Representative opportunities

It's great to have the season underway in both the Peter Jackson VFL and TAC Cup for 2017.

Strong crowds greeted the six matches across the Easter weekend in the VFL and we welcomed back the Channel 7 broadcast games – in the new Saturday afternoon timeslot – with an average viewership of 45,000.

With the season now in full swing, we have a number of representative squads being named over the next month. It begins with the Vic Country and Vic Metro U18 and U16 Academy squads for TAC Cup players, as well as the Country and Metro squads for the TAC Cup Girls.

For all players selected in these initial squads, grasp the opportunity to learn and develop your game. You will have the chance to train with some of the best players in the competition and hear from a number of new coaches, so make the most of it. Whether you make the final squad or not, know that you have been given an opportunity that is not offered to every player in the competition, so absorb as much as you can to help further your game when you return to football at local or TAC Cup level.

At VFL level, we host the WAFL on May 27 at North Port Oval, with the initial squad to be named next week. State representative football is a rare commodity at senior level now, so it provides an opportunity for a number of VFL-listed players to showcase their skills at the highest level possible. Casey coach Justin Plapp has been handed the reins of the state team this year, attempting to return the first win for the VFL since beating the TSFL in 2012.

We look forward to seeing these squads announced and wish everyone involved all the best on the training track leading up to final selections.

Metro's mix of old and new



Martin Allison coaching Vic Metro in 2013

Martin Allison first coached the Vic Metro Academy for a year in 2013, and with the program now undergoing change at the top, his steady hand has been passed the “keys to the Ferrari” once again.

Allison took a talented Vic Metro group to within one win of the 2013 NAB AFL U18 Championships crown, narrowly losing only once – to eventual title-winners South Australia in the carnival’s defining match.

Back then, he was guiding the likes of the subsequent top three picks at the 2013 AFL Draft – Tom Boyd (ex-Eastern Ranges), Josh Kelly (ex-Sandringham Dragons) and Jack Billings (ex-Oakleigh Chargers) – in their football development.

Today, the Academy is being headed by former 228-game AFL player and dual North Melbourne premiership forward **Brett Allison**, who this year became AFL Victoria’s Metro Talent Pathways Manager.

With new blood at the top, Martin Allison’s experience in the Metro program will be highly valued.

He previously took the Calder Cannons to TAC Cup premierships in 2009 and 2010 before coaching Metro in 2013. Allison then worked at Essendon developing the likes of AFL father-son prospects Jake Long and Tom Wallis as well as the club’s Irish recruit Conor McKenna before returning to Metro as an assistant coach under David Flood last year.

When Flood – named the 2016 U18 All Australian coach for taking Metro to last year’s U18 Championships title – moved on, Allison was called on to assume the driver’s seat.

“I see myself as one of the luckiest coaches in Victoria,” Allison said. “I’m given the best players in metropolitan Melbourne, and they listen, they want to learn and they want to get better.

“I compare it sometimes to someone giving me the keys to a brand new Ferrari and they say: ‘Drive this around for a couple of months, go as fast as you like, go as far as you want, push it beyond limits and give the keys back when you’re finished – just don’t break it!’”

Martin Allison said this year’s Metro model isn’t exceptionally tall or fast, but that quick ball movement would be the name of its game. It reflects a subtle change in his approach to coaching since he last held the reins at Metro.

“I’d like to think my style has changed,” Allison said. “I’m watching AFL footy evolve and I think we need to evolve with it, so we want to be a more attacking team.

“We’ll still defend with a lot of vigour but hopefully we’ll play with a lot more flair and willingness to attack than when I last coached Metro. The coaches want to create an environment where players feel they can play with a lot more freedom.”

Martin Allison said players such as Western Jets midfielder/forward Cameron Rayner and Eastern teammates Joel Garner and Adam Cerra were among

those to have impressed him early in Metro's training program.

And Brett Allison backed his head coach to get the best out of them.

"Marty's a real people person and a really good communicator," he said. "He builds good relationships with the players, is able to talk to them on their level and from what I've seen they feel really comfortable with him.

"He knows the system pretty well and I thought with myself coming on board and not having a great deal of experience in how it all runs, it was pretty important to have some people involved who have had the experience and know how to run the program."

