ROUND 12 PREVIEW

Robe versus Mount Burr

THE Roosters return home today with heavy legs and brown-stained jumpers after playing on the heavy Kalangadoo Oval.

It would have taken copious amounts of Napisan to get the

seasiders' jumpers pearly white again but the recovery from a hard slog might be much harder.

On the other hand, the Mozzies might be suffering from leather poison as they booted 18 goals on a not-so-boggy "Mick" and Jean Walker Oval.

The Burr Boys had interleague representative Brodie Hennink back on the oval as the injury he sustained in the big loss to Kalangadoo on June 14 was not that serious.

Ex-preiership skipper Justin "Horrie" Nowak is back in A Grade while another rucking option in Bill Lowndes has just resumed in the Reserves.

Perhaps the visitors may use Nowak and Lowndes and regular ruckman Nick Morrison in a bid to curb the influence of in-form Robe coach Dylan Coxon.

If the Mozzies can't win at the seaside, then they don't deserve to be in top spot.

Nangwarry versus Kalangadoo

THERE won't be too much pretty or flashy footy being played at Nangwarry today but you can be assured the Saints will be striving for their breakthrough win for 2014.

The undermanned home team will give a much better account of themselves than in the first meeting of the teams on April 12 which resulted in a whopping 96 point victory to the Magpies.

Kalangadoo was knocked off top spot a week ago as Mount Burr took full advantage of the better scoring conditions and lifted its percentage.

A minor premiership would be nice for the black-and-whites but will only come if they can win games such as these by a significant margin.

Kongorong versus Hatherleigh

THE Hawks literally had the luck of the draw for round 11 and probably kept themselves warm and dry while the eight other clubs battled the worst weather conditions of the

season.

With two good wins over Nangwarry and Tantanoola, the home ground advantage and the fresh legs, Kongorong comes into contention today.

However, a win over the reigning premiers is a tall order and not just because the Eagles have revived their chances of first-ever back-to-back flags with four consecutive victories.

Hatherleigh is just about at full strength and knows it tormented Kongorong with a 92 point thumping in the third round.

The win was so emphatic that the victors almost trebled the score of the opposition.

Although John Simkin is in great form in attack, Hatherleigh will take some beating.

Tantanoola versus Port Mac

THE switch is 'off' at Tigerland at the moment and the team is far better than it has shown in its big losses to Kongorong and Hatherleigh.

Although the Hawks and the Eagles played well in those games and deserved their wins, Tantanoola was flat and seldom looked to be in contention after quarter time in both games.

It was not long ago that the Tigers were wondering what games they had to win to be certain of securing a double chance finals berth.

Now the club has to consider what has to be done to ensure a spot in the major round is secure.

Tantanoola's percentage is the worst of any team in the top five and is unlikely to improve today.

Port Mac's form has been patchy and one wonders if skipper and triple Mail Medallist Will Macdonald will return from injury.

ROUND 11 REVIEW

IT was great weather for ducks on June 28 and a day when the bigger and stronger (or smarter and wiser) footballers came to the fore.

With the exception of Mount Burr, the round was played in

The Ian McInnes Memorial Shield is remaining at Mount Burr for another 12 months as Glencoe lost its fourth consecutive match.

SA COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

TANTANOOLA might be missing star teenage recruit Jack Dawe today as he is in the mix to play for Murray South East in the SA Country Championships at Kadina this weekend.

Robe's Nick Cane was also a chance to play for the combined side from the Mid SE, Western Border, KNT and River Murray leagues.

The others from the Mid SE who trained with the Murray South East

squad at Keith on Sunday were Glencoe trio Tom Edwards, Zacc Cocks and Matt Kasparian.

The Murphies have the bye today.

When the Budget deadline arrived, I was not sure if the five Mid SE lads made the cut.

I think Nick won't be in Kadina but the other four are a good chance as either first-choice selections or emergencies.

About five other Mid SE players were invited to train with the Murray Zone East team but all declined for reasons such as injury.

There doesn't seem to be too much enthusiasm around the Mid SE for the State Championships in 2014 and this was the same situation as 2013, 2012, 2011 and so on.

Perhaps this is understandable and I will suggest five reasons.

Firstly, the level of representation from the Mid SE has been low with an average of only about two players each year for several seasons.

Secondly, the South East region (and certainly not the Mid SE) has never hosted a weekend dedicated to the SA Country Championships.

They began 20 years ago and so it is our turn.

The recent stranglehold which Port Pirie and the Riverland had on hosting rights has finally been broken with all matches being played at Kadina.

Thirdly, the drawer shows the odds are stacked against the Murray South East.

Not only do we have the longest travel time, we have the shortest period to rest.

The Murray South East players will have barely an hour to recover from their first qualifying match before they have to suit up again.

On the other hand, the Eyre Peninsula footballers have a recovery time lasting almost four hours between their first and second game.

Fourthly, is there much of an incentive with respect to representative honours?

When the SA Country Championships conclude tomorrow afternoon, a Team of the Championships will be selected.

Those included in the team will then represent the South Australian Country team which will host the West Australian Country side at Alberton Oval on Saturday July 26.

This match will be the curtain-raiser for the Round 14 SANFL clash between the Port Adelaide Academy team and the Adelaide Crows Reserves.

I am not too sure how many spectators will turn up but I am certain it will be less than the record 20,082 who saw reigning premiers Sturt play Port at Alberton on June 10, 1967.

The Port Adelaide Academy team and the Adelaide Crows Reserves have only played once before and that was a special event a few months ago at the Clare Oval.

Would it not have been better to have the SA Country and WA Country match as a curtain-raiser to the AFL Showdown between the Adelaide Crows and Port Power?

Let us never forget that capital city folk have a \$600 million re-built Adelaide Oval and another footbridge over the River Torrens because the Labor State Government sold the South East forests harvesting rights at a fire sale price.

Instead of honouring our best country footballers with a game at the State's iconic sporting complex, they are instead sent to Alberton Oval in the 'burbs.

Lastly, the Mid SE has scheduled a home-and-away round of matches for today.

In recent years, there was a bye in the Mid SE to coincide with the staging of the SA Country Championships.

I did not agree with this programming decision as it did not make sense to disrupt the whole Mid SE competition when we were only having about two players in the Murray South East team.

Who knows what 2015 will bring!
