## FRED'S FOOTY FEED



TANTANOOLA will take full advantage of an exhausted Mount Burr and advance to the grand final by 5pm today.

It won't be a huge victory but the fresh and keen Tigers will prevail against the ageing and weary Mossies.

With just one match in the space of 28 days, the extra zip of the Tigers will be decisive on the most southern footy ground in South Australia.

The 2009-2011 premiers had looked set to take the direct route to the 2014 season decider last Saturday as they were within striking distance of the young Kalangadoo line-up at the last change.

However, the Magpies were far from spent and stormed home in the last quarter with two big goals from "Killa" Kilsby and one from exskipper Michael Durbidge.

Mount Burr players ran out of steam as a slick Kalangadoo outfit swept to a deserved 14 point victory.

The sun shone, the ground was in tip-top condition and it was a credit to the Hatherleigh sporting community.

There was the occasional bit of rough play but field umpires Neil Webber, Paul Cavanagh and Michael Pink did a good job.

The large oval and temperatures in the mid-twenties would have really sapped the energy of the Mount Burr players and especially the eight aged over 30.

It will take plenty of ice and rubdowns to get the Mozzies onto the seaside oval today.

Last Saturday was also significant as Mount Burr was again without any top tier players due to injury, suspension or work commitments.

It has been repeatedly stated that the Mossies have secured their past three flags from 2009-2011 with all their top rank players on the oval.

By any yardstick, Mount Burr had

been lucky when it came to injuries in that hat-trick of premierships.

Are there some clues which point to a result today?

#### 2014 RESULTS

MOUNT Burr have had Tantanoola's measure on both occasions this season with a 33 point win at "Mick" and Jean Walker Oval on May 3.

The return match at Tigerland on July 19 was a ripper with the Mozzies booting two late goals and winning by just 17 points.

#### SURPRISE PACKET

EVERY finals series turns up a surprise packet and it is sometimes a player who does not get much attention from the umpires when dishing out Mail Medal votes.

In the case of Tantanoola, the X-factor player today might be Jordan Williams.

He polled a best-on-ground vote in the opening round against Kongorong way back on March but did not get another during the minor round.

However, if the utility player can repeat his first semi-final efforts, then the Tigers are well on the way to victory.

The three goals of Williams in the last term sealed their victory.

#### **BEST TEEN**

I RATE Jack Dawe as one of the best teens in the Mid SE.

At the age of 18, he might get a chance to play in his first senior grand final.

I reckon his dad Jason Dawe will assign him the job of running down the flanks today.

#### THE LAST WORD

TANTANOOLA will advance to the grand final but Kalangadoo will be the Premiers. More of that next week.

#### **COACHES FOR 2015**

I RECKON most of the current Mid SE coaches will be back on deck in 2015 and Robe will have Jim Jess as head coach with Fabian Bigmore as his assistant.

There might be a few vacancies and who might fill them?

There are a number of former

MSEFL identities who might not be staying with their Western Border and KNTFL clubs next season.

Will former Nangwarry junior Jon Copping be on the move again after two seasons back at Penola?

However, the KNTFL Eagles could be on the cusp of a hat-trick of premierships next year and the club is celebrating its 150th anniversary.

These are powerful reasons for staying at the club and would also rule out the likes of KNTFL playing coach and dynamo Adam "Hoggett" Merrett.

Ex-Kalangadoo and Tarpeena plaving coach Keith "Hooker" Ransom has had four seasons at West Gambier from 2010-13.

He spent most of 2014 as assistant coach with Casterton/ Sandford until he parted company with the Cats in July.

Will he stay involved with the WBFL in 2015?

Let's have a look at some of the other coaching possibilities in the Mid SE for next season.

Justin McConnell, formerly of the

Glenelg Football Club, has been a stand-out player and goalkicker in his four seasons as North Gambier coach.

He has won the Western Border medal voting, won two flags, coached the Murray South East zone team for three seasons and had his jaw broken in 2012.

With SANFL zone club Glenelg in the doldrums, there is often speculation McConnell may return to the Bays in some role.

I can see McConnell coaching at SANFL level after his days as a player are over.

Classy on-baller Richard O'Grady. assistant to McConnell, has been one of the best players in the WBFL in the past three seasons.

He won the Brian Hennessy Memorial Medal in 2012 as the competition's best and fairest player and is a highly-regarded underage coach at interleague level.

The WBFL Tigers are again WBFL flag favourites due to the input of McConnell and O'Grady.

has many representative honours to his credit and is as good as any other player in the WBFL.

I think he has had some "nibbles" from the Mid SE in recent years.

Luke Duncan has coached Penola in the past and is currently coach of South Gambier and the championship-winning Murray South East zone team.

At 34, he would still dominate in the Mid SE playing arena but he has missed much of the past two seasons with some serious injuries.

Any other options?

Bay boy Ben McGregor has been back home at Port Mac with his two brothers for the past four seasons.

He was appointed as vice-captain of the WBFL interleague team in 2010 and is a top-quality player and a top-quality bloke.

If you look to McLaughlin Park, Steve Duldig and Andrew Nitschke are highly decorated players and former Millicent coaches.

Duldig would still be a stand-out player in the MSEFL while 41-yearold Nitschke has long hung up his boots

Nitschke would be an excellent non-playing coach given his background and his excellent work with juniors at the SE academy.

Former Glencoe underage mentor Matt Sinkunas would be a good choice for an A Grade coach as he has played in the SANFL at South Adelaide and Port Adelaide and has won the 2008 and 2009 Walker Medals in our competition.

I reckon ex-Mossie Rvan Gamble might come back home to coach one day but it probably won't be in 2015 for the veteran of 35 AFL games with Geelong and Saint Kilda.

Likewise, current and recent SANFL players Nick Pearce and Luke Panozzo (ex-Tantanoola), Brad Agnew (Mount Burr) and Warrick McGinty (Kongorong) might come

back home within the next five years. Perhaps one or more Mid SE clubs might follow the example of the KNTFL and the WBFL and import a new coach direct from Adelaide where there are literally hundreds of

teams. The days of getting a quality coach/player to come to this region on a work transfer with a bank or a stock firm are rarer and rarer these davs.

The top three in the Mail Medal (Clint Gallio, Will Macdonald and Jonny Agnew) are unlikely to go anywhere next season but I reckon the fourth-placegetter would make an ideal coach in the not-too-distant future.

The winner of the 2014 Bill Hanel Memorial Award as the best player under 21 years of age, Zacc Cocks was vice-captain of Glencoe and the Mid SE team this season.

#### **MORT'S BOOK**

IT was great to catch up with league identity Peter Ey and about 40 others at the Glencoe clubrooms on Sunday afternoon for the launch of Mort Frost's excellent book about the post-war history of the mighty Mid SE.

This is yet another example where the Mid SE has blazed the trail for country leagues across the State.

I have seen club history books and an excellent account of the Mortlock Shields at Port Lincoln but not of associations and leagues like ours.

Mind you, the Mid SE has sailed serenely along for almost halfa-century with the withdrawal of Tarpeena being our only change since 1966.

The speeches by master of ceremonies Les Edwards, league president Peter Mitchell and Peter Ev due attention to the success of the Mid SE and the fine manner it has been recorded in Mort's book.



Police and security personnel will be particularly vigilant regarding glass containers as this poses a very real danger to player and spectator safety.


Supporters are requested NOT to take alcohol onto the playing surface at any time during the day. This includes at the conclusion of each match.






