Perkins a lesson in persistence

Not much knocks the AFL men's competition off the front page of the paper, especially during the opening round of the season.

But the NAB AFL Women's Grand Final did just that on the weekend, with premier Adelaide - featuring Eastern Devils Swisse VFL Women's draftee Sarah Perkins recognised on the front page of The Age with the headline 'Making HerStory'.

With close to 100 VFL Women's players drafted into the AFL this season, just one now has the title of premiership player, with Perkins to be congratulated on being part of the successful Crows outfit.

Perkins is a great example to up-and-coming female and male players, having been overlooked at the women's draft but making the most of the late lifeline thrown to her by Adelaide to live out her AFL dream.

The TAC Cup regularly provides over 50 per cent of the talent to the AFL at draft time, but it is only a small percentage of players from the competition that are drafted. Each weekend almost 300 players take to the field representing their region, with double that amount on TAC Cup lists. While it is the elite talent that is often focused on in the competition, we should also recognise the role our clubs play in developing future Peter Jackson VFL and local players. The skills learnt at this level are taken back into the community, as the players become leaders from the education and training provided in the TAC Cup.

Talking about leaders, it is pleasing to see 15 AFL captains this season having been drafted out of the TAC Cup, Gippsland is best represented with four former players leading their AFL team and having met in Round 1 – Leongatha duo Dyson Heppell (Essendon) and Jarryd Roughead (Hawthorn), and Robert Murphy (Western Bulldogs) and Scott Pendlebury (Collingwood).

Today we look at the TAC Cup captains that have been named for 2017 in the Record, with those names to possibly join the long list of former TAC Cup players who go on to become AFL captains in the future.

The AFL Victoria Record this week looks at how incoming head coaches Rick Coburn (Bendigo Pioneers), Daniel O'Keefe (Geelong Falcons), Justin Wenke (Northern Knights) and Leigh Clarke (Oakleigh Chargers — pictured) have found their way to some of the TAC Cup's top jobs.

Leigh Clarke's strong sense of connectedness to the **Oakleigh Chargers** is something he hopes to instil in his players as the club's new head coach.

Clarke is the first former player to take the reins at Oakleigh, having been part of the club's inaugural TAC Cup season in 1995 as a 15-year-old. He replaces Michael Stinear, who coached Melbourne in the inaugural AFL Women's season after guiding the Chargers to TAC Cup premierships in 2014-15 and being named the 2016 TAC Cup Coach of the Year.

Clarke left Oakleigh's program as a 16-year-old with the onset of serious foot injuries but returned as a strength and conditioning coach in 2010 after a playing career at local level. He progressed to become a line coach at the Chargers and was set to become Stinear's senior assistant coach for the 2016 season before being appointed as the Richmond VFL team's forwards coach.

"I can see the charm in being back where I started," Clarke said of his new role.

"What I love is the connection around here, and that's what I'm trying to preach to the boys now. It's not just my connection to the club, but there are team managers, property guys and helpers who were here on my first day and are still here now.

"There's some pride in saying they're still involved, I think."

Clarke said Oakleigh's issue of having to deal with the football commitments of private-school boys was another constant from the days of the club's inception, but that sports science and an increasing focus on development had changed the way TAC Cup players were coached.

He said his own coaching style would borrow from the successful approach of Stinear.

"Mick and I were very close," Clarke said. "I was appointed his senior assistant on a Thursday (before the 2016 season) and on the Monday I got the job at Richmond.

"Mick's a very mindful coach. He's got a real kindness and a care in the way he prepares people and treats people on-field and off-field, and that's what I took away from him.

"My coaching philosophy is built around connecting with the players and engaging them. They've been in their own tribe and they're coming to join our tribe now, and I want them to bring all their skills and characteristics to make our tribe better."

The new head coach of the **Northern Knights** certainly isn't new to the TAC Cup – in fact, **Justin Wenke** knows exactly what it takes to reach the competition's pinnacle.

The 42-year-old takes over from three-year Northern coach Andrew Shakespeare after ending his premiership-winning stint as mentor of the Oakleigh Chargers early in the 2014 season.

Wenke guided the Chargers to the 2012 TAC Cup flag from sixth position after the home-and-away season in his first year as head coach. The Chargers then missed the finals in 2013 before Wenke left the club during the following season due to personal reasons.

