ROUND 13 REVIEW

Mount Burr returned to top spot with a big 133 point win at home over Nangwarry.

The Saints were undermanned but still gave the Mozzies too much latitude and this was reflected on the scoreboard.

Kalangadoo came into Round 13 in top spot but a 10 goal home-ground win over Tantanoola was not enough to

keep them there.

Nonetheless, it was a great way for the Magpies to celebrate a number of milestone matches.

With losses in three of their past four games, questions are rightly being asked about the premiership chances of the Tigers.

Port MacDonnell cruised to a big win at the Bay over Kongorong.

Glencoe avoided a fifth consecutive loss by playing well from the get-go against Robe.

The Roosters did not seem to have a lot of rhythm in their game.

MAIL MEDAL NIGHT

For the likes of Robe, Nangwarry, Glencoe and Kongorong whose A Grade premiership aspirations have now ended, much of the interest remaining in 2014 will be on the identity of the Mail Medal winner.

At some time in late August, the Mid SE circus will come to Millicent and set up camp for the weekend in the War Memorial Civic and Arts Centre.

The dates are yet to be confirmed but you can expect the senior function for footballers and netballers will be held at night and the junior equivalent on a Sunday afternoon.

There will be one happy change this year and you can thank the ratepayers of Wattle Range Council for that.

After being of limited effectiveness for much of the time since the venue was erected in 1970, the oil heaters have been replaced.

What should be a part of proceedings for Mail Medal night?

LIFE MEMBERSHIPS

The Acme Enamel Badge Making Company should do quite well out of the MSEFL in 2014

as I reckon no less than 11 of the prestigious black-and-red life members badges will be issued by league president Peter Mitchell.

This will be one of the largest presentations of this kind since the eligibility criteria were changed in the late 1990s and the player life member category was added.

Under our constitution, all nominations for MSEFL life membership must be ratified by a vote of club delegates and the next such meeting is not too far away.

Some of the nominations are fairly straightforward.

HERMAN

Nangwarry's Adam "Herman" Dinnison reached his personal milestone with his 250th A Grade game on his home ground against Tantanoola on the penultimate game of the 2013 season.

There was no MSEFL club delegates meeting between this late-season game and the 2013 Mail Medal night and so "Herman" will have to wait almost 13 months to get his 'gong'.

"Herman" was an effective but unobtrusive ruckman/forward for the Saints and he will be long remembered for his match-winning effort in their last winning grand final team in 1999.

Moving ahead to this year, there were two MSEFL life memberships reached in round five on May 3 at "Mick" and Jean Walker Oval at Mount Burr.

STUMPY

Barry "Stumpy" Nilsson officiated in his 250th senior match while Mount Burr's Will Whitty brought up 250 A Grade games.

I have always thought "Stumpy" was one of the best

members of our umpiring panel.

When I make mental notes of an umpire's performance, the term I would most often use in reference to him is 'good'.

Like "Fred" in my line of Smiths dating back almost 200 years and "Jockey" among the Knaggs clan, "Stumpy" is a nick-name among the Nilsson clan.

Another local "Stumpy" is the Rendelsham-based professional lobster fisherman called Garry.

He was a long-serving Hatherleigh secretary and is currently a MSEFL executive member and a MSEFL life member.

BIG WILL

You would need a long memory to recall when Big Will played anywhere other than full-back but he was a useful ruckman/forward in his youth.

The first 25 games of Big Will's career were spent at Tantanoola and so it will require a joint submission from the Tigers and the Mozzies to get Will's name added to the hallowed list.

There are three other current Mozzies who have qualified for MSEFL life membership.

Dale Bowering and Scott "Mullet" Bevan have well exceeded the 250 A Grade games requirement.

Long-time team mate Adam Wiese is also well on the mark in the player/coach category as he can include his games as player at Hatherleigh and those matches at Mount Burr when he was the injured playing coach.

Hopefully, these four Burr Boys will receive the accolades of the MSEFL on Mail Medal night in 2014.

CRAIG SKEER

Another player/coach who must surely have passed the 250 career tally is Hatherleigh's Craig Skeer.

In my humble opinion, the four remaining life membership nominees are deserving of formal recognition as they have given the MSEFL great service off-the-field.

IAN LEIBHARDT

Ian Leibhardt would probably admit that he was not the most scintillating player in the Mount Burr B Grade teams and that his best service to the Mozzies was as a committeeman and club president.

It is his many years of dedication to the MSEFL and especially the junior grades which should get him a life members' badge.

LU MCINNES

Like Ian, long-time MSEFL executive member Lu McInnes was a great supporter of the Mozzies and may have been secretary at one stage.

In the past decade, she has well tackled the less glamorous side of footy administration and picked up some of the tougher tasks and done them well.

BUSINESS AWARDS

To round off the night, MSEFL life memberships should be provided to two Millicent businessmen who have been suppliers and sponsors of our sporting group, and many others, over many years.

At both league and club level, Ian Seebohm and Brian Foster have given tangible support and all the while with a degree of old-fashioned service and

commitment.

Both have already received a number of accolades from the local community they serve so well.

These are my personal views and it will be up to the club delegates to decide.

HONORED GUEST?

If indeed we have 11 life memberships to present on Mail Medal night, should we get a celebrity guest to hand them out.

Do we want to repeat our decision from the late 1980s and get an AFL Brownlow Medal winner to attend our Mail Medal night?

Back then, Brad Hardie was in the midst of a successful 150 game AFL career when attended the MSEFL night-of-nights at Kongorong.

I am not certain if he would sue the MSEFL for these following comments but, in my opinion, he gave me every indication he would rather have been sitting in a dentist's chair having a root canal.

No, the MSEFL does not need the Brad Hardies of this world to honour our champs and devoted servants,

We already have two in our midst.

Perhaps the nod goes to Jim Jess who still turns up to watch Robe on the odd occasion like at Glencoe last Saturday.




