

PREVIEW—ROUND 5

In the Hunter Haval Black Diamond Cup, Wyong Lakes head to Feighan Oval to play Warners Bay; Singleton makes the trek to the Central Coast to play hosts Terrigal Avoca; Newcastle City are away to the Maitland Saints, Lake Macquarie host Nelson Bay and in the BARTV Match of the Round, undefeated Cardiff head to Tumbi Umbi to play the Killarney Vale Bombers. Gosford has the Bye. Wyong Lakes, after being dismantled by Terrigal Avoca last week, head to Feighan Oval knowing they must win to stay in the top 7. Magpies coach Michael Tos will be after complete commitment on the training track this week in order to have Wyong Lakes ready for a Warners Bay outfit that will be close to full strength for the first time this season. The Magpies will look to Brayden Tos, Tyler Wood, the experienced Lee Moore and Carter Jones for clearances in the centre on the wide-open expanses of Feighan Oval, hoping to get the ball quickly to key forward Justin McPhan. The Bulldogs are expecting the return of Jack Hardman, Luke Roach, Nick Turner, Ben Crawley and Ben Hunter, five automatic members of Marty Reiman's First XVIII. Hardman missed the AN-ZAC fixture with a slight leg problem but will be fully fit this Saturday. Turner and Hunter give the Bulldogs



great experience and Crawley will slot into his new role at centre-half back, seeking to take intercept marks and get the ball to influential half-back flanker Lachlan Deverell. Singleton make their second visit to the Central Coast in fourteen days, knowing they will have a huge task in trying to topple Terrigal Avoca on their home deck at Hylton Moore Oval. Roosters coach Andrew Scott has had solid performers in Scott Moore, Cam White and follower Sam Brasington this season, and will look to Jackson Kolatechew and rover/small forward Alex Mitchell to trouble the Panthers back six. The return of sublime centreman James Webster last week was a massive boost for Chris Bishop and the Panthers. Brandon Thomas has been superb as a small forward so far this season, coming second in the League goalkicking tally with fourteen goals across four rounds. Terrigal Avoca midfield will have speedy rover Jack Grimmond back this week, with Grimmond's form so far this season, particularly his run and carry, sure to cause headaches for Scott and the Roosters midfield. Newcastle City have been in very good form in their three matches this season, A close loss to early competition favourites Cardiff in Round 1 has been followed by very convincing wins over the Dockers and Bombers. Despite a significant turnover of players in the off-season, City have been kicking some good scores on the back of an effective forward line, led by Pat Gillingham and Cam Keast. Conor Haswell's move to the midfield has been an unqualified success, with his clean hands and superb delivery surely raising the interest of BDAFL selectors two weeks out from a huge clash with AFL Canberra at Manuka Oval. Maitland's long-term injury list and a couple of significant retirements are not being used by the Saints as an excuse for their early-season struggles in their first season playing Cup football. Mitch Greaves has moved into the midfield and has been solid all year, supported by the experienced Chris Pedler and ruckman Mick Norton. The acquisition of Newcastle City premiership players will provide valuable experience for the youthful Saints outfit. Lake Macquarie head home to Tulkaba Park seeking their first victory of the season over a Nelson Bay side needing some immediate victories if they are to get near the Top 7. The Dockers were undermanned last week in their loss to Gosford, but the form of ruckman Riley Janissen, winger Daniel Zuzek, Rory Sleeth and long-kicking fullback Damian McIntyre will be very pleasing to the Dockers faithful. Janissen had a great battle with the Tigers' Tristan Carter last week and will have his hands full with the League's most in-form ruckman, the Marlins' Billy Barton, this week. Nelson Bay have been inconsistent so far this season and need to dominate the centre clearances this week to put enormous pressure on the Dockers back six. Barton's on-ballers, Jayden Rymer and Adam Grinyer, were in good form last week and need to repeat that form if the Marlins are to topple the Dockers. Newcomer Andrew Last has been in Nelson Bay's top six best players all season, and the return to form last week of reliable utility Joel Erickson will have been pleasing for Marlins coach Sean McGrath. The BARTV Match of the Round comes from Adelaide St Oval, where Killarnev Vale faces the undefeated Cardiff Hawks. Killarney Vale will look to pick up the pieces after running onto a dominant Newcastle City last Saturday. Ryan Coughlan has been in good form for the Bombers, and Coughlan will need his very best performance if the Bombers are to spring a massive upset. Ruckman Tim Oosterhoff's battle with Hawks ruckman/forward Tom Yensch will be pivotal to the contest, as will the Bombers trying to control Cardiff's superb midfield. Coach Scott Reed will probably be picked up by Cardiff's backline general Zac Metcalfe, with Reed needing to keep Metcalfe close to the goalsquare to prevent Metcalfe linking up with Bryce Graetz and Nick Tomlinson across half-back. The gradual return to full fitness of Bombers' midfield gun Josh Mifsud from a long-term ankle injury gives Reed some real quality in the centre, something the Bombers need in abundance if they are to make a run at the Top 7. Cardiff, despite Yensch's absence last week, are travelling exceptionally well this season and it is all smiles at Hillsborough at this time. Hawks coach Nathan Harkness has an unusual forward line, going without a traditional power forward unless Yensch is resting in a forward pocket. Josh Murphy, Jack Lennon and vastly improved small forward Lachlan Price have been a combined constant menace for opposition backlines as the Hawks seek their first Black Diamond Cup since 2006. In the GE Womens Competition, Killarney Vale are at home to Cardiff; The Entrance Bateau Bay host Port Stephens; Gosford head to Bill Elliott Oval to play hosts Wallsend-West Newcastle; Warners Bay are at home to Wyong Lakes; Singleton makes the long trek to East Gosford to take on Terrigal Avoca; Maitland welcome the Newcastle City Novas to Max McMahon Oval; Nelson Bay are away to Lake Macquarie and the Newcastle City Stars head to Weeraman Field to play the Muswellbrook Cats. In the Hunter Haval Black Diamond Plate, Cardiff head to Adelaide St Oval to play Killarney Vale; Wyong Lakes are away to Warners Bay; Terrigal Avoca are at home to Singleton; Newcastle City make the short journey to Rutherford to take on the Maitland Saints; Lake Macquarie host Nelson Bay: Wallsend-West Newcastle host Gosford and great rivals Muswellbrook and The Entrance Bateau Bay do battle at Weeraman Field.



