Business end of the season

What a historic week it has been for our VFL competitions.

For the first time ever, the Peter Jackson VFL best and fairest – the J.J. Liston Trophy – was announced with the inaugural Swisse VFL Women's Best and Fairest at Crown Palladium on Monday night. It was a special occasion to have so many of Victoria's most talented male and female state-league players all in the one room at the same time. I congratulate Williamstown's Michael Gibbons and Darebin Falcon Daisy Pearce on their best-and-fairest wins.

A pleasing aspect of the night was not only recognising a new era in women's football, but also acknowledging the rich history of the competition, with many former J.J. Liston Trophy winners in the room. The late Frank Johnson was represented by his family on the night and it was a fitting tribute at the start of the evening to see a replay of Frank's speech just 12 months earlier about what the 1952 Liston win meant to him.

Interest in the VFL continues to grow as we count down to the 2016 Peter Jackson VFL Legendairy Grand Final on Sunday September 25 at Etihad Stadium. Last Sunday we set a new benchmark for viewers of the VFL on Channel 7, with a record 155,000 fans tuning in to witness Footscray overrun Essendon in the final term to book a Preliminary Final berth against Collingwood. Add to that over 6,000 spectators in attendance at North Port Oval on Sunday and we are set for an exciting final two weeks.

Our highest-ever ratings for a VFL TV game on ABC was 198,000 for the 2014 season decider, so let's hope we can eclipse that figure over the remaining three games in the season. For fans unable to make the Grand Finals next weekend, their TV viewing will last throughout the day, with the TAC Cup Grand Final on Fox Footy from 11am and Channel 7 starting its broadcast of the VFL finale with an hour pre-match from 2pm.

Gibbons wins VFL's J.J. Liston Trophy

Williamstown midfielder Michael Gibbons won the 2016 J.J. Liston Trophy for the Peter Jackson VFL's best and fairest player on Monday night.

The 21-year-old polled 17 votes to finish two votes clear of **Geelong** AFL-listed midfielder **George Horlin-Smith** and three ahead of **Seagulls** captain **Ben Jolley** and **Port Melbourne** skipper **Toby Pinwill**.

Gibbons had 16 votes on the board after Round 15, putting him six votes in front of Jolley and Borough midfielder Tom O'Sullivan with six rounds to play. Horlin-Smith polled eight votes and Pinwill 10 after that point, but both had commenced their runs of form too late. Pinwill had the chance to tie for the lead in the final round but failed to produce the required three-vote performance.

Gibbons backed up his Norm Goss Medal-winning performance in Williamstown's 2015 Grand Final triumph with a break-out season that saw him play every match and average 29 disposals, seven clearances and six inside-50s per game. He finished the home-and-away season as the competition's top-ranked player for total disposals, uncontested possessions and inside-50s, the no.2 player for total kicks, no.3 player for total clearances and no.4 player for total contested possessions.

His presence in Williamstown's dominant first-choice midfield alongside ruckman Nick Meese and fellow on-ballers Jolley and Willie Wheeler helped drive the Seagulls to a top-four finish.

Gibbons polled votes in eight games – equalled only by Pinwill – including three best-on-ground performances for:

- 26 disposals, 10 clearances and six tackles in a 44-point win against the Casey Scorpions in Round 3;
- 30 disposals, 10 clearances and eight tackles in a seven-point win against Port Melbourne in Round 4; and
- 37 disposals, 13 inside-50s, nine clearances and a goal in a 72-point win against Footscray in Round 9.

Gibbons also won the Frank Johnson Medal for the VFL's best player in May's State Game against the SANFL and last week played his 50th senior VFL game in Williamstown's semi final victory over Sandringham. As a junior, he captained the Murray Bushrangers in 2013 and was named in that year's TAC Cup Team of the Year.

Gibbons is Williamstown's 10th J.J. Liston Trophy winner and the first since Paul Dooley claimed the honour in 1996.

23-year-old **Horlin-Smith** polled his 15 votes in just 11 matches, averaging 26 disposals and seven clearances per game. **Jolley**, 30, led the VFL for total handballs during the home-and-away season and averaged 31 disposals and six tackles per game in 17 matches, while **Pinwill**, 31, averaged 27 disposals and six clearances per game in 16 matches.

Casey's big Mac claims A. Todd Medal

Casey Scorpions ruckman Oscar McInerney won the 2016 A. Todd Medal for the best and fairest player in the AFL Victoria Development League on Monday night.

