## Chairman's Report

## MEMORIAL TROPHIES



#### The Senior Grade 'Most Consistent Player' Award is dedicated to the memory of Travis Hopper

Travis was born on 25th October 1971. He played for the Nepean Colts Under 20s in 1989 and 1990 and First Grade for the Penrith club in 1989 and 1991. In his short career he won a number of awards, most notably the 1990 Armstrong Medal, as the Sydney Football League Under 20's (Division 2) Best and Fairest Player. Travis's brothers Brad and Craig also played football for Penrith and Blacktown respectively.

> Travis Hopper died on 28th July 1991 as a result of a car accident. He was returning home with friends after playing football for Penrith.

Travis was the beloved son of Judy Hopper.

The Penrith AFC Senior Grade 'Most Consistent Player' Award is our ongoing dedication to Travis's memory.

#### The 'Club Person of the Year' Award is dedicated to the memory of Dianne Guymer

Dianne was born on 18th May 1972 and came from a family with a long background in Australian Rules Football, from her grandfather and uncle, to her father Vince and brother Chris. Dianne played junior football with the St Clair club from 1982 to 1984, winning several trophies. Later, she also acted as boundary umpire and water carrier for the Nepean Colts. Dianne was a proud and vocal supporter of both the Penrith and Blacktown clubs.

Dianne Guymer died in the same car accident as Travis Hopper. She was the beloved daughter of Vince and Lyn Guymer.

The Penrith AFC 'Club Person of the Year' Award is our ongoing dedication to Dianne's memory.

# PERPETUAL TROPHIES

#### The Senior Grade Best and Fairest Award is named the "Michael Walker Medal"

Mick started with the club as a 16 year old in 1981, his first game being the second the club ever played. Over the years his name has become synonymous with the Penrith AFC. He holds the games record for the club (267) and was at the helm as coach when the Rams won their first flag in 1989. Mick has captained the club, coached both First and Reserve grades, has been an Association representative player and was a playing member of the club's two senior premiership sides. As an administrator, he was president of the club for four years and also chaired the Sydney Football Association. Mick was awarded Life Membership in 1992, received an Australian Sports Medal in 2000 and won the award which now bears his name in 1990.

#### The Reserve Grade Best and Fairest Award is named the "Geoff Eldering Medal"

Geoff started with the club in 1981 as a player who was virtually new to the game. From these beginnings he went on to build a formidable record with Penrith. He is one of six players to have played over 200 games for the Rams, and was a playing member of the club's first two flag winning sides. He coached the second of those premierships, the side going through the season unbeaten in 1991. He played for, captained and coached Association representative sides and won the Apted Medal in 1989 as the Association Best and Fairest player. He has coached Penrith sides in three different grades, has been club captain and twice was runner-up in the Senior Grade Best and Fairest. Geoff was awarded Life Membership of Penrith in 1989.

#### The Under 18 Grade Best and Fairest Award is named the "Alan Stewart Medal"

Alan was first involved with the Penrith Junior Football club in 1980, before turning his administrative ability to the new Rams senior club the following year. Until 1992 he was one of several people who formed the backbone of the Penrith AFC. He did a remarkable amount of work to help with the challenge of running a senior football club in this area in the 80's - his roles at various stages included president, secretary, treasurer, records officer and association delegate. Alan received Life Membership of the Rams in 1991 and the Australian Sports Medal in 2000.

#### The Senior Grade Coach's Award is named the "Keith Claxton Coach's Award"

A footballer of considerable ability, Keith was playing at the highest level of Sydney football when he and others formed the Penrith club in 1981. In Penrith's inaugural season, he captained the club and put in a tremendous amount of work at the administrative level. Keith also won the McFarlane Medal as the Association Reserve Grade Best & Fairest player in each of Penrith's first two years. After two seasons' absence, Keith returned to Penrith in 1985, playing his 50th game and assisting the club in consolidating its move to two senior grades.

#### The Reserve Grade Coach's Award is named the "Frank Taylor Coach's Award"

Frank had an extensive career in football prior to his RAAF posting to Sydney. He played for Western Suburbs before being appointed inaugural coach of Penrith in 1981. He led the club to the preliminary final in that year, in addition to being an important part of the club administration. In 1983, the club's first year of fielding two sides, he coached Reserve Grade, and also won that grade's Best & Fairest award. In 1985 he played a further 15 games and served as president, and then assumed the treasurer's role the following year.

## **Senior Grade Report**

At the end of season 2005 I wrote that our improved season had come from significant improvements in discipline, self belief and commitment. More importantly I closed last year's report by saying to improve further we would require even greater commitment and enthusiasm. Unfortunately as a group we were unable to sustain all of the above qualities over the full season and that, combined with injuries and work commitments, made for a tough year.

