



MOUNT BURR v KALANGADOO

RUCKMEN win games and this is why I think Kalangadoo will inflict the first loss on Mount Burr in 2014.

The Magpies have the luxury of interleague rep Jon Mules at the centre bounces and he can be backed up by the likes of James Pratt and Tim Brennan.

Perhaps triple Mail Medallist Brian Casey might return from injury today?

Who is there among the Burr boys to help Nick Morrison?

Ever since ex-skipper Pete Agnew opted to play (and work and surf) at Robe, the Mossies look vulnerable in this area.

There are not many options.

Up until the end of 2012, Dylan Gamble was a back-up but he has since gone to Glenelg in the SANFL.

Ex-coach Adam Wiese was coaxed out of retirement a year ago but it won't happen again in 2014.

Justin Nowak skippered a Mount Burr premiership side 14 years ago but seldom plays A Grade nowadays.

Millicent teenage recruit Henry Walshaw lacks experience, coach Frazer Scanlon and Matt Lesslie are injured, Matt Wallis is now playing in New South Wales with 2010/11 premiership coach Mark Kruger, Chris Murray is needed in attack and Taylor Redden is not tall but has had some success as a ruckman.

The Mossies have a fine on-ball division in Tom Renzi, Jonny Agnew and skipper Clint Gallio.

They can shark the ball off opposing ruckmen but this is not the answer.

There are still a few weeks until the clearance deadline and I will be watching the MSEFL website until 11.55pm on June 30 to see if the Burr boys go searching for a back-up to Morrison.

"Whatever it takes" is heard in sporting circles and it might take a loss today to jolt Mount Burr into action.

When the visitors enter the Mt Burr clubrooms for post-match refreshments, they will see the Harry Bott Memorial Shield still on the wall and where it has been since 2011.

The shield is contested once a year and it honours the memory of the late

Kalangadoo Football Club president and Mt Burr storekeeper.

I reckon it will be going home with the Magpies tonight.

ROBE v HATHERLEIGH

THIS is another danger game for the reigning premiers as Robe are a team capable of many surprises.

There was a lot to like in Hatherleigh's big win over Glencoe in round eight and the Eagle attack functioned well after almost two months in the doldrums.

Whoever wins today is still in with a chance of playing in the major round.

It all depends if the top six Roosters can perform at the top of their games and I speak of coach Dylan Coxon, Nick Cane, Jakob Woods, Pete Agnew, Jaryd Dawson and John Dunn.

The Eagles have a more even spread of talent and their 'bottom six' is impressive.

I reckon the home ground advantage will get the seaiders across the line.

GLENCOE v PORT MACDONNELL

THIS will be the day that all realistic hopes of a Murphy premiership in 2014 will come to an end.

I expect the Demons will recover from their disappointing loss to Mount Burr on May 31 and come away with the premiership points and quite easily at that.

Josh Ransom is another few weeks away from resuming while the Demons are still waiting on Tim Sullivan (Under 18 State team commitments), Brad Stephens and Lachy Pratt to return.

Skipper and triple Mail Medallist Will Macdonald hurt his shoulder in the first of the interleague matches a week ago.

It remains to be seen if he will play today.

The Murphies look as strong as they are going to be in 2014 and they will reach the half-way mark of the season with just three wins.

The race for the flag will contract by one after today.

It may be mathematically possible for Glencoe to reach the finals but I doubt it will happen.

NANGWARRY v KONGORONG

ONE of these teams will get to sing their victory song this afternoon and have something to cheer about at the half-way mark of the minor round.

The other will be outright bottom, have a sour percentage and favouritism for the wooden spoon.

Coming into this season, I really did not think that these two teams would be winless at the end of round eight.

For possibly the last time, may I just say it was a disappointing programming decision to put reigning wooden spooners Nangwarry up against the 2013 grand finalists to commence this season.

The MSEFL club delegates approved the 2014 draw and responsibility lies entirely with them.

The Saints were shell-shocked by their drubbings in round one and two and have not really recovered.

It is a similar story with Kongorong.

They have played some good first quarters, some impressive second quarters, some outstanding third quarters and some terrific last quarters.

The trouble is that they have had more than two winning quarters per game in 2014 and that is why they share with Nangwarry the same unhappy zip-seven tally sheet.

You can expect that ex-Hawk Tyson Ploenges will get some special attention from his former team mates.

INTERLEAGUE

WHAT are we to make of last week's inaugural South East zone team carnival?

Well, I reckon it was a good day as the Mid SE tasted success at both underage and senior level.

Our senior team was not too flash against the Western Border but could hardly be faulted against the KNTFL.

Well done to coach Jeff Medhurst and his team.

My association with Vansittart Park dates back to 1968 and there are few venues in country SA which are better.

The new lights are first-class but let us not forget that they were purchased as a guilty gesture by the Labor State Government after they sold the pine forests harvesting rights for tuppence.

Hats off to Scott Duncan, Ian Perryman (SANFL) and David Heard (Western Border) for taking care of all the administrative arrangements in such a good fashion.