After three consecutive years without making the finals, the Knights have appointed a coach with a pedigree of TAC Cup success – even if that success was achieved in rather unorthodox circumstances.

"The 2012 Grand Final (against the Gippsland Power) was quite unique because it was won by a golden point," Wenke said.

"I have the memory of (now Western Bulldogs premiership player) Jackson Macrae kicking that point to put us in front and then the siren going. It was quite an amazing feeling."

While he oversaw the top-age years of AFL draftees such as Jack Viney (Melbourne) and Jack Billings (St Kilda), Macrae's rapid progression to become the no.6 pick in the 2012 NAB AFL Draft was one of Wenke's most satisfying stories of player development at Oakleigh.

"Jackson was a boy who didn't make the list as a bottom-age player at the Chargers," Wenke said.
"I'd had a long association with him through the Yarra Junior Football League interleague teams I'd coached, so I knew what he was capable of. He had to work on his kicking a bit, but we put him on the list as a top-ager and he became a really high draft pick.

"The other one was (Macrae's fellow 2016 Bulldogs premiership player) Toby McLean, who was cut at the Dandenong Stingrays and then we brought him in. He was a different sort of character – most of the Chargers boys were private-school boys but Toby had left school.

"Integrating him into the system was a real feather in the cap of the Chargers, to take in a boy that had talent and develop him a little bit, and then he was the best-on-ground medallist on Grand Final day (in 2014) and got drafted really highly.

"They're the success stories you look at, and it's probably why you coach – to pick up the ones that may slide through and give them another chance."

New **Bendigo Pioneers** head coach **Rick Coburn** knows the challenges of being a player for the region's TAC Cup club well.

Coburn played in Bendigo's inaugural TAC Cup match in Round 1 of the 1993 season and is the first former Pioneers player to return to coach the club. He replaces Brett Henderson, who coached Bendigo in 2015-16 and oversaw the development of AFL



draftees such as Tom Cole (West Coast) in 2015 and Joseph Atley (Port Adelaide), Kobe Mutch (Essendon) and Kayle Kirby (Collingwood) in 2016.

The Nyah native used to travel almost 100 kilometres to attend Pioneers training sessions and said understanding the "tyranny of distance" faced by some of his players would be central to his new role.

"It was an exciting period when the competition first started (in 1992)," Coburn said.

"Everything was just coming together almost as a bit of a trial, really. We did a lot of our training at that stage at a place called Nullawil which was pretty much in the middle of the region – it was just a country footy ground with pretty limited resources.

"Boys were coming from left, right and centre to play a series of trial games, with training run out of our regional centres by our football development managers. In some ways, some of those structures are still in place.

"It's come a long way in terms of the professionalism of the program and its delivery, but some of the issues we'll face are still there – the tyranny of distance and being able to manage our boys who are sometimes spread five hours from each other."

Coburn said he'd be a "players' coach", one who'll aim to build strong relationships with players and their families to help them manage the often demanding commitments of the club's program in terms of time and distance travelled.

But he also boasts a strong record in getting the best out of teams on the field, coaching South Bendigo to six Bendigo FNL finals series (including two Grand Finals) in seven years at the club's helm from 2007-13.


"It was a great experience to have my own side for a long period of time," Coburn said.

"I coached there for seven years and played for eight, and to have a long stint at a club you have to constantly reinvent yourself and the list. That probably correlates really well to the Pioneers with new players coming through each year."

Daniel O'Keefe admits there was some romance to his appointment as **Geelong Falcons** head coach.

O'Keefe, only 28 years of age, captained the Falcons to a TAC Cup semi final and won their best-and-fairest award just 10 years ago in 2006.

His love for the club drove O'Keefe to keep in contact with key Geelong figures through the following years – including his three ill-fated seasons on Sydney's AFL list from 2007-09. He did some U16 assistant coaching with the Falcons four years ago before returning in a leadership and development coaching role in 2016.



So when five-year head coach Andrew Allthorpe decided to move on from his role at the end of the last season due to family and work commitments, Talent Manager Michael Turner simply looked within the club's inner sanctum for a suitable replacement.

"To say I'm excited and proud is an understatement," O'Keefe said of his new position.


