

BL&GFA DUAL REGISTRATION POLICY



The Barossa, Light and Gawler Football Association (BL&GFA) recognises the importance of preserving the integrity of the junior football competition in the League, and allowing every child in our community that wishes to participate in the game of football, the opportunity to do so.

With some clubs experiencing excess numbers in junior grades the BL&GFA recognizes there may be a need for junior players to have the capability to play at another Club or in another League, to ensure that they do not miss out on an opportunity to play regular games.

<u>With some conditions</u>, the BL&GFA have adopted the SA Community Football League regulation 15.1 which allows junior players under the age of 15 yrs to play with two Clubs.

The regulation states: 15.1 Subject to Regulation 15.2, a player may be registered to play football with only one Affiliated League Club at any one time, unless the player is under the age of fifteen (15) years on January 1st in the current year. The player may dual register with a second club in a different Affiliated League via a type two (2) permit on Sporting Pulse, with the approval of both Leagues.

BL&GFA CONDITIONS:

Dual registration may be approved where <u>all</u> of the following circumstances apply:

- a) No player from outside of the BL&GFA will be permitted dual registration into any BL&GFA Club.
- b) All other Clubs within the BL&GFA are able to field 21 players in their team(s) in that grade;
- c) The player's primary registration remains with the BL&GFA Club;
- d) The player will only play one game on the weekend (not play for both Clubs in one weekend)
- e) By playing for another Club, the player does not cause any other available player from being displaced from the recipient Club;
- f) The names of the players playing under a dual registration will be clearly marked on the team sheet of the applicant club.
- g) Dual registered players are ineligible for medal votes for the other League.

OPERATION:

- a) The Club requesting the player(s) is to complete "Part A" of the the BL&GFA Form 11 and forwards the form (preferably via email) to the donor Club.
- b) The requesting Club submits an on-line application for dual registration is made via the Sports TG website.
- c) The donor club will complete "Part B" of the application (Form 11) and forward the form to the BL&GFA Junior Football Officer (JFO) **AND** the BL&GFA Registrations and Transfers Officer (RTO) who will administer the dual registration process.

If a breach of this policy is identified, the BL&GFA may rescind the Club's right to Dual Registration and fine the offending BL&GFA Club a maximum of \$250. If the breach is of regulation 15 of the SA Community Football League Inc. regulations, the issue will be brought to the attention of that body.