The day ran smoothly due to their efforts.

It was hard to judge the crowd numbers as the wet and cold day kept many people inside their cars.

I thought the crowd could have been improved by greater support from Mid SE clubs.

At the post-match presentations, I was pleased to hear Murray South East coach Luke Duncan read out the names of eight Mid SE players in the training squad.

They have been invited to train for the annual SA Country Championships in

Kadina next month.

In years gone by, the Mid SE has only had about two players in this team and I am confident the number will be much higher in 2014.

One of the least surprises is that the Western Border Football League yet again got an armchair ride from the regional football administrators.

The venue was Vansittart Park and this bestowed a definite home ground advantage as four North Gambier players were in the WBFL side.

Others such as WBFL skipper Steve Duldig, of Millicent, would have played there about 20 times in his career.

Compare that to the Mid SE guys and you might find that Bay boy Ben McGregor may have played at Vansittart Park six times during his spell with South Gambier.

Other Mid SE players with WB experience would have had far less exposure than Ben.

The disadvantage was even more pronounced for the players from the KNTFL.

Secondly, the draw heavily favoured the WBFL as it appears it was designed for them to have the maximum amount of recovery time between their two qualifying matches and the last fixture of the day.

The league with the least amount of recovery time was the KNTFL.

The Mid SE has occasionally been treated as the poor relation by the regional football administrators.

Let us not forget that we have been snubbed in terms of AFL and SANFL fixtures on our ovals and towns for more than a quarter of a century.

You have to go back to March, 1989 to the Foundation Cup match at Robe when Port Adelaide played Glenelg.

Ever since, all the AFL trial games, training games and SANFL trials have been played on grounds and towns in the KNTFL and the WBFL.

I cannot see this situation changing in the near future as the precious pups in the AFL won't leave their super duper venues to play in the sticks.

In the meantime, we can begin planning for the 2015 South East zone championships.

There will be a lot of work to do but the host Mid SE club stands to gain a fair bit of revenue from booth and canteen sales as well as a gate raffle.

It has been a long time since Tantanoola hosted an interleague match while I don't think one has ever been played at Nangwarry.

SOUTH EAST ZONE CARNIVAL REPORT

AFTER much anticipation, Senior and Under 17 teams from the three South East leagues assembled at Mount Gambier's Vansittart Park for the inaugural South East Zone Carnival on Saturday.

The MSEFL Under 17 team was first up to kick the dew off the grass, against host league Western Border. The playing surface was extremely slippery and soft, with both teams finding it hard to keep their feet. The MSEFL boys were able to match the much stronger, faster WBFL in general play however were unable to find any forward targets. The second half was a much more even affair with WBFL having a greater forward efficiency rate and coming away with a hard fought 4 goal win.

The boys had a bit of a break before coming up against the KNTFL, who had earlier also lost to WBFL, providing a chance for MSEFL to have another crack at them in the final if they could come away with a win. In a true wet weather game both sides battled hard to move the ball with any great efficiency. The MSEFL midfield were clearly on top of their opponents and the defence stood up strongly as KNTFL continually pushed forward. MSEFL kicked their only goal for the half from their only forward entry, but this was enough to claim victory and a spot in the final against WBFL.

WBFL came out all guns blazing in the final, displaying a high level of skill, continually hitting targets and moving the ball with precision. In contrast the MSEFL boys were second to the ball and struggled to gain any forward momentum. To the boys' credit they continued to battle hard all game and were able to restrict the scoring opportunities of WBFL in the second half. Best player votes were cast over the four games played by the Under 17s with Sam Zeitz being awarded best player, Kyall McClean runner-up and Bradley Mitchell third.

The Seniors kicked off their competition also against host league Western Border and despite controlling our fair share of play were unable to apply any scoreboard pressure, with WBFL having a far greater forward efficiency rate. WBFL forwards were adapting better to the conditions, whilst at the other end of the ground the MSEFL were struggling without a dominate forward presence, finally going down by 36 points.

In the second preliminary match, MSEFL came up against KNTFL who had

earlier beaten the WBFL. MSEFL made the most of their opportunities kicking towards the scoring end in the first half and with the wet weather conditions suiting our style of play we were far more efficient. Our forward structure was effective in creating a number of scoring opportunities and despite KNTFL kicking two late goals, MSEFL still held a slender 1 goal lead going into the break. During the second half MSEFL were able to kick two goals into the wind and despite KNTFL having the majority of play in their forward 50 the defence of MSEFL were able to apply the necessary pressure to the ball carrier to cause missed opportunities and scoring shots and hang on for a hard fought win.

With all three leagues winning one match each, MSEFL missed out on playing the final by percentage. Over the two games, Ben Mules was named best player for MSEFL with Jack Dawe picking up the MSEFL best under 21 player award.

This was played Monday morning, where an impressive performance saw the girls beat Port Augusta before bowing out in the semi finals against the Riverland team.


The 15 & Under team had a smoother run with wins against Port Augusta, Mid West and Mid Hills
