THE Scanlon name returns to the Mid SE and the Glencoe Oval this afternoon when Frazer Scanlon *(pictured right)* takes the helm of the Mount Burr United Football Club.

After a bye in round one, the 20 other Mozzies will be keen to make Scanlon's first foray into our league a successful one.

His late father Phil Scanlon had a long association with the Murphies but sentiment will be set aside today.

The Mt Burr brains trust had a close look at the Murphies at Kalangadoo a week ago and would have pinpointed their strengths and weaknesses.

It was the superior speed of the Magpies which earned them victory and this should also give the greenand-gold visitors the winning edge today.

Robe is a better team than in 2013 but so too are Kalangadoo.

The Magpies would have been on cloud nine after their opening round win over the Murphies but they will come to earth with a thud today if their colours are lowered by the Roosters.

The seaside oval will suit the likes of speedy Tom Williams who is back home from Adelaide after completing a degree in media and marketing.

Prior to last week, his last game for Kalangadoo had been its narrow loss to Mt Burr in the 2009 grand final at Hatherleigh.

Kalangadoo must win matches such as these to be considered a force this season.

Nangwarry put up a respectable effort against Hatherleigh but it fell well short of victory.

If it is repeated today at home against Port MacDonnell, the result will be the same.

The Saints have to maximise their

scoring opportunities and maintain the momentum for four quarters.

In any case, the Demons are warm favourites.

The match at Tigerland between cross-town rivals Hatherleigh and Tantanoola will be a bewdy.

The red-and-whites pulled off an upset win at this venue in the final minor round match of 2013.

They had the incentive of securing a finals' berth whereas their opponents were already assured of playing in the second semi final.

With Glen Gascoyne in attack, I reckon the result will go Tantanoola's way.

ROUND ONE REVIEW

I PICKED the card in round one and, despite the final scores, all four games were entertaining.

I reckon I had the pick of the contests when I saw the Magpies hold off the Murphies at Kalangadoo.

Neither team was at full strength and both showed enough class, fitness and talent to indicate they are worthy of major round contention.

It has been a while since the black-and-whites have been described as a quick side but, as I have said before, that gave them the winning edge.

With his SANFL experience, new coach Ben Mules is obviously stressing the importance of moving the ball with speed and precision. Both Kongorong and Tantanoola

showed enough in their match to give heart to their supporters.

Booting lots of goals always delights the fans and this match had 33 of them.

The game at the Bay was onesided but Robe matched Port Mac after the long break.

The Roosters look to be a five goal better team than 2013 but the Demons still look to be the early season premiership favourites. The loss of Josh Ransom is

significant.

Nangwarry did not want a big ground and a hot day in round one but that is what they got at Hatherleigh.

The Saints matched it with the



Eagles for three quarters and then the reigning premiers really found their rhythm.

I can recommend their brew and

Des will be happy to also tell you about the times in the early 1970s when he coached the Murphies for a couple of seasons.

Much of his career was spent as a 300 gamer with Penola when the Eagles played in the Western Border.

TIDY UP TIME

ONE of the Mid SE constitutional matters which was tidied up over the summer was to state the names of the nine clubs in the competition.

Eagle-eyed observers would have noticed that the name of the Tarpeena Football Club was thus removed by a vote of the club delegates at the annual general meeting.

For the first time since the 1940s, there is no reference to Tarpeena in the constitution of the Mid SE.

For the past decade, the Mid SE has regarded Tarpeena as being "in recess".

It had taken a brief break from the Mid SE in 2000 and returned for three more seasons.

Its 'second coming' as the Tarpeena Kangaroos was short-lived as only eight games were won over the course of the 2001, 2002 and 2003 seasons.

By the end of last year, it was obvious to all in the Mid SE that

a 'third coming' was not going to happen and the executive committee put the wheels in motion for this to be reflected in the constitution.

Just last Saturday Tarpeena's last church held its final service.

Over 60 people farewelled the Tarpeena Community Church and the closure was prompted by an infestation of white ants.

The Tarpeena Primary School and the service station are also no longer open but brighter days are ahead for the Tarpeena Mill with major capital investment

I think Tarpeena still have a netball team in the second-tier competition staged in Mount Gambier.

It is hard to explain exactly what sent the Tarpeena Football Club into oblivion.

The reasons are evident at other footy clubs around the nation and include a declining population, lack of on-field success, financial challenges and a shortage of volunteers to do the many jobs week-in and week-out.

Of course, Tarpeena still remains very much in the record books of the Mid SE including the A Grade premiership years of 1961 and 1974.

That last A Grade premiership side under captain/coach Dennis Mansell was dominant as it clocked up 17 wins, two losses and one tie over the minor and major rounds.

Players like Garry Pitt, Terry Howe and Joe Campbell were to the fore.

The very last premiership side of the Canaries came at the Bay 20 years ago when the Cliff Robinsoncoached Senior Colts team completed an undefeated season.

These 1974 and 1994 successes were recalled at a reunion at the clubrooms of the Tarpeena Football Club last Saturday night.

You can be sure that many past feats were fondly recalled.

As an example, the remarkable Mansell brothers played over 1,000 games in the "brown and gold colours" and are life members of the Mid SE.

We welcome them each year to the Mid SE junior medal count

as Ken, Peter (senior) and Dennis have proudly presented the Junior Colts Best and Fairest Medal which bears their name each year since 1978 when the first winner was Hatherleigh's Steve Hample.

I never saw Tarpeena play in a major round but I did witness some outstanding feats on the footy field.

Andy Gray would be my choice of second ruck in my Mid SE All Star team and there has never been a more lion-hearted player in my 32 years of involvement with this league.

The way Andy recovered from serious burns was an inspiration and he was a gentleman on and off the field.

Zeb Bonney (now sadly deceased) played league footy with Glenelg and also had a brief spell with Tarpeena.

In one home game against an allpowerful Mt Burr lineup, he singlehandedly took the Mozzies apart.

He played the best half of footy that I have ever seen in the Mid SE.

Arguably, the best home-grown player from Tarpeena was Darren Mansell who went on to play more than 100 games for Glenelg when they were a force in the SANFL.

Darren played one season with Penola and he was invariably referred to as "the ex-Penola boy" in the write-ups by the city press.

Over the years, Tarpeena had some high-profile coaches including Footscray legend Gary Lazarus, ANZ banker and former Sturt player Mark Heinrich, goalkicking legend Michael "Whale" Timms and current Kalangadoo A Grade ruckman Tim Brennan.

Even long-time Nangwarry Football Club president Shane "Plugger" Ploenges was at the helm of the Canaries in the mid-1980s.

There are a few ex-Tarpeena players like Tim Brennan about the footy fields of the South East and Western Border but their number is dwindling.

Most have long hung up their boots.

There may still be a Tarpeena Football Club but it is no longer affiliated with the MSEFL.

Thanks for the memories.






