# LET THE SEASON BEGIN !!

It has been 186 days since Terrigal Avoca held aloft the Black Diamond Cup at Newcastle No.1 Sportsground.

Congratulations to the Panthers on winning the Black Diamond Cup for a fifth time, also to Maitland and Cardiff on winning the Black Diamond Plate and Reserve Grade Premierships respectively and also to Newcastle City on claiming the Women's flag.

Last years results will all be forgotten today when the clubs take the field to embark on the search for their own holy grail in 2018.

It has been a busy time for both clubs and the league since last September, there is no such thing as an off-season.

What has happened in the off-season and what can we expect in 2018:

- We welcome two new clubs, Port Stephens and Wallsend-West Newcastle in to the Black Diamond AFL making it 15 clubs plus the Umpires Association.
- Wal Bembic has been re-elected as President for a fourth year with Paul Redman replacing Mark Stocker on the BDAFL Board.
- Christine Burrows has been reappointed as the BDAFL Umpires Coach for a sixth year.
- Hunter Haval have continued as naming rights sponsor for both the BDAFL and also the Black Diamond Cup competition.
- Belmont 16 Footers Sailing Club, GE Industrial, Prime7, Star104.5, The Entertainment Grounds-Central Coast, Sportscoast Trophies and Marks Men Workforce have continued as partners for 2018. ISC Teamwear will continue as the BDAFL's exclusive apparel supplier
- BarTV continue as a BDAFL Media partner and will once again be broadcasting the BDAFL Match of the Round LIVE via the internet.
- The Hunter Haval Black Diamond Cup competition has been expanded and will consist of eleven teams in 2018, the most ever for that competition.
- The Board, in conjunction with AFL NSW/ACT also introduced a Community Club Sustainability Player Points system aimed at making for more competitive football.
- In it's fourth year the BDAFL Women's competition will increase to sixteen teams with four new teams, Port Stephens, Terrigal Avoca, The Entrance Bateau Bay and Wallsend-West Newcastle. It is pleasing to note that all clubs now have a women's team under their banner which makes for healthy clubs.
- Fourteen teams will compete in the Black Diamond Plate competition (Reserve Grade)
- Overall there will be forty one teams playing across the three competitions.
- A social competition will also be introduced during the season.
- The BDAFL held a successful season launch last week at the Belmont 16 Footers Sailing Club with in excess of 100 guests in attendance.
- In a great result for football in the region, Nelson Bay's Pippa Smyth became the first BDAFL Women's player to play in the AFLW competition when she debut for GWS Giants against Adelaide Crows.
- Jarrad McVeigh, Isaac Heeney (Swans) and Daniel Lloyd (GWS Giants) all played in Round 1 of the AFL, whilst Paul Hunter (Adelaide) debuted during the JLT competition.

The volunteers will again have a busy year ahead, and I would like to thank them for the contribution they make to not only BDAFL, but AFL in general. If you have the opportunity please see your club to lend a hand, your will find it very rewarding.

Well with the pre-season behind us it is time to bounce the ball, so to all players, umpires, officials & supporters (new or existing, young or old) I hope you have a successful and enjoyable season.



## BLACK DIAMOND CUP SEASON PREVIEW

Terrigal Avoca's defence of their hard-earned 2017 premiership sees a radically different Black Diamond Cup landscape and the most open season in years. The increase to a eleven team competition, the addition of the Community Club Sustainability Program (CCSP) adds a new dimension to the Cup, with all clubs now having to add careful mathematics to their weekly selection meetings. The Panthers now have three Central Coast derbies with the addition of Gosford and Wyong Lakes into the Cup. Teralba-based Lake Macquarie enter the Cup as well, and the Black Diamond Cup makes a very important foray into the Hunter Valley with the addition of the 2017 Black Diamond Plate grand finalists, the Maitland Saints and the Singleton Roosters.

