PREVIEW—ROUND 4

In the Hunter Haval Black Diamond Cup AFL Round 4 fixtures this Saturday, undefeated Cardiff host last round victors Nelson Bay at Hillsborough; Newcastle City are at their No.1 Sportsground headquarters for this first time this season as they host Killarney Vale; Singleton and Maitland, always great rivals, have their first ever Black Diamond Cup local derby at Rose Point Park in Singleton; undefeated Wyong Lakes have an enormous challenge, visiting reigning premiers Terrigal Avoca at Hylton Moore Oval; and Gosford Tigers, chock full of confidence after two very impressive wins in successive rounds over Maitland and Singleton, host the Lake Macquarie Dockers, looking for their first win of the season. Cardiff have come through the first three rounds, against City, Terrigal Avoca and Warners Bay with flying colours. An outstanding back six, led by Nick Tomlinson and Zac Metcalfe, kept the Bulldogs goal-less last week and launched countless attacking raids. Bryce Graetz has been a standout as a defensive on-baller, making life much easier for fellow won-ballers Marcus DeLeur, Jack Lennon, Simon O'Brien and Tom Yensch. Josh Murphy, Nelson Brown and the rapidly-improving small forward Lachlan Price have been in great form, Price in particular has been a nightmare for opposition defences with his foot-speed and ability to create something from nothing. Nelson Bay coach Sean McGrath led his charges to a solid first win of the season last week over Maitland. Jarryd Rymer, back from long-term injury, Mark Spencer and Connor McCartney provided excellent performances supporting stalwarts Billy Barton, Jayden Rymer and rover Adam Grinyer. Barton's match-up with Yensch will be a beauty this Saturday, and how Nelson Bay break down Cardiff's vaunted back six will be pivotal to the result of this fixture. Newcastle City, after the Bye last week, will be chomping at the bit to rip in against Killarney Vale this Saturday, at the Blues headquarters of No.1 Sportsground. The return of representative ruckman Chris Jackson from Collingullie-Glenfield Park is massive for City, giving them plenty of opportunities in the ruck contests plus an extra follower, such is Jackson's quality around the ground. Pat Gillingham, Cam Keast and the very promising Reed van Huisstede give City plenty of targets up forward, with veteran followers Mitchell Knight and Matt Enright giving the Blues plenty of contested ball and quality delivery. The Bombers will hope coach Scott Reed returns this week, as they only managed four goals last week against Terrigal Avoca. Max Mumford and Josh Mifsud were both solid contributors in their first game of the season last week, and Ryan Coughlan and ruckman Tim Oosterhoff have been very consistent across the first three rounds. Wyong Lakes head to East Gosford on Saturday undefeated in their two first two matches back in the Black Diamond Cup. The Magpies face a huge task in combatting the reigning premiers Terrigal Avoca in a litmus test of where they are at in their return to the top division. Club stalwarts Lee Moore, Chris Koop-Folkes and Justin McPhan have started the season in great form for the Magpies, with Max Warran, Peter Drzal and youngster Keaton Jones also in fine form in the Magpies in their 136-point win over the Dockers last week. Wyong Lakes need to find a way to kick a decent score against the traditionally stingy Panthers defence if they to secure an upset victory. Terrigal Avoca got back to business in a solid win over Killarney Vale last Friday Night. Coach Chris Bishop will be very pleased with his back six after they kept the Bombers goal-less after