President's Report

It was a fantastic year for the South Croydon Football Club - both on and off the field.

The renovations of the social rooms were completed in July creating a facility and environment that everyone is proud to call home. Having the new facilities has already proven fruitful with record function attendance and increased social revenue. I want to sincerely thank all of those involved with the funding, furnishing and building of the facility - in particular the Maroondah City Council, Mike Symon, Bendigo Bank and Stephen Ouon.



On the field, it was a year of records for the club - longest streak in 1st division (5 years), most wins in 1st division (10), first finals appearance in 1st division and first Chandler Medallist (Daniel King). While is it great to reflect on such a season, we need to continually improve as a club and these "records" need to be become the new standard.

Despite such a successful year from the seniors, the biggest improvement within the club came from another team. Coming off an unsuccessful 2012 campaign, the Vets undertook a very active recruiting strategy resulting in at least half a dozen former senior players coming back to the club. Coach Dale White turned a one-win team into a one-loss team culminating in holding up the premiership cup by defeating Boronia at Lilydale Sports Oval. I commend the veterans on their recruiting philosophy, not because of their on-field success, but because it encourages former players to get involved with the club again. We appreciate all the support given from the veteran players and families throughout the year.

Unfortunately it was another difficult year for the Under 19s squad. Wayne Dalton took over as coach at the beginning of the season with great enthusiasm and commitment. I'd like to thank Wayne and his assistant coaches and other helpers for the time and effort put into this team throughout the year. We managed four wins throughout the season - an improvement on last year - beating Noble Park, Knox and East Burwood twice. The boys battled out every game and gave their all. They came close to knocking off finalists, Norwood and Vermont, showing the potential they have. A solid preseason is needed for all the Under 19s returning next year as well as the incoming Under 17s - something that was perhaps lacking this season. The aim of the Under 19s is to mould the players into senior footballers and with no shortage of talent in this team I look forward to seeing many of this year's Under 19s get there in the near future.



It was a strange year for the development squad in what could only be described as an underachieving season. We were off to a slow start dropping our first six games before looking to have turned the corner by putting together two on the trot against East Burwood and Noble Park. The victory against Noble Park was the only loss they would suffer during the season. We then went on another six game skid before winning our final four games in impressive fashion. It was a credit to Matt Grant and his assistants to keep the team enthusiastic throughout the entire season and they were really rewarded with the last four rounds' results.

A special mention needs to go to incoming coach Shane Lewis who had a taste of what next season is going to be like when he stepped in for a few games this season in Matt's absence. Finishing with a percentage of over 90 from only six wins - with four of those coming against the top six teams - really demonstrates how competitive the team was and the potential for success in the future. We had 32 different players play a senior game in 2013 which proves our development squad is strong. Once again, congratulations and thank you to Matt Grant, all his assistant coaches and everyone else who helped out with this team throughout the season.

Coach, Damien Franken, had the reins for his first ever preseason as senior coach and set a new level of expectation for the playing group. Damien and his assistant coaches put together a thorough plan for the preseason that was executed perfectly - giving the team the tools it needed to succeed. They were vindicated heading into the season after going undefeated after three practice matches. The season was off to a flying start, winning the first two matches against Lilydale and Scoresby. On a high, we headed back to Scoresby again the following week to take on division one new-comer, Rowville.



We were jumped early and down by 10 goals before the half time siren blew. The following week we let one slip against Blackburn after leading most of the day and what could have been a four and zero start after the first two weeks slipped to two and two. Our "bogey" side for the season came in the fashion of local rival, East Ringwood, who touched up on two occasions to capture and then retain the Mason-Glenn Bendigo Bank Shield. We then hosted Norwood at home and went down fighting in a tough effort against last year's ladder leader. Sitting at two and four we then set our sights on East Burwood, not willing to settle for mediocrity this game was looked at as an important stepping stone to keep in touch with the final five, not to avoid relegation. It was a great day for the club and one of the few times we were able to win in all three grades. In the next two rounds we took on powerhouses, Noble Park and Vermont, but just couldn't put four quarters together to be competitive. From here we went on a four game winning streak beating Scoresby, Knox, Lilydale and Rowville. The victories against Knox and Rowville, both by under a goal, highlighted the toughness and belief the senior coaching staff had instilled in the playing group. Looking to win five in a row and putting ourselves in charge of our own finals destiny, East Ringwood visited Cheong Park and unfortunately we put in one of the worst performances of the year.



