# **President's Report 2015**

2015 had some successes and a disappointing relegation of the senior team on goal difference. The Committee was able to secure \$200,000 in funding to fix the change rooms at Balfe Park to use it as a match day venue. In the future, we will seek further support towards improvement to the pitch and lights at Balfe Park. We expect the project to start in February 2016 and be completed by April.

This year we welcomed Ausnet as a new major sponsorship and hope that we can make this a long term and valuable partnership. Our relationship with Melbourne Victory saw our kids being involved in Victory games. We thank Melbourne Victory for their active support of our club.

We signed an MOU with Moreland City Football Club, who are a local NPL club, to act as a community club for them. This has seen some players move between the two clubs. The NPL is still creating a fairly unstable environment with kids moving to and moving from NPL clubs. The Committee believe that as a community club Brunswick Zebras must continue to provide opportunities for all at modest costs. This means improving both our facilities and ensuring we provide good coaching. The majority of coaches at our club are now parents or former players and it is important we invest in their development.

The current committee continues to see the Zebras primarily as a community club with a mission to promote football and well-being. The committee has worked to ensure that teams were competitive, grounds were available and any potential conflict was dealt with quickly.

The Committee comprised a mixture of experienced and new members. In particular I want to recognise the invaluable work done by the committee and highlight the particular contributions of: Robyn Thomas as a new secretary and member of the committee, she has dealt with an overwhelming workload and still is a friendly face at the club; Theo Zafiropoulos has ensured the canteen worked and our uniforms were ordered; Sean Farrell for his work, especially with the refugee families, and his calming influence; Rob Barrese for doing the financial records; Maria Berry for adding some rigour and professionalism into the committee work.

Thanks to all the volunteers, team managers, coaches, players and all the people that make it possible to field teams. We are a club with a justifiably proud reputation for sportsmanship.

Next year we will be spending money on Balfe Park and providing more support and resources for coaching development.

The current committee will continue into 2016 as we were elected for two years. The Committee has recently co-opted Angelo Vocisano, Kevin Thomas and John Deininger to provide more support and in particular to ensure we have strong representation from the junior boys component of the club. We are a large club with a strong presence in both girls and boys junior football. Our senior teams are competitive and moderately ambitious.
