It will be a great opportunity to see the VFL return to the winners list and showcase the depth of talent in our competition.

Keeping an even Kiel

Luke Kiel hasn't enjoyed the easiest initiation as a Peter Jackson VFL club captain in 2017.

Alongside Tony Lockyer, the 26-year-old has taken the reins from former skipper Matt Austin at North Ballarat, but Kiel's young Roosters team has suffered a couple of heavy defeats early in the season.



Losses to Richmond by 188 points in Round 1 and Footscray by 124 points in Round 3 have presented an early test of the Swan Hill product's leadership ability. A veteran of 72 senior VFL games, Kiel has won best-and-fairest awards in 2015 and 2016 and earned selection in the 2015 VFL Team of the Year and 2016 VFL state team, but helping his club through a difficult year on the field would be a new feather in his cap.

"It's definitely been a challenge with a couple of big losses; it's just about bringing everyone together," Kiel said of his role as co-captain.

"I just try to do everything right on and off the field. Training intensity is a pretty big one especially for the young blokes, and trying to make it enjoyable for them – things like going out for dinner, doing a few fun activities to take their mind off footy a little bit. Footy's not really everything and that's what we're trying to teach them.

"We're trying to give them feedback (on their performances) but you've got to care about them before you give them feedback, because if you don't really care they're probably not going to take the feedback as well.

"I'm just trying to do what the leaders did for me when I came to the club (in 2012), trying to make me feel welcome and setting a standard – guys like

Myles Sewell, Steve Clifton, Michael Searl and Matt Austin.

"It's a bit of a different situation now though. We're just trying to make it as enjoyable as possible so people want to turn up to football training, because it's hard when you cop a couple of heavy defeats."

Ahead of the club's first match at its redeveloped Eureka Stadium base against Williamstown in Round 5, Kiel said North Ballarat's competitive losses to the Casey Demons in Round 2 and Sandringham in Round 4 was evidence the Roosters "can match it with the good teams" but acknowledged consistency of effort across four quarters was an area for improvement.

It's understandable considering just less than half of the club's 2017 list is under the age of 21, a vast demographic change from when Kiel arrived at North Ballarat in 2012.

"When I first got there we still had a team in the Development League and were still (partially) aligned with North Melbourne," Kiel said. "I played a whole year in the Development League in 2012, then had a pretty big pre-season in 2013 and I've played senior games ever since.

"We made the finals in the last year of our alignment with North Melbourne in 2014 but lost an elimination final, and then once we lost the affiliation we've



dropped back. Obviously we don't have as much depth and you lose the intellectual property (of the AFL club) as well, like all the game plans."

Kiel is now part of a senior core of Roosters including Lockyer, Austin, Lachlan George, Andrew Hooper, James Keeble, Orren Stephenson and 2015 J.J. Liston Trophy winner Nick Rippon that is trying to take the burden off younger teammates as they develop.

Mature-age recruits like Jacob Cooke-Harrison, Ben Cox and Toby Thoolen were added over the off-season to shore up North Ballarat's base of hardened, experienced bodies, while Kiel's on-field role has also changed over the years to reduce the pressure on the club's talented youngsters.

"I played in the back line for pretty much my first four years at the club," Kiel said. "But the last two years I've dropped a little bit of weight and gone into the midfield to take the load off the young ones.

"I'd like to finish my career in the back line because I feel like that's where I play my best football, but for now we can't just put young ones in around the footy and have them get beaten every week.

"There's been added enthusiasm (due to more young players on the list) but I think we could probably do with a few more older ones to help the young ones. They're jumping out of their skin to play but it's good to have a few level heads around as well."

Even though he's a new VFL club captain, Kiel's level head knows the 2017 season is about more than just wins and losses for the Roosters.

Hayes hits national heights

Eastern Ranges ruckman Sam Hayes knows what the NAB AFL U18 Championships is all about – he was the only bottom-aged All Australian named after last year's carnival.



The 17-year-old was instrumental in the closing rounds of Vic Metro's undefeated campaign, booting three goals in a victory over the Allies and then two majors in the title-sealing win against Western Australia.

203cm Hayes now has his eyes on more success at this year's Championships starting on the weekend of June 10-11. He's part of the initial 47-player Vic Metro squad released this week alongside the likes of Joel Garner (Eastern), Jack Higgins (Oakleigh Chargers) and Harrison Nolan (Eastern), who also appeared in the 2016 carnival.

The Ferntree Gully junior said his Championships performances gave him the confidence to go on and play 16 TAC Cup matches for the Ranges, averaging 12 disposals and 22 hitouts per game.

"I honestly didn't think I was going to have the year I had," Hayes said earlier this year of his 2016 season.

"The U18 Championships were a step up but you feel comfortable when you're playing with those kinds of guys (at Metro), and because I was younger, I sort of felt I was the underdog and that also made me feel comfortable.