There has been the usual comings and goings in the off-season which keeps challenging clubs. Premiers Terrigal Avoca has seen the departure of Peter Van Dam, Alastair Richardson and premier-ship-winning coach Mark Skuse (retired) and key backman James Hart (travelling) whilst key midfielders Corey Billins (ankle) and Kurt Fleming (shoulder) will miss a large part of the season. A positive for the Panthers is the return of James Webster after missing the majority of the 2018 season with a knee injury. Cardiff may well be the early favourites for the flag. Nick Chapman has departed, but the outstanding midfield trifecta of Elliott Davey Medallist Tom Yensch, Marcus DeLeur and Simon O'Brien give the Hawks an outstanding midfield in their last season at Hillsborough before moving to their brand new headquarters, the Pasterfield Complex at Cameron Park.

Nelson Bay has a huge task. Coach Sean McGrath has to overcome the loss of Luke Price, veteran Aaron Clayden, the Eddy twins Ben & Jeremy, Todd Thornton and Harrison Freund, placing a huge dependence on brilliant midfielder Jayden Rymer, ruckman Billy Barton and the success story of the Marlins 2017 season, fullback Chris Eddy.

Newcastle City welcome back talented ruckman Chris Jackson to No.1 Sportsground as they seek to atone for a rare minor semi-final loss to Nelson Bay at a windswept Dick Burwell Oval last year. His addition is off-set by the loss of key players in Aaron Seen, Nick Gill and Sam Payne. How City go about this season will be fascinating, with the expected continued improvement from their younger players. Expect big seasons from the likes of Conor Haswell, Jackson Crawford and Aidan Watling, The Blues will no doubt be in contention to reach their annual goal, the Grand Final. Warners Bay has lost utility Ben Kernahan and youngster Rob Schindler-Taylor, but they Bulldogs played reasonable football in the back half of last year after an interrupted pre-season and they will look to ensure a spot in the Top 7. Young ruckman Tom McDonnell will be keen for a massive year one year after playing for the Sydney Swans academy. The return of Jack Hardman is a huge boost for the faithful at Feighan Oval, with real belief that a deep Finals run is within their grasp.

Killarney Vale showed enough last year, in patches, that they are definite Top 7 material this year if they can get their best 22 on the paddock each week. The loss of Ryan Barrett will hurt them however a fit Josh Mifsud and the return of Brendan Lewis will be a bonus. Scott Reed and Tim Oosterhoff will be other key players.

Maitland face similar challenges to Nelson Bay as they commence Black Diamond Cup football at the upgraded Max McMahon Oval. The loss of Ben Stewart, Todd Sheldon, Jim Taranto and Wade Beard presents a huge hurdle for the Saints, however will provide great opportunities for their younger players. Coach David Ross will be hoping for a quick recovery from a bad quad injury for star League representative forward Patrick McMahon.

The outstanding Andrew Scott has taken over the coach's clipboard for the Singleton Roosters, who are after a Top 7 berth after two terrific seasons Black Diamond Plate in 2016 and 2017. Scott welcomes back star backman Sam Brasington after a year in Sale and will look to midfielders 2016 Granland Medallist Alex Mitchell and Andrew MacPherson to lead the way at Rose Point Park.

Wyong Lakes will be returning to the Black Diamond Cup scene for the first time since 2011 and the Magpies appear to be well placed. They will rely on experienced players Chris Koop-Folkes, Justin McPhan, Lee Moore and Tim Hillman to lead the way for youngsters such as Brayden Tos, Tyler Wood and Carter Jones.

Former junior Josh Barty has taken the coaching reins at Gosford and there is a positive feel around the club as they enter the challenge of a Black Diamond Cup return. The club has seen a number of other former juniors return to the club whilst on the other end of the scale veteran forward Tim Eather will once again pull on the Tigers guernsey. Pat Murphy, Alex Remy and Scott Burkinshaw were their keys last year and they will again be required to lead the way in 2018.

Lake Macquarie will be looking to their exciting band of youngsters to lead them back into the Black Diamond Cup. Damon Tually, Sam Wellard, Rory Sleeth, Jakson Bertoli and Riley Janissen have all had big pre-seasons and looking forward to playing in the Premier competition.