The 203cm 21-year-old polled 16 votes in 12 games to finish one vote clear of **Box Hill Hawks** goalkicker **William Murphy** and two ahead of **Sandringham's Kenny Ong**, in just his first VFL season after previously playing with Montrose in the Eastern Football League.

McInerney polled votes in seven games, the last of which came in Round 16 when a two-vote performance saw him overtake Murphy into the lead. He was never headed from that point, despite not polling in the final five rounds – due in part to receiving a call-up to the senior Scorpions team for VFL Rounds 18 and 21.

McInerney was adjudged best-on-ground for his performances in a 12-point loss to Box Hill in Round 7, a 46-point win against Werribee in Round 11 and a 70-point victory over the Tigers in Round 15.

In an endorsement of his development this year, McInerney won a place in Casey's team for its senior Qualifying Final triumph over Footscray two weeks ago, when he recorded 12 disposals, 14 hitouts and a goal as back-up to no.1 ruckman Jake Spencer.

173cm **Murphy** kicked 14 goals in his second season on Box Hill's list, polling votes in seven of his 12 games. The 20-year-old also graduated to play three matches at senior level, improving upon his 13 appearances in the Development League in 2015.

Ong, 22, struggled for senior opportunities at Sandringham this year, playing only three games for the VFL Zebras after making 47 appearances from 2013-15. The 179cm livewire polled 14 votes in just 10 Development League games, including four best-on-ground performances – the most of any player.

VFL Semi Finals review

FOOTSCRAY 13.16 (94) d ESSENDON 10.15 (75)

In typical fashion, Footscray steamed home at North Port Oval to deny Essendon successive preliminary-final appearances and set up its own clash with Collingwood. The Bulldogs booted six goals to one in the final quarter – including three to X-factor forward Mitch Hannan – after trailing the Bombers by 18 points at the last change. Earlier, the Dogs kicked the first three majors of the game and went 16 points in front when Bailey Dale booted his third midway through the second term. Essendon responded with four unanswered goals either side of half time, a Sam Michael major to start the second half putting his team in front for the first time since the match's opening minutes. But inaccuracy in front of goal plagued the Bombers in the third quarter, with a return of 4.7 not enough to hold off a surging Footscray when it mattered.



WILLIAMSTOWN 14.11 (95) d SANDRINGHAM 7.7 (49)

The Seagulls advanced to their seventh consecutive preliminary final and 10th in the last 11 years with two bursts of brilliant football at North Port Oval. Scores were tight until a serious leg injury to Sandringham defender Jack Noone halted play early in the second quarter. When proceedings resumed, Williamstown kicked away from the Zebras with four unanswered goals – including Sam Dunell's third major – to take a 26-point lead into half time. After the Seagulls extended their advantage to 36 early in the third quarter, Sandringham rallied with three straight goals to cut the margin to 17 at the last change. But the reigning premiers were dominant late, midfielders Ben Jolley, Michael Gibbons and Willie Wheeler helping their team to a six-goal-to-one final stanza and a preliminary final date with the Casey Scorpions.

Another medal for Marcon



Richmond AFL rookie Adam Marcon continued his decorated VFL career by winning the club's Peter Jackson VFL best-and-fairest award, the Guinane Medal, recently.

The 24-year-old midfielder was delisted by the AFL Tigers shortly after the home-and-away season had concluded but polled 44 votes to be named VFL club champion ahead of VFL captain Sam Darley (38 votes) and AFL rookie Jason Castagna (36).

Marcon averaged 23 disposals, five tackles and four clearances per game in 15 matches for ninth-placed Richmond, forming a tough midfield core alongside AFL-listers Andrew Moore and Jacob Townsend, and VFL-listers Jacob Ballard and Tom Couch.

In 2012, he claimed the Northern Blues' best-and-fairest award and was selected in the VFL Team of the Year, later crossing to Williamstown where he won last year's Fothergill-Round Medal for the best VFL player under 23 as well as making the Team of the Year in 2014 and 2015.

Next Gen Academy noms

Four Peter Jackson VFL players of multicultural or indigenous backgrounds have been nominated by AFL clubs to be part of their Next Generation Academies ahead of the 2016 NAB AFL and Rookie Drafts.

AFL clubs will be able to automatically list a nominated player from their particular Academy zone as one of five Category B rookies if the player is overlooked by other clubs in both the AFL and Rookie Drafts. The AFL itself has also nominated 10 additional players who will be available to be listed by any club as Category B rookies if they also miss out at the drafts.