"I've always held this club dearly to my heart and always followed up with Mick Turner and (my coach in 2006) Garry Hocking when I went up to Sydney. I always wanted to make sure that everything was running smoothly even though I'd left the club.

"My passion for the club is very high – it always has been and always will be. I've always wanted to do something like this, and it's probably happened a little bit sooner than I thought it would but it's very exciting."

O'Keefe's AFL career was ruined by injury and he failed to make his senior debut in three seasons on Sydney's list after being selected at pick no.15 in 2006 AFL Draft. He said the lessons learned as a youngster from Warrnambool struggling to make it at the elite level in another state would help him guide a new generation of AFL aspirants, despite his relatively tender coaching years.

"While it didn't work out how I wanted it to, the three years I had in Sydney taught me a lot in terms of, firstly, growing up, but more importantly about not taking things for granted," O'Keefe said.

"The same goes for the kids at the Falcons – they've only got one, two or three years maximum here. You've really got to make the most of your opportunities because you never know when your last game could be or when you might finish up."



Balta's 2015 season with Essendon Doutta Stars in the Essendon District FL broke him out of a football funk that could have seen the 194cm 17-year-old lost to the game.

His performance in the Stars' under-16 premiership triumph provided the foundation for an impressive 2016 campaign at Calder in which he booted 18 goals in eight games.

Balta's form was recognised late last year with elevation to the AFL Academy alongside junior teammate and good friend Cameron Rayner of the Western Jets.

"It was that game (that changed things) – when something's on the line, I realise how well I can play," Balta said of the under-16 grand final. "Cam got named best-on-ground but all the other boys were saying I should have got it!

"I thought: 'Why can't I play like that all the time?' and then I just started going for it.

"In under-12 football I was a good player, but everyone started to catch up to me and I think it kind of got my head down. I started to become an average player and talked myself down, but I started lifting again and realised what I could do.

"It was that whole under-16 season. I worked with (former Essendon and Geelong ruckman) John Barnes that pre-season – he helped me with my skills and he's very honest with me."

Balta named Barnes as one of the most significant influences on his football career to date, but his addition to an AFL Academy Level Two squad including 22 other TAC Cup players should see a few more influential names added to that list.

Balta attended the Academy's annual highperformance training camp in the United States in January, spending a week training at the IMG Academy in Florida before a further week in Los Angeles under the eyes of former AFL champions such as head coach Luke Power and assistants Brad Johnson, Peter Sumich and Nick Dal Santo.

"They've had the AFL experience and I want to be like them and do what they've done," Balta said of his Academy coaches. "To do that, I've got to listen to what they say and really take it in. "I learnt I could push harder than I thought I could (on the US camp). You think you've got a certain level of potential but then once you think you've reached it, you just blast right past it with an experience like that.

"On one of the big days we had a 3km time trial and then sprints, and a couple of boys –myself included – were really fatigued and we kind of slowed down before the line and had to re-do it.

"Everyone got behind you. From a group that was nothing together (before the camp) to how we've bonded now, it's really something special."

Cannons Talent Manager Ian Kyte has seen Balta fully invest himself in his football during his time at the club, with the resolution of eyesight problems also a key factor in his rise to prominence.

"He's dramatically improved his footy over the last seven or eight months," Kyte said.

"That's been helped by getting contact lenses, so he actually sees the game and what's going on down the other end a lot better than he used to. We've found that's really helped his marking and his depth perception of where the ball is."

Balta only wears the contact lenses while playing football but has noticed he's running under the ball less often and that marks had "started clunking a bit more".

Kyte said Balta would likely be used mostly as a power forward in 2017, but would also pinch-hit in the ruck and "could nearly play as an on-baller, which we did with him a couple of times last year".

No matter where he plays on the field this season, Balta wants to throw everything into making it work. His main goal for 2017 is to be selected by an AFL club come November, but he won't let his head drop if that dream doesn't come to fruition.

"I just want to know I've done the best I could and that I couldn't push any harder," Balta said.

It's a mindset far from the one he was in just a couple of years ago.



TAC Cup Round 1 Review

Highly-rated goalkicker Jaidyn Stephenson helped the Eastern Ranges record their first victory for 2017 when the TAC Cup season kicked off last Friday night under lights at Rams Arena.

