THE blockbuster match today is at the Bay where the Mount Burr Mozzies come to play.

Today is also the final day of a highly successful professional lobster season for 2013/14.

You can expect that the visitors won't be keen on surrendering their unbeaten status but they need to curb Will Macdonald and occasional Mount Burr cricketer Dylan Bromley.

Unless a major form reversal occurs, neither Hatherleigh nor Glencoe will maintain the major round ranking these teams enjoyed in 2013.

ROUND SEVEN REVIEW

There was some unhappy reading of the results in the Western Border where the 'top three' met the 'bottom three'.

The closest result was decided by more than 15 goals and the average difference was 100 points.

Back in the Mid SE, Port Mac skipper Will Macdonald deserved to poll five Mail Medal votes in a dominant display at Kalangadoo.

Hatherleigh was still at Mount Burr's heels until well into the third term but could not sustain the

pressure.

Kongorong showed at Glencoe that a win is not too far away while the Tantanoola brigade should have been happy with a 41 point win at Robe.

LAST OPPORTUNITY

THIS is my last opportunity to wish senior coach Jeff Medhurst and his Mid SE side well as they prepare for the inaugural zone carnival at Mount Gambier's Vansittart Park in a week from now.

I don't expect there to be many changes to the lion-hearted team (should that be Lyon-hearted?) which did us proud a fortnight ago at Tintinara.

Without telling the coach and co-selector Shane Ploenges exactly what to do, I hope they give strong preference to the 22 who made themselves available.

Next week's team will expand to 23 and have at least five players aged under 23.

Meanwhile, the game against the Mallee Football League has been run and won a fortnight ago and here are some sidelights.

He was loyal to the Mid SE and thought we would win by 27 points and achieve a 97 point turnaround on the 2013 result.

The Mallee League held off a fast finishing Mid South East to win their A Grade Interleague clash at Tintinara by 17 points.

In a high scoring match on a big oval the MSE big marking forwards had an impact in the last term but the Mallee side were able to keep their nose in front until the final siren.

The game looked like being a shoot-out in the first term with Mallee kicking 6.3 to MSE 6 goals straight.

Trevor Rigney was leading well at full forward and kicked 4 goals for the quarter for Mallee.

The second term was again even with Mallee holding a 6 point lead at half time.

MSE captain Clinton Gallio was having a big impact in the midfield and Mallee's Jarran Crabb did an excellent job of curbing his influence when moved onto him midway through the term.

Mallee added 7 goals in the third term to MSE 3 goals and held a 5 goal break at the last change.

Jarred Graetz showed an enormous work rate at centre half forward with the clever skills of Corey Knight and Hayden Thorpe having an impact.

Patrick Barrett was dominant all day on a wing and Patrick Gabb used his height to advantage in the ruck.

Ty Bennetts came into the game in the midfield and his impact gave Mallee the edge.

MSE came back in the last term with Alexander Lyon, who marked everything that came near him all day and Glen Gascoyne proving difficult to contain.

Josh Keller showed his class and steadied the Mallee side and Rigney finished the day with 8 goals.

Ty Bennetts was named best on ground by the umpires while Trevor Rigney was awarded the Leighton Huxtable Medal by the Mallee coaches.

BROTHERS IN ARMS AT KONGORONG

WITH finals a rarity and premierships even scarcer, the Kongorong Football Club hasn't had much to celebrate in recent decades.

The Mid South East Hawks are currently eighth on the nine team ladder, but facing a "winnable" game at home against Robe (7th) today.

One factor Kongorong can already celebrate occurred last weekend when one third of its starting XVIII were made up of two sets of brothers.

The Saffin brothers, Bronson, Kallin and Taylor were selected in the Hawks senior side for the first time in their careers, while the Phillips siblings, Dwayne, Jason and Shaun have experienced that

thrill before after enjoying time with East Gambier in the Western Border before crossing to the Mid South East for the start of the 2013 season.

Bronson is one of the most recognisable faces in the MSE having been a regular interleague representative and in 2011 shared honours with Port MacDonnell ruckman, Will Macdonald in the league's Mail Medal best and fairest award.

At age 28, Bronson is the elder of the three Saffin brothers with Kallin 25 and Taylor, the junior at just 17 and fresh out of Senior Colts ranks.

The Phillips boys are evenly spaced apart in terms of age with Dwayne (24), Jason (22) and

Shaun (20).

Proud parents, David and Jenny Saffin and David and Janet Phillips were trackside last week to watch their offspring in action, but unfortunately couldn't get the Hawks over the line against Glencoe.

It was Kongorong's sixth successive loss this season and reaching the finals is getting more difficult with each round completed.

Kongorong has not won a premiership since 1988 and in the 26 year interim, the Hawks have only contested five finals series, 1990 (3rd), 1991 (4th), 2001 (4th), 2002 (4th) and 2004 (4th).