Essendon has nominated **Coburg's** prolific two-time VFL Team of the Year midfielder **Ozgur Uysal**, 24, as well as first-year **Northern Blues** goalkicking livewire **Hisham Kerbatieh**, 19. **Essendon VFL** 19-year-old **James El Moussalli** and **Sandringham** 22-year-old **Kenny Ong** were also nominations of the AFL.

1st PRELIMINARY FINAL

Casey Scorpions vs Williamstown

Sunday September 18, 2.40pm, North Port Oval

The Seagulls found their midfield mojo against Sandringham last week after being shut down by Collingwood's suffocating pressure in their Qualifying Final. Usual suspects Ben Jolley (41 disposals against the Zebras), Michael Gibbons (37) and Willie Wheeler (29) would have sent a timely reminder to the rested Scorpions of what the reigning premiers can do. Casey's centre-square crew is rather capable itself though, easily ranking first in the VFL for disposals per game and second only to Williamstown for contested possessions and clearances. Melbourne-listed ball-winners such as Jack Grimes, Viv Michie and Alex Neal-Bullen ran riot against Footscray two weeks ago, effectively implementing the handball-happy game plan that served the rising Demons so well in the AFL this year. Tackling pressure will be the key to determining who wins this midfield battle: Williamstown has shown it can be susceptible to high-pressuring opposition while Casey's quick-fire ball movement will give Williamstown tacklers Ed Carr and Sean Hetherington chances to cause panic. When these teams last met in Round 3 at Casey Fields, the Scorpions won more of the ball but lost by 44 points as the Seagulls laid 96 tackles. Indeed, the team that can best escape congestion and deliver clean entries inside 50 to mobile forwards such as Sam Dunell (Williamstown) and Tim Smith (Casey) will go a long way towards securing a Grand Final berth.

2nd PRELIMINARY FINAL

Collingwood vs Footscray

Saturday September 17, 2.40pm, North Port Oval

The Magpies had better be prepared to do battle for a full four quarters, as the Bulldogs have regularly shown they're never beaten until the final siren sounds this year. A case in point was last week's Semi Final against Essendon, when Footscray came from three goals down at the last change to prevail by 19 points on the back of Mitch Hannan's three final-term majors, Jordan Russell's sterling defensive performance and Mitch Honeychurch's relentless effort in the middle. Just two weeks prior, the Bulldogs snapped Collingwood's 12-match winning streak by recovering from a 21-point quarter-time deficit to seal their top-four spot with a 32-point triumph at VU Whitten Oval. Since then, Footscray has lost vice-captain Mark Austin to a serious knee injury and the Magpies their tough mid-forward Ben Moloney to a broken leg. Moloney (12 tackles) was one of the players who pressured Williamstown into submission in their Qualifying Final, along with Brent Macaffer (12 tackles) and unheralded VFL-listers Nick Gray (eight) and Gus Borthwick (eight). The Bulldogs will need the likes of Jed Adcock and Liam Nash to match that intensity to ensure Collingwood tall targets Corey Gault, Jarrod Witts and Lachlan Howe (three goals against the Seagulls) can't dominate the air inside 50 – because up the other end, Footscray's relatively small forward line will have to contend with star interceptor Ryan Pendlebury and rebounder Jordan Kelly.

The Box Hill Hawks Development League team gets another chance for redemption on Sunday.

The Hawks have been on the wrong end of the last four Development League Grand Final results, falling to Coburg in 2012 and then losing three straight deciders to Williamstown from 2013-15 – including two decided by golden points.

Indeed, Box Hill has a rich recent history at the pointy end of Development League seasons – it took home the 2009, 2010 and 2011 flags, and also lost another Grand Final in 2008.

The Casey Scorpions, meanwhile, haven't tasted Development League success since 1995 when the club was called Springvale. There's no question their 2016 VFL list boasts remarkable depth thanks to the rapid progression of Melbourne's AFL-listed youngsters as well as smart recruiting of VFL-listed talent. But whether they have the experience to overcome the Development League's hardened perennial contenders is another question altogether. The last time these teams met in the Semi Final

two weeks ago, the Hawks demonstrated why they finished three games clear on top of the ladder by defeating the second-placed Scorpions to the tune of 92 points.

Current Development League leading goalkicker **Jake Summers** booted five goals that day, while Box Hill senior team regulars **Nick Evans** and **Sam Switkowski** as well as first-year talent **Anthony Brolic** were particularly influential. **James Freeman** kicked three of Casey's seven majors and **Yarran Jaffer-Williams** continued his exciting run of form towards the end of the season, but few others could help stem the tide.