O'LEARY BUOYANT ABOUT WOMEN'S TALENT

When Newcastle City Stars Coach, Shaun O'Leary says that more women from the Black Diamond AFI are capable of being drafted into the AFLW competition you take notice given his recent experience in the AFLW system.

"I personally think that Black Diamond AFL has got so much potential, some of the girls in this League are as good as the girls I worked with up in Darwin. I think if they get the get the right opportunities, albeit we are a fair way away from Sydney, we can definitely see some of these girls getting drafted into the AFLW."

O'Leary has excellent football coaching credentials, moving to Newcastle after being heavily involved with Womens Football in the Northern Territory, inclusive of working with the Adelaide Crows AFLW program.



"I like the way that the AFL has managed the AFLW for now, and I agree with the number of teams that have competed in the first two years of the competition. They haven't gone too hard too soon, and particularly with all of the junior pathways that weren't there previously, we are only going to see the quality improve exponentially as the young girls develop."

O'Leary has been very pleased with the start of the 2018 season by his Stars. "There's a long way to go in the season, of course, but I couldn't have asked for a better start, that's for sure. We have some real quality in players like Paige Mathewson, Ashlee Hayllar & Sarah Halvorsen. We have a couple of the best players in the League, we are pretty blessed. I'm actually working closely with the multi-talented Halvorsen to try to get concentrate more on Australian Rules, the sky's the limit for her."

When asked about his coaching in the Northern Territory, O'Leary explained; "I spent four years up there, and stumbled across Womens footy, spending time with the Waratah footy club, who are a powerhouse of Womens footy up in the NT. They've won six of the last seven Grand Finals, so they are a very successful team. More recently, I was working with the NT Football Academy and the Adelaide Crows AFLW Academy, working with the Darwin-based Crows players in the off-season and identifying possible draftees as well."

O'Leary explained that, over his time at Waratah AFC, several Tiwi Islanders were an integral part of the club's success. "We had four members of the one family who came across from the Tiwi Islands on a regular basis."

The BDAFL and Newcastle City took the unusual step of conducting a full draft of their female players in the offseason, creating the Stars and the Novas sides. O'Leary's take on the Draft was; "We play each other this week which will be very interesting, both teams on paper are very even."

"Personally, coming in fresh and not having seen Newcastle City previously, I think it's exciting. We have some really good, young junior talent in our team that were probably hidden away with the Novas last year, they're now getting the opportunity to play alongside Mathewson, Hayllar, Halvorsen and Kirsty Ferguson, and I think it's fantastic for the club overall."

O'Leary stated that City premiership player and Nova Audrey Gillingham was a very a good player and "she will one of the players we pay most attention to when the two sides meet."

O'Leary has just returned from coaching the Australian Defence Forces Womens team when they played the Richmond AFLW side at Punt Rd as a curtain-raiser to the Richmond-Melbourne Anzac Eve game at the MCG.




GREAVES RELISHING PLAYING BLACK DIAMOND CUP

Maitland Saints midfielder Mitchell Greaves commenced playing for his beloved club as an Under 12 player in the Newcastle AFL back in 2007 and is now relishing the opportunity to play in the Hunter Haval Black Diamond Cup.

Injuries and retirements have meant that Greaves has moved from the backline into the midfield this season. "It's been an awesome experience playing in the Black Diamond Cup. I've been thrown into the midfield this year. I played on Jayden Rymer when we played Nelson Bay recently, just watching him is great but to play against him, he is such a star player. He is so young and so talented, that's where you want to get to with your footy."

As the twenty-two year-old Greaves approaches two major milestones this season (he has played 91 Senior and 6 Reserves matches for Mait-



Greaves explained that "Dad (Kevin Greaves) and a few others started the club in 2007, starting just with Under 12s and 10s, and we pretty much worked our way up from there. We had the goal of getting a Senior team eventually, and we got there with a lot of hard work. We are now at the top level, which is where everyone in the club wanted to head. It's great that we made it, and it's awesome to see how far the club has gone in a Rugby League dominated area."

