

### **Editors Comments**

### Round 2

The New England Nomads started their season well with a win over the Tamworth Swans, the Cats had a really good first half against the Gunnedah Bulldogs however they would want to forget the second half of that game. The last time these 2 teams met was in round 14 at Tamworth's NO.1 and the very undermanned Cats were thumped by 170 points, with Weston Whitby kicking a Country Energy TAFL record 19 goals. The Cats have been able to recruit more people to the club this year and will be buoyed by their early effort against the Bulldogs, but will be no match for the Nomads at home. The Nomads struggled in the first quarter against the improved Swans and, if it was not for the Swans giving away a free kick late in the first quarter, they would have been goalless for the quarter. Nomads' Coach, Brendan Meehan, urged his players to play with more intensity after quarter time and slowly they clawed their way back into the game, finally getting in front in the last quarter. They then showed that they could withstand a late charge from the Swans and win under pressure.

Nomads to win by 72 points.

The Swans host the Inverell Saints in a game between 2 round 1 losers. Neither team was beaten by much, and both will be looking to open their winning account for 2009. The last time the Swans and the Saints met was in round 11 last year at NO.1 Oval with the Saints beating the Swans by 56 points. In fact, the Swans have not beaten the Saints since their thumping win in the 2006 preliminary final. The Saints were not disgraced against the Kangaroos and showed that they will still be a force this year. They are still getting used to a new coach and I am still confident that they will play finals this year. The main reason the Swans lost to the Nomads was their undisciplined acts that resulted in 3 direct goals to the Nomads. Coach Rick Watt will be instilling in his charges this week the importance of staying focused and disciplined. If they can do this, they will play finals this year. Swans to win by 15 points.

In the match of the round the Gunnedah Bulldogs will be hoping to make the Kennel a fortress this year and their first challenger will be the Tamworth Kangaroos. The last time these 2 met was in round 12 in Tamworth last year and the Kangaroos had a compelling 84 point victory. The Bulldogs travelled down to the Cattery last week with only 19 men and lost Scott Hardy to injury in the first quarter. So the fact that they completely out-played the Cats in the second half shows that you underestimate the Bullies at your peril this year. The Bulldogs were simply awesome kicking 17 goals 8 behinds in the second half, while keeping the Cats to just 4 behinds at the same time. The Kangaroos had a workman type win against the Saints and showed that they will not be easy beats this year, even with their player losses from last year. I have a feeling, though, that this is going to be the year of the Bulldog.

Bulldogs to win by 30 points.



### Spirit Of The Laws

Contest for the ball

#### **GENERAL PLAY**

"The player whose sole objective is to contest the ball shall be permitted to do so."

A player may be fairly met by use of the hip, shoulder, chest, arms and open hand and be pushed or bumped in the chest or side.

Solid but legal bumps are permitted.

#### CONTACT TO THE HEAD

Contact to the head is considered to be illegal.

### HEAD OVER THE BALL

A free kick will be awarded against a player who bumps or makes forceful contact to an opponent from front-on when that player has their head down over the ball.

#### Note:

A player can bump an opponent's body from side-on but any contact forward of side-on will be deemed to be front-on;

A player with their head down in anticipation of winning possession of the ball or after contesting the ball will be deemed to have had their head down over the ball for the purposes of this law.

# PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT

Play by the rules – the rules of your Club and the laws of the game.

Attend training sessions and matches at times advised by the Club. If unable, for a valid reason to do so, players will inform the club as soon, as is practical.

Act respectfully toward the officials and players of their own opposing Clubs.

Respect and follow the directions of coaching staff, match and club officials.

Treat all players with respect, as you would want them to treat you.

Act respectfully towards match officials at all times. Abusive language is unacceptable.

Avoid individual or collective behaviour, which may reasonably be held by spectators to be offensive.

Avoid all acts likely to incite spectators to violence or disorder.

Make no detrimental statements in public (radio, television, print or electronic media) in respect to the performance of any match officials, players, or any policy decisions of the Club or the Tamworth AFL.

Abide by the By-Laws, (Rules & Regulations) and the Competition Rules of the Tamworth AFL.

Respect the facilities and equipment of their own and opposing Clubs.

Do not use remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability as many such comments are politically incorrect and it is your coach, team-mates, Club and family that are let down with such remarks.

# PARENTS & SUPPORTERS CODE OF CONDUCT

Remember that you are for there for the participants to enjoy the game.