Stephenson kicked four goals in the first term as the **Ranges** opened up a match-defining 25-point lead over the **Calder Cannons** by quarter time. The Cannons worked to within 13 points of Eastern during the second stanza but wasted several chances to put the pressure on their opponents in the third, managing only four behinds as the Ranges responded with three majors of their own

While Stephenson finished with five goals, over-ager Jordan Lynch (two goals) and 2016 All Australian ruckman Sam Hayes were also influential as Eastern ran away to a 54-point win.

On Saturday, the **Geelong Falcons** posted their 11th straight opening-round win in defeating the **GWV Rebels** by 82 points at Simonds Stadium.

After an even first quarter, the Falcons exploded with 13 unanswered goals from late in the second term until early in the last to put the Rebels away. David Handley was the biggest star inside 50 for Geelong – booting six majors – while five other Falcons chipped in with two apiece.

Meanwhile, the **Murray Bushrangers** kept a streak of their own alive, winning a 23rd consecutive match against the **Bendigo Pioneers** by 51 points at Punt Road Oval.

The streak dates back to 2004 and was continued on Saturday thanks to Murray's seven-goal-to-one final quarter, which ended Bendigo's hopes after the Pioneers were within 12 points of the lead at the last change. The experience of over-agers Nick Richards (27 disposals) and Ben Paton (23) was crucial for the victors.

Also on Saturday, the **Dandenong Stingrays** held off a fast-finishing **Gippsland Power** outfit to record a 16-point win at Morwell Recreation Reserve.

Led by 30 disposals from AFL Academy midfielder Luke Davies-Uniacke and four goals to Dylan Morris, the Stingrays built a 43-point lead by early in the third quarter. The Power wouldn't be denied though, pushing their opponents until the final siren.

In the first leg of a Sunday double-header at Ikon Park, 2016 TAC Cup premiers the **Sandringham Dragons** started the new season as they ended the last, accounting for the **Oakleigh Chargers** by 55 points.



Bottom-age AFL Academy key-position player Max King was a colossus up forward for the victors – clunking four contested marks and booting four goals – while Andrew Brayshaw (25 disposals), Charlie Constable (24) and Alfie Jarnestrom (22) were Sandringham's chief ball-winners.

Wrapping up Round 1 in the second leg of the double-header, the **Northern Knights** denied a gallant **Western Jets** outfit by 16 points in an entertaining contest.

After conceding the first five goals of the game, the Jets drew level by three-quarter time only for Knights captain and regular half-back Nick Coffield to go forward and bag three final-term majors (four for the game) to secure the win for his team.

TAC Cup club captains

The best young leaders in the TAC Cup have been named their clubs' captains for 2017.

The **Bendigo Pioneers** will be led by Balranald product **Laine Fitzgerald**, who finished equal-second in the club's best-and-fairest award as a bottom-ager last year.

Tough midfielder **Brad Bernacki** will skipper the **Calder Cannons**. The East Sunbury junior finished third in the club's best-and-fairest count behind subsequent AFL Rookie Draft picks Ben Ronke and Zach Guthrie.

Langwarrin product **Josh Bateman** and Berwick junior **Oscar Clavarino** will jointly captain the Dandenong Stingrays, while Clavarino's fellow AFL Academy member **Joel Garner** – a mid-forward from Wandin – will lead the **Eastern Ranges**.

The **Geelong Falcons** have named three captains: Queenscliff over-ager **Charlie Francis**, Colac defender/ midfielder **Cooper Stephens** and AFL Academy onballer **James Worpel** from Bell Park.

The AFL Academy's **Aidan Quigley** – a Yinnar product – will skipper the **Gippsland Power**, over-ager **Callan Wellings** (Trentham) will take the reins at the **GWV Rebels** and the **Murray Bushrangers** have named a four-player leadership group consisting of **Will Donaghey** (Wodonga Bulldogs), **Daniel Johnston** (Barooga), **Harrison Jones** (Wodonga Bulldogs) and **Alex Paech** (North Albury).

The **Northern Knights** will be led by skilful defender **Nicholas Coffield** from Eltham, with the **Oakleigh Chargers** to be captained by key forward **Toby Wooller** of Old Scotch.

