President's Report

After our maiden final appearance last year, the excitement and expectations heading into the 2014 season was high. A mountain of work was done during the offseason to ensure the club maintained its on and off-field success from the previous season. Damien Franken again had control of the senior side, however there were coaching changes for the other two sides - Shane Lewis was appointed the development team coach, while Zane Job was given the reigns of the U19s squad. The committee also saw a number of changes with Steve Bishop, Chris Dinnell and Matt Higgins stepping down and inclusion of former president Stephen Quon and Steve Schinck.

It's not often you lose out on a potential senior "recruit" to a veterans team, but that's exactly what happened when club legend and life member Eamon "Ace" Costello decided to lace up the boots for the "old fellas". With an already stacked premiership side from the year before, the addition of Ace reaffirmed the Vets as Premiership favourite. They didn't disappoint. With an identical record from the year before, we headed into the finals with only the single defeat to our name. In the grand final we came up against the only team to have beaten us during the season - North Ringwood. With Dion Festini leading the way with a best on ground performance, the Vets went back-to-back beating the Saints be 18 points.

Had it not been for 4.5% and a bit of bad luck, the under 19s would have been playing finals football this year. In a great turnaround from last year, the boys finished 6th, missing out on the finals only by percentage. With an even mixture of top and



bottom age players along with a number of recruits we finished on 10 wins and 6 losses. A lot of credit needs to go to Zane Job and his assistant coaches for leading this young group of men to a successful season. The team has a great relationship and respect for the coaching panel and it's fantastic for the club they are returning to the helm next season. Two individual highlights that standout from the year are Francis Kavanagh playing in the senior side and Captain Taylor Gibson winning the EFL U19s best and fairest. I'm sure in years to come a number of the players from this team will be playing senior football.



After a caretaker role for a handful of games last year Shane Lewis put up his hand to become the full-time development squad coach this season. Shane and his assistant coaches nearly got the team to the big dance, with the season lasting all the way to the preliminary final. Unfortunately Vermont got the better of us that day after an excellent finals campaign. In a year where we struggled against the top four sides, two wins in the final series proved we were amongst the best teams in the competition. We finished the regular season 5^{th} with 11 wins and 7 losses and put on display the great depth the club has to offer. Congratulations goes out to all those involved with the team which will go down in club history for winning our first club final in division one.

After finishing 5th last year and making the division one finals for the first time we now had a new benchmark in which to measure ourselves against.

We had a busy and what would prove to be successful offseason recruiting. Two recruits received EFL honours with Jason "The Hulk" Eagle winning the league goal kicking and being selected in the EFL team of the year with fellow new comer/club best and fairest Daniel Hughes and club captain Daniel King. With a harder draw, we won one less game than last seasoning finishing with 9 wins 9 losses which was unfortunately only good enough to finish 7th. Three losses by fewer than two goals show how close we were to a repeat final appearance. The season wasn't without highlights though, in round 15 after a long run of outs against rival East Ringwood we finally regained the Mason-Glenn Shield and in the final round of the season we knocked off the only club we have never beaten in division one – Noble Park. The coaching staff lead by Damien Franken has moulded an unmatched culture at the South Croydon Football Club. Damien has earned the respect and admiration of everyone involved with the club and it's unfortunate that due to work commitments he has stepped down from the role. With change comes opportunity and I know the club and supporter base are excited to see Leigh McQuillen's impact on the club.



A common theme I've often talked about during my time as President is volunteers. Again, this year would not have been possible without all the people behind the scenes putting in their time and effort to run this club. A big thank you to every member of the committee – Vince Cali, John Dinnell, Peter Kaspar, Bryan King, Paul McConnell, Stephen Quon, Steven Schinck, Chris Lamb, Cathy White, Michelle Cox, Wendy Langford and Chris Dinnell.

Anybody who thinks running a football club is a six month job is kidding themselves. All of these people work year round to make the club one of the most respected in the Eastern Football League. Between work and the football club I don't know how Vince finds time for anything else. From the website, to our app, to the "Bulldog Briefs" and basically all correspondence in and out of the club Vince just never stops! I want to especially thank Vince for all his support over my tenure as President. Treasurer's Report

It is with great pleasure that I present my sixth treasurer's report covering season 2014.