Greaves started off playing soccer before taking up Australian Rules when the Saints formed. "When I was in High School, I was influenced to play Rugby League for a bit (from 2010-2012), it was a dumb decision looking back as I could have developed a lot more as an Australian Rules player if I had kept at all the way through from Juniors. I got back into playing with the Saints in 2013 when we got back to playing First Grade footy."

Greaves and the Saints had very different experiences in the 2016 and 2017 Grand Finals, both against Singleton at Newcastle No.1 Sportsground. Greaves stated "2016 was a tough one. We came in pretty confident, we had a good side all year, and to finally make the Grand Final after being beaten by dominant sides in previous years was an amazing feeling.

That howling wind on the day was terrible, but that's no excuse, Singleton had to play in it too, we went out there and didn't play the way we wanted, and we ended up getting beat. It was very hard to cop, we had worked so hard to get there over many years.

We came back in the 2017 Grand Final, we had a few more players come back, we had a really strong senior side assisted by a few real good recruits. We really worked hard on our game, we knew that we would be coming up against a strong Singleton side again. We just threw everything we had at it, we knew it would be our last shots at playing in Grand Final for a while, as we were heading to the Black Diamond Cup in 2018. Getting the win was crazy, it was an amazing couple of days after, pretty surreal getting to celebrate, we went down in history. In the end we deserved it."

Greaves explained that the Saints are adjusting to life without Ben Stewart & Tim Sheldon (retirement) Wade Beard, Jim Taranto (season-ending injuries), and star forward Patrick McMahon ("who is unsure if he will be back this season, his leg injury is not healing as well as he hoped").

Greaves said that the upgraded Max McMahon Oval is in great nick, and not as hard as previous years. "It's much wider and the irrigation works mean that the ground is much better to play on than previous years."



RAWSON & CATS STARTING TO FIND THEIR FEET

Muswellbrook Cats follower Gyarn Rawson described the Cats' first ever victory, a couple of weeks ago over The Entrance Bateau Bay, as "such a good feeling, it was very, very exciting, there were lots of celebrations and it picked up the spirits of the girls after a tough year last year." They backed that win up with their second win last Saturday over Port Stephens.

When asked about playing for the Cats in their second season in the BDAFL, Rawson stated "it's completely different. Last year, it was our first year, we had to find our feet, a lot us didn't know what to do, it took us a while to know what to expect. Coming into our second year, we have some new girls playing, and it just feels totally different. The girls have



picked back up, the coaching is getting a lot better as well as our skill levels improve, it's amazing how quickly things can turn around in a year with a couple of wins under our belt. We definitely feel much more like a football team now"

Rawson advised that Muswellbrook stalwart Ken Garland is coaching the Womens team this year and he is being assisted by Grant O'Leary.

Rawson explained that the Cats are very much a family club; "it's definitely a family club, we come from a small town so everyone knows everyone, some of us have partners in the Mens team, we used to sit on the sidelines watching the Mens side and now we are actually playing each week.

It's a big family affair, my partner Cameron Davis plays in the Mens team. Cameron's a good player, but I think I have got him this year, I have more goals than him so far so there is a bit of partnership rivalry going on this year." Rawson described her sporting background; "My sporting background was mainly Netball. I played representative Netball for about five years. I played a bit of Rugby Union at school, and I have played in a few charity Rugby League games. I have always been a bit of a sporty person, but because of my height and build, Australian Rules was right up my alley."

Gyarn advised that she is approximately six-foot-tall, about the same height as former Nelson Bay and now GWS ruck Philippa Smyth. "I rucked against Pippa then went and then went and watched her play for the Giants, which was awesome. She is phenomenal. I'm not going to lie, watching Pippa set off a little fire in my belly, and I was like, this could be me or a couple of other girls if we do alright. Watching someone that I rucked against, playing for GWS, was awesome."

Rawson said that after taking up Australian Rules, tackling was never a problem for her. "Tackling is something I really enjoy doing, that has never been a problem. Playing League, Union and Netball, they are stop-start games, whereas I enjoy the skills and constant movement in Australian Rules, it's a perfect mixture. The fitness (particularly the running) has got me a bit, especially last year, where fitness got a lot of us. Once you are on the field, your adrenalin kicks in and you kind of forget that you are dying inside."

Gyarn Rawson is a Plant Mechanic by trade, working at the Mount Arthur mine, working shiftwork. "Last weekend, I was coming off night shift, and you can definitely see a difference when I come off night shift, I get a little bit crankier when I'm off night shift. Kenny says I should take full advantage of this and work night shift before every game!"

Gyarn Rawson is one of Muswellbrook's leading lights and we wish her and the entire Muswellbrook football club all the best this season and beyond.



For the second week in a row we have all three sides competing at home, this time against Singleton.


We had a great week on and off the field with both men's sides scoring good wins and the women having a very promising result against Wyong Lakes.




