THE blockbuster of the season will be the battle of the birds at Kalangadoo.

With six wins in a row, Hatherleigh is in 'cherry ripe' form and there is only one other team in the competition which currently has a better record.

That team is comprised of 21 Magpies who are aiming to continue their seven game winning streak.

It would be a brave man to pick against them on their home ground and I am not going to do so.

It is that little extra pace as well as the goalkicking trio of Anthony Kilsby, Matt Doody and Alexander Lyon that will give the edge.

Mount Burr supporters might well be scratching their heads to see which players will fill the 21 places at home to Kongorong.

It matters little who will be suiting up for the Mozzies as they should be too strong for the Hawks.

With the finals this close and a second semi final berth almost assured, the second-placed team might be tempted to rest some of their veterans like Nick Morrison.

If the Burr Boys miss playing in the B Grade finals, there might be some other players in the mix.

The Glencoe/Tantanoola clash could go either way with the Tigers aiming to regain fourth spot and the Murphies keen to keep sixth place.

The Tigers just had one poor quarter in round 14 and they have too much at stake.

Nangwarry makes the long trip to Robe and not much joy will await them there.

With the benefit of the home ground and a fortnight's break, the Roosters should win.

ROUND 14 REVIEW

THERE were no real surprises in round 14 other than the size of Hatherleigh's win at home over Port MacDonnell.

The Eagles are motoring along fairly well with six wins in a row but the wheels have fallen off the Demon chariot.

They were never going to get back into the contest when they posted just one scoring shot in the opening term while conceding 13.

The result was almost a mirror image of the meeting at the Bay on May 3 when the home side won by 52 points

One poor quarter cost Tantanoola its home game against Mount Burr and the Mozzies looked in top shape when they were given some latitude in the second term.

Kalangadoo are not just winning games: they are doing so at a canter.

Kongorong was the latest to succumb to the Magpies who have just about assured themselves of a double chance final.

Glencoe's mid-season woes are behind the club as a big win was achieved at the expense of Nangwarry.

GOAL KICKING TROPHY

ARE we going to have a 'new' winner of the Mid South East goalkicking award in 2014?

Will Port Mac's Dylan Bromley become the first player since then Nangwarry coach Leigh Capewell in 2000 and 2001 to win consecutive trophies?

With three matches left for him to play, Bromley sits in third spot and just 12 away from leader Anthony Kilsby, of Kalangadoo.

His 2014 is far fewer than his 2013 minor round of 93 and there are perhaps four obvious reasons.

Bromley has been used a great deal in defence, his Demons have not travelled quite as well as last season, this winter is so much wetter and there are fewer easy games as the overall standard of the Mid SE competition has

improved.

He was also off the field for much of last Saturday's loss at Hatherleigh with a heavy knock to his back and he did not register a goal.

Whereas there are still eight past Mail Medallists in senior company in the Mid SE this season, Bromley is one of only four past goalkicking award winners still about.

Mozzies' Chris Murray (winner in 2012 with 76 goals) and Jack Gregory (2011, 66) have not been near the goals as much in the opening 14 rounds of this season as past years.

Murray's best return has been six goals against bottom team Nangwarry at Mount Burr on July 12.

At present, Murray currently sits in equal 11th place on the list and his tally of 27 goals is matched by Kalangadoo newcomer Alexander Lyon.

Gregory has 19 goals so far in 2014 and his leading tally was also recorded on this day against the

Saints when he booted four.

It is odd that Mount Burr is one of the favourites to win the minor premiership and the flag but it does not have a player in the top 10 goalkickers.

Following on from Murray are Dylan Ridley, newcomer Tom Renzi and injured veteran Scott Bevan who all have booted 23 goals so far in 2014.

The fourth player in the past MSEFL goalkicking trophy winner category is Kym Dodd who shared the win eight years ago with Tiger team mate Mark McCallum.

They both slotted through 79 goals as Tantanoola went top.

Owing to overseas work commitments and family responsibilities, Dodd has only played a handful of games in B Grade this season.

If the golden boots don't work for Bromley, who else is in the running for the prize at the Millicent War Memorial Civic and Arts Centre on August 25?

