PRE-SEASON CUP

A FEW weeks have passed since the Mid SE circus arrived at Glencoe on the last Saturday of autumn for the annual pre-season cup.

It was interesting to see how the Murphies had spent their latest hand-outs from the District Council of Wattle Range and the State Government.

There are flush facilities for the boozy crowd on the Hill but little attention has been paid to the 1940s-era change rooms.

Glencoe players are handsomely paid and so have to tolerate the antiquated surroundings but it is a woeful way to treat the visitors and the umpires (who have a change room the size of a shoebox).

The main focus of one of my

spies was on the key signings of the clubs over summer and the progress shown by the junior brigade.

This spy knows her footy and said it was good that most of the big names did play and they had the old-fashioned red hot go.

She said Hatherleigh's Brad Haskett looked to be superfit and moved and spoke well.

As Jack Kelly has come straight from Sturt in the SANFL to Robe, she said there is little doubt that he is a class act.

It is more than 30 years that another Double Blues onballer came from Unley to Guichen Bay.

That was triple Mail Medallist and premiers coach, the late Kym Smith.

Jake Dowdy really caught her eye and this South Gambier recruit will bolster the big man stocks of the Mozzies.

Callum Hudson was regarded as the 'signing of the summer' with the ex-North Gambier player suiting up with Kongorong.

Realistically, it would appear the Hawks need another four of his ilk to go top but they have laid a solid foundation.

Hudson will see at least one familiar face in the MSEFL in 2015 as his ex-North team mate Troy Hatt has switched to Tantanoola.

He is a skilled, running type of player.

Without naming names and going on the write-ups in the Millicent Times, some recruits did not play in the Mid SE pre-season cup while some clubs had little to show for their recruiting efforts over summer.

It was one of those off-seasons where there was little movement between the three leagues of the SE.

TIME IS UP FOR CUP?

SHIFTWORK stopped me from going to the Pre-Season Cup but I was not too despondent.

If the Mid SE did not have a pre-season cup in 2016, would anyone care?

Some of the newcomers strut their stuff but, otherwise, the competition on March 28 was lacklustre.

Good on Kongorong and coach Tony Elletson for winning the trophy which looked like it came from the

bargain bin at Cheap as Chips.

I suppose the cup will go into the largely empty trophy cabinet at the home of the Hawks.

Elletson & co. were fair dinkum but, from all reports, most of the other clubs were not.

In some cases, clubs chose to fill up their teams with kids and B Graders.

When the Mid SE had its pre-season carnival at Mount Burr from the 1950s until the 1980s, the competition for the coveted Legacy Cup was intense.

Nowadays, the clubs play off for a no-name trophy.

Our league is seldom outsmarted by our neighbours in the Western Border Football League but they have had a naming rights sponsor of their competition for the past seven years.

Even though the WBFL faces the same apathy for its pre-season competition as we do, at least the WB clubs compete for a decent prize.

Going back to about 2010 when Mount Burr revived the concept, the pre-season cup was supposed to provide a huge financial bonanza for the host club on account of the profits from catering.

I think Glencoe did OK from hosting the 2015 pre-season cup but I am reliably told the crowds petered out after about 2pm.

It was fairly obvious that many players and spectators were not interested in the outcome of the last few games.

According to those in the know, some of the players were happy to jump into their utes and depart after their commitments were cleared of the day.

As the pre-season cups are hosted on a rotational basis, Hatherleigh is scheduled to hold the 2016 event.

I know the Eagles are keen to show off their new-ish clubrooms and changerooms but they hardly need the extra income.

The club is one of the wealthiest, if not the wealthiest, in the MSEFL.

In any case, my musings about the future of the pre-season are somewhat premature.

PHIL MUHOVICS MEMORIAL CUP AND MEDAL

TODAY at Nangwarry in the Senior match against Glencoe, both sides will again be playing for the Phil Muhovics Memorial Cup.

Now in its fifth year, Nangwarry are yet to secure the Cup but not from a lack of endeavour.