Brett Allison said it was important that former Western Bulldogs player **Steve Wallis** and current Director of Coaching at Eastern **Michael Rizio** were continuing as Metro assistant coaches in 2017, while Carlton AFL Women's and Sandringham line coach **Jackson Kornberg** and Uni Blues (VAFA) senior coach **Quinton Gleeson** have also joined Metro as assistants.

Allison said his experience of developing players in the AFL system – at Sydney from 2001-09, North

Melbourne from 2010-13 and Melbourne from 2014-16 – meant he can prepare Metro players for exactly what they'll face if they eventually join AFL clubs.

"I think I have a good idea of the challenges players face once they get to an AFL club," Allison said.

"That's one of the things I hope to make a difference in – to make it easier for them to transition from the TAC Cup to AFL level. It's a pretty big step and I think a lot of the players feel they have a good understanding of how different it'll be, but in reality that's not the case."

Working under Paul Roos in a successful era at the Swans, Brett Allison played a part in developing players such as Nick Malceski (ex-Eastern) and Nick Smith (Oakleigh) into AFL premiership players and All Australians.

At Melbourne, he worked with recent high draft picks Christian Petracca (ex-Eastern), Angus Brayshaw (Sandringham) and Sam Weideman (Eastern), who are starting to form the core of one of the AFL's most promising teams.

This year's Vic Metro representatives will hope both Allisons can help them get to a similar position in years to come.



Captain Curren comfortable at Sandy

One of Sandringham's prized recruits for the 2017 Peter Jackson VFL season would actually know more about the club than many of his teammates – and he's now their new captain.



Having played 69 senior games for the Zebras while an AFL player over the last six seasons (and winning their best-and-fairest award in 2012), delisted St Kilda midfielder Tom Curren shunned the prospect of seeking a new football environment to sign with the Saints' VFL affiliate this year.

The 24-year-old managed only 25 AFL games after being selected as a rookie at the end of 2010, struggling to win prolonged opportunities at the elite level due to St Kilda's depth of talented young midfielders and various injuries.

Having put the disappointment of his delisting behind him, the Mt Eliza and Dandenong Stingrays product has accepted a two-day-a-week placement working with the Saints' strength and conditioning staff while completing a university course in exercise science.

"Being delisted is obviously something you're not going to be thrilled about, particularly if you feel like you've still got a bit to offer," Curren said. "More often than not (delisted players) do move on to a fresher environment, but I was really happy with the relationships I had at the club.

"I found out Lindsay Gilbee was going to be the senior coach and the strength and conditioning staff know me and my body and my history. I just felt like it was right. I spoke to a few other clubs, but at the end of the day I just had to go with my heart because I really couldn't picture myself playing in another jumper.

"The placement played a small part too... I'll try and help whoever's in St Kilda's rehab group. I've been

there a little bit myself the last couple of years so I know what it's like. I was heavily interested in strength and conditioning while I was playing with the Saints and it's something I'd like to pursue long-term."

Curren had to focus on his own rehabilitation over the off-season after breaking his wrist in Sandringham's 46-point semi-final loss to Williamstown, while he also had post-season surgery on his quad.

But having returned to full training shortly after Christmas, Curren's standard-setting during the pre-season saw him rewarded with the captaincy position vacated by the departed Trent Dennis-Lane.

He said the role wouldn't change what earned him the honour in the first place – the disciplined way he conducts himself on and off the field.

On the field, Curren expects to be employed in his usual on-ball role with the capacity to go forward and hit the scoreboard, while new Zebras senior coach Gilbee said his skipper's professionalism off the field had made him a stand-out leadership option.

"It was just a perfect fit all-round," Gilbee said of Curren's appointment as captain. "Tom's a local person and he's just a professional on all fronts in how he prepares and how he goes about his football.

"He leaves no stone unturned, and even though he's not on an AFL list anymore, how he's conducted himself and how he's presented himself this year has been outstanding.

"He's been a true leader ever since he walked into the club last year."

