## **Treasurer's Report**

It is with great pleasure that I present my ninth treasurer's report covering season 2016.

This season we managed to reach our year end with cash on hand without a need for any extra ordinary contributions. For me this is a fantastic result. We are still debt free and start 2017 with a positive cash flow.

This has been achieved with another increase in player associated costs of 16.7%.

The major contributing factors to our success have been the improved game day takings (up 25.2%), an improvement in memberships (up 12.5%), an increase in social function profit (up 15.7%) and an improvement in Thursday dinners (up 16.5%). The game day takings are due to an improved fixture and improvement in team performance. The membership fees are due to the decision to revert to all players



having to be financial members of the club. The social functions are due to more functions spread across a greater period of time and Thursday night dinners are due to more patronage and improved buying.

Bar: we again thank Billy for his efforts in running a tight ship. Our takings were 23.7% up and with the changes made last season our margin was maintained and this flowed through to an increased profit. I would also like to thank the other helpers including Damien, Vince, John, Dianne, Bryan and many others who work behind the bar. I must also thank the boys on "Terry's Bar" on match days - a wonderful, consistent effort.



Canteen – a similar situation existed with the canteen. Sales were up 15.8% which led to a higher profit. We are indebted to Kerryn Nixon and her band of helpers on match days. On Thursday nights we achieved a great result and I thank the tireless work of Karen Cali and all the Thursday night helpers – this area continues to grow and deliver a great result. I also thank the "Burger" BBQ Crew for all their work.

Social Functions: This year we welcomed Tracey back into the saddle and she seemed to continue from where she left off! The results speak for themselves.

With Cathy's help the Social area is now a huge income generator – well done. I also thank the players for organizing the iPod shuffle and other events – we need the players support.

Kennel Club: Another great year for the Kennel club. This group again excelled with a wonderful effort from Paul McConnell in achieving a profit of over \$20k. This group's success is critical for the club and we all need to support it and push for growth.

Revenue: This is one area where we struggled to improve, however, we maintained our sponsors and I am indebted to Damian Degenhardt for his help and support during the season. We are also indebted to the playing group led by Fitzy and Danno as our players raised over \$12k in player sponsorships.

Merchandise: This area had a good year by maintaining sales and achieving a better profit for the club. I would like to thank Michelle and John for their tireless efforts.

Mudlarks: We are indebted to the continued growth of the Mudlarks. They are now a necessity. Thanks to "Tubby", Ian and John for all their efforts.

NEXT season – I know I say the same thing every year but no doubt our player payments will increase again so we will need to lift (off field) by 10-15% this means \$30-\$40k.



I would like to thank Cathy on taking up the president's role. She is a joy to work with and certainly is like the "Energizer Bunny" she never stops. We are lucky to have her.

Finally, I would like to thank JD for all his support and endless coffees – his help keeps me sane and at the club. And on a personal note to Dianne, who now not only supports me but has decided to help the club as well. This season has not been easy for our family but she has supported me all the way.

I'd like to congratulate all players on their performances this year and the way they represented our club on the field. For many players, this was their last year representing the Doggies. The Club wishes each player well for the future and every success in your football endeavours for those who transition into the senior level.



The club had mixed on-field success with two teams making the finals. Our Under 15s were knocked out in an elimination final, whilst our Under 11s made the grand final, resulting in an impressive come from behind victory, and became 2016 Premiers – well done. Apart from finals success, a pleasing outcome this year was the growth in numbers participating in our Under 8s and Under 9s. This provides a great platform for the longer term strength and success of the South Croydon juniors.

A big thank you goes out to all of the parents and other members who volunteer their time at the club and regularly drive players to training and games. There are many people who do an amazing job to ensure

our kids can play a game of football each week. This includes all the current Committee members for the time put into the successful operation of the club and the ongoing work that at times goes unnoticed, but is highly appreciated. The strength of our Club and the foundation for a sustainable future is the quality and dedication of our volunteers whether they be coaches, assistant coaches, team managers, runners, trainers, boundary umpires, goal umpires, time keepers, BBQ cooks, canteen helpers or others who provide regular support. The club could not function without this assistance.

We had tremendous financial support from a range of sponsors in 2016 which allows us to minimise registration costs for families and purchase new equipment. Remember, the more people that help on a regular basis or provide financial assistance, the better the outcomes for our kids. ## Senior Coach's Report

Finishing with six wins and twelve losses doesn't sound like a very successful year on the field, but I believe that it was a very successful year, where we were able to improve in all of the main categories.

Looking at the raw number of 2016 versus 2015 we have improved in every area. We won two more games than 2015, moved up one position on the ladder, averaged an extra goal per game while averaging two less goals against per game and on top of that our percentage was 13.7% better. These numbers while not looking like huge improvements I believe are a sign that as a playing group we are moving in the right direction and with another pre-season of working on the game plan these numbers will continue to get better.

The highlights of the season for me were: Round 16 with all 3 teams winning versus North Ringwood, a great home win against Montrose with a huge crowd there to witness the win, and our last 6 weeks where we were able to win 4 out of our last 6 games while the teams around us on the ladder were going the other way. There were also some very close games against really good opposition in Rowville and Norwood that we just let slip, but once again were big improvements.



After many hours spent recruiting thanks to Dimma, we were able to bring in some really great additions to the footy club, all of the new players at the club were able to have a big impact on the field for us in 2016, but more importantly they were able to fit into the tight knit group and uphold the great club culture that is developing with a lot of those players helping to drive that culture. In saying that we still need to get more players in the door for the 2017 season as for a lot of the season we were not able to get enough players on the training track and at some stages were even struggling to get a full development team some weeks, without that depth coming through we were unable to create a competitive environment for spots in the senior 22 and I firmly believe that, that is holding us back from really challenging the top teams at the moment.

From not having the depth at the start of the year come opportunities for players to have an impact at senior level and let us as a coaching group unearth some new talent. We ended up playing 40 players for the season with 8 debutants and plenty of players who took their game to a new level this year with the future looking very bright with some outstanding seasons being had by players such as Jake Tucker, James Crowle, Dylan Marshall and the continued improvement of younger players Jason Fitzgerald, Riley McKernan, Tom Schinck and Harry George.

From an off field perspective, I cannot thank the committee enough for their generous support that they were able to give me as a first time coach and in particular to Cathy White, Vince Cali and John Dinnell.

To my coaching staff Noel King, Ben Osborne, Andy Greenall, Stevie Dinnell, Brad Neil, Damon Hindmarsh, Greg Stafford and Phil McDonald, thank you guys for your efforts this year, the amount of time and effort it takes from you to help get the players ready to play at their best is huge and to do it all for the love of the footy club is amazing and I can't thank you guys enough for your support.



When I first took this job I wanted to come back and coach local footy as I hadn't been involved in a local senior football club and wanted to be involved at a club that wanted to have success but also a club that enjoyed the company of the people involved and made everyone feel welcome. I couldn't have asked for a better club to become involved in, there are so many great people involved in this footy club from Karen and the ladies doing Thursday night dinners, Brian and