In last week's Preliminary Final, **Bayley Fritsch's** four goals along with strong performances from first-year Scorpion **Aloysio Ferreira** and big man **Jordan Moncrieff** helped Casey climb over Williamstown by six points, denying the Seagulls a chance at four consecutive Development League premierships. That win is sure to give the Scorpions added confidence this week, as will their competitive losses to the Hawks by 12 points in Round 7 and by 20 points in Round 21.

It's difficult to ignore the magnitude of Box Hill's Semi Final triumph though – just as it's tough to forget how successful the club has been in this competition for a long time now.

TAC Cup Semi Finals review

The Dragons knocked the minor premiers out of the finals in straight sets and advanced to a preliminary final against the Geelong Falcons by controlling play throughout the contest at IKON Park. Sandringham put the first three goals on the board before Sam Fowler scored Dandenong's opening major on the quarter-time siren. A Josh Battle goal brought the Stingrays closer early in the second term, but the Dragons answered with the next three – including two of Tom Maloney's four goals for the game – to take a 24-point lead into half time. Fowler bagged his second major within a minute of the restart before a Sandringham midfield led by Corey Lyons, Will Setterfield and Tim Taranto took over the game, dominating possession and kicking goals with ruthless efficiency.

The Chargers reached their fifth preliminary final in six years – this time against the Murray Bushrangers – by knocking a top-four team out of the finals in straight sets for the second season running. Oakleigh went 18 points ahead of the Rebels with a Josh Daicos goal entering time-on of the final quarter at IKON Park, but answering goals to Hasker Dawborn and Lachlan Huppatz kept the Chargers on edge until the final siren. Earlier, Shannon Beks booted North Ballarat's first three goals and threatened to blow the game apart before Oakleigh's Dion Johnstone (three majors) helped his team to a four-goal run during the third term that established a 14-point lead at the last change. It proved a gap slightly too big for the Rebels to overcome.

Multicultural additions to AFL Academy

Three TAC Cup players from multicultural backgrounds have been added to the 2017 NAB AFL Academy squads.

The initial announcement of the 2017 Academy squads was made last month, but the AFL has opened up two extra spots in both the Level One (bottom-age players in 2017) and Level Two (top-age) squads for multicultural prospects to achieve a more diverse group.

Gippsland Power 17-year-old **Changkuoth Jiath** will join the Level Two group after playing 10 TAC Cup games in 2016, while **Murray Bushrangers** under-16 prospect **Ajak Dang** and **Western Jets** youngster **Buku Khamis** have been called into the Level One squad.

Next Gen Academy noms

18 TAC Cup players of multicultural or indigenous backgrounds have been nominated by AFL clubs to be part of their Next Generation Academies ahead of the 2016 NAB AFL and Rookie Drafts.

AFL clubs will be able to automatically list a nominated player from their particular Academy zone as one of five Category B rookies if the player is overlooked by other clubs in both the AFL and Rookie Drafts. The AFL itself has also nominated 10 additional players who will be available to be listed by any club as Category B rookies if they also miss out at the drafts.

Stats that mattered in the Semi Finals

Stats Central examines which stats influenced the results of last week's Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup Semi Finals.

VFL

FOOTSCRAY *d* ESSENDON

Footscray's 19-point triumph was built on stopping Essendon's forwards from scoring. The Bombers certainly had enough chances to do so, their midfield helping send the ball inside 50 on 63 occasions but only kicking 10 goals (a conversion rate of 16 per cent). The Bulldogs, meanwhile, managed a goal 30 per cent of the time they went forward (13 goals from 43 inside-50s), thanks mostly to the opportunist efforts of **Bailey Dale** and **Mitch Hannan** (three goals each). Their real match-winners were stationed down back though, with **Jordan Russell** (10 marks, 14 rebound-50s), **Fletcher Roberts** (nine marks, five rebound-50s) and **Bailey Williams** (eight marks, five rebound-50s) controlling the air and running the ball back out of danger.