A big crowd turned out at North Port Oval for Port Melbourne's 'Call to Arms' Day and Borough champion Chris Cain's 175th senior match, which earned him VFL life membership. Port opened up a scrappy contest by kicking three unanswered goals in the second term to take a 22-point lead into half time, with Jordan Lisle then booting six second-half goals to ensure victory for the home team.

This was extended to 10 points before the Hawks went on a four-goal run to race out to a 14-point lead 25 minutes into the final stanza. The Bulldogs answered with two late goals but Box Hill had done enough.

Christian Burgess put the Lions in front for the first time at the 22-minute mark of the final term but Collingwood defender Jordan Kelly regained the lead for the Magpies with a goal minutes later, and they desperately held on in the dying minutes to win.

The home team restricted Essendon to just one goal in the first half but had to hold off the fast-finishing Bombers, who kicked seven of the game's last 11 goals to fall short by just seven points.

Marcon the missing link?

Could last year's top-ranked team for contested possessions and clearances per game have an even stronger midfield in 2017?

With the return of 2015 Williamstown premierships on-baller **Adam Marcon** to Burbank Oval after a season on Richmond's AFL rookie list, the Seagulls look ominous.

The 2015 Fothergill-Round Medallist dominated in a 23-point win against the Casey Demons in Round 1, racking up game-highs of 32 disposals, 21 contested possessions and 13 clearances, while also laying 12 tackles and kicking a goal.

Williamstown lost the uncontested possession count by 103 to the Demons – last year's premier team for finding the ball in space – and also gave up 54 more marks. But as is their style, the Seagulls recorded more contested possessions (21), clearances (10) and tackles (44) than their opponents.

The usual suspects of **Michael Gibbons** (27 disposals), **Willie Wheeler** (25), **Ed Carr** (21) and **Ben Jolley** (20) were also amongst Williamstown's top ball-winners on Monday, but Marcon could be the difference-maker senior coach Andy Collins wanted after defeat at the hands of Casey in last year's preliminary final.

"We probably lacked a bit of versatility in the midfield last year," Collins said earlier in 2017. "But this year we've got a lot more versatility, with (recruited players) Ben Cavarra (10 disposals, one goal against the Demons), Jason Pongracic and Corey Yeo, as well as Adam Marcon.

"Towards the end of the season we got beaten by bigger bodies in there. (Melbourne's) Clayton Oliver was really good for Casey in our preliminary-final loss as was Koby Stevens when we played Footscray, but we feel we're better equipped this year."

Further improvement from **Jack Dorgan** (18 disposals, 10 tackles and one goal against the Demons) and **Brett Bewley** (17 disposals, nine tackles) will only increase the midfield riches at Collins' disposal, while the changes to the third man up rule means they'll all be better served by big man **Nick Meese**.

With pure one-on-one ruck contests guaranteed, Meese had 67 hitouts (and a round-high 14 tackles) opposed to Cameron Pedersen and Declan Keilty on Monday.

The Northern Blues scored just eight goals from 52 inside-50s against **Port Melbourne** and a big reason for that was **Brody**

Mihocek. The Borough's 2016 best-and-fairest was a wall in defence in his team's win, recording game-highs of 13 marks (five contested) and seven rebound-50s among his 27 disposals.

Geelong lost several important statistical categories relating to the contests in its triumph

TAC Cup Round 3 Review

The TAC Cup recognised ‘Drive to the Game’ Round two weeks ago, with the centrepiece being a triple-header of games between country teams at Queen Elizabeth Oval.

The **Gippsland Power** used the occasion to notch their first win of 2017, knocking off home-town team the **Bendigo Pioneers** (1-2) by 26 points.

Gippsland engineered a 54-point turnaround in the second half after going into the long break 28 points behind a Pioneers team missing five NAB AFL Academy members who played at the MCG the following day.

Stand-in Power captain Will Stephenson (replacing AFL Academy member Aidan Quigley) sparked the comeback with two goals to start the third quarter and added another shortly before the last change to put his team 12 points in front. Nick Hogan (32 disposals, nine clearances) continued finding the ball in the clinches as Gippsland sealed victory in the final stanza.

The **Geelong Falcons** continued their barnstorming undefeated start to the season by defeating the **Murray Bushrangers** (2-1) by 54 points in the second leg of the country triple-header.

