in the Wynyard R.S.L. - G.G. meets the Committee. - G.G. accepts the coaching position. - Geoff Emin appointed Reserves Coach. DEC. 1977 -Annual General Meeting - Allen Good continues as President, Geoff Emin as Secretary, Bruce Marshall as Treasurer, John Tolland and Ron Wynwood as Darwin delegates. FEB. 1978 -Official pre-season training begins. - Rex Barker appointed Head Trainer. APRIL FOOL'S DAY - First roster match - Yeoman begins season with the first of 3 wins against Somerset. - Dale Ewington appointed Captain. - Kerry Hodgetts appointed Selector. APRIL - Geoff Denny appointed Seconds Captain; Mick Davis vice-capt. - Geoff Gaby gets his first kick for Yeoman - and his last for APRIL 8th. many months. We win, going away. APRIL 22nd. - First encounter with Ridgley, at Ridgley - we lose by 67 points. MAY 27th. - Geoff Gaby coach of Darwin Association team. - Second encounter with Ridgley, at L.C.O. - we lose by 29 points. Geoff Gaby takes a forward flank for the first 22 minutes, gets his first kick since April 8th - and his last for the season. - Last Training night - followed by a tea at which Geoff Gaby AUGUST 31st: announces that he will accept re-appointment for 1979. FRIDAY SEPT. 1st .- Kath Gaby, family and friends present a meal for players, trainers, committee and some supporters at the Wynyard Cricket Club. Address by Tony Fletcher - all are resolved to "FIGHT ONE MORE ROUND".

SATURDAY SEPT, 2nd. GRAND FINAL DAY.

- 10.00 Members meet at L.C.O. to decorate cars.
- 10.15 Convoy of over 50 cars leaves for Wivenhoe.
- 12.00 Seconds burst onto the field.
 - 2.15 Victory. Yeoman's first Premiership since 1952.
- 2.20 Geoff Gaby leads a squad of 21 onto the ground; tossess, wins, kicks to the inland end, leaves the field.
- 4.40 Victory. Celebrations begin.

DESCRIPTION:-

Yeoman failed to make full use of a 3 or 4 goal breeze to the inland end in the first quater, kicking too many points, while Ridgley managed 2 goals towards the sea. As has often happened this year (and others), we improved against the wind and opened up a 3 goal break by the half-way mark of the second quarter. At the time-on mark we had a lead of 14 points and looked definitely superior, but uncontested marks at the 26 and 28 minute marks left us only 2 points up at half time.

Ridgley matched us goal for goal for 15 minutes in the vital 3rd. quater, although we always threatened to take the match over completely. Finally, persistence paid off. At the 24 minute mark, and again at the 26 and 27 minute marks we goaled and opened up a 31 point break. At oranges, the camp was confident and determined to give everything in the final round, Ridgley at no stage looked like breaking through. Geoff Emin's goal at the 15 minute mark as good as sealed the match. Supporters gradually took up positions along the boundary line. Tim Morse yelled, "She's ours", and 3 minutes later it was. The siren ended the 26 year drought and the champagne flowed. Dale Ewington accepted the "Examiner Cup", Greg Bramich received the award for Man of the Match, and the team, joined by those Reserves players still capable, ran their lap of honour.

All I want ot say is thanks very much for a fantastic effort. For everyone not only the players out there today but to the supporters, it was a classic effort and a fantasic effort by our mercurial coach Geoff Gaby (loud cheers and applause) One of hte greatest coaches of all times (hear hear)

GEOFF GABY: -

Fellas I don't think ever in my life have I been so proud of so many people. I honestly can't remember being so glad. My first one was Irishtown and it was great and I thought it could be as good but belive me I think today must top the honours because we've been the under dog all year. We had to come the hard way. I asked 50 odd players the impossible on the track I did'nt do it I was injured all the time and I asked and I flogged and I flogged and I was criticised when I was not there but no one single soul from the top committee to the worse supporter once through the year said a bad word against me and I was given the opportunity. I didn't win the bastard the club the blokes that went out there and the two sides today they won it. They put in on the track they knew what it was all about I didn't have to tell them it wasn't going to be easy and as the year went by they thought they could get up and beat these fellows in the grand final without being prepared. But we were prepared this year. So we got up and won because we were all prepared to bloody fight for each other.