WILLIAMSTOWN *d* SANDRINGHAM

It's been their calling card all season and the Seagulls again dominated the midfield battle in their 46-point victory. Not for the first time in 2016, a defeated opposition will be having nightmares following an encounter with **Ben Jolley** (41 disposals, 22 contested possessions, 10 clearances), **Michael Gibbons** (37 disposals, 19 contested possessions, 11 clearances), **Willie Wheeler** (29 disposals, eight inside-50s, seven clearances) and **Nick Meese** (16 disposals, 38 hitouts, six clearances). The likes of Sandringham on-ballers Tom Curren, Jack Sinclair and Luke Verma were simply unable to match the star foursome, with the Zebras losing the disposal count by 64, contested possessions by 52, clearances by 18 and inside-50s by 27.

TAC Cup

SANDRINGHAM DRAGONS *d* DANDENONG STINGRAYS

Sandringham maintained a stranglehold on time in possession during its 61-point victory. The Stingrays essentially kept up with their opponents in the contests, but once the Dragons gained control of the ball they rarely gave it up, recording 148 more uncontested possessions than Dandenong. 18 Sandringham players had more than 10 uncontested possessions compared to just four Stingrays, with **Jack Scrimshaw** (25 disposals, 19 uncontested possessions), **Liam Murphy** (24, 19), **Tim Taranto** (28, 18), **Andrew McGrath** (27, 18) and **Reuben Hayward** (25, 18) the chief ball hogs who Dandenong just couldn't get a hand on.

They won the clearance count by eight, and if it wasn't for Oakleigh's **Vincent Adduci** (24 disposals, four clearances), **Ed Phillips** (24, four) and **Campbell Lane** (32, three) evening things up at the stoppages, this result could've been different.

- 2009 **Bendigo Pioneers** draftee **Dustin Martin**, a 2016 All Australian who established himself as an elite ball-winning inside midfielder for Richmond;
- 2011 **Gippsland Power** graduate **Sam Docherty**, who enjoyed a break-out season as an intercepting, rebounding half-back in his third year at Carlton;
- 2010 **Dandenong Stingrays** key forward **Tom Lynch**, a 2016 All Australian who kicked 66 goals for Gold Coast to secure back-to-back club champion awards; and
- 2013 **Sandringham Dragons** draftee **Zach Merrett**, who enjoyed a prolific season in Essendon's depleted midfield and captained the Bombers to victory over Gold Coast in Round 21.

Milestones for Mummy and Hartigan

Former VFL players Shane Mumford and Kyle Hartigan brought up milestones in the first week of AFL finals.

Mumford, 30, played his 150th game in GWS' Qualifying Final triumph over Sydney, having been originally selected from the **Geelong VFL** team at pick no.57 in the 2007 Rookie Draft by Geelong's AFL operation.

The combative ruckman played 21 games over two seasons with the Cats before being traded to Sydney, where he played 79 games – including the 2012 premiership victory – from 2010-13. Mumford then crossed to the Giants for the 2014 season, where he has played 50 games and become an integral part of the club's developing on-ball division, also winning a best-and-fairest award in 2014.

Hartigan, 24, played his 50th game in Adelaide's Elimination Final defeat of North Melbourne after being taken by the Crows with pick no.14 in the 2012 Rookie Draft from **Werribee**.

The key defender was a state representative and named in the VFL Team of the Year earlier in 2012, his third season with the Tigers after missing out in the 2009 AFL drafts as an 18-year-old. Hartigan has established himself as a reliable second tall backman behind Adelaide's no.1 defender Daniel Talia.

For the first time, the V/Line Cup will encompass both the Under 15 Boys and Youth Girls divisions, replacing the previously known Youth Girls Shield competition.

Now in its twelfth year as the official naming rights partner of the carnival, V/Line has contributed extensively in providing the opportunity for young players to challenge themselves against the best in their age group across regional Victoria.

With over 42,000 females lacing up the boots in 2015 across the state, AFL Victoria CEO Steven Reaper said it was great to have V/Line extend its support to one of the fastest growing sports in the country.

"In 2016 alone, around 100 new female teams have been established across the state, which is a positive indication for a strong future at a national level when the inaugural AFL women's league commences next season," Reaper said.

"With V/Line's support, we are now able to deliver a joint competition that provides opportunities for both males and females just as we have with the Peter Jackson VFL/ Swisse VFL Women's and the Herald Sun Shield competitions."

After the successful introduction of the V/Line Cup to regional Victoria last year, more than 3,000 participants are expected to flock to Latrobe City Council when the four-day carnival kicks off on September 26-29.

In 2016, the V/Line Cup has grown to include nine girls' teams and 14 boys' sides from across regional Victoria.

For many competing at this year's carnival, WorkSafe AFL Victoria Country's premier junior regional championships will be a stepping stone to AFL Victoria's mainstream talent pathway, the TAC Cup.