half-time, and will look for a repeat performance against a confident Magpies forward line led by the experienced Justin McPhan. Brandon Thomas has been in great form in the forward line in the first three rounds, and Jack Grimmond has been the in-form rover across the competition, his run and carry causing huge headaches through the middle of the ground. Both Singleton and Maitland will look to get back to winning ways in their Hunter Valley derby this Saturday after Round 2 losses. There will be extra incentive with both teams playing for a trophy in memory of former Singleton player, Brian Childs who died tragically in a car accident in 2015, the week after these two teams played. Maitland, after a poor first half last week, came roaring back in the second half in a positive sign for the Saints. Mitch Greaves, Mick Norton and Dustin Spriggs were excellent for the Saints last week, and Harrison Harbrow and Bailey Challen will look to repeat their Round 2 form as the Saints play their fierce rivals and their Grand Final opponents in the past two years. Singleton would have been disappointed in losing a thriller at West Gosford last Saturday, and coach Andrew Scott, in his new role across half-back, will be seeking an improved performance across the park as the Roosters seek their second win of the season. Scott's move to the back six has opened up a followers role for the outstanding Sam Brasington, who has returned to the Black Diamond Cup a better footballer from his time in the Victorian city of Sale. Jackson Kolatchew has emerged as the Roosters key forward this season. Gosford welcome Lake Macquarie to Adcock Park. Gosford coach Josh Barty must have been a proud man last Saturday evening as the Tigers completed a wonderful seven days in which they defeated both of the 2017 Plate Grand Finalists, Maitland and Singleton, by a combined twelve points. Barty saw experienced forward Tim Eather kick a match-winning five goals last week, with valuable contributions from Tom Hunt, Mark Haywood and Daniel White. Alex Remy has been very consistent for his coach already this season and will look for plenty of touches this Saturday against the Dockers. The Dockers quite simply must win this week, both to kick-start their season and for their own confidence in what has been a tough return to the Black Diamond Cup. Regulars Riley Janissen and Rory Sleeth were good performers last week, ably supported by Clayton Beck and Isaiah Button. Key forward Damon Tually will need a big haul of majors this week if the Dockers are to trouble the Tigers. The Dockers may elect to have a loose man in defence after having big scores kicked on them in their last two losses to City and Wyong Lakes. In the GE Womens Competition, Nelson Bay are away to Cardiff; Lake Macquarie has a tough away fixture at Adcock Park against Gosford; the Newcastle City Stars host Killarney Vale in what will be a big test for the Bombers; Terrigal Avoca host Wyong Lakes; Maitland are away to Singleton; Wallsend-West Newcastle welcome Warners Bay to Bill Elliott Oval; Muswellbrook make the long trek to Medowie to play Port Stephens and The Entrance Bateau Bay welcome the very much in-form Newcastle City Novas to the Bateau Bay Sporting Facility. In the Black Diamond Plate, reigning premiers Cardiff welcome Nelson Bay to Hillsborough; Singleton host The Entrance Bateau Bay at Rose Point Park; Newcastle City host Killarney Vale; Warners Bay make the short trip to Maryland to play Wallsend-West Newcastle; Muswellbrook host Maitland at Weeraman Field; Wyong Lakes are away to Terrigal Avoca and the Gosford Tigers are at home to Lake Macquarie.