AFL Academy key forward **Hayden McLean** (Beaumaris) will skipper the **Sandringham Dragons**, while the **Western Jets** will have joint-captains for 2017 in **Luke Hitch** (Keilor) and **Nicholas Stuhldreier** (Bacchus Marsh).

TAC Cup players in U18 Academy Series

Several TAC Cup players are playing for the GWS Academy team in the new AFL U18 Academy Series, which launched last weekend.

The Academy Series has replaced Division 2 of the NAB AFL U18 Championships, with NSW-ACT replaced by the GWS and Sydney Academy teams and Queensland replaced by the Brisbane and Gold Coast Academy teams. The Northern Territory and Tasmania will remain as participants in the five-round competition.

The GWS Academy kicked off its campaign with a four-point loss to the Sydney Academy, 12.14 (86) to 12.10 (82), in Blacktown on Sunday. Highly-rated **Murray Bushrangers** midfielder/forward **Charlie Spargo** was named among the GWS Academy's best players after racking up a game-high 24 disposals and kicking a goal.

The GWS Academy will now face the Gold Coast Academy in Blacktown on Saturday, then Tasmania in Hobart on Saturday April 8, NT in NSW on Saturday April 29 and the Brisbane Academy in Broadbeach on Saturday May 6.

Mitchell vaults into TAC Cup Girls

For someone boasting a rich football bloodline, it could be said Chelsea Mitchell has embraced the game surprisingly late in life.

The 18-year-old Oakleigh Chargers TAC Cup Girls player is the daughter of former Sydney, Collingwood and Carlton ball-winner Barry Mitchell and the sister of current Hawthorn midfielder Tom Mitchell.

But instead of following her famous family members onto the football field, Chelsea pursued elite-level gymnastics for most of her early life.

After eight years in the sport – and at times training up to 30 hours per week – Mitchell decided it was time for a change. Having only started playing school football last year, she's now on Oakleigh's inaugural TAC Cup Girls list and has played in the club's first two matches for 2017.

"I did elite gymnastics for about eight years," Mitchell said. "I never really did a ball sport until about Year 9 when I started netball, and now I'm playing footy.

"I injured my elbow (while doing gymnastics) and I just hadn't been doing anything on it for about a year. I was a bit behind everyone else and it was just getting a bit tough mentally to try and keep up. I did love it but I just started to lose love for the sport.

"Australia isn't really up there with the big countries in gymnastics like America, China and Russia, but it was still hard work. It's really helped me to be determined and I think it's really helped me learn how to work hard and be disciplined."

Mitchell's determined nature comes out on the football field, with her competitiveness her biggest strength – "i'll always go for the ball," she says.

The 170cm midfielder has also been used by Chargers coach Luke O'Shannessy in the back line but said that wherever she played, her immediate focus was on improving her skills.

To that end, it helps having a father who played 221 AFL games from 1984-96 and a brother who last year starred in his 65th and final game for Sydney – the club's 22-point AFL Grand Final loss to the Western Bulldogs.

Having Tom back in Victoria after he was traded to the Hawks over the off-season helped Chelsea prepare for her TAC Cup Girls debut.




"All summer I was doing work with my brother and dad, trying to improve," she said. "It was really good to have them around, teaching me the ways of how to play.

"Tom tells me about proper ways of kicking and good strategies like the switch and how to defend. I love having him home.

"I honestly thought the Swans were going to win (the Grand Final). I had it in my head that they were going to win so it was a bit of a shock when they didn't, but Tom was so good about it. He knows he did his best so that's all we can really ask from him."

As she continues her rapid transition to a new sport though, Chelsea might find herself asking a bit more from her accomplished football sibling.

Murray Bushrangers over-ager and North Albury junior **Ben Paton** was a constant thorn in the side of the Bendigo Pioneers during

his team's 51-point victory in Round 1. Paton had a round-high 11 rebound-50s among his 23 disposals, which equated to him personally repelling almost a third of Bendigo's 36 inside-50 entries for the match.

The boot of **Jackson Ross** (an Old Haileybury junior) was a big reason for the **Eastern Ranges** recording a +33 advantage in inside-50s (62-29) in a 54-point triumph over the Calder Cannons. The athletic 192cm former elite tennis player unleashed 18 kicks against the Cannons, seven of which drove the Ranges inside 50 – a team high.