There are three fellas in particular Geoff Emin, you've been standing in the shadows the sun shines on you too mate you've done a bloody fantastic job. I could not, I repeat I could not have done the job this year if the players had'nt picked this fella as captain. Dale the greatest captain the club is likely to have "CHEERS".

Kerry Hodgetts has been a great help too, I've got that close to them that evey time they breathe I breathe too.  - anywhere not just in sheds,
 - anytime.
 - by anyone players, officials, supporters, women, kids.
 - at different speeds to suit different occasions, moods.
- (4) short and sweet.
- P.S. I shoul have organised royalties at 5 cents a time I'd have made a fortune in the last few weeks''''

CELEBRATIONS . .

On the 19th August 1978, Yeoman Seniors and Seconds muscled their way into the Grand Finals. Coachs, players and anyone associated with the club behaved as if the season was over and the Flag has been one. Yeoman had been successful - it had reached the Grand Final for the first time in twelve years. The Seconds Grand Final saw Yeoman strike glory and coach Baldy Emin was quietly elated. Emin missed the colour of the Seniors entry onto the ground and also missed the press photos. The team drank champagne easily and spent the afternoon drinking the supporters seventy dollars "(another 130.00 later) The Seniors Grand Final was won the hard work of selebrating began with the first ever presentation of the winners cup at the ground..

Beers in hand the players did the easiest 4,40 (honour) lap for the season. Bluey Bramich took the prise for best player of the day. The club song took a bashing, Ewey addressed the players and supporters and gave showing signs of emotion was almost ...speechless.

The 50 festooned cars winded there way back to Les Clark. The cup was filled with beer and the ritual began. The Club Hotel was the next stop, the town was full Yeoman's victory, West Park Cricket Pavillion was the scene from 8pm to 12.30am 3,000 people piled in and spilled out and Podge Marshall worked overtime to keep the beer up to the players wives— Mesdames Gaby, Sturzaker, Emin, and Morse were down on the park doingthe Yeoman flag hung on the wall telling all that premierships were won in 1951, 52, and 78 the old stagers, J.D. Tolland, Athol Dyke, Athol Bell, Harry Clarke, Harold Bloomfield and many more could not stop smiling.

As Joan Hodgetts tells todays players you only made the flag, were the ones who appreciate it and know what it means. It is Yeoman's first flag since Kegs brought Yeoman from the bush to the city in 1970. SEPT.2nd Midnight- 136 gallons down. The all night stand continued back at the club rooms.

6.30am Sunday. Snow Peebles and Wally Hodgetts proved tobe the club hardies Morse, Ewington the Sturzakers brothers and Paice did not make it home but all enjoyed Anne and Graeme Murfett's first course of breakfast at 6.45am while Peter Stevens came good with porridge at 7.15am.

SUNDAY was family barbeque day. Monday was a lonweekend for the Y.F.C. Tuesday 8.00pm 252 gallons down, thing happend throughout the week but reports lacked substance"I dont know I was toossed".

FRIDAY 8th SEPT. 1978. Best and Fairest at Les Clark, with John Castles and Tommy Wynwood collecting prizes. 8pm;- 324 gallons down, with Podge Marshall's top 6 consumers being Wally Hodgetts, Snow Pebbles, Kerry Hodgetts, Timothy Morse, Geoff Gaby and Chris Sturzaker. SATURDAY, 9th SEPT, 1978. 4am. Police intervention because the club song is not appreciated in the early hours, particularly around town. And on she goes..... BEST AND FAIREST VOTING. 37 players polled votes in the Reserves voting and 25 in the Seniors, with 13 scoring in both - indicating the depth of talent in the Club. RESERVES :-1. This victory rendered Daffy tearful and also speechless - almost. He managed to recover in time to entertain the adoring assembled multitude with his usual few words. Congratulations to Daffy on becoming one of the very few full-backs ever to win a top award. (What a unique double - Hudson and Castles tops in one year.)

PAST PREMIERSHIPS:-

The 1978 double was our first success for 26 years, but Yeoman can claim to have won more premierships than the great majority of Tasmanian clubs. It's impossible to say how many without undertaking considerable historical research, but the following are some worth repeating:- 1906, 1907, 1908, 1909, 1910 1913, 1914 - in the Burnie District League.

1921, in the Burnie Football Association.

1940, in the Darwin Association.

1951, 1952, and 1978, in the Darwin Football Association.

The 1978 Reserves Premiership is the Club's first in that division.