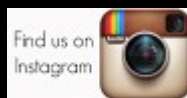

BDAFL SOCIAL COMPETITION

The inaugural BDAFL Social Competition will commence this Sunday with four Central Coast clubs, Gosford, Killarney Vale, Terrigal Avoca and Wyong Lakes nominating teams to participate.

The competition will be for players 35 years and over (as at 1 January) however club s will also be able to have four underage players on the field at any one time.

Underage players however are not permitted to play on both Saturday and Sunday on the same weekend.

BDAFL Football Operations Manager, Garry Burkinshaw is excited by the new competition.

“The Social competition is exactly that “social” and gives those players who can no longer play in the main competitions on a Saturday the opportunity to still be able to run around (albeit a bit slower) and have a kick. Already we have heard of a number of former BDAFL greats who will be making a return” Burkinshaw said.

“The allowance to field underage players also gives an opportunity for players who careers may have been cut short by injury or availability to still play, whilst we may also see fathers and sons having a game together”

The competition will consist of six home and away matches played every two/three weeks with both matches scheduled at the same venue. At the conclusion of the regular season a finals day will be held.

In addition to the age restrictions there are a number of rule variations which include:

- No raised knees in the ruck contest
- Greater protection for the player in front in a marking contest
- Overly aggressive and sling tackling not permitted
- Non-tackling rule for those players not wishing to be tackled.

TOMLINSON AT HOME WITH THE HAWKS

Veteran Cardiff defender, Nick Tomlinson is not only doing an excellent job on-field for the Hawks but also providing a great service to the club members off it as well.

Vastly experienced Cardiff Hawks backman Nick Tomlinson has had a great football career, including stints in the QAFL, NEAFL (both with Morningside AFC) and in the SANFL (with Sturt AFC) made even better when you consider that he hails from Bowen in the Whitsunday Islands District of North Queensland (Tomlinson explained that Bowen is the “Fruit Bowl of the North”) and just to play junior footy, he had to travel two hours one way to play footy in Mackay.

“My interest in footy came through my father, who grew up in Albert Park in Melbourne. The closest competitions were either two hours north in Townsville or two hours south in Mackay, so I played my first game of footy with the North Mackay Saints as a 12 year old, having played soccer up to that point. My first touch was a goal, and I was hooked from that moment on.”

Tomlinson, after attending Boarding School in Yeppoon, and whilst “Australian Rules was well down the pecking order at a Rugby League School, I managed to make a few rep sides and win some respect.”

After graduating High School, Tomlinson headed to Brisbane “to try and get drafted. I ended up at the Morning-side footy club, and I’ve been there ever since, apart from a two year stint in Adelaide with Sturt and six months in Darwin, where I played as well.”

Tomlinson explained how he ended up playing in the SANFL; “I’d gone a bit stale with my footy in Brisbane, I was looking to get out and do something different. I went to Darwin with a mate, and played with the Palmerston Magpies in the 2006/07 season, and just enjoyed my footy up there. I had a lot of fun and came runner-up in the League Best & Fairest Medal. One weekend, I was lucky enough to play well one weekend when some Sturt scouts were there, and I got an invite to trial with them. I went OK in the trial and got signed up for a two-year contract.” Tomlinson was honest and blunt in rating his performance with the Double Blues “I struggled. It’s very good footy down there, I played just two games in the SANFL and ended up playing in the feeder club in the lower Leagues by the end of the two years. I am really glad I did it, I got myself super fit and gave myself the best chance, but I just wasn’t good enough, to be honest”.

After heading back to Queensland, accumulating representative jumpers for both Queensland Country (“I am a very proud country boy and I played in four carnivals with Queensland Country) and Queensland, and playing in the first years of the NEAFL with the Morningside Panthers, Tomlinson advised how he ended up in Newcastle; “My ex-partner was offered a great position at a Shopping Centre in the Lower Hunter Valley, so we made the decision to move to Newcastle with our little boy Hugh, who was born in 2014.”

“We’d visited Newcastle over the years, and really loved it, so we came down here. When we first came here, I was keen to watch some local footy, so I ventured down to No.1 Sportsground early last season, and Cardiff had a win over Newcastle City. When I was leaving Brisbane, I had a mate who said he knew a bloke in Newcastle who was the President of a club down there. I ended up running into current Cardiff AFC President Quinton Davis at that game and he said “yes, I was aware that you were coming down here. I felt that the club had a real family feel about it, and I ventured down to training. Long-term calf issues reared its ugly head last year, on the back of no pre-season. I didn’t play much last year.”

This year is a different story however as he has been the lynch pin for the Cardiff defence with his ability to read the play, excellent decision making and excellent skills not only repelling opposition forward forays but also starting many of Cardiff’s attacking movements,

“I’m having plenty of fun running around again to be honest. Didn’t think I’d missed it so much until now”.

Off-field he is currently working in a couple of different jobs; “I am doing two casual jobs at the moment. I am Youth Worker with The Big Brown House, and I’m also doing a Food Prep role with Dark Horse Café in Wickham run by the lovely Shelley Valvo, the partner of Quinton Davis.”