Despite failing to reach our goals this year it must be said that there were many positives to come out of the season. First grade had some new faces including star midfielder Steve McWilliam, Christopher Blake, Matt Warnock and Hayden Hampel. Ben Howard and Ash Brown were welcomed back to AFL, both making big contributions this year. Jason Bradley and his Reserve Grade side fought hard all season and showed improvement with newcomers like Chris Knight, Mark Jackson, and Andrew Piper making strong debut seasons.

The Under 18's coming back to the club was a fantastic boost, and several players made important contributions to both Reserve and Senior grade. I would like to congratulate John and the boys for the way they improved through the year with some outstanding performances seeing them fall just short of finals football. Young players such as Ryan Freeman and Grant Berry to name just two will play important roles in the club's future.

As I step back from football to spend more time with my family I would just like to say good luck for next season. No matter if you're the best Senior player or the newest Under 18 player on the list, for the club to improve you need to train hard and consistently. Ability will always get noticed but it means nothing without total commitment. Commitment will turn you into very good players - just ask Brian Skepper, John Keane and Christian Triffitt.

I've had some wonderful years at this footy club and I would like to thank all the players, board members, support staff, and coaches that helped me both as a player and coach over the past 9 seasons. In particular I want to say a special thank you to Jason Bradley and Jim Wright who have both helped me immensely over the past two seasons and finally my family Delphi, Jack and Sophie for their love, support and understanding.

### **Reserve Grade Report**

This season saw the Reserve Grade side only play 12 matches - 3 being washed out and S-W Sydney forfeiting in the last round. This was very disappointing as it would have probably resulted in at least 2 more wins for the team, thereby moving us up the ladder and into a more respectable position as far as the ladder goes.

We had a new leadership group in place for this year, with Justin Brock as captain and Robert Watkins vice-captain. These two led from the front with not only their voices but more importantly with the way they played. They were ably backed up by new players Mark Jackson and Niven Thorn together with experienced players Stuart Ayres and Luke Donoghue.

We also blooded a few of the Under 18 players into senior football and by my reckoning they will be a feature of this club's senior ranks for many years to come. Players like Andrew Piper, Niven Thorn, Christian Knight, Matthew Spooner and Brooke Pauna. These players, along with the 2nd and 3rd year players, will need to take the next step up by placing more pressure on the 1st graders. This will help Reserve Grade improve - hopefully enough to make the finals for the 1st time in a number of years in 2007.

I would like to thank various people for the help and support they gave me this year. Firstly to the Board for allowing me to coach the side again this year; to Rick for his input during the year; the captaincy group for showing the way out on the field; my various team managers, but especially Jim Wright who ended up doing most of it while still being the 1st Grade Manager; Julie Celeban for the great work she did in looking after the side with strapping and rub downs - I just wish, on behalf of all of the team, that you stayed on for the whole season. Hopefully next year you will agree to do it again.

Finally to my family. if it wasn't for the total support they gave me to do this job then I don't think I would have ended up the season with a full head of hair!!!! I couldn't have asked for a more thoughtful and understanding family.

One last thought. To improve on this season we must all make the commitment to start the pre-season as a club and not a group of individuals as that is the only way we will improve and in the end have more fun doing it.

## **Under 18 Grade Report**

Following the Greater Western Power side in 2005, the Under 18s returned to the fold of the Rams in 2006. Blue Mountains junior club coach John Noye took helm of the side, which featured a mix of both new and experienced Under 18s players. (Of the 30 players who took the field for the 18s, exactly half were making their debut at this level). As with 2005 (and also 2003) the side featured a mix of Penrith and Hawkesbury players.

The competition reverted to the traditional format of commencing the season with two divisions – the previous year the divisions weren't decided until a qualifying competition was conducted at the start of the season. This saw the Rams in second division, competing against six other clubs – two fielding second sides (St George and Pennant Hills) and the remaining four (like the Rams) fielding their top side. Given the good mix of players in the squad, and the nature of the competition, expectations were high for the season ahead. Unfortunately that was not to be the case, with the boys winning only three games and finishing in fifth spot on the ladder. Things could have been different with a little more luck however. Potential wins were lost with two abandoned games against lower placed Manly (four games were abandoned overall). Add in 4 byes and a last round forfeit due to a scheduling misunderstanding, and the side played only 9 games in an 18 round season.

Despite missing the finals, the side still had a very creditable year and could have made the finals if things went a little more their way. They won three games (the team in fourth spot winning 5), and lost to finalists Campbelltown in Round 1 by 10 points, Pennant Hills in Round 11 by 25 (after leading at three-quarter time) and Western Suburbs in Round 12 by 5 (again after leading at the final break).

Dale Chivas only played 2 games in the side during the season, due to Senior Grade selection. Damien Watson, Ryan Freeman and Grant Berry also played multiple games at senior level, in a promising sign for their future development.