The Falcons are the TAC Cup’s highest-scoring outfit and showed their potency in the second half, exploding with nine unanswered goals to turn around a one-point deficit at the main break. Gryan Miers and Lachlan Noble each kicked two goals in the second-half onslaught, while Cassidy Parish (29 disposals) and Harry Benson (27) were Geelong’s major ball-winners.

In the third game of the triple-header, the **Dandenong Stingrays** (2-1) continued the **GWV Rebels’** winless start to 2017 with a hard-fought 20-point win.

As rain hit in Bendigo, the Stingrays swam to a 54-point lead at half time thanks to an eight-goal-to-one first quarter. Bottom-age forwards Jai Nanscawen and Bailey Williams both had three goals by the long break, while Mitch Cotter (27 disposals, eight clearances for the game) started things in the middle. The Rebels worked to within 14 points of the lead midway through the last quarter but Dandenong steadied late.

Meanwhile, the undefeated **Sandringham Dragons**

joined Geelong at the top of the ladder in recording a 64-point triumph over the **Western Jets** (1-2) at Burbank Oval.

Isaac Morrisby and Aaron Trusler were weapons inside 50 for the Dragons with four goals each, while Andrew Brayshaw (26 disposals, 11 tackles, 10 clearances) was influential in the contests.

The **Northern Knights** (2-1) were spurred to victory over the **Eastern Ranges** (1-2) at Preston City Oval by six goals from Joel Naylor.

The 190cm Whittlesea junior had five majors by half time when the Knights had opened up a 17-point lead. The Ranges were gallant after the main break but fell short by 15 points.

In the final match of Round 3, the **Oakleigh Chargers** (2-1) finished strong at Rams Arena to consign the **Calder Cannons** to a third defeat for 2017.

The Chargers booted five goals to two in the last quarter to run away with a 43-point win, with Charlie Whitehead slotting four majors for the game.

AFL Academy games

A group of TAC Cup players have stepped out for the NAB AFL Academy in games at AFL grounds over the last two weeks.

The Academy celebrated its 20th anniversary with an intra-Academy match at the MCG on Sunday April 9, when the competing teams were named after former AFL Academy and TAC Cup players Joe Daniher (ex-Calder Cannons/now Essendon) and Jacob Weitering (ex-Dandenong Stingrays/now Carlton).

The Academy then faced Peter Jackson VFL team the Northern Blues at Etihad Stadium last Saturday, with Western Jets midfielder/forward Cameron Rayner appointed captain of the Academy team for the night.

TAC Cup Girls flag**

The Calder Cannons completed a clean sweep of the five-round TAC Cup Girls competition to claim the inaugural title.

Calder and the Murray Bushrangers both finished the season with five wins from as many matches but the Cannons were awarded the premiership cup with a superior percentage of 412 compared to 232.

Led by Melbourne Uni VFL Women's and Collingwood AFL Women's player Alicia Eva as coach, the Cannons won their final match in convincing fashion, defeating the Bendigo Pioneers by 63 points. Chloe Molloy again led the way up forward with three goals, finishing with 20 majors for the season to win the competition's leading goalkicker award. She also shared the inaugural best-and-fairest award with Dandenong Stingrays player Bridie Kennedy.

With a fifth win in the bank, Calder needed to wait the result of Murray's clash with the Oakleigh Chargers before having the title win confirmed. The Chargers denied the Bushrangers any chance of stealing the title away from the Cannons by leading for three quarters, before Murray kicked three second-half goals to win by four points. Grace Egan was the best for the Bushrangers and completed a successful season by finishing sixth in the competition best-and-fairest.

In other results:

- The Northern Knights won a fourth straight game to finish fourth on the ladder with a 10-point victory over the Dandenong Stingrays. Leading by 16

points at half-time, the Knights had to overcome a third-quarter revival by the Stingrays, who took a four-point lead into the final term. The Knights steadied though, kicking the first three goals of the last quarter to claim the win.