Encourage participation, but don't force it.

Teach that enjoyment is more important than winning. Never ridicule mistakes or losses. Supporters are there to support not downgrade.

Lead by example and respect all players, coaches, umpires, administrators and spectators. Physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated.

Recognise all volunteers who give up their valuable time.

Never publicly criticise umpires, rather raise personal concerns with club officials in private.

Do not use remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability as many such comments are politically incorrect and it is your coach, team-mates, Club and family that are let down with such remarks.

Respect the facilities and equipment of their own and opposing Clubs.

Do not engage in physical and/or verbal intimidation, abuse or conduct toward any player, official, umpire or supporter. Such actions are totally unacceptable.

Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by spectators, coaches, officials or players.

Abusive language is unacceptable.

# COACHES CODE OF CONDUCT

Set a good example and display utmost honesty and integrity in all dealings. Teach fair play and good sportsmanship.

Never place the value of winning above that of instilling the highest possible ideals and character.

Be reasonable in demands, setting goals and expectations at an attainable level.

Maintain a current knowledge of the rules of the game.

Teach and interpret the laws of the game to the players.

Never ridicule players.

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all individuals within the context of my involvement in Australian Football, including refraining from any discriminatory practices on the basis of race, religion, ethnic background, or special ability/disability.

Encourage and create opportunities to develop individual as well as team skill.

Ensure that all players understand the importance of regular attendance at training and positive attitude at training and that team selection throughout the season, including the finals, may be influenced by their training attendance and attitude.

Ensure that injured players are given prompt and competent medical attention and that doctor's orders are strictly adhered to.

Endeavour to keep informed regarding sound principles of coaching and skill development and of factors relating to the welfare on my players.

Display and teach appropriate sporting behaviour, enduring that players understand and practise fair play.

Display and foster respect for umpires, opponents, coaches, administrators, other officials, parents and spectators.

Abide by the By-Laws, (Rules & Regulations) and the Competition Rules of the Tamworth AFL.

Do not engage in physical and/or verbal intimidation, abuse or conduct toward any player, official, umpire or supporter. Such actions are totally unacceptable.

Respect the facilities and equipment of their own and opposing Clubs.

Make no detrimental statements in public (radio, television, print or electronic media) in respect to the performance of any match officials, players, or any policy decisions of the Club or to the Tamworth AFL.

# ADMINISTRATORS CODE OF CONDUCT

Involve others in planning, leadership, evaluation and decision making related to Australian Football.

Create pathways for people to participate and develop through the sport not just as players but also as coaches, umpires and administrators.

Ensure equipment and facilities are safe and appropriate to the ability of the participants.

Establish that qualified and competent coaches and officials capable of developing appropriate sports behaviour and specific skill technique provide adequate supervision.

Help coaches and officials highlight appropriate behaviour and skill development and help improve the standards of coaching and officiating.

Assist all participants in Australian Football to know and understand the rules.

Set a conduct example for others to follow.

Make it clear that abusing people in any way is unacceptable and will result in disciplinary action.

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person.

Make no detrimental statements in public (radio, television, print or electronic media) in respect to the performance of any match officials, players, or any policy decisions of the Club or to the Tamworth AFL.

Do not engage in physical and/or verbal intimidation, abuse or conduct toward any player, official, umpire or supporter. Such actions are totally unacceptable.

Always respect the use of facilities and equipment provided. Ensure on and off the field behaviour is consistent with the principles of good sportsmanship.

Ensure all parents, coaches, sponsors, administrators, officials, medical staff and players, understand their responsibilities regarding fair play in sport.

# OFFICALS CODE OF CONDUCT

Display fairness and uniformity in applying the rules.

Be honest in your assessment of situations.

Be consistent and courteous in calling all infractions.

Condemn deliberate fouls as being unsporting and promote fair play and appropriate sports behaviour.

The health and safety of the players must be the most important reason to be weighed in during the decision making process.

Use common sense to ensure the 'spirit of the game' for players is not lost by being too pedantic when applying the rules.

Be a positive role model in behaviour and personal appearance.

Ensure you remain up to date with any rule changes and/or interpretation of the rules as laid down by the AFL.

Seek continual self-improvement through study, performance appraisal and regular updating of competencies.

Do not engage in physical and/or verbal intimidation, abuse or conduct toward any player, official, umpire or supporter. Such actions are totally unacceptable.
