PREVIEW—ROUND 3

In Round 3 Black Diamond Cup action this Saturday, Killarney Vale and Terrigal Avoca have a Friday Night fixture at Adelaide St Oval, Round 2 victors Gosford and Singleton meet at Adcock Park, Nelson Bay host Maitland in one of two games to be featured on BARTV, Wyong Lakes host Lake Macquarie and in the second BARTV Match of the Round, fierce local rivals Warners Bay and Cardiff lock horns at Feighan Park, with a full Anzac Day ceremony to be undertaken before the commencement of that fixture.

Killarney Vale will be confident after their convincing win over Nelson Bay last Saturday. Ryan Coughlan has been in good form for the Bombers, picking up a best on ground last week. Ruckman Tim Oosterhoff's battle with Panthers follower Sam Ellis will be pivotal to the contest under lights at Adelaide St Oval. Coach Scott Reed, Connor Reilly and Dan Cartwright will look for a continuation of their recent form, with the match-up on Reed very important to the result. Will MacKellar may get some time on Reed given his size and speed, but Reed's excellent hands and ability to use his body in marking contests sure to cause issues for the Panthers back six. A new look Terrigal Avoca will need in-form rover Jack Grimmond at his peak on Friday Night. Grimmond's speed and ability to run & carry were highlight's in last week's loss to Cardiff, and how Reed includes negating Grimmond's influence will be an interesting part of the Bombers pre-game planning.

Gosford's tough, tight win away to Maitland last week was a massive boost for the entire Tigers club as they have re-entered the Black Diamond Cup. The Tigers defence kept the Saints to a mere six goals, and they will need a repeat of this form as they host Singleton, who have realistic claims on a top four finish this year, such is the quality of their list. Tigers Coach Josh Barty will look to in-form teammates Dan White, Alex Remy and Scott Burkinshaw as the Tigers return to Adcock Park. Burkinshaw's possible match-up with star Rooster Sam Brasington is a real focal point in this fixture. Brasington loves to launch attacking raids from half-back, whilst Burkinshaw's size and marking ability will test the slightly smaller Rooster. Roosters Coach Andrew Scott will be after the ideal 2-0 start on Saturday, with Scott Moore, Mitch Gaffney, Nick McPherson and gun rover/forward Alex Mitchell sure to trouble the Tigers defensive capabilities.

Nelson Bay welcome Cup newcomers Maitland to the Tomaree Peninsula on the back of two heavy losses in their first two matches. Coach Sean McGrath needs to find some support for Jayden Rymer, Billy Barton and recruit Andrew Last if the Marlins are to secure their first four points of the season. Maitland, after a solid first-up win over the Dockers, were brought crashing back to earth last week by a committed Tigers outfit and will look for a better performance from their forwards as they seek their second victory of the season. Former fullback Rob Eddy managed three majors last week and he will be happy with the wide-open spaces of Dick Burwell Oval to create havoc for a Nelson Bay backline spearheaded by Chris Eddy. Former Marlin Dylan Stuart returns to Dick Burwell Oval for the first time since switching to Max McMahan Oval, whilst Mitch Norquay and Mitch Greaves will look for a continuation of their early season form for the Saints. BARTV coverage of this fixture will commence at 1.55pm.

Round 1 winners Wyong Lakes host a desperate Lake Macquarie at Don Small Oval. The Magpies, under coach Michael Tos, had the Bye in Round 2 after a great Round 1 win over Gosford. 2017 Granland Medallist Brayden Tos will look to dominate the ruck contests for the Magpies in this fixture, providing quality ball for the experienced Chris Koop-Folkes, Justin McPhan (who managed seven goals from centre half-forward in Round 1), Lee Moore plus youngsters Tyler Wood and Carter Jones. Lake Macquarie will be dead keen to rebound from last weeks big loss at the hands of Newcastle City as they make the short trip down the M1 to Tacoma. The Dockers produced a reasonable performance in Round 1, other than poor shooting at goal, and need to replicate that form against a confident Magpies outfit. Dan Zuzek, Sean Clune, Sam Wellard and Damon Tually all need lots of touches to give the Dockers a chance at an away victory.