- The Eastern Ranges finished strongly with an 82-point win over the Gippsland Power. Lilly Kelly kicked three goals with Melanie Hogg named best-on-ground.
- The GWV Rebels secured a 56-point win in the final round, leading from start to finish against the Sandringham Dragons. Cecilia Lowrey kicked three goals for the Rebels.
- The Geelong Falcons finished in third spot after a 42-point win over the Western Jets. Lucy McEvoy and Olivia Purcell were among the best for the Falcons, and finished fourth and eighth respectively in the TAC Cup Girls best-and-fairest.

End of dark Knights

The Northern Knights have endured three particularly dark years, but the club looks to be emerging into the light.

The Knights finished 10th in 2014 (with a record of 6-11), 10th in 2015 (4-13) and 12th in 2016 (4-12) after reaching a semi final in 2013, but a 2-1 start to 2017 and a list full of talent will have them thinking of a return to September action.

Northern was dominant in the early days of the TAC Cup. The Knights won four consecutive premierships from 1993-96 but haven't reached a Grand Final since, and Talent Manager Rhy Gieschen said earlier this year it was time for a change.

"We want to bring the Knights back to being one of the stronger TAC Cup regions," Gieschen said. "Going through a pretty poor year last year has probably really galvanised the playing group and they want to have some more on-field success.

"About midway through last year we made a real effort to put time and effort into some of our bottom-age players – they played every game when they were available for us and in key roles. We think that will hold us in pretty good stead this year."

That effort to blood bottom-age players in 2016 is bearing fruit now.

2017 captain **Nick Coffield** played every game last year and the rebounding defender became the match-winning forward in Northern's 16-point victory over the Western Jets in Round 1, booting four second-half goals to go with his 22 disposals.

In the same game, **Marcus Lentini** (13 games in 2016) had a match-high 31 disposals, while **Alex Federico** (eight games) was influential in the contests with 22 disposals and seven clearances and **Patrick Naish** (nine games) dynamic inside 50 with two goals.

Two weeks ago against the Eastern Ranges, **Joel Naylor** (nine games in 2016) was the hero of Northern's 15-point victory with six goals. **Ethan Penrith** (17 games) had a round-high 13 tackles and **Jack Petruccelle** – who burst onto the scene in two games late in 2016 – had 19 disposals and six inside-50s.

Gieschen's investment in the future late last year may yet take the club back to the glories of its past.

The **Gippsland Power** marked and disposed of the ball less than Bendigo in their 26-point Round 3 victory over the Pioneers, but did the tough stuff better with 17 more contested possessions and eight more clearances. Sale junior **Nick Hogan** (16 contested possessions and nine clearances) and Traralgon product **Nick Lowden** (13 and six) were the Power's best in the clinches.

The **Sandringham Dragons** effectively monopolised possession in their 64-point win against the Western Jets. Last year's premiers had 73 more uncontested marks and 134 more uncontested possessions than the Jets, with Old Brighton junior **Quintin Montanaro** finding the space to rack up round-highs of 10 uncontested marks and 21 uncontested possessions.

The **Dandenong Stingrays** proved the benefit of accurate kicking for goal in their 20-point triumph over the GWV Rebels, getting the win despite having the same number of shots on goal (16.6 to 12.10). Rosebud product **Jai Nanscawen** (4.1) and Crib Point junior **Bailey Williams** (three goals straight) were Dandy's chief dead-eyes.

Nine Vics selected in Boomerangs and World Team squads



Nine of Victoria's top Under-15 Indigenous and multicultural players have been selected to the national Flying Boomerangs and World Team squads to compete at the 2017 NAB AFL Under-16 Championships on the Gold Coast in July.

Selected by AFL Club recruiters following the 2017 AFL National Male Diversity Championships held in Blacktown last week, the respective squads of 25 young men have been chosen based on school attendance, leadership skills and football ability.

Of the nine Victorian representatives, five players from regional Victoria will form part of the Indigenous Flying Boomerangs squad, while four fellow statesmen join the World Team squad.

AFL South East has the most players represented across the two squads with two players, ahead of AFL Barwon, AFL Gippsland, AFL Western District, AFL Goulburn Murray, AFL Goldfields, northern and south-west regions each with one representative.

AFL Victoria Diversity Talent Manager Chris Johnson said the future for Indigenous and multicultural players in Victoria is bright, following a solid performance at the AFL National Diversity Championships.




