President's Report

The 2015 season was both challenging and rewarding for the South Croydon Football Club.

While this statement might appear at odds with a less than moderate on field performance, the club's culture and community spirit shone throughout this year.

The end of the 2014 season saw a number of changes both at committee level and within the football department. On the club admin side, Mark Lumsden stepped down from the President's role as he would soon return to the USA to reside with now wife Jen. Stalwarts Paul McConnell and Bryan King felt the time

was right to step down from committee – however both remain heavily involved as key volunteers. The club welcomed new and old faces to the committee; Damon Hindmarsh elected into the Football Operations Manager role (John Dinnell moving across to an Assistant Treasurer/Finance role), while Paul Lewis and Annemarie O'Donnell joined us in general committee positions. Regrettably, even though several potential candidates were canvassed, no one nominated for the vacant president's position at the 2014 AGM, nor was the role able to be filled as the season progressed. While all tasks were performed as required, not having a formal club figurehead meant that strategic, directional decisions were not given sufficient attention. This must be remedied in season 2016 as the highest priority.



From a football perspective, the SCFC member and supporter community was informed of Leigh McQuillen's appointment as senior coach prior to the 2014 AGM, given Damien Franken's decision not to continue due to increased work commitments. With Leigh's arrival the senior coaching panel underwent wholesale changes. The endeavour of Leigh and his support team could not be questioned, however player departures, injuries and the inability to cohesively embed the new game plan took their toll.



Other distractions for the coaching and playing group included the inability to train at Cheong Park until just before Rd 3 as a result of major remediation surface works undertaken by the council. Further ground sand slitting occurred prior to Rd 7 to complement the earlier works. Disappointingly, by Rd 16 the ground had again deteriorated, prompting council to undertake further drainage work post season (now creating delays for our cricket club cousins), however as we speak the ground is in fantastic condition, and we hope that all the short term pain will now lead to long term surface improvements.

Club on field season results in summary were;

- Senior team 4 wins, 13 losses, 1 draw
- Reserves team 4 wins, 14 losses;
- U19s 6 wins, 10 losses, 2 byes
- Veterans 8 wins, 1 loss

Highlights included a senior team win against Blackburn on ANZAC Day; all three teams winning at home against Nth Ringwood in Rd 7; retaining the Mason/Glenn shield against East Ringwood in Rd 9 and the Veterans finishing atop the ladder and participating in finals for the third year in succession. Individual highlights included Eamon Costello's jointly winning the EFL Vets B&F award and club captain Daniel King's successive selection to the EFL senior representative team.



Following the end of the season, the club and Leigh McQuillen mutually agreed to part ways. Shane Lewis and Zane Job also moved on from their roles, but will remain active within the club. Thank you to all 2016 coaching staff for your dedication and commitment to the club – I wish you success in your future endeavours.

Another challenge for the club was the opposition by some local residents to our permit for fence signage. These signs showcase our sponsors and assist with our revenue raising. The club worked co-operatively with Maroondah council and followed their direction in the planning process. Even though council approved the permit application, the opponents ultimately took their objection through to VCAT – which caused the club addition expense and disruption. I am pleased to confirm however that VCAT eventually confirmed council's decision and the club will be able to erect its permanent fence signage in season 2016 and beyond.

While there were challenges, there were equally many rewarding experiences during the season, which demonstrated the real fabric of the club's inclusive and diverse player, supporter and member base. We entered the season with the terrible news of injuries sustained through a car accident by our trainer Monique Kouvaras, whose dad Maurie being one of our Vet's players. The way the club members, in particularly the Vet's team, rallied around Monique and Maurie through fund raising and donations was fantastic to see – this even extended to support from two rival clubs Noble Park and Norwood who provided funds, goods and services that were provided to the family for their use in greater fund raising. Most importantly, we are all overjoyed to learn that Monique has made great advances in her recovery; she has been back to the club a number of times recently and hopes to return to the training ranks in 2016.

Another great story is the continued work of players and supporters raising funds for the Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday Appeal. This worthy fundraising effort was started some years ago by Paul Horne, and has been successfully co-ordinated by Grattan Stephens for the last three years. Each year has produced fantastic results, this year being no exception with over \$4,500 raised by rattling tins at the corner of Eastfield and Bayswater Roads.



The ANZAC Day fixture against Blackburn was held at Cheong this year, with a strong crowd supporting the day. The collaboration of the Blackburn Football and Blackburn RSL clubs in helping us pull off this day with due reverence was most pleasing.



Ironically several great 'President's Lunches were held this season. Each one was well attended and typically featured a guest speaker and many visiting club guests. Thanks again to Cathy White for driving these days. We hope to have more of these next year.

