Treasurer's Report.

It is with great pleasure that I present my third treasurer's report covering season 2011.

For all members we are again pleased to present a full set of audited results for this season, they are included for your perusal in this report.

I would like to highlight some areas regarding the financial performance of our club.

The final result shows a trading loss of \$25,003.

This season has been the toughest I have had as a Treasurer at any club and the daily reconciliations and money chasing to ensure that all our suppliers, players and others were paid was very demanding. However with the support of Quonny we got there.

The move to Hughes Park had a double effect. In round figures we lost \$10k in kennel club membership and our costs went up \$12k for Hughes Park costs. Also after match bar takings were down on normal Cheong home match days with player costs going up \$15k.

Bar – we are indebted to Kate Timms and all the volunteers who work behind the bar. The bar achieved a margin increase on lower takings.

Canteen – The canteen figures include match day, match day BBQ and Thursday night teas. Again we have wonderful support Kerryn Nixon and all Thursday night helpers and the "Burger BBQ Crew". The total result was a profit increase of \$1,841 over last season.

Social Functions – Here we must thank Tracey Adams for all her work in not only running the social functions but raising the standard in delivering quality functions for all members and players. Also special thanks to Fitzy and Disco for their wonderful work with the "Ipod Shuffle" night, which was a huge success.

Gate Takings - With the move to Hughes Park one area of improvement was the gate takings. We are indebted to Robin King and all his helpers for getting the fence up at home games. Gate takings were up by \$4,285.

Merchandise – Bryan King rules this area with an iron fist and makes a treasurer's job easy as he notes and collects everything, add to this the Toyota sponsorship the merchandise area had a good year – thanks Bryan.

NEXT season - I think we are all glad that 2011 is behind us and we can now come back home and give 2012 a real shake.

However, to be more successful in first division we need to raise the bar and find an increase in revenue that will help bring a consistent first division status. Also maybe a change of culture – "What can I do for South Croydon" rather than "What can South Croydon do for me".

Finally I would like to thank my wife Dianne, This season has not been easy but she has supported me all the way. I could not have continued as treasurer without her! – Thanks.