"Before the Allies game I didn't think I was up to that (national) standard, but after that game I thought maybe I could compete with those guys and then I had the confidence to go and do it."

Hayes has started the 2017 TAC Cup season averaging 15 disposals and 23 hitouts per game in four matches – also booting a match-winning six goals in a three-point victory over the Gippsland Power in Round 6

– and representing the NAB AFL Academy against the Peter Jackson VFL's Northern Blues at Etihad Stadium in April.

Hayes hopes to spend more time in the forward line this year, where his ability both in the air and at ground level could help 10th-placed Eastern increase its scoreboard impact.

"If you can have two aspects to your game as a big man, that's pretty good," Hayes said.

"I also want to be more consistent than I was last year and try to close the gap from the bad games to the good games, and improve my follow-up after the ruck contest because if you can do that, you're an extra midfielder for your team.

"Covering the ground and tackling are things I think I need to improve on, because last year I only got one tackle a game which isn't enough for a big man."

With such improvement still on the cards, Ranges Talent Manager Len Villani said Hayes' rapid rise to prominence after last year's U18 Championships may not be the end of the surprises the big man has in store.

"Sam's got beautiful hands in the ruck and hits to advantage really well," Villani said. "He can also take a mark around the ground and be dangerous when he goes forward.

"He's still growing and has a fair way to go in terms of his physical development and ability to cover the ground, but he continues to show improvement every year."

Five unanswered goals in the first 15 minutes of the final quarter secured victory for Box Hill at Simonds Stadium. After a lengthier-than-usual half-time break due to an issue with the ground's siren, the Hawks took a nine-point lead into the last change before exploding with a burst of majors the Cats couldn't match.

Port Melbourne recovered from a slow start to edge in front of the Bombers and grind them down in tough conditions in the VFL's return to Frankston Oval. The Borough turned a 20-point deficit at quarter time into a seven-point lead at the main break, before a four-goal-to-one final term secured victory.

North Ballarat responded to a big loss to Footscray in Round 3 by pushing Sandringham to the very end at a wet Trevor Barker Oval. The Zebras built a 30-point advantage early in the third quarter, but the Roosters fought to within eight points of the lead late in the final term before Nathan Freeman sealed the win for the home side.

Footscray left it very late to snatch victory from Richmond in a thriller at Etihad Stadium. Trailing by 12 points at three-quarter time, the Bulldogs swapped the lead with the Tigers several times in the closing minutes but weren't headed once Lukas Webb booted the go-ahead goal at the 30-minute mark of the final term.

VFL state squad

42 players were last week named in the initial Peter Jackson VFL state squad that will host the WAFL in two weeks at North Port Oval.

All 14 VFL teams are represented in the squad, which features VFL-listed players that have performed well in the opening rounds of the season.

Just 12 players from the VFL team that faced the SANFL in 2016 were named in the initial squad, which will be reduced to a training list of 30 at the conclusion of Round 5 with players outside of the squad still able to be named should their form warrant selection.

In a change from previous years, a development squad has also been named – separate from the squad of 42 – featuring a host of up-and-coming talent from VFL ranks. Blues bag three straight

The Northern Blues haven't made the Peter Jackson VFL finals since changing their name from the Northern Bullants in 2012, but their 2017 season is on track to be different.

After an opening-round loss to Port Melbourne by 29 points, the fourth-placed Blues have reeled off wins against Williamstown by 21 points, Coburg by 62 points and then Collingwood by 13 points.

Josh Fraser's outfit is doing it in the same fashion as aligned AFL team Carlton, which has claimed impressive victories over Sydney and Collingwood under Brendon Bolton in the last two weeks.

Carlton is the AFL's top-ranked team for kicks per game and the bottom-ranked team for handballs per game through seven rounds, while Northern has recorded an average kick-to-handball ratio of 1.6 across its three wins compared to a ratio of 1.2 for its vanquished opponents.

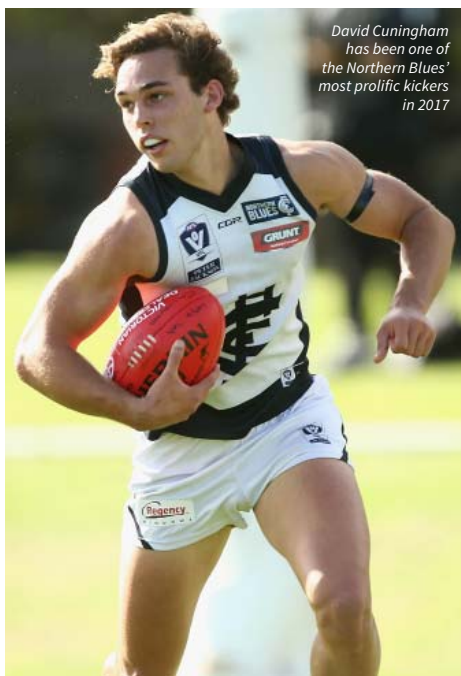
Ex-Port Adelaide (AFL) off-season recruit **Cam O'Shea** has disposed of the ball by foot 53 times in those three games, while **Blaine Boekhorst** (47 kicks), captain **Tom Wilson** (35) and **David Cunningham** (33) have also been prolific.

