### THE VOICE OF REASON

GLENCOE are back in the finals race and will return to the four tonight after winning by at least 10 goals at Kongorong today.

The 2015 season was starting to get a bit on the boring side but the competition is well and truly alive.

Meanwhile, there is a guaranteed blockbuster down at the Bay today.

How will the super-shrewd Kalangadoo coach Ben Mules approach this match and will he risk the notso-fit Magpies against one of the competition's other heavyweights?

When you look at the premiership table, it is a pretty safe bet that his team will be playing off in the first semi final.

It can't finish any higher than third and it can't finish any lower than fourth.

To my mind, this will be the last time Magpies and the Demons will meet in 2015, and not in the preliminary final on September 12.

That is, Glencoe will defeat Kalangadoo in the first semi while Mount Burr will defeat Port Mac in the second semi.

Having said all that, today's match just comes down to bragging rights.

At Tigerland, Tantanoola would be looking forward to another win to stop Glencoe reaching the finals.

It won't happen as Robe will win and the Tigers won't get back in the top four.

With all respect to Nangwarry, Mount Burr coach Frazer Scanlon will be looking to rest some of his ageing players and give his colts plenty of game time.

There are plenty of keen young Mozzies who should be given a full two hours on the Nangwarry Oval today.

It would make good sense to give them leading roles in the pivot as they might be needed in September.

Along with Port MacDonnell, Mount Burr has had a charmed run with injuries this season.

That good run of luck could soon end and a squad of 26 game-hardened players is needed to mount a successful major round campaign.

For the next month or so, teams like Tantanoola, Robe and Kongorong will chiefly battle it out for the title of best team out of the four.

### **ROUND 13 REVIEW**

There were lots of one-sided results but I saw a finals-quality outfit in Glencoe take Tantanoola apart.

Make no mistake, anyone watching the Murphies on Saturday would think they were premiership material in the first, second and fourth terms.

Mind you, the Tigers were weakened when they lost a trio of players inside the ten minute mark.

Glencoe went off the boil in the third term.

From all reports, Port MacDonnell's lucky run continued at Robe, Mount Burr had a sweet win over a struggling Hatherleigh while it was the Killa Kilsby Show as Kalangadoo crushed Nangwarry.

### **REGIONAL ROYAL COMMISSION**

There is still not much about the mysterious workings of the proposed South East Football Netball Regional Royal Commission.

Nonetheless, people with a good knowledge of the mighty Mid SE form half of the membership.

That is, we have three of the six Regional Royal Commissioners and they have close ties with the Kongorong, Kalangadoo and Hatherleigh clubs.

Firstly, we have Robin White who is an ex-playing coach of the Hawks in the 1990s.

He could not get them into a grand final but he was good value as a player and coach.

Professor Google tells me Mr White is 54 years of age and was 177cm tall and weighed 80kg during his playing

However, it does not tell me he was a hard-at-it defender.

As a teen, he was recruited from West Gambier to play with South Adelaide in the SANFL.

Back then, the South East zone was tied to the Panthers.

Under inspirational coach Hayden Bunton Junior, White was a member of South's last grand final team in 1979.

After a few more years with the Panthers, he joined Melbourne in the then Victoria Football League.

Once again, I am indebted to Professor Google for telling me he made 30 appearances for the Demons in the 1985, 1986 and 1987 seasons.

Going from memory and without the benefit of Professor Google, I reckon Robin White came back home to coach West Gambier and then headed out to Kongorong.

There are huge gaps in this snapshot in the career of Mr White but, suffice to say, there is no one among the 100,000 residents of the South East with a better footy pedigree.

The Kalangadoo connection with the six proposed Royal Commissioners comes from Tim Heysen.

Other than being a semi-regular spectator at Magpie games, I am not aware of a direct connection with football.

Nonetheless, the Heysens have a connection with the Derrymore property at Kalangadoo which dates back to the pre-war years.

Mr Heysen is a successful potato grower, media savvy and an accomplished public speaker.

His involvement with such industry groups as the South Australian Potato Growers Association and the family trust which operates "The Cedars" art studio in the Adelaide Hills would give him an insight into the dynamics of community activities.

Former Hatherleigh A Grade player Frank Brennan has a high public profile and it has not diminished since he retired as the District Council of Wattle Range supremo a few years ago.

Since then, he has been appointed the chairman of the South East Drainage Board and the NRM board.

Mr Brennan is the master of ceremonies of our annual Mail Medal night at the Millicent Civic Centre and was the president of the Mid SE Junior Football Committee about a decade ago.

In partnership with president Norm Facey and coach Richard Hill, Mr Brennan was one of the masterminds of the sole Millicent Football Club flag in the Western Border Football League.

He was the club secretary of the Saints when they went top in 1984.

One of the Millicent committeemen in that era is now set to join the ranks of the Regional Royal Commissioners on the South East Football Netball Regional

Royal Commission.

Bill DeGaris is a leading South East lawyer, a golfer of note and a former opening batsman with the Prince Alfred Old Collegians Football Club in the Adelaide Turf Cricket Association.

Some of his best work for the community was done about a decade ago when he chaired the South East Regional Health Service.

That was no easy task and Mr DeGaris will bring his diplomatic skills and legal knowledge to his role as a Regional Royal Commissioner.

I am not aware of Mr DeGaris having any close involvement with the Mid SE.

His younger brother Richard (also known as Dick) played some games at Hatherleigh.

The sole female on the SEFNRC is Dr Helen Macdonald who has been at the helm of the Naracoorte Lucindale Council since 2011.

Her girlhood home was a mixed farming property at Marcollat as her father, Malcolm Macdonald, was the long-time general manager of the Willalooka Pastoral Company.

Her CV lists her education at Keilira Rural School, Seymour College and Flinders University.

The academic sphere of Dr Macdonald is Applied Ethics and she has completed an Arts degree with Honours and a Doctorate of Philosophy.

She has worked as a waitress and in a smallgoods factory, been a university lecturer and has served in senior roles with the Newmont mining company in Australia and overseas.

I have precious little knowledge of the sixth member of the SEFNRC.

It is Brendon Smart and he is well-known as a player and administrator in the KNTFL.

Does anyone else get the feeling this is all happening in the background and all of a sudden we, the general footballing public are going to get hit with a whammy we may or may not like, the latter I would suspect.

More about the plans of the SE Football Netball Regional Royal Commission will appear in the coming Budgets.





Congrats to young Benny on his 18th. No reports, so everyone must have been on their best behaviour. Tommy Williams and Reece Carlson also blew out candles.




## ROBE ROOSTERS