This match continues to honour the contribution Phil made to both clubs and the medal named in his honour is presented to the player judged by the family displaying the attributes Phil was renowned for, skill and good sportsmanship.

Phil began his junior football playing Senior Colts with Glencoe up to 1973. He made his A Grade debut the following year and continued until the end of 1979 as a classy left footer playing mainly in defence.

He then ventured to the Western Border for a few years before returning to Glencoe as Senior playing coach in 1987 and 1988.

During his time with the Murphies, he represented the League at Under 21 and at Senior level. He also played in a Reserves premiership for Glencoe in 1978.

Phil began playing at Nangwarry in 1992 after coaching and playing at Robe for a couple of seasons. He became the Saints Senior coach the following year also carrying on as a player and did this again in 1994.

He continued as non playing coach from 1995 until the end of the 1998 season. During these six years as coach, he guided Nangwarry to the finals every year winning three premierships in 1993, 1994 and the third in 1997 was against his original club Glencoe.

After a break of a few years, Phil's love for the Nangwarry Football Club saw him return as the Senior non playing coach again from 2004 to 2007.

He also coached the Mid SE Interleague team on two occasions in 1994 and again in 2007.

Phil was awarded Coach/Player Life Membership of the Mid South Eastern Football League in 2007.

Sadly Phil lost his battle with bone cancer in 2010 aged 53.

ANZAC DAY MEDAL MATCH

THE Mid South Eastern Football League and Netball Association are proud to once again offer an ANZAC Day Medal Match to commemorate ANZAC Day.

This year's ANZAC Day Medal Match will be between Glencoe and Port MacDonnell at Glencoe on Sunday 26th April.

Since the successful pilot program back in 2010 of awarding an ANZAC Medal in selected football and netball games across the state, the SA Community Football Board, Netball SA, Veterans SA and the State RSL have continued to provide this opportunity to all leagues throughout the State. The League will continue to rotate participating clubs to provide all clubs the opportunity of being a part of this significant date on our calendar.

During many wars, Australian Rules football matches have been played overseas in places like northern Africa, Vietnam and Iraq as a celebration of Australian culture and as a bonding exercise between soldiers.

In 1975 the VFL/AFL first commemorated ANZAC Day and the ANZAC spirit with a match of Australian Rules Football between Essendon and Carlton in a one-off match in front of a large crowd of 77,700 at VFL Park, Waverley.

The modern-day tradition began in 1995 and is played every year between traditional AFL rivals Collingwood and Essendon at the MCG. In 2013 St Kilda and Sydney initiated an Anzac Day match in New Zealand to honour the ANZAC bond between the two countries with the fixture being retained in 2014 against Brisbane and in 2015 their opponent will be Carlton.

The medals will continue to honour the memory and war service Mr Herb Ashby OAM DCM (football) and Sister Mary Catherine Mules (netball).

Players, both football and netball will assemble on the Glencoe Oval prior to the commencement of the A Grade football match to pay their respects as well as embracing the memory of, and gratitude for the supreme sacrifice made by so many Australians in conflict.

The player adjudged by an independent selection panel as the player who best exemplifies the ANZAC spirit – skill, courage, self sacrifice, teamwork and fair play will awarded with the 2015 Herb Ashby ANZAC Day Medal.

ANZAC MATCH PROFILE

Herbert Hector Ashby OAM DCM

HERBERT Hector (Herb) Ashby was born in Mount Gambier on the 12th of October 1921. He was raised at Kongorong on a farm, along with his seven brothers and two sisters. Although he was awarded a scholarship to attend high school, Herb decided to go out to work instead, to save his parents the expense of having to board him in Mount Gambier during the week.