“Also, I have started a player welfare program at Cardiff, similar to something I did at Morningside AFC. It’s there to show players that there is a framework around them for anything that they need, be it their Mental Health, everyday obstacles like buying your first car, enrolling in University, etc. We’ve also got a Professional Network set up for the more involved, specific issues like medical or legal issues.”



JONES, A MASTER OF ALL SPORTS

The introduction of the Black Diamond AFL women’s competition has seen women who have excelled at other sports come across and play AFL with Gosford forward Ange Jones a perfect example of this.

Jones has had, by anyone’s measure, a remarkable football career across four different codes.

Jones explained that she has:

- Represented Australia in OzTag
- Represented the NSW Cockatoos in Rugby Union
- Player Premier League soccer with Ourimbah
- Played in an AFL Sydney Premiership with the Gosford Tigers
- A long history in Athletics, with emphasis on Shot Put, Discus & Javelin



How did Jones get involved with AFL; “I actually got involved with footy via Karina and Simon Berry. I used to play soccer with Karina, when she was Karina Davidson, at East Gosford FC. Karina put a message out to the girls about playing Australian Rules, so I went down one day, had a game and absolutely loved it.”

“I’m from a Rugby Union background originally, playing for Ourimbah as well as Central Coast and NSW Country, so the tackling was not an issue, it was more learning the rules of AFL, and I haven’t stopped playing since. I played Rugby as a fullback or outside centre, so I am used to kicking the football, although it must be said that a Rugby Union football and an Australian Rules football are completely different.”

Jones has played OzTag for 19 years as well. “I’ve played OzTag with Central Coast, the NSW Country Bulls, the Australian open side, at Under 27 level then recently for the Over 35 team. We are playing in the OzTag World Cup at Coffs Harbour in November this year, after the Nationals at the same venue in October.”

Extraordinarily, there’s even more. Ange Jones; “The week after the World OzTag championships, we (competing for Mingara) head to the Gold Coast for the Masters Pan-Pacific Athletics championships. I compete in most disciplines except long-distance running, but my best events are the throwing events; Shot Put, Discus & Javelin. As far as we have been advised, the Pan-Pacs will be staged at the home ground of the Gold Coast Suns and the Athletics for the recent Commonwealth Games, Carrara (or Metricon) Stadium.”

Jones is a stay-at home Mum to 2 year-old Billie. “I have a great support network for my daughter, who comes with me to all of my footy games, of every code. “It’s easy and hard at the same time. I live in the Lake Macquarie District, so training with the Tigers is a fair trip each week. On Saturdays, the Mums on the sideline look after Billie for me. On Sundays at OzTag, I have some of my family take care of Billie. I pretty much play for her now.”

Jones was upbeat when talking about Gosford’s chances in season 2018, despite the loss of 2017 League Best & Fairest Alison Parkin and centre half-back Tarryn O’Hehir. “I think, with the squad we have, we’ve got a lot of new players coming through. A lot of them have experience playing junior AFL or other football codes, they’ve got the sporting ability, they just need to learn the rules, and they are picking up the rules very quickly. Having any sort of background in ball sports like football, Netball and Basketball is a huge advantage. It’s great confidence for our team having new players that are willing to learn, and that is being reflected on the field. I think we have a great chance of making the Top 7 this year.”

Jones herself has started the season in good form kicking seven goals in each of the two games she has played to sit in second position on the league goalkicking table.

Ange Jones is quite simply an inspiration, and is a wonderful role model for all players in the League. We wish Ange and the Tigers all the best for this season and beyond.

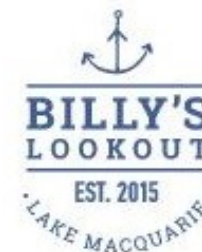

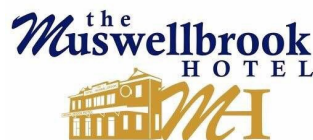