The tall timber of the **Geelong Falcons** stood strong in an 82-point win over the GWV Rebels. **Adam Garner** (194cm), **Tom McCartin** (192cm), **Rick Read** (192cm) and **Jordon Reid** (194cm) all took three or more contested marks against the Rebels, while 181cm **David Handley** (a Geelong West Giants junior) took three himself and also booted six goals.

Dragons keep flame burning

The 2016 TAC Cup premiers have started the new season as they finished the last.

Having claimed their third flag in September and produced five of the first 11 picks at the 2016 NAB AFL Draft in November, the Sandringham Dragons began 2017 with a comprehensive 54-point victory over the Oakleigh Chargers at Ikon Park in Round 1.

During last year's run to the premiership from fifth on the ladder after the home-and-away season, it was the work of talented midfielders such as Andrew McGrath (AFL Draft pick no.1 to Essendon), Tim Taranto (no.2 to GWS), Will Setterfield (no.5 to GWS), Oliver Florent (no.11 to Sydney) and Corey Lyons (no.71 to Brisbane) who drove the Dragons forward to success.

And on the evidence so far this year, it seems Sandringham has assembled a similarly broad range of on-ball threats.

The Chargers had more disposals and took more marks than the Dragons on Sunday, but the reigning premiers booted nine more goals than their opponents thanks to dominance in the contests.

Sandringham won the clearance count 40-28 on the back of eight players having three or more clearances. In fact, only five of 23 Dragons players didn't record a clearance

Pocket rockets Lucas Barrett and Lachlan Harris (four clearances each) led the way, while Andrew Brayshaw, Charlie Constable, Alfie Jarnestrom, Kai Owens, Will Walker and Sebastian Williams all recorded three.

Their work in winning the ball and driving it forward created opportunities for big men **Max King** (four contested marks, four goals), **Isaac Morrisby** (two goals) and **Hayden McLean** (one goal) to use their height to advantage and capitalise inside 50.

A midfield topped with star talent will take a team a long way – look at Geelong's 2016 AFL preliminary-final campaign with Joel Selwood and Patrick Dangerfield leading the way.

But midfield depth underneath the top tier will invariably take a team further. Last year's AFL premiers the Western Bulldogs and their army of quick, brave and skilful on-ballers are evidence of that.

Victoria finalises AFL National Diversity rep squads

Victoria has finalised its Kickstart and All Nations representative squads ahead of the 2017 AFL National Diversity Championships this month.

Following a successful state leadership camp in Halls Gap, 41 of Victoria's best U15 Indigenous and Multicultural players will pull on the Big-V jumper and travel to Blacktown, Sydney for the National Diversity Championships from April 8-13.

Held annually, the National Diversity Championships provide a unique opportunity for 213 participants from culturally diverse backgrounds to represent their state and compete for the coveted Kickstart and All Nations titles.

For the first time, Victoria will enter standalone representative state sides in the competition following AFL Tasmania's decision to submit its inaugural state teams.

A host of talented young indigenous stars from across regional Victoria form the final 22-player Kickstart squad, with AFL South East (five), AFL Goldfields (four) and AFL Goulburn Murray (four) leading the way with the most representatives.

10 different AFL Victoria regions are included in the final 19-player All Nations squad, with five players selected from Northern Victoria, followed by AFL South East, south west and AFL Goldfields with two players each.

Nine different nationalities are represented in the All Nations squad with players from India, Vietnam, Lebanon, Japan, South Sudan, Philippines, Mauritius, New Zealand and Nigeria making up the list.

Leading Victoria's representative squads for the first time are coaches Jamie Pi (All Nations) and Peter Dye (Kickstart).

While being new to the roles this season, AFL Victoria Indigenous Programs Manager Aaron Davey said both men were the right fit to lead the next generation of Victorian Indigenous and Multicultural talent.

"Both Peter and Jamie bring a wealth of experience to the group, having been involved in football for a number of years," Davey said.

"Participation in our Kickstart and All Nation squads is an important step for the development of more Indigenous and Multicultural talent seen at the elite level and we are proud to provide our players with the tools to tackle any challenge life throws at them, both on and off the field.

"All our coaches understand the importance of embracing our cultural heritage and Jamie and Peter's guidance will help players return to their respective communities as young leaders and role models for their peers.


