DECLARATION 1

Conditions of being a Member of Softball Australia and its Affiliated States, association and clubs

- 1) I agree to abide by all the rules, regulations and policies of Softball Australia and the relevant state body, association and/or club, as updated from time to time.
- 2) I authorise Softball Australia and its Affiliated States, associations and clubs to use and disclose, to related and relevant bodies, any of my personal information that may be necessary to implement the rules, regulations and policies in (1) above. I agree to have my name and results published in official programs, newsletters and websites unless I have specifically indicated not to.

Softball Australia National Insurance Program

- 3) I understand that all states participate in the Softball Australia National Insurance Program, and their affiliated associations and clubs have \$20 million public liability insurance cover.
- a. All claims are handled by V-Insurance (National Insurance broker). Please contact V-Insurance on 02 8599 8660 for all your insurance cover information.
- b. I fully understand that the Softball Australia National Insurance Program includes a limited level of cover in the event of personal Injury. I understand that only NON-MEDICARE medical expenses can be claimed. Due to current Commonwealth Legislation, if the medical service provided is eligible for a Medicare rebate of any value, any resultant GAP in costs can't be covered by the National Insurance Policy.

- 5) I have read, understood, acknowledge and agree to the above declaration.

CNSA Waiver *

I, seek permission for myself / my child to play for Cruisers Softball Club in the Cumberland Nepean Softball Association 2017/18 summer competition. I agree to abide by all the rules and regulations set down by Cruisers Softball Club and CNSA including umpiring, canteen, working bee and fundraising duties. In event that I/my child is injured during a game or training session, I hereby give permission for qualified medical treatment to be obtained and agree to pay for any medical expenses incurred. I also agree and accept that Cruisers Softball Club / CNSA will no way be liable in the event of injury or accident to me/my child however caused.

Club Duties *

Our sport cannot be run without the support of players and parents. The club is required, by CNSA, to provide assistance and support in activities such as working bees, canteen and umpiring. Our club relies on players and parental support with coaching, team management, scoring and fundraising.

PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT *

Play for the 'fun of it' and not just to please parents and coaches.

Play by the rules. Never argue with an umpire or official. If you disagree, have your captain or coach approach the umpire or official during the game to ascertain a ruling.

Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, deliberately fouling or provoking an opponent and throwing equipment is not acceptable or permitted in any sport.

Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.

Be a good sport.

Cheer all good plays whether by your team or the opposition.

Treat all players as you would like to be treated.

Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.

Cooperate with your coach, manager, team mates and opponents. Without them there would be no game.

PARENTS / GUARDIANS CODE OF CONDUCT

If children are interested, encourage them to participate.

Focus upon the child's effort and performance rather than the overall outcome of the event. This assists the child in setting realistic goals related to her ability by reducing the emphasis on winning.

Teach children that an honest effort is as important as victory, so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.

Encourage children to always play according to the rules. Remember that children learn best from example.

Applaud good plays by both teams. If you disagree with an umpire or official, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than question the umpire or official's judgement and honesty in public.

Remember, most umpires and officials voluntarily give their time and effort for your child's involvement. Many umpires are also children.

Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.

Recognise the value and importance of volunteer coaches. They give of their time and resources to provide recreational activities for the children and deserve your support.

Avoid the use of derogatory language for any reason.
