THE VOICE OF REASON

GLENCOE'S barn-storming run will continue all the way until the grand final at Robe on September 19.

The Murphies have won five of their last six games and they won't be beaten again in 2015.

They are just five wins away from a premiership.

In other words, all they have to do is win another 50 terms of footy and they will do it

Glencoe won the first Mid SE premiership in 1936 and it has been a powerhouse club ever since.

With the young talent in the ranks, I predict Glencoe will make significant inroads in the coming seasons into the record number of A Grade premierships which is currently held by Mount Burr.

My original prediction of a maroonand-gold flag back in March will be correct.

To finish the minor round, Keith Ransom's team will have easy wins against Kalangadoo (away) and Mount Burr (home).

In all likelihood, they will meet the Magpies again in the first semi and clean them up again.

Port Mac will inevitably run out of luck, won't play well in the finals and will lose the second semi and the prelim.

That means Glencoe will meet Mount Burr in the season decider at the seaside and will win the Wilf Sprengel Premiership Shield for the first time since 2007.

I haven't seen the Murphies for a few weeks but the reports are all positive.

They are achieving wins against the odds and without some key players like ex-coach Adam Price, utility player Clay Von Duve and ace forward Tory Weaver.

In many ways which I am not able to fully explain in this column, there is a burning desire in the Murphy camp to win the 2015 premiership.

Other MSEFL teams probably have more raw talent and are certainly paid a lot more but it will be the expert coaching and the good ol' fashioned G&D which will pay a dividend at the business end of the season.

My spies at the Robe game last week told me that Glencoe faced a season-defining moment midway through the last quarter.

The Roosters had again snatched back

the lead and everything, and I do mean everything, was going their way.

With the hopes of fourth place fading rapidly, the true Murphy spirit shone through and they kicked the last two goals of the match.

Do Port Mac, Mount Burr and Kalangadoo possess that amount of self-belief?

I think not.

Let's not forget that some senior Murphies were not available to play last Saturday and yet the young team still produced the goods.

It is the sharp end of the season and Glencoe is peaking at the right time.

Nothing in heaven or on earth will stop the Murphies from going top.

ROUND 17 PREVIEW

The Magpies are up against their oldest rivals but it will be a bleak day for the black-and-whites.

Not even the home ground advantage will be enough to stop the Glencoe juggernaut from winning and winning

If Kalangadoo gets within 30 points of Glencoe today, I will be surprised.

Today's loss will be the first for the Magpies since June and will end a five game winning streak.

Mount Burr got well and truly back in the winners' list in round 16 and Kongorong won't present much of a challenge in round 17.

Cross-town rivals Hatherleigh and Tantanoola meet again and the Tigers will start as favourites.

There is a mathematical possibility of the red-and-whites reaching the finals but it will rely on Glencoe losing both of their remaining minor round games and that simply won't happen.

Without being unkind to Nangwarry, it will be a one-sided contest when Port MacDonnell visits.

ROUND 16 REVIEW

Every week there seems to be a reunion and I wish I could get to them all.

I chose the Tantanoola reunion at Tigerland and saw lots of old-timers from their 1975 premiership team about the place.

Only a few are still in full-time work with plenty of retirement stories on offer.

Some of them should have pulled on the boots and a red-and-white jumper and taken on the Mount Burr Mozzies as they successfully did on grand final day 40 years ago.

The modern-day Tigers were undermanned and the visitors looked to be in control from the get-go.

In the other matches, Robe was not disgraced in being defeated by the team which I feel is certain to win the 2015 premiership.

After the grand final is over next month, the Roosters will appreciate how well they played to boot 16 goals on the home ground of the team which will win the flag.

I looked at the Hatherleigh team listed in The Border Watch on Friday and it looked pretty good.

The brightest point in Kongorong's big home ground loss to Kalangadoo was the 250th A Grade game from Mr Reliable Legh Jenkin.

After all, Legh has met the 250 A Grade game requirement to receive this honour in the Player Life Member category.

There are quite a few others who have well and truly joined this club but not yet been officially honoured with a badge and certificate.

They are current Mount Burr player Dale Bowering, retired Mozzie Scott "Mullet" Bevan and Nangwarry Saint Adam "Herman" Dinnison.

Another couple of recipients in the player/coach league life member category are current Hatherleigh coach Craig Skeer and retired Mozzie supremo Adam Wiese.

As I cast my eyes down the list of

the league player life members, there is still only one involved in A Grade footy in 2015

Nangwarry co-coach Dion Dinnison has gamely pulled on the boots on many weeks as his beloved Saints face an ongoing player shortage.

Michael Jones has switched mid-season from playing to umpiring while Port Mac's Shannon Smith and Nangwarry's Trevor Fenn are active footballers in the Ressies.

Ben Young is an umpire life member and still going well.

Field umpires Kevin Nobes, Barry Nilsson and Neil Webber together with goal umpire Dave Gilbert are also in this category and they are also continuing to give great service to the Mid SE.

Nangwarry president Shane Ploenges is a player life member of the Mid SE and occasionally helps out with some field umpiring in the lead-up games.

The Mid SE life membership is one of the most highly sought after footy honours in this region.

REGIONAL ROYAL COMMISSION

Some information is slowly trickling out about this proposed new body.

There are lots of questions about how it might work.

Will it be an advisory body or will it be a controlling body?

Will the South East Regional Royal Commission have the power to force clubs to merge or tell them where to play?

Who will decide if Millicent wanted to re-join the Mid SE after an absence of 69 years?

Would such a decision rest with the nine Mid SE clubs or the SE Royal Regional Commission?

Would Nangwarry be allowed to keep its jumper, colours and nick-names as they are the same as Millicent?

On the other hand, could the Mid SE's strongest clubs like Glencoe and Mount Burr be sent to play in the WBFL?

These questions might be hypothetical but answers are needed to such scenarios. If you are at all concerned make your feelings known to your club hierarchy and club delegates and league hierarchy.