In addition the V/Line Cup also provides an important development pathway for young umpires, with all field umpires at the Championships members of the V/Line Umpire Academy.

V/Line Chief Operating Officer Carol-Anne Nelson said they were excited to support the future of women's football.

"We are thrilled to extend our sponsorship of the V/Line Cup to include the Youth Girls division and are proud that we can be part of this revolutionary time in women's football."

Generating an estimated \$2.1 million in economic benefit to the Latrobe City region last year, the opportunity to host the 2017-18 V/Line Cup will be opened to other regions following the 2016 event.

All applications to host the event will be assessed by an AFL Victoria committee in the coming months, with the successful applicant notified at the end of October.

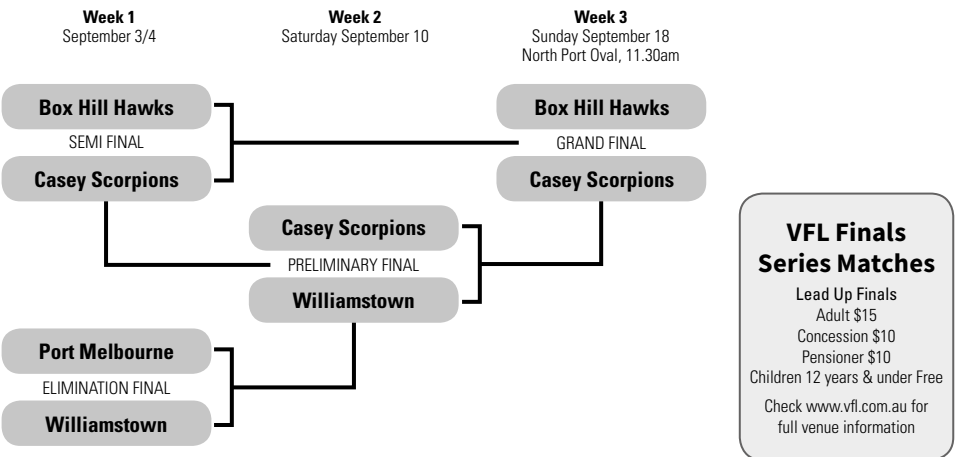

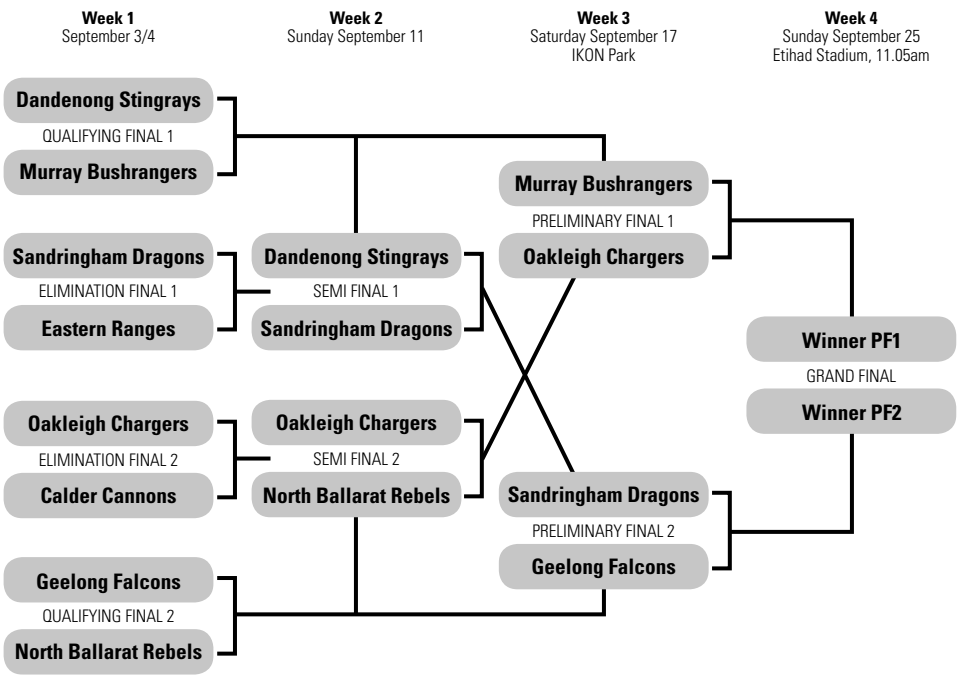
