder Cannons forward **Karl Brown** has topped the TAC Cup goalkicking table for the 2016 home-and-away season with 46 goals from 16 games. The 193cm over-ager finished 11 goals clear of Geelong Falcon Brett Blair, being held goalless only twice and booting bags of nine, seven and six majors. He also averaged 13 disposals, five marks and four tackles per game.

17 Collingwood's VFL-listed players have been integral to the Magpies being in prime position to claim the minor premiership, and perhaps their most underrated this year has been defender/midfielder **Matt Smith**. The 25-year-old is club's only VFL-lister to have played every game (17), ahead of seasoned VFL campaigners **Jordan Kelly** and **Ben Moloney** (both 16).

Betts and Mundy crack 250

Former Calder Cannons small forward Eddie Betts and ex-Murray Bushrangers midfielder David Mundy both played their 250th AFL games in Round 22 last week.

Betts, 29, was part of **Calder's** 2004 TAC Cup premiership before being selected by Carlton with pick no.4 in that year's Pre-Season Draft. The Templestown junior played 184 games for the Blues from 2005-13 before crossing to Adelaide in 2014, where he has twice been the club's leading goalkicker and earned All Australian selection in 2015.

Mundy, 31, was taken from **Murray** by Fremantle with pick no.19 in the 2003 AFL Draft. The Seymour product won the Dockers' best and fairest in 2010, earned All Australian selection in 2015 and this year succeeded Matthew Pavlich as club captain.

Meanwhile, former **Dandenong Stingrays** midfielder **Adam Treloar** notched his 100-game milestone in Round 22. The 23-year-old Noble Park junior was a 17-year-old access selection by GWS in 2011 and played 79 games for the Giants from 2012-15 before being traded to Collingwood ahead of the 2016 season.

21-year-old ex-**North Ballarat Rebels** defender **Martin Gleeson** – selected by Essendon with pick no.53 in the 2012 AFL Draft – played his 50th AFL game last week, along with 25-year-old former **Bushrangers** ruckman **Jon Ceglar**, who spent two years on Collingwood's rookie list without playing a senior game before being delisted and then taken at pick no.15 in the 2012 Rookie Draft by Hawthorn.

Rioli rising at Richmond

Former North Ballarat Rebels small forward Daniel Rioli was named the Round 22 nominee for the NAB AFL Rising Star award.

19-year-old Rioli had 16 disposals and kicked two goals in the Tigers' nine-point loss to St Kilda. He is averaging 10 disposals and three tackles per game and has booted 13 goals across 17 matches since debuting in Round 1 this year.

The Darwin, Northern Territory native – a cousin of Hawthorn champion Cyril Rioli – moved to Ballarat at the age of 15 to attend St Patrick's College. He kicked 14 goals in nine TAC Cup games for the Rebels before being selected by Richmond with pick no.15 in the 2015 NAB AFL Draft.

Meanwhile, three TAC Cup graduates made their AFL debuts in Round 22:

- Former **Northern Knights** midfielder **Brayden Fiorini** recorded 17 disposals and three clearances in Gold Coast's loss to Collingwood. The 19-year-old averaged 30 disposals per game in the TAC Cup before being selected by the Suns with pick no.20 in the 2015 NAB AFL Draft.
- Ex-**Calder Cannons** forward **Callum Moore** had five disposals, three marks and kicked a goal in Richmond's loss to St Kilda. The athletic 193cm 19-year-old was selected in last year's TAC Cup Team of the Year before being taken by the Tigers at pick no.12 in the 2015 Rookie Draft.
- Former **Sandringham Dragons** utility **Josh Clayton** picked up six disposals in Brisbane's loss to Geelong. The 190cm 20-year-old was selected by the Lions with pick no.86 in the 2014 AFL Draft.

More than 30 Islamic schools are involved in the program nationally with talented players from across the country chosen to form a group of 35 who will be invited to the Bachar Houli Academy.

Selection into the Academy provides emerging junior players from an Islamic background aged 14-17 with an opportunity to enhance their skills in a high-performance talent and leadership training camp held later this year.
