## ROUND TEN PREVIEW

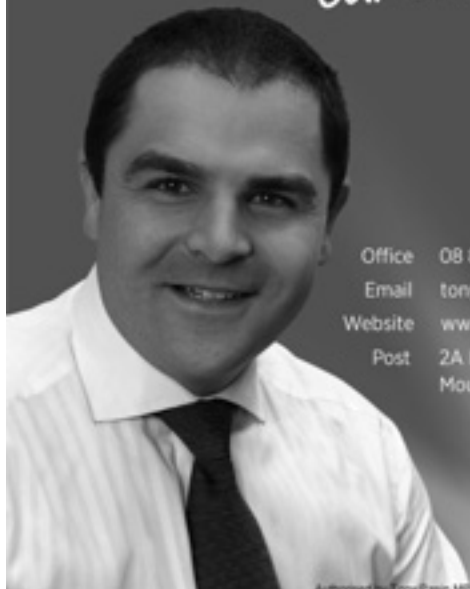

## BLOW THE WHISTLE

One other issue that has raised its ugly head of late is the fact that a few runners and water boys are under the misunderstanding that they can control fights, order around opposition players and generally stand around coaching players. Under no circumstances are runners or water boys to abuse, interfere with or touch an opposition player or official. If we are not careful the day will come when a runner or water boy will be on the wrong end of a fist and then it will be too late. Runners and water boys are also reminded that getting in the way of an opposing player whilst in the vicinity of the ball will result in a free kick to the opposition. No runners or water boys are allowed in the fifty metre zone when a player is kicking in after a point has been scored.

Not too much in the way of rumours from my umpiring mates at present but one George Street rumour suggests that the Tigers may have received an early birthday gift with a very big man possibly returning to the club. 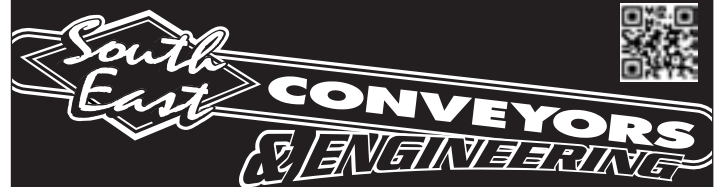