This style of play means the VFL Blues have conceded the third-fewest total points through four rounds, as they safely control the ball for longer periods of time and make it difficult for the opposition to score quickly if turnovers occur. It's also a direct way of moving the ball and means Northern is the VFL's fourth-ranked team for inside-50s per game.

There's a noticeable style to the AFL and VFL Blues when they don't have the ball too – they apply manic pressure. Carlton is the AFL's second-ranked team for tackles per game and Northern has out-tackled its last three opponents by an average of 17 despite winning more of the ball against Williamstown and Coburg.

Boekhorst, **Andrew Gallucci**, **Nick Graham**, **Sam Kerridge**, Wilson and even big man **Liam Jones** have all recorded seven or more tackles in single games during the VFL team's winning streak.

It's a potentially successful formula for the developing Blues: Don't let the opposition control the ball – and if they do have it, get it back quickly.

3 **Footscray** and **Richmond** are the top two teams for total points scored in 2017 and they put on a scoring show in Round 4. The Bulldogs won by seven points in a 118-111 result, with AFL-listed key forward **Jack Redpath** slotting three majors (six for the match) in his team's eight-goal final quarter to help seal a thrilling victory.

17 **Sandringham's** hardened bodies proved the difference in a 14-point win against a developing North Balarat outfit. The Zebras weathered the Roosters' intense pressure to top the contested possession count by 17, **Jack Lonie** winning a round-high 19 and **Dylan Weickhardt** recording 15 with just three uncontested possessions.

60 **Werribee's** defence weathered 60 inside-50s from Casey to defeat the Demons by 13 points. The Tigers conceded a goal from just 16 per cent of opposition inside-50s while scoring a major from 31 per cent of their own (13 goals from 42 inside-50s). **Matt Hanson** had a game-high seven inside-50s for the victors.

St Kilda Sharks have opened the season with a thrilling one-point win on the road against the Eastern Devils in Round 1 of Swisse Wellness VFL Women's.

A goal from Alison Brown saw the Sharks move ahead with three minutes left in the final term, with no more than 14 points separating the 2016 finalists throughout the game. In the end, St Kilda's direct play late in the game provided them a nail-biting win, 6.5 (41) to 5.10 (40), as Callum O'Connor reports.

Pouring rain at Mulgrave Reserve was an unwelcomed sight for the Round 1 clash, with both sides missing key players to injuries carried over from the AFLW season. A goal to Sophie Casey saw the Devils take the quarter-time lead and they extended it by the main break to 14 points despite the Sharks' attempts to control the play with more poised ball movement.

In the absence of 2016 Devils leading goalkicker Sarah Perkins, Bec Privitelli moved to the forward line and proved she had lost none of her forward smarts after a season in defence. TAC Cup Round 6 Review

The Northern Knights won a second consecutive thriller in a wet Round 6 to improve their record to 4-2 and remain entrenched in the top eight in fifth position.

The Knights came from 21 points down midway through the last quarter to snatch victory from the **Dandenong Stingrays** (6th, 3-3) by three points at Preston City Oval.

Just a week after pipping the Bendigo Pioneers by the same margin, Northern hit the lead for the first time through a long goal from captain Nick Coffield 26 minutes into the final term. Shortly after, Oliver Wilson laid a goal-saving tackle inside Dandenong's forward 50 to save the match for the Knights.

Wilson laid a game-high 11 tackles, while teammates Jamison Shea (25 disposals and four goals) and Jack Petrucelle (20 disposals, 17 contested possessions and a goal) were influential.

The top-of-the-table **Geelong Falcons** maintained their unbeaten start to the season by defeating a dogged **Western Jets** outfit (11th, 2-4) by 24 points at Burbank Oval.

Western slammed on the game's first five goals before Geelong responded to create an eight-point lead at quarter-time. The Falcons then managed to hold the Jets at arm's length for the rest of the match, with 194cm Adam Garner booting three goals and bottom-age NAB AFL Academy midfielder Sam Walsh (34 disposals) the leading ball-winner on the ground.

The **Murray Bushrangers** (5-1) sit in outright second spot on the ladder following a hard-fought 19-point win against the **Calder Cannons** (12th, 0-6) at Rams Arena.