Herb worked from the age of twelve; including in a cheese factory and on a farm, until war broke out. He enlisted in the Army in 1940 at the age of 18, claiming that he was in fact 23. After completing his training, Herb was sent to the Middle East as a member of the famed 2/48th Battalion and was wounded in action in September 1941. The 2/48th was a much decorated battalion with 4 VCs awarded to its members during the course of the War. Herb himself was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal (DCM) in 1942 for bravery following his single handed wipe out of enemy machine gun emplacements. Part of the wording of his citation reads:

For courage, leadership and determination to fight on against great odds for a period of 15 hrs although his Section was isolated from the remainder of the Company.

At Tel el Eisa on 22 Jul 42, Private Ashby was in command of his Section, in an attack on strong German positions. The attack was commenced at 0615hrs and early in the advance the Company received heavy casualties from artillery and machine gun fire. All the Officers were killed or wounded and Private Ashby's Section became isolated from the remainder of the Company. Although at times his position appeared to be impossible he refused to consider withdrawal and insisted on fighting on. By his alertness and fire control he was able to release from capture a crew of three from a Valentine tank and two members of his Section, killing or wounding all the enemy who had seized them.

With great personal courage he sniped continuously at enemy nearby and by his leadership and dogged determination inspired his men who inflicted heavy casualties on the enemy during the engagement lasting all day.

There were only 110 DCMs awarded during World War II. The complete story of Herb's war service is the subject of a book 'Last Man Standing' by Peter Dornan which was published in 2006.

Herb came home on leave in 1943 and one of the first things he did was join the RSL; he remained a member until the day he died. After his leave, Herb rejoined the 2/48th which was sent to New Guinea. He contracted malaria and was repatriated back to Australia. While recovering in Mount Gambier, Herb met a local nurse, Heather Hancock and they married in 1945.

After the War, Herb became a soldier settler in Mingbool growing a variety of crops and using sound water management techniques. Herb grew potatoes, peas, beans and flax as well as raising dairy cattle and sheep. The Mingbool community was a close knit one where everyone supported each other and it is therefore perhaps not surprising that Herb became involved in many community committees and activities. The family moved into town in the mid-seventies and Herb had a career change, becoming the inspector of water resources until his retirement. He also invested in local real estate.

His support of his Desert War mates never waned and each year Herb would organise a reunion lunch in Mount Gambier which would be attended by his old comrades and their relatives from across Australia. It continues to this day. He became President of the Mount Gambier Sub Branch in 1957 and RSL state councillor for the Lower South East in 1959, retiring in 1971. Herb held many office bearing positions in the RSL and was made a life member in 1964.

Herb Ashby was awarded the RSL's highest award of a Meritorious Medal in 1989 for his service to the League and its members over many years. Herb was also Chairman of the Mount Gambier Distressed Soldiers Fund which was established after World War 1 to assist soldiers to get on their feet financially on their return home from war. Although the fund is not so active today, Herb remained the Chair until his death.

Herb received the Medal of the Order of Australia for service to the community of Mount Gambier in 1996. He was also citizen of the year in Mount Gambier in 2007.

Herb is survived by his wife of almost 64 years Heather, their five children and their families. He will always be remembered as a local hero who remained a humble man who fervently hoped that future generations would not have to experience a war like his did.

ANZAC MATCH PROFILE

Sister Mary Catherine Mules

MARY was called up for full time duty for the Australian Army Nursing Service on the 29th July 1942.

Mary transferred to the AIS (Australian Imperial Service) and she was commissioned to Lieutenant. She served 1516 active service days with the General Military Hospitals in Australia. She was discharged from duty in January 1946.

Mary returned to Kalangadoo and was an integral member in the formation of the local Mothers and Babies Society, where she also worked as a clinical nurse. The Kalangadoo Mothers and Babies clinic was later renamed in her honour. Mary passed away in 1973.

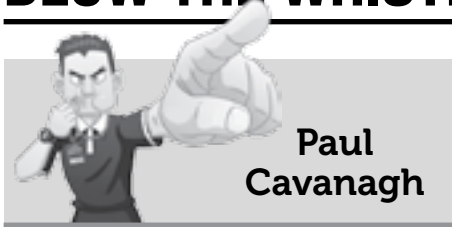
