President's Report

This year was definitely an interesting year with some great highs and some equally great lows. It was certainly great to be back home at Cheong Park on the new surface and in our own environment. We had a solid pre-season and everybody's expectations were that we would definitely improve on the 2011 season. The season certainly started and finished positively but was extremely difficult if not disappointing through-out the majority of the middle of the year.

The veterans had another enjoyable year under coach Dale White. They were keen to push the philosophy of participation and fitness and this worked well. The team only had one win for the season but all in all they really enjoyed themselves. Off the field the veterans were well organized and I commend them on the way they operated through-out the season and all the help they gave to our treasurer to make life easy for him. The veterans 'recruiting' programme is again well under way with whispers aplenty of some legendary past players getting involved next season.

The Under 19's again had a tough year with only the 2 wins for the season. This year the players showed great commitment to the club and their coach and team-mates. Thanks and well done to Ash Fullarton on all his efforts as the Under 19's coach this year and as assistant coach over the 2 years prior to that. He has been dedicated and hard working through extremely tough times and done a terrific job. He has continued to instil the values we hold



highly, which is that our club comes first before the individual. Again we hope many of Ash's players will go on to be successful senior players at South Croydon well into the future. Well done to all the Under 19's support staff that helped out during the season.

The reserves had an indifferent year winning 6 of their 18 games. The season started off with a bang as they thumped Croydon in the opening game and had 3 wins up

by round 5 but struggled for consistency for the rest of the year. Probably the most pleasing thing again was the fact that many of the reserve players got opportunities to play senior football in 2012 and this will make them better players for the future. Well done to Matt Higgins on his first job as coach. I am sure it was a great learning experience for him and his enthusiasm and dedication to the reserves team was first rate. We now need the regular reserves players to lift their effort and work rate to a level that will improve the club. If we can build a strong reserves list for 2013 with lots of pressure to get senior spots our club will definitely improve. Again, well done to all of Higgo's support staff on their great contributions each week.

The seniors had what I would call a very disappointing year with only 4 wins and finished in 11th place. We started the season well with a Round 1 victory over Croydon at Cheong Park to retain the Arndale Cup. Round 3 saw another home victory over Lilydale and things were going well with high spirits and energy around the club. We then went on a horror run losing 11 games in a row. The first 6 of these losses we were very competitive in every game yet couldn't get the job done. In Round 9 we managed to cough up a 30 point lead over the top of the table Norwood and went down by 2 points. In Round 10 we had a 50 point loss to the previously winless Croydon and lost the Arndale Cup. This was followed by a big loss to Vermont and a thumping at the hands of Lilydale.

At this point I felt that changes needed to be made immediately for the betterment of the clubs future. I went to the committee and asked them to support me in changing the senior coach. The committee were fully supportive of MY DECISION and I sincerely thank them for that support. It was not an easy job asking the senior coach Ben Delarue to step down after 2 ³/₄ years in the role but was necessary. Ben graciously accepted the decision and then spoke to the playing group and coaching staff before departing. I sincerely thank Ben, Lori and his entire family on their involvement and commitment with our club. I certainly hope that sometime in the future they come back and support us as they are always welcome.

Next I asked assistant coach Damien Franken if he would be prepared to step up as the interim senior coach for the remainder of the year. After he assessed what commitment was required for the role he accepted the position wholeheartedly. We knew it wasn't going to be an easy job for the final 6 weeks of the season but we put in place a plan with the aim / expectation of winning 3 of the final 6 games. Damien along with his assistant coaches in Noel King, Darren Cameron and Ben Osborne did a wonderful job through-out this period to firstly build up the player's confidence again so they were enjoying themselves and then get the right team set-up and game style in place which allowed us to be more competitive. In Round 15 we finally got back on the winners list at Cheong Park with a 25 point victory over East Ringwood to regain the Mason-Glenn Bendigo Bank Shield. We finished the season with a Round 18 thumping of Blackburn by 39 points at Cheong Park to finish the season in a very positive manner.

We then had a big end of season celebration at the I-Pod Shuffle Night which was an excellent way to finish what was otherwise a disappointing season for the club on the field. 4 wins for the season was certainly a backwards step in 2012 and should not be accepted.

On the committee front I would again like to personally thank all members of the club committee on their wonderful efforts and commitment to the club for the season gone. The committee member's tireless work ethic and devotion to our club is inspiring. Special thanks need to go out to Tracey Adams who is stepping down after 3 years as our social director. She has organized brilliant functions over her time and will be extremely difficult to replace. Also special thanks to Travis Edmonds who is stepping down from his position as Revenue Manager. This position is one of the toughest at the club and he has done a great job over the past 2 years working hard to find the revenue required to run a 1st division club.

Well done to the junior club on their season and for all their support to the senior club. It was great having the under 17's boys up to train and have a meal at Cheong Park through-out the year. If Cheong Park can handle an increased work load next year I am sure we can have more junior teams up to train and enjoy the senior facilities. With the junior ground currently being re-built and unavailable for the 2013 season the senior club will certainly be doing everything in its powers to support the juniors next year.

On the non-committee front I would like to personally thank all helpers and contributors around the club on their dedication and efforts to the club for the season gone.

Well done to Billy Carter (Bar Manager), Kerryn Nixon (Canteen Manager) and Karen Cali (Thursday Night Dinners). These 3 people and their dedicated teams of helpers do a wonderful job and help raise a large portion of the clubs revenue.