The next week, undefeated and reigning premiers Balwyn, came to town. In what was one of the greatest wins in the football club's history we upset the Tigers by a solitary point. We travelled to Norwood the following week looking to cause another upset, but much like the first time around couldn't put together a full four-quarter effort. Blackburn was our next destination and a must win for our finals' campaign. We got over the line in a hard fought win and after hearing the results of the Rowville vs. East Ringwood game we celebrated a little harder. This meant that our final chances solely rested on our shoulders heading into the final round of the season against East Burwood.

In an historic day for the club we slugged out a victory to cement our very first division one finals appearance. In the elimination final we took on a strong Norwood team at a windy Jubilee Park. We were unable to capitalise on the wind in the first quarter and went into the break trailing by just over two goals. In the second term Norwood didn't make the same mistakes we did and used the wind to their full advantage piling on seven goals to one. We went into the break with a hefty 53 point deficit. In a game where a team could have just easily rolled over, resigned to the fact of defeat and the end to the season, the boys again showed their determination and attitude to never go down without a fight. Despite being short on the bench and having injured players on the field we rallied to win the last two quarters and cut the final margin to 28 points - playing some of our best football of the season in doing so. The support and ovation our members gave our players coming off the ground that day will long be remembered by all those involved. I'd like to thank Damian and all the coaching staff for getting the players to the level where they are now competing with the best in first division.

This being my first year on the committee, let alone as President, I didn't fully understand the work and time that volunteers put into this club. Without them, we simply couldn't exist. Secretary Vince Cali does an absolute power of work – from updating the website, the phone app, Bulldog briefs, liaising with the EFL and local council (just to name a few). I don't know how he manages to hold down full-time employment. Thank you for all of your help this year. Our Treasurer, Peter Kaspar, has again done a fantastic job managing our finances and I appreciate all of your early morning Saturday work amongst everything else. Your support has really helped me through the year. Football Operations Manager, John Dinnell, had a long break during the year, but I won't hold that against him! His work in organising the players and coaching staff has been phenomenal. Thank you very much JD. While on the subject, it would be remiss of me not to mention Michelle Cox for stepping into the role and not missing a beat in John's absence. I think we have our succession plan for the future, thanks Michelle! Michelle was also very active in assisting Cathy White and Chris Dinnell who did an absolute fantastic job with this year's social calendar. The list included "Drinks around the World", "Unleashed", "Reverse Raffle", "IPod Shuffle", "Gala Ball" and "Ladies High Tea" - culminating in the first Presentation Night we were able to hold in our new rooms.

Another function that deserves credit is the season launch organised by Sponsorship Manager, Matt Higgins. It was a great revenue raiser for the club and I thank you for this and your other sponsorship work.

Paul McConnell and Bryan King do an amazing job organising the club's facilities and apparel respectively and whenever a job needs doing, no matter what it is, these gentleman are always first to put their hand up.



Thank you Paul and Bryan for everything you've done this year. Wendy Langford is a genuine all-rounder and jack of all trades. From her training duties to assisting in the kitchen to helping with social functions, Wendy has been incredible. Thanks Wendy. Steve Bishop once again did a wonderful job running the Kennel Club for the 2013 season. Steve, just like everyone else on this list is multi-talented and willing to help with anything. Congratulations Steve on a successful year running the Kennel Club, I really appreciate all your work.

I'd like to also thank non-committee members for their help over the 2013 season. The passion these people have is what makes you proud to be associated with the South Croydon Football Club. Past President, Stephen Quon, has been fantastic in helping me transition into the role and his continued presence at all things South Croydon has been great support for me. 


Finally I would like to thank my wife Dianne. This season has not been easy but she has supported me all the way. I could not have continued as treasurer without her! – Thanks.

U19's Report

Prior to commencement of preseason training Wayne Dalton was appointed coach of the Under 19s with Dom Coniglio as his assistant. Wayne established a working relationship with Luke O'Toole (Captain 2012) and together they incessantly called players to ask them to attend preseason training before Christmas. The average number at training prior to Christmas was 6 and this number increased to 9 in the January/ February period. The lack of numbers made it physically impossible to coach the players as a team. Wayne contacted quite a few players who he had coached previously and had not played in 2012 and was able to recruit a few new faces. As February came around Wayne and Luke jumped back on the phones and started calling players again. Slowly the numbers started to increase. We mustered enough numbers to play the first practice match against Mt Eliza, but we still didn't have the numbers to field a side in the Kangaroo Flat practice match. Fortunately as the commencement of the official season drew closer Wayne and Luke were able to coerce a few more players to commence training and we fielded a team in the first match against Lilydale.