## GE BLACK DIAMOND WOMEN'S PREVIEW

There will be great intrigue in the 2018 GE Black Diamond Women's competitions as the experienced sides clash with the new teams in an expanded sixteen team competition.

Newcastle City took all before them in 2017 in a dominant performance, however in 2018, the Blues will field two evenly matched teams following an internal draft to decide the make up of the "Stars" and the "Nova's". Whilst not expecting the same domination as in 2017 both teams are filled with plenty of talent and will be expected to be in contention at the end of the season.

The talent has been evenly distributed with Ash Hallyar, Paige Mathewson, Sarah Halvorsen, Roisin Rosie-Yates and Tayla Braithwaite lining up for the Stars, whilst the Nova's will be led by Kate Handley, Meaghan MacDonald, Audrey Gillingham, Erin White and Kailee Goodwin.

Nelson Bay have figured in all three Black Diamond Women's Grand Finals, however will be entering the 2018 season minus a number of familiar faces in Pippa Smyth, Lisa Steane and Jess Phillips. New coach Russel Fox will be relying on players such as Sophie Balcombe, Kate Holland, Lauren Cooper and Jemma Astley to lead the way for the Marlins.

Preliminary Finalists, Maitland and Gosford will be looking to take the next step in 2018. The Tigers will need to do it however without 2017 Women's Best & Fairest winner, Allison Parkin who has moved to Sydney. Tarryn O'Hehir and Rachael Elcoate. Talented youngster Orana Young returns to the Tigers.

Maitland on the other hand have been reasonably stable in the off-season, and they will again be relying on key players Jacqui Dudgeon, Sarah James, Sarah Burns and Jodie Eagar to lead the way.

Killarney Vale are expected to be a key player in 2018 after making great strides in 2017. The new coaching staff are buoyant from what they have seen in pre-season and with a young playing list are expected to hit the ground running. Ashleigh Page, Skye Bailey and Georgia Butler, are predicted to have big years for the Bombers.

After making the finals for the first time in 2017, Wyong Lakes will be looking to continue this improvement under new coach, Josh Lawler. The Magpies have acquired former Killarney Vale captain Monique Maddalena in the off season and she will add great experience to the side. The Magpies keys will once again be Rebecca Ives, Emily Bohan, Aleece Hemmings, Alexandra Pearce and Ash Sephton.

Warners Bay coach, Tracy Baker will be looking for a change of luck on the injury front as she enters her second year in charge. Injuries have cruelled the Bulldogs past two seasons however they remain positive ahead of the 2018 season. Di Crep was a revelation in the ruck last year and she will again be a key. Kate Booth has been a stalwart down back, whilst Rachel Evans showed plenty of promise up forward last year.

Singleton were the big improvers in 2017 and a solid pre-season has the Roosterettes primed for a big 2018. Tori Cowburn was standout last year earning herself a spot in the Women's Team of the Year. Tahlia Thompson and Kyah McBride are two youngsters to keep an eye on for 2018.

Lake Macquarie have a new coach in club stalwart, John "JJ" Janissen and the regular influx of new players. Whilst it may take the Dockers a little while to gel as a team they have a couple of players namely Holly Kozlik and Emma-Jayne Howe who will make an immediate impact.

Cardiff will be looking on an improved season after finishing 10th in 2017. Numbers have increased significantly in the off-season. Best & Fairest winner Mollie Palmer is expected to improve further this season.

Muswellbrook will enter their second season buoyed by an expanded playing squad and the introduction of the four new teams.

Of the four new teams, Port Stephens, Terrigal Avoca, The Entrance Bateau Bay and Wallsend-West Newcastle the Panthers appear to be the most advanced with solid numbers and the acquisition of experienced players in Morgan Ross, Leah Tagilala and Danielle Rippon.

All in all an exciting Women's season is about to commence. Good luck ladies !!!

The first game sees reserve grade up against Maitland. These games always prove to be a strong battle and the resses will need to hit the ground running (literally) to get the choccies.