Warners Bay and Cardiff, always the fiercest of local rivals, have a massive fixture at Feighan Oval to complete Round 3. Both clubs and the League have agreed that this fixture will feature a full Anzac Day ceremony before play, run by Cardiff RSL Sub-branch President Syd Lynch. The teams will be playing for the Cardiff RSL Sub-branch Anzac Trophy.

Warners Bay will look to bounce back from a close round 2 loss away to Singleton. Still missing follower Jake Roach with injury and a number of players through a wedding, the Bulldogs have a huge task to topple high-flying Cardiff, who have beaten League heavyweights Newcastle City and Terrigal Avoca in their first two games. Ben Crawley was outstanding in his new role at centre-half back last week and will have his hands full with the Cardiff forward rotation, featuring Josh Murphy and resting ruckman Tom Yensch. Speedy follower Jack Hardman and Matt Spinks will have a great battle with Hawks skipper Simon O'Brien, whilst full-forward Kayne Gibbs will have a big day, particularly in his defensive work on Cardiff's backline general Zac Metcalfe.

Cardiff newcomer Nick Tomlinson has been excellent in the first two rounds and forms a lethal half-back line with Chad Mayo and Bryce Graetz, whose play as a defensive centreman was pivotal to the Hawks solid win over Terrigal Avoca last start. BARTV coverage from Feighan Park will commence at 1.50pm.

Newcastle City has the Bye in Round 3 of the Black Diamond Cup.

In the GE Womens Competition, Killarney Vale host Central Coast rivals Terrigal Avoca, The Entrance Bateau Bay are at home to Singleton, Wallsend-West Newcastle welcome the Newcastle City Stars to Bill Elliott Oval, Nelson Bay host Maitland, Lake Macquarie head to Tacoma to take on Wyong Lakes, Gosford make the long trek to Medowie to play new club Port Stephens and Muswellbrook host the Newcastle City Novas.

In the Hunter Haval Black Diamond Plate, Killarney Vale are at home to Terrigal Avoca, The Entrance Bateau Bay host Singleton, Maitland head to Dick Burwell to play hosts Nelson Bay, Wyong Lakes are at home to Lake Macquarie, Warners Bay host Cardiff, Muswellbrook make the long trek to Adcock Park to take on Gosford and Wallsend-West Newcastle are at home in hosting Newcastle City.

BDAFL APPOINT BILKEY AS REP COACH

Black Diamond AFL have appointed Rowan Bilkey as the Coach of the Men's Representative team that will play AFL Canberra at Manuka Oval, Canberra on May 19. Sean McGrath and Marty Reiman have been named as Assistant Coaches with Chris Bishop and Garry Burkinshaw also on the selection panel.

Bilkey has had, by anyone's standards, a remarkable playing career. Premierships in Sydney, London and Auckland; representative football for Sydney AFL in 2010-2011, second place in the 2011 Sydney AFL Best & Fairest Award, and a League Best & Fairest Award playing for Uni Blues in the Auckland Football League.

Bilkey indicated that he very pleased to be announced as the BDAFL Representative Coach; "It's a huge honour, the League has been around for a long, long time and it is great to be part of it."

Bilkey explained his background and junior footy; "I am a Baulkham Hills Falcons junior, and then the East Coast Eagles (whom Bilkey played senior footy for) was formed out of the Baulkham Hills footy club in 2000. I played my junior footy with Baulkham Hills, and I idolized the club as a young man. I watched them run around on a Sunday, getting flogged every week, when I was 14, 15, 16. In 2000, when I joined the senior club, that's when the East Coast Eagles were formed."

When asked about playing Australian Rules overseas, Bilkey said; "I moved to the UK when I was about 20, having worked for a couple of years before then for the Sydney Swans. I decided to travel a bit, working in a pub in London, and my now wife went with me. Once I arrived in London, I got a phone call from Matt Glynn, who was the President of the West London Wildcats at the time. He asked me to come down and have a kick, and I was fortunate enough to be in the right place at the right time; we went on to win the Premiership the two years I was there. The Wildcats won six out of the next eight premierships after that."

