FOOTBALL SOUTH BURNETT CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

1.1 PLAYERS CODE

As a Team Member

- Play for the "love of the game" and not just to please parents and Coaches.
- Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your team's performance will benefit so will you.
- · Play by the rules.
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain or Coach approach the official during a break or after the game.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are by your team or the opposition.
- Treat all players, as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players or deliberately fouling or provoking an opponent is all unacceptable behaviours.
- Co-operate with your Coach, team mates and opponents. Without them there would be no game.
- Smoking, drinking of alcohol, smoking or taking of non-prescription drugs is strictly forbidden for juniors. Smoking or taking of non-prescription drugs is strictly forbidden for seniors.
- · Abide by the FQ Sunsafe policy.
- Be a good ambassador for the game, your CA and your family.

1.2 PARENT'S CODE

- Remember that young people play football for their enjoyment, not yours. If a player is reluctant, encourage but don't force them.
- Focus on the player's effort and performance rather than winning or losing. □ Assist in setting realistic personal goals related to his/her ability.
- Encourage players to always play according to the laws of the game.
- Never ridicule or yell at a young player for making a mistake or losing a game.
- Remember that players learn best by example. Applaud good play by both teams.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from all sporting activities.
- Consumption of alcohol at junior sporting events is strictly forbidden, other than in clearly marked and approved bar areas.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach young players to do likewise.
- Show your appreciation of volunteer Coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.
- Encourage players to recognize the value of an honest effort so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- Supervise the maintenance of a written log of any injury (or treatment) needed by the players as a result of CA activities and notify Team Officials □ Provide support for the FQ Sunsafe policy.

1.3 SPECTATOR CODE

- Young people play organized sports for fun. They are not playing for the entertainment of spectators only, nor are they miniature professionals.
- Applaud good performance and efforts by your team and the opponents. Congratulate both teams upon their performance regardless of the game's outcome.
- Respect the officials' decision and at all times demonstrate appropriate social sporting behaviour.
- Never ridicule or scold a player for making a mistake during a game. Positive comments are motivational.



- Condemn the use of violence in any form. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from all sporting activities.
- Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them there would be no game.
- Encourage players to play by the rules and officials' decisions.
- Consumption of alcohol at junior sporting events is strictly forbidden, other than in clearly marked and approved bar areas.

OFFICIALS CODE

- Compliment and encourage all participants.
- Be consistent, objective and courteous when making decisions.
- Condemn unsporting behaviour and promote respect for all opponents.
- Emphasize the 'spirit' of the game, rather than errors.
- Encourage and promote rule changes, which will make participation more enjoyable.
- Be a good sport yourself. Actions speak louder than words. Your behaviour and comments should be positive and supportive.
- Keep up to date with the latest trends in officiating and knowledge of young players' growth and development.
- Assist to provide a platform that also involves the personal development of young players.
- Assist young players to develop knowledge of the rules of the game and coaching techniques and participate in the development of the sport.
- Implement and support the policies of the CA.
- Be a good ambassador for the game and your CA.

 Under no circumstances, touch players.

1.4 COACH'S CODE

- Remember that young people play for the fun and enjoyment and that winning is only part of their motivation.
- Never ridicule or yell at players for making mistakes or losing a game.
- Be reasonable in your demands on your player's time, enthusiasm and energy. □ Teach your players to follow the rules.
- Whenever possible, group players to ensure that everyone has a reasonable chance of success.
- Avoid over playing the talented players. The 'just average' players need and deserve encouragement.
- Ensure that equipment and facilities are appropriate to the age and ability of the players and meet safety standards.
- Develop team respect for the judgments of officials and opposing Coaches and for the ability of the opponents.
- Follow the advice of a physician in determining when an injured player is ready to recommence training or play.
- Keep informed of the latest Coaching practices and the principles of young players' growth and development.
- Provide a platform that also involves the personal development of young players, and their ability not just to compete, but also to serve in the development of the sport.
- Implement and support the policies of the CA.
- Be a good ambassador for the game and the CA.
- Be a good role model for players and set a good example for them. Do not smoke or drink alcohol in the vicinity of the team.
- · Under no circumstances, touch players.