Murray looked to be cruising to victory with a 30-point lead at half time and having restricted Calder to a solitary goal. But the Cannons came out firing in the third quarter, piling on six goals to two and then moving to within four points of the lead in the final term before the Bushrangers steadied. Jessy Wilson kicked three important majors for the victors while Harry Jones collected a game-high 26 disposals.

The **Oakleigh Chargers** (4th, 4-2) held onto their place in the top four after accounting for the **GWV Rebels** (8th, 2-4) by 40 points at Warrawee Park.

Oakleigh was only seven points in front at the main break but blew the game open in the third quarter with six goals to GWV's one behind. Jack Higgins

stood out in difficult conditions for the Chargers with 28 disposals and one major, while Jordan Troani was also a key contributor (21 disposals, seven inside-50s and a goal).

203cm Sam Hayes was the match-winner with six goals for the **Eastern Ranges** (10th, 2-4) in their three-point triumph over the **Gippsland Power** (7th, 2-4) in Healesville. 19-year-old Jordan Lynch's two majors were also important for the winners.

In Round 6's final match, **Bendigo** (9th, 2-4) claimed the scalp of the **Sandringham Dragons** (3rd, 4-2) by 21 points at Queen Elizabeth Oval. Braydan Torpey slotted three goals for the Pioneers while Darby Henderson (35 disposals) and Angus Schumacher (28) ran rampant through the middle.

VFA heritage game

The Dandenong Stingrays and Oakleigh Chargers will again celebrate the history of VFA clubs Dandenong and Oakleigh at this Sunday's clash between the teams at Shepley Oval.

"Many of our players went home and did some research on the Redlegs and it carried over into the rooms prior to the game, with players talking about the jumper numbers they were wearing and who'd worn them in the past.

"I think it's great that we always remember the game itself was built on the VFA and great country players, clubs and leagues."

In the 2016 heritage game, the Stingrays pipped the Chargers by one point in a thriller at Warrawee Park.

The game will also be live streamed on taccup.com.au from 1pm.

AFL Victoria will live stream one TAC Cup match each round in 2017, with commentary provided by the TAC Cup Radio team. A replay of the game will be available on the TAC Cup website on Sunday night.

Bushies back it up

For the beaten 2016 Grand Final team, the Murray Bushrangers have quietly gone about building a 5-1 record to sit second on the TAC Cup ladder.

Murray produced a competition-high 10 players added to AFL lists last year, including NAB AFL Draft pick no.12 Jy Simpkin who has impressed in five senior games for North Melbourne so far in 2017.

Second-year Bushrangers head coach Leon Higgins admitted earlier this year that it'd be difficult for his 2017 group to match the deeds of last year's, but that they'll "be more than competitive throughout the season".

When asked about potential 2017 draftees, Higgins pointed firstly to Charlie Spargo – but the classy 175cm midfielder/forward hasn't played a TAC Cup game this year due to commitments with the NAB AFL Academy and GWS Academy (of which he's no longer a part).

Instead, a collection of unheralded players is emerging to record impressive numbers through the first six rounds.

Over-age defender **Ben Paton** has been one of Murray's most consistent players averaging 23 disposals and six marks per game running off half back, and was in his team's best players for its Round 6 victory over the Calder Cannons with 19 disposals and five rebound-50s.

Jessy Wilson was also crucial against the Cannons with three goals and the 184cm top-ager now leads the Bushrangers goalkicking table with 11, ahead of 196cm **Daniel Johnston** (10 majors) and livewire indigenous prospect **David Smith** (nine).

On a wet day at Rams Arena, the grunt of co-captain **Harry Jones** (averaging 23 disposals and six tackles per game) and over-agers **Isaac Wallace** (17 and six) and **Nick Richards** (21 and three) was important, while **Doulton Langlands** – a bottom-ager in Murray's Grand Final team – stood out with 21 disposals and six inside-50s.

Add in the ball-winning ability of 170cm **Angus Hicks** (ave. 24 disposals and six tackles) and marking power of 195cm **Jordon Butts** (ave. 17 disposals and eight marks) and suddenly the Bushrangers seem to have enviable depth of talent.

They may not be as well known as Simpkin and Will Brodie may have been in 2016, but they're proving just as effective for their team.

The **Eastern Ranges** had 11 fewer inside-50s and three fewer scoring shots than the Gippsland Power in their two-point victory but clearly made their forward thrusts count. Rowville product **Trent Mynott's** damaging boot was a key factor for the Ranges, sending the ball inside 50 six times from his round-high 23 kicks.

The **Bendigo Pioneers** reaped the rewards of going direct in a 21-point win against the Sandringham Dragons. The Pioneers had 31 fewer disposals than the Dragons but recorded 13 more kicks, with Echuca product **Darby Henderson** and Strathfieldsaye junior **Angus Schumacher** racking up 19 disposals each by foot.

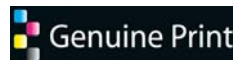