Bilkey later won a promotion with his then employer Kings Transport to be the General Manager of their New Zealand branch. "My wife and I had our honeymoon in New Zealand, so we jumped at the chance of living and working in Auckland. My predecessor had played footy for Uni Blues in Auckland, and I also knew a Uni Blues player named Nick Trask, who played a handful of games for the Brisbane Lions in the early 2000s. We were fortunate enough to win two flags when we there as well."

Bilkey and his wife have four beautiful sons. Bilkey said that "we had a block of land in Sydney but decided it was too busy to live there anymore, especially after living in the more relaxed atmosphere of Auckland. My brother lives in Newcastle, so we ended up buying a place in Newcastle. I was fortunate enough to land a job with my current employer Tamex Transport about two weeks after we moved up here. We've been here since Christmas 2016."

Bilkey, when asked about being appointed as League Coach, advised that "I knew BDAFL Football Operations Manager Garry Burkinshaw from when Garry ran the Sydney AFL. I actually worked for Digital Media, who had the rights to film Sydney AFL games. I had a fair bit to do with Garry as a player and contractor in the industry. I contacted Garry to say I would love to be involved with the BDAFL, and a few weeks ago, he asked if being League Coach was something I'd be interested in. I jumped at the chance."

Bilkey is a former teammate of Terrigal Avoca Premiership Coach Mark Skuse, who he described as a very good player, a "smart player".

With the BDAFL taking on AFL Canberra at UNSW Canberra Stadium (also known as Manuka Oval), Bilkey advised that "I played some junior rep footy there as a 15-16 year old, then I played there in the NEAFL as well, we actually played in a semi-final against Eastlake there, going down by about 14 points. It's one of my favourite grounds, it's an ideal size for football, and a beautiful place. I saw Jarrad McVeigh take one of the best marks I have ever seen there, as a 16-year-old."

Bilkey indicated that he has a steep learning curve with the possible BDAFL rep team, "not knowing any of the players. I will spend time watching games live and on BARTV, and will endeavour to meet the players on the way".

We welcome Rowan Bilkey to the BDAFL, it's great to have him on board with the League, and we look forward to a long relationship with him.

MCPHAN FIT & FIRING FOR PIES

Wyong Lakes may be making a return to the Hunter Haval Black Diamond Cup competition this year, however key forward Justin McPhan is no stranger to this competition having made his debut for Wyong Lakes as a 15 year old in 2007.

"It seems a long time ago now but I was very young when I made my debut, and I think I had a reasonable season" McPhan said.

He kicked 30 goals in 13 games in his debut season which was very impressive.

McPhan was most enthused about the Magpies Round 1 victory over Central Coast rivals the Gosford Tigers in both teams' return to the Black Diamond Cup competition. "We performed very well, it was a really good start and there is a great vibe around the club." Whilst it was good win for the club McPhan also had a huge day out kicking seven majors.

"I benefitted from some quality ball supplied by our midfield, which makes the job a lot easier, it was a bit of a bonus and I got to help the guys out. It was the ideal start to the season, which we were hoping for, it gives a good run into the season."

McPhan has a different role this season from 2017, playing mainly as a centre half-forward. "Last year I was injury-prone, and I missed a fair few games with a couple of left hamstring strains. This year, moving to centre half-forward is a bit of a change for me, I am seeing a lot more of the ball and I am running a lot more. I am getting used to it and so far it is going well."

In consultation with Magpies coach Michael Tos, "the plan was for me to play last year at centre half-forward. The hamstring injuries put those plans on the back pedal, and the lack of fitness meant I played out of the square. This year, I have had a nice pre-season and I enjoying the new role. Our new physios are on board and have done some assessments on my hamstring, and have come up with a plan consisting of thorough match-day stretching and also stretching through the week. The hammy is basically back to 100% right now."

McPhan said that there is an excellent vibe around the whole club at present, "with the club really heading in the right direction. Our Coach Michael Tos has instilled in us a dedication to training and a willingness to improve across the board. After winning the Black Diamond First Division competition in 2014, we went downhill from there for a while. Tossy has been great for us, driving us to seek continual improvement in all grades, and that has benefits across the Club. Our Women's side, this year led by Josh Lawlor, have been great as well and they have a big chance this season. It's very much Happy Days at Wyong Lakes at the moment."