This season has seen us maintain our position in first division and again live in a "hand to mouth" situation by getting through by the skin of our teeth. We should, however be proud that with a 21% increase in player associated costs we were able to turn a small profit and have no debts at the end of the financial year.

It has again been a most difficult year as cash flow was a disaster but with the help of a wonderful committee and a "special" supporter and playing group we made it through.

Bar: we are indebted to all the volunteers who work behind the bar. With Billy being taken ill we had Damien, Vince, John and many others step in. We had a slight sales decrease (due to a poor home game fixture) but our margin increased so we maintained our income. I must also thank the boys on "Terry's Bar" on match days - a wonderful, consistent effort.

Canteen – The canteen figures include match day, match day BBQ and Thursday night teas. The match day figures were slightly down this year (due to a poor home game fixture) our margin however was steady and we achieved a good result and are indebted to Kerryn Nixon and her band of helpers. This season we achieved a record result from Thursday dinners and I thank the wonderful work of Karen Cali and all the Thursday night helpers. I also thank the "Burger" BBQ Crew for all their work. The total result was a profit of \$21k.

Social Functions: Again we are indebted to Cathy White. Wow what a fantastic effort – she is a pleasure to work with and thorough in everything she does. We maintained our profits in this area and it has become a vital area for our club. I must also mention and thank Chris (Disco) Dinnell and the players, for organizing the iPod shuffle - it is the best thing that ever happened to our cash flow.

Kennel Club: Wow, a record year for the Kennel club. A wonderful effort from Paul McConnell who reached new heights in achieving a profit of \$20,267 - an increase of 81% over the previous year. This group's success is critical for the club.

Revenue: Here we are indebted again to Steve Quon. Even though we didn't have a "season launch" function the sponsorship team raised \$55k and profit rose by 11%. This is where OUR club shows itself over other clubs as the players raised \$17,340 in player sponsorships and I thank Fitzy and Dylan on a superb contribution.

Merchandise: Bryan King rules this area with an iron fist and makes a treasurer's job easy as he notes and collects everything – thanks Bryan.



Mudlarks: We are now indebted to the continued growth of the Mudlarks. They are now a necessity. Thanks to "Tubby", Ian and John for all their efforts.

NEXT season – I know I say the same thing every year but "to maintain the rage" in first Division we need to lift (off field) by 10-15%.

I would also like to congratulate the coaching and playing groups on their continued contribution to our club. We are indebted to the wonderful loyalty and leadership they continue to show.

19s Coach's Report

2014 was a fantastic season for the U19s, for the first time in the club's history we had a very competitive side in 1st division that showed a never say die attitude throughout the season.

With 10 wins and 6 losses we found ourselves in 6th spot, equal 5th, but missed out on percentage. The boys had some great wins throughout 2014, knocking off the minor premiers Norwood, and who could forget the 8 goal last quarter against Rowville at home to win with Pezza's goal after the siren. We also had our chances against Vermont, but fell short. With some situations out of our control - having 2 byes, Noble Park forfeiting, and a tough draw; the players continued to improve and their work ethic on the training track and those weeks not playing, were enthusiastic and encouraging.



There has been a lot of work over the past 6 years, with a recruiting drive that has seen the club gain 27 new players over the last 3 years head to our U17s and U19s. This has been achieved by people with the same vision - that we prepare players for 1st division football at the kennel. Thanks to Warren French, Shane Alderson, Tony Mason, Steve Bishop, Ash, Gino, and of course JD. Without your commitment and passion over the years we could not have achieved what the team did in 2014.

With a great preseason from all players we started the season as probably the fittest team I'd seen for a long time, but knew with no TAC players we need to be fit and be a balanced team in which every player needed to be accountable every minute of a game. We brought in a rotation system off the bench that made players aware of the importance of maintaining fresh legs for the team. We also made it clear we would be playing a brand of football that would demonstrate attacking at all cost. Defense zones were only executed in our forward line. Over the years some guys have made huge improvements in their development and belief in the potential that they can bring at senior level in years to come.