This season we trialled a club Chaplain. Sports Chaplaincy Australia is the National governing body for football chaplains, and the Eastern Football league entered into a joint initiative to provide Sports Chaplains to EFL Clubs. SCA Volunteer Chaplains are trained, interviewed and accredited to ensure the highest levels of integrity. A Chaplain is primarily at a club to provide pastoral care to all levels of club players, members and staff in a caring, responsible and discrete way. Issues such as addictions, relationship breakdowns, bereavement and injury support are some of the issues that Chaplains deal with on a day to day basis. The Sports Chaplain provides the sporting club with another layer of care, communication and assistance that enables the club to function better as a community sporting centre. Our Chaplain Graeme

Barnden, has fit right in to our club and immediately proved to be a valuable member of the club volunteer community – we certainly look forward to seeing Graeme back in 2016.

The club also ventured into the EFL netball competition this year fielding two teams; K9 Red in Division 3 and K9 Blue in Division 4. The competition was tough and while not too many wins were gained, the girls enjoyed the experience and may return for another crack in 2016. Thanks to Michelle Cox, Wendy Langford and Kate Arnott for taking the lead with the teams.

It would be remiss not to thank our fantastic group of volunteers – who are the life blood of our club. Enormous thanks must go to the hard working committee who continually give their time, and often their money, to ensure our club continues to prosper. Thank you to Peter Kaspar, John Dinnell, Stephen Quon, Cathy White, Damon Hindmarsh, Michelle Cox, Wendy Langford, Kevin Cox, Paul Lewis, Annemarie O'Donnell and Steve Schinck. This group gets in and does whatever is required to keep the place going. Specific call outs to Cathy White for her excellent function and social event organisation; Paul Lewis and co for their Mudlark involvement - both functions and the introduction of the successful home game marquees; Stephen Quon for his work on revenue and getting us across the line with our fence signage. Another terrific effort again by our players this year in raising significant player sponsorship.

Additionally, the club also has a dedicated group of non-committee volunteers who get in and get their hands dirty week in week out – these volunteers are what the club is about and they are owed a great



debt. Paul McConnell continues to do a fantastic job with Kennel Club and ground operations. Bryan King keeps his hand in by handing our equipment, cooking the BBQ, being umpires escort and many other roles. Ian Scholfield for his Mudlark work. The bar staff both in the rooms or in the game day booths led by Billy Carter and Terry Cuthbert. The Saturday canteen team of Kerryn and Steve Nixon, along with the Thursday night dinner crew led by Karen Cali

Treasurer's Report

It is with great pleasure that I present my seventh treasurer's report covering season 2015.

This season the final numbers do not tell the story. If it wasn't for the magnificent (personal financial) support of two committee members, the SCFC would have a carry-over debt situation. As it is we are debt free and start 2016 with a positive cash flow.

It has again been a most difficult year as cash flow was a disaster and we are indebted to the support of the EFL and MCC who approved my requests for a payment plan without hesitation. I also need to thank our wonderful committee who never stopped in trying to ease the situation.

Bar: we again thank Billy for his efforts in running a tight ship. We made some strategic changes at the beginning of the year that paid off. Even though our takings were 9% down due to lower match day crowds our profit was only 5% down as we traded with an improved margin (2.5%). I would also like to thank the other helpers including Damien, Vince, John, Dianne, Bryan and others who work behind the bar. I must also thank the boys on "Terry's Bar" on match days - a wonderful, consistent effort.

Canteen – a similar situation existed with the canteen. Sales were down 18% (even with the introduction of after match rolls that raised over \$3.5k) again due to low match day crowds and less Thursday night meals, but the profit was down 12% due to an improved margin (2.7%). We are indebted to Kerryn Nixon and her band of helpers on match days. On Thursday nights we achieved a great result and I thank the wonderful work of Karen Cali and all the Thursday night helpers. I also thank the "Burger" BBQ Crew for all their work.





Social Functions: Again we are indebted to Cathy White. Wow what a fantastic effort – she is a pleasure to work with and thorough in everything she does. We dramatically increased our profits in this area and it has become a vital area for our club. I must also thank Chris (Disco) and the players, for organizing the iPod shuffle - it is the best thing that ever happened to our cash flow.

Kennel Club: Another great year for the Kennel club. This group again excelled with a wonderful effort from Paul McConnell by

achieving a profit of \$19k. This group's success is critical for the club.

Revenue: Here we are indebted again to Steve Quon, Damian Degenhardt and their helpers. They achieved a record \$76k for the club in difficult circumstances. Again we thank our playing group led by Fitzy, Dano and Dylan as our players raised over \$12k in player sponsorships.

Merchandise: This area had a good year by maintaining sales and achieving a better profit for the club. I would like to thank Michelle for her tireless efforts.

Mudlarks: We are indebted to the continued growth of the Mudlarks. They are now a necessity. Thanks to "Tubby", Ian and John for all their efforts.



NEXT season – I know I say the same thing every year but "to maintain the rage" in first Division we need to lift (off field) by 10-15% this means \$30-\$40k. Again this season we had a player/coach cost increase of 15.2%, which equates to a 52% increase over the last three seasons.

Finally, I would like to thank JD for all his support and endless coffees – his help keeps me sane and at the club. And on a personal note my wife Dianne, who continually supports me. This season has not been easy but she has supported me all the way. I could not have continued as treasurer without her! – Thanks.