McPhan stated that the Magpies Cup side is a very young side and that he is one of the senior players, albeit at the relatively young age of 26. "We have some really good young local juniors in our squad, and it falls on some of our experienced blokes like Chris Koop-Folkes, Lee Moore and myself to show leadership around the Club. It's our definite goal to make the Top 7, and I think with the group of players we have, we are improving each week under Tossy's leadership."

Not only does McPhan excel on the football field he is also an accomplished Baseball pitcher, having a trial arranged around this time last year with Sydney Blue Sox. "Unfortunately, in Round 3 of 2017, I did my hamstring so that sadly I couldn't trial then with the Blue Sox. Being a pitcher, you simply can't perform with a crook hammy. I came back a bit too early from the first hammy, hoping for another chance with the Sox, but I did it again and that put paid to any trials". McPhan plays Baseball locally for the Wyong Wildcats and supports the St Louis Cardinals in the MLB.

The Magpies will be looking to make it two wins on the trot this Saturday when they host Lake Macquarie at Don Small Oval.



PAGE EXCELLING AS BOMBERS SKIPPER

New Killarney Vale Women's captain Ashleigh Page is relishing her new role and is leading from the front.

She has started the 2018 season in great form being named as Killarney Vale's best player in the opening two rounds of the season, and is dead keen on having a huge season and helping her team deep into the August-September GE Womens Competition Finals Series.

Page explained that she is very happy to be captain of her team at the relatively young age of 22. "We lost our captain over the off-season, I came back from Canada early last season and wanted to step up into a leadership role. Everything fell into place for me, which I was very happy about, and I really keen to fulfil this role."

Page stated that she returned from working in Canada for Round 5 last season. "I was working at a ski resort at Silver Star Ski Resort in British Columbia, which is about six hours from Vancouver. Unlike previous years, this season I have been able to get in a full pre-season, which has been important for my skills and fitness levels."

Whilst having the ability to play in most positions, Page's preference is to play in the midfield. "I hope to have most of my game time in the midfield, trying to get quality ball to Butters (Georgia Butler) and Skye Bailey in the forward line. I think I will go up forward and down back at times, dependent on match situations."

Page advised that the competition has definitely improved over the past couple of seasons and that she feels this season is a very open competition.

Page said that her Killarney Vale are definitely targeting a place in the BDAFL Top 7 this season. "Making the Finals last year was a great achievement for us, and this year we are striving to take that extra step. We've got some great young players and I feel that we are ready to go further in this year's Finals Series."

Growing up in Broken Hill playing Basketball, Page then moved to Tamworth, playing representative Basketball there before moving to the Central Coast and commencing playing Australian Rules in an unusual way. "I had just come out of a movie at Tuggerah Westfield, not even knowing that Australian Rules existed on the Coast, and the Killarney Vale girls were handing out flyers at the Shopping Centre. I came down to training the following Tuesday and it is fair to say that I have fallen in love with the game. I always went to footy with Dad in the AFL-dominated Broken Hill, never thinking that I would actually play the game."

Page had an interesting opinion on how playing Basketball for so many years has helped her with playing Australian Rules. "Basketball has helped me the most with overhead marking. I pride myself on taking contested marks, and this is where Basketball has really helped me. We are working on contested marking repeatedly at training, because we know if we can take contested marks, we can really break out. Georgia Butler has fantastic marking skills, you will have to look out for her this year, she has really improved."

Page is a fulltime factory worker on the Central Coast. She explained "I am working full-time, my hours are, I get my weekends off, I can get to training and this enables me to focus completely on my footy."

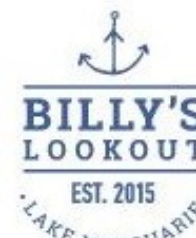

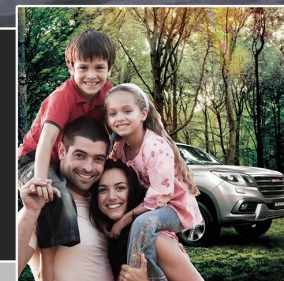