The 'Kennel Club' was again back to its best this year. Steve Bishop and Tony Ring did an outstanding effort in getting 105 members into the group. Well done boys and lets push for 150 in 2013!!

We formed a new coterie group this year called 'The Mudlarks'. The aim of this group was again to raise added revenue for the club to help recruit new players. This group would be responsible for paying the new recruits. A great job was done by all involved including Paul Lewis, Ian Schofield, John Dinnell and Peter Kaspar. Treasurer's Report

It is with great pleasure that I present my fourth treasurer's report covering season 2012.

For all members we are again pleased to present a full set of audited results for this season, they are included for your perusal in this report.

I would like to highlight some areas regarding the financial performance of our club.

The final result shows a cash trading loss of \$276. However some of our income was used to pay existing debt which meant that the club made a profit of \$9,141 from ordinary activities before tax. This also meant that our equity doubled from \$9.3k to \$18.4k. The problem we have is cash – starting the new season with only \$5k.

This season has been the toughest I have had as a Treasurer. However with the support of Quonny, some wonderful social events and support from the players and sponsors we were able to turn the ship around.

Bar – we are indebted to Billy Carter and all the volunteers who work behind the bar. The bar achieved a sales increase of 24% and with a steady margin this meant an \$8.5k increase in profit.

Canteen – The canteen figures include match day, match day BBQ and Thursday night teas. Again we have wonderful support Kerryn Nixon and this season the wonderful work of Karen Cali and all the Thursday night helpers and the "Burger BBQ Crew". The total result was a profit of \$14.9k.

Social Functions – Here we must thank Tracey Adams for all her work in not only running the social functions but raising the standard in delivering quality functions for all members and players. Also special thanks to Chris (Disco) Dinnell, his first year on the committee he achieved wonderful results including his famous "IPOD Shuffle" night, which was a huge success and raised nearly \$10k for the club.

Gate Takings – Unfortunately with the move back home this was the only area to suffer. As we are unable to fence off the ground gate takings were down by \$4.6k.

Merchandise – Bryan King rules this area with an iron fist and makes a treasurer's job easy as he notes and collects everything, the merchandise area had a good year – thanks Bryan.

Expenditure – we were able to keep a tight reign on expenses and kept the total 4.29% below last season. We are very much indebted to the **Mudlarks** group who supported the new players with the funds that were raised.

NEXT season – As I said at the presentation night we wouldn't win too many games playing 5 or 6 short. But I believe that we are 5 or 6 short in committee and sub-committee help.

In leaving I must thank our out-going president Steve Quon for his wonderful support of me and the football club. He will be hard to replace. Another who is leaving is Tracey who was a very complete social director and really supported me in all ways. Thanks Tracey. And, finally a third person leaving in Travis – I thank him for all his efforts – another difficult role.

Finally I would like to thank my wife Dianne. This season has not been easy but she has supported me all the way. I could not have continued as treasurer without her! – Thanks.

Reserves Report

As is the case with every football club, the season started with optimism, after a long summer of training on hard grounds, with gut busting session after session. The first game of the season was against the old foe Croydon, and a comprehensive pasting was handed out.

We tasted victory again in round 3 against Lilydale, only to front up to division powerhouse Vermont the week after, who went through the season undefeated. This has us at 2-2, and square on the ledger. By the end of round ten however, even with another comprehensive thrashing of Croydon, we had scraped and fought to get to a 4-6 record, meaning we would need a perfect run home to make the finals. Not impossible, but we would need everything to go right.



I think the challenge that lay ahead from there, was as much a mental challenge as a physical one. With a long list of injuries and unavailability starting to hamper the reserves, and the regular drain of players moving into the seniors to help cover injuries, our competitiveness started to drop away.

This was reflected by the round 11 performance of one goal only being kicked against Vermont, and the impressive first half against Balwyn away in round 13 that ended up in a crushing loss due to a poor second half. Fitness was a major issue in the

second half of the season, and it was obvious to all, that failure to regularly attend training means the intensity from the start of the season can't be maintained. That's a lesson to all for season 2013.

The season ended with a loss at home to Blackburn, and a 6 - 12 record. However it was quite pleasing that the percentage was at 87.41%, a sign that we had the ability to stay in games for long periods of games, again, often it was a lack of fitness rather than a lack of ability in most games.

There were things to smile about however, development of young players, and the sure heads of older ones. The Old Boy Dion was a rock in defence for the season, ably assisted by the kid with the boy band hairdo in Darcy, Strongy, and Strippers who led admirably as skipper all season. Through the middle we had the influence of Fish, Zenners, Sam Cali and Disco and Jonny Del when fit. The Big Show indeed put on a show for much of the season, waxing with Foggy; we had for the most part a dominant advantage in the ruck department for most of the season. Up forward is where we battled the most, with Dom required to play multiple roles, and at times dominating, but we weren't able to supply a lot of support to him with our better performed players for the year in the middle.

It was an enjoyable experience being involved in coaching this year, you learn after you retire in footy as a player, that there were only really two things that are important. 1 is playing finals, as they are the games you remember, and 2 are the friends you make along the way. So as you start to think about season 2013, what can you do better? Do you want better endurance to run out games? Start training now. Do you want to put on muscle so you are not pushed off the ball? Start training now. Premierships aren't won in September, they are won in January. Turn up to pre-season in the best physical condition of your life, and just see what happens from there.
