TODAY sees Brett Sneath play his 150th game for the Hatherleigh Football Club.

Brett started his football career at Millicent making his A Grade debut in 1995 at the age of 16. He played over 160 senior games at Millicent and was rewarded with a Runner-Up Best & Fairest in 2000.

With the hope of playing consistent footy finals and winning a premiership flag, Brett decided to join the Eagles in 2006. He was a SE Zone representative that year and played in the Grand Final unfortunately losing on the day, but with the taste of finals footy he continued on with the Eagles successfully winning premierships in 2008 and 2013.

Brett's accolades so far include Interleague representative in 2007, Mid SE Team Of The Year in 2009 and 2012, leading goal kicker in 2012 and A Grade captain in 2010 and 2014. His passion for the game has rewarded him with the A Grade TR Skeer Medal Best & Fairest in 2009 and 2011 and Runner-Up in 2010.

Brett is predominantly an onballer and also plays at half forward. He is a courageous player and is more often than not at the bottom of the pack. His strong leads, goal kicking and excellent overhead marks are also a feature of his game. He personally rates the 2013 season as one of the more memorable ones, kicking equal club 55 goals for season, winning the flag and finishing 3rd in the Club Best & Fairest.

Brett is a popular member of the club and is well known for his dry sense of humour! Congratulations Brett on your 150th game with the Hatherleigh Football Club.

GLENCOE CELEBRATING PREMIERSHIPS TODAY

THE Glencoe Football Club will be celebrating today when it holds a premiership reunion.

The premierships include the 1955 and 1985 A Grade wins, along with the 1950, 1955 and 1990 B Grade, 2010 Senior Colts and 2005 Junior Colts victories.

During half time of the A Grade match against Robe the club will provide refreshments in its new viewing room under the stubby booth for those who were involved in the premierships.

The club will also recognise the teams at approximately 7pm in the clubrooms.

The two A Grade premierships lived up to expectations, with both being decided by less than a straight kick.

In 1955 Glencoe defeated Tarpeena at Millicent by two points, with a more accurate 10.11 (71) to 8.21 (69).

It was another 30 years before the club again tasted premiership success, this time against Robe at Kalangadoo in what was possibly the club's most memorable day.

Again it was the accuracy of the Murphies that created the success, with a scoreline of 20.8 (128) to the Roosters' 18.15 (123).

At half time of the match the Murphies were down by more than seven goals, with the game eventually won on the last goal of the day after a final quarter comeback.

In 1950 the B Grade side defeated

Kalangadoo at Tantanoola by nine points, while in 1955 it enjoyed a 58-point win over Hatherleigh at Millicent.

The side then had to wait another 35 years for its third title, when returning to Tantanoola, it defeated

Mount Burr by 10 points.

The Senior Colts won their only flag in 2010 against Robe by 30 points at Glencoe oval while the Junior Colts managed a premiership in 2005 – also against Robe – by 15 points at Kongorong.

Yet again, The Voice Of Reason achieved a perfect score.

Tantanoola was on fire in the first quarter at Kalangadoo and then the flame petered out.

Hatherleigh did what it was expected to do to Nangwarry while there was not too much excitement about Robe's home ground win over Kongorong.

ROBBIE IS TOPS

The other big news of round 15 was the elevation of our popular umpire Robbie Ransom to the pantheon of stars in the Western Border Football League all-time best team.

Port MacDonnell's 1988 grand final coach was named at CHB in the team chosen by former Border Watch sports editor Rod Morris and published in the Western Border Budget.

Being a State Country player, premiership player and a 19-time interleague player earned Robbie the points in the ranking system used by Rod Morris to determine the league's best.

The previous week Rod Morris had put Kevin Harris in the WBFL best-ever team.

Known as "Ox", he was captain-coach of Hatherleigh for three seasons in the 1990s when he was hovering around 40 years of age.

I don't think he or his successor at Eagles Peter Zeitz received enough credit for laying the foundation for the club's success which came a few years later.

THE PINK COUSINS

The Umpires Column was taken over last week by the Pink cousins while Paul Cavanagh was on the sick list and IMHO they gave me plenty of LOL moments.

It is good to have a column with a degree of levity and originality and one that does not take matters too seriously.

The Pinks challenged The Voice of Reason to come with a best-ever Mid SE team and suggested Chook, Will, BC, Jonesy, Doody snr, Eugene and Timmsy would come under close scrutiny.

Let's have a look.

CHOOK

The late Kym Smith was the best player ever to pull on a jumper in the

Mid SE.

He won a hat-trick of Mail Medals and a Walker Medal, took the Roosters top in 1987 and delivered the best bump ever seen in a Mid SE grand final.

The victim was Glencoe's John Bronca and the year was 1985 and that bump will be re-lived time and time again at the reunion of the Murphies this afternoon.

MICHAEL JONES

This well-travelled and durable footballer was gutsy and classy and a true ball magnet.

Much of his footy in his teenage years at Glencoe in the late 1980s was simply terrific and he deserved to win consecutive Mail Medals.

Like Chook, Michael Jones is a guaranteed selection in my best-ever Mid SE team.

WHALE

Born in Leeds in the UK, Michael Timms kicked well over 1,000 career goals in the Mid SE at Nangwarry, Robe, Tarpeena and Port Mac.

Big, strong, tough and surprisingly quick were just some of his attributes and let us not forget he also booted 100+ goals in a season at South Gambier.

He would not be my choice of full-forward in the all-star Mid SE team.

That accolade would go to Neil Nankivell, of Glencoe.

As a police officer, he came to us later in his career from the River Murray Football League.

Nankivell played a huge part in the back-to-back Glencoe premierships in 1991 and 1992 as well as the Mid SE interleague win over the then KNFL at Glencoe in 1992.

STEAMER

Originally from New Zealand, Rick Stephens came to be a Burr Boy after some time at Millicent.

His CV is impressive with a Walker Medal, twice leading league goalkicker, grand final coach and interleague captain.

One astute Mid SE observer told me Steamer could have played in the SANFL.

With Nankivell allocated to FF, perhaps Steamer could have been placed at CHF in the best-ever Mid SE team.

I think not as I have earmarked that spot to Glencoe's 2004 Mail Medal winner and premiership coach Simon Jones.

EUGENE

Eugene Warrior flashed into our league 29 seasons ago in Tantanoola's premiership team.

Renowned for his drop-kicks, he won two Reserves Magarey Medals and had a talented footballing son of the same name.

I don't believe players who spend just one season in our league should be included in the best-ever teams of any competition.

This would rule out Eugene from holding down a position like half-forward flank.

In any case, there are other better players to fill these two spots.

They are ex-Glencoe skipper Justin Maloney and Murphies 1985 premiership coach and Mail Medallist Chris Ryan.

BC

Brian Casey won three Mail Medals and played in numerous grand finals for his beloved Magpies for two wins, a tie and a few losses.

As he headed west over summer, the chances of Kalangadoo winning consecutive flags took a tumble.

BC could play just about any position on the field but he did his best work at CHB.

He won't be in the key defensive position in my best-ever Mid SE team as that would go to former Glencoe coach Adam Price.

He was just about the best specialist defender that I have ever seen in the Mid SE.

I have run out of space to write about the two other suggestions of the Pink cousins.

They are Port MacDonnell's triple Mail Medallist Will Macdonald and the Doodys.

Perhaps another week.