Anthony "Killa" Kilsby has

headed the tally for most of the season in his comeback to the MSEFL with ladder leaders Kalangadoo.

He began the year with a big haul at home against arch rivals Glencoe and has not looked back since then.

With other scoring options like Matt Doody (30 goals) and Alexander Lyon, the Magpies are making a strong push to end their 12 year premiership drought.

It is a different story at Kongorong as the Hawks have endured 26 years since their last flag.

One consolation for them in 2014 might be the goalkicking trophy for veteran John Simkin.

Not only does he have one of the best kicks in the league, he also has the ability to spray his shots far and wide.

Much of his career at Kongorong has been spent in defence but I reckon his best work has always been done in attack.

I am sure someone will correct me but I reckon his career-high in a single game was 12 and that was a few years ago.

Simkin currently has 44 goals and is in second place on the ladder to Kilsby.

Tantanoola recruit Glen Gascoyne has had a mixed season so far and that has been the story of his new team of Tigers as well.

Time is running out for Gascoyne and the other wearers of the red-and-whites to make their mark on the competition.

Inconsistency has been their biggest enemy.

After being Tantanoola's leading goalscorer in the first half of the season, Gascoyne might not win the club or league trophy.

With 33 goals, Gascoyne is currently three behind Matt Pilmore.

He has been the spare parts man for the Tigers and often given the role of 'minder'.

Pilmore had some good games in attack mid-year and has remained in attack.

Way back in 2005, Pilmore won the Senior Colts goalkicking trophy with 71 goals.

It is 50 years next year since I saw my first competitive game of footy (South v. Port at Adelaide Oval).

In all that time, I have never come across a footballer with the nickname of "Sauce".

That was until I made the acquaintance of Glencoe's Alex Hentschke.

He did some good work for the Mid SE in our interleague campaigns this year and has carried the otherwise lacklustre Murphy attack.

Along with team mate Michael McRae, "Sauce" booted nine goals against the hapless Saints at Nangwarry on Saturday.

Have two players every kicked nine goals each in a Mid SE game?

His took the season's tally of "Sauce" to 41 and he is within striking distance of Simkin and Kilsby.

In a wet year, no player has averaged much more than four goals per outing and that it was what makes the effort of Nangwarry recruit Tyson Ploenges so full of merit.

In a winless team, Ploenges has booted 29 goals from eight games for an average of 3.6.

He has already proved his worth as a goalkicker with Kongorong and West Gambier and he needs to stay at Nangwarry in 2015 if the Saints are to climb the ladder.

Rounding out the top 10 goalkickers are reliable Robe and Mid SE left-footer Jaryd Dawson (30 goals), Doody and McRae (34 goals).

My money is on Simkin to win the goalkicking prize.

After today, the Hawks play three teams in the bottom half of the table.

Kilsby has the bigger challenge as he has Port Mac at Port Mac in round 16, the bye in round 17 and Mount Burr at home to finish the minor round.

"I have also used such newspapers as The Border Watch and The South Eastern Times as well as the weekly Budgets which began in the 1950s," Mr Frost said.

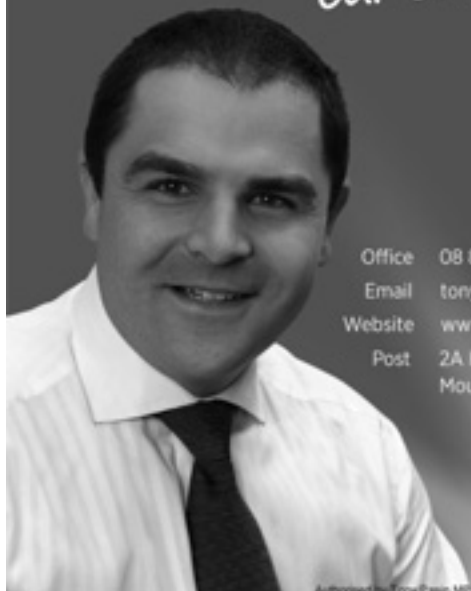
"Orders are now being taken for the book and they can be placed with either club officials or the Mid SE."

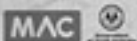
