

PREVIEW—ROUND 7

Black Diamond Cup action returns this week after a General Bye last Saturday for the representative fixture played in Canberra. In the Match of the Round, Wyong Lakes & Singleton, sixth and seventh on the ladder, have a crucial clash at Rose Point Park. These two sides have had many spirited clashes in recent years in the Black BLACK Diamond Plate competition most notable last year when Singleton eliminated Wyong Lakes from the Premiership race after the Magpies finished minor premiers. This however will be the first meeting of the teams time in the Black Diamond Cup competition since 2011. The Magpies enter the match on the back of a stirring victory over arch rivals Killarney Vale and will be looking to the return of key forward Justin McPhan to provide another avenue to goal which was carried last start by five goals to Jarred Cross. McPhan's return will be offset however by the expected loss of arguably their best player this year in Chris Koop-Folkes due to a facial injury. Koop-Folkes injury will mean players such as Tyler Wood and Nathan Doyle to provide support to their star midfielders Tim Hillman and Lee Moore both of whom never seem to play a bad game. Singleton are coming off a horror last four weeks, where they travelled to Gosford, Terrigal Avoca and Newcastle City, all three fixtures and will welcome their return to the comforts of home where they are unbeaten this year, including a win over Warners



Bay. Coach Andrew Scott is expected to be able to call on a number of key players which will certainly provide support to Sam Brasington, Alex Mitchell, Sam Brasington, Scott Moore and Cam White. Scott himself is a proven star in our competition as shown in last weeks Representative fixture where he was judged Best on Ground for the BDAFL. Scott has used himself in many positions this year however a permanent role in the midfield would certainly benefit the Roosters. When expected return in Nick McPherson who will add must needed size to the Roosters and his match up with Magpies twin towers, Brendan Charlton and Brayden Tos could be pivotal to the outcome of this match. Warners Bay head to Gosford in what should be an interesting clash. The Bulldogs have returned to form in recent weeks whoever will be missing key players in Jack Hardman, Ben Hunter and Ryan Sorensen. Coach Marty Reiman will be hoping these losses will be offset by the return from injury of influential midfielder Jake Roach, whose long kicking be an asset on the short Adcock Park ground. Gosford pushed Terrigal Avoca for a half last start and will know that if they can repeat this effort they will be right in this contest. Daniel White has been a consistent performer all year and if he and BDAFL representative can get on top in the midfield, the leagues leading goalkicker Tim Eather could be a handful although Bulldogs fullback Lincoln Stewart will be a handful on the back of his impressive showing in the representative fixture last week.

10th-placed Killarney Vale must kick-start their season on Saturday when they host 11th-placed Lake Macquarie. The return of full forward Bryce Singleton has given the Bombers and extra dimension up forward allowing Scott Reed to push further up the ground. Tim Oosterhoff has been impressive all year as has skipper Josh Mifsud however they will need an alright performance if they are to record their first win of the season. OOSTERHOFF, A RUCKMAN ON THE RISE

Killarney Vale and BDAFL ruckman Tim Oosterhoff has been one of the Bombers most consistent players over the part two seasons, despite only recently turning 20 years of age.

Oosterhoff consistency was rewarded last Saturday when he made his representative debut against AFL Canberra, an experience he described as a steep learning curve. It was the first time I had really came up against a big ruckman (AFL Canberra's 6ft9", Matt Channon) and it took me a while to adjust. After half time I used my strength which is my leap and overall I was happy with my performance.

Oosterhoff, a Niagara Park Ourimbah junior, who was chosen as a teenager to be part of the Sydney Swans Academy. "Whilst I was part of the Swans Academy, I played my footy with the North Ryde Dockers for the first couple of years. I then played for Pennant Hills as well, playing in a losing Grand Final with them."



When Oosterhoff made a decision to re-commence playing footy on the Central Coast, he advised that he had some choices about where to play. "Niagara Park Ourimbah is more or less aligned with the Gosford Tigers, but at the time I came back to the Coast, they weren't playing Senior Footy. My Dad Steve won a premiership with Killarney Vale in the 80s so I wanted to play there. Dad is originally from Melbourne and also spent time in Darwin before settling on the Central Coast."

Oosterhoff also indicated that Steve Oosterhoff is "a very passionate Essendon fan, which is the main reason I am."

When asked about Killarney Vale's hope for 2018 and the expectation of a Top 7 finish, Oosterhoff stated "for sure, that's definitely one of our goals. At the start of the season, we were thinking of a top 3 finish, but the way things have panned out, with a few players injured and unavailable, we are aiming for a spot in the Top 7."

The return of veteran full-forward Bryce Singleton to the Bombers Cup side has been an added bonus for Oosterhoff and his colleagues. "He has kicked bags of four and six goals recently, he was actually in our Cup side when I made my debut. It's really good to have him back."

Oosterhoff also spoke about his teammates and good friends Kyall Walford and Alex Bailey; "Kyall has had some niggling injuries this season but he is a real quality player. Alex is always in there, having a real crack in and under, he's not afraid to have a crack at it, and he also brings a lot to our team."

Being a young ruckman does not faze Oosterhoff, and he talked about whom he looks up to in the Australian Football League; "I look up to players like Brodie Grundy from Collingwood and Nic Natanui from the West Coast Eagles. Grundy gets around the ground, picks up 30 touches and also 50 hitouts every week. He's great to watch. He killed it on Anzac Day, he's pretty much an extra midfielder now."

In the BDAFL, Oosterhoff indicated his highest-rated opponents in the ruck, "Tom Yensch is a very good player, the way he gets around the ground. Cameron Keast from Newcastle City is a tough opponent to come up against. He's a huge man and very hard to get off the ball."

Tim Oosterhoff is very confident of what the future holds for his beloved Killarney Vale club. "We've got some really promising juniors coming up, we have about six rookies in our Cup side right now. I'd say that over the next few years, we will be challenging Cardiff, Terrigal Avoca and Newcastle City for a place in the Top 3."

Oosterhoff indicated that having Adelaide St Oval as the Bombers home ground is a real privilege. "This will sound biased, but I think it's the best ground in the League. Great ground, electronic scoreboard, great people and a great culture."

Oosterhoff is a first-year apprentice draftsman with Lindsay Dynan Engineers in Tuggerah.

Tim Oosterhoff is one of the best tall men in the BDAFL, we wish him and the Bombers all the best for this season and beyond.

AFL CANBERRA TOO STRONG FOR BDAFL

These changes made a difference especially Scott, whose strength in the contest, ball winning ability and composure with the football saw the BDAFL experience their best period of the game to begin the third quarter. With Tim Oosterhoff using his jumping strength to gain control in the ruck the BDAFL were able to get the ball forward however wasteful kicking for goal saw them miss five shots on goal. As good sides do AFL Canberra made the BDAFL by taking the ball down the other end to kick back to back goals to deflate the BDAFL's spirits. Lennon and his Cardiff teammate Marcus DeLeur kicked goals before the three quarter time break to make the difference 59 points at the final change. Despite the result being decided the BDAFL players showed plenty of character and continued to compete aggressively and were rewarded with goals to Jack Hardman and Josh Mifsud to begin the final quarter with Pat Murphy kicking the final goal of the game all of which were interspersed by four AFL Canberra goals. Overall AFL Canberra were too strong thoroughly deserving their 70 point win. Coach Bilkey was philosophical after the game: "We got a bit of a shock in the first half, Canberra exposed us with their run, which we spoke about pre -game. They really used their run and their experience playing a such a big ground to their advantage. In the second half, we really put a focus on the contested football, our tackles inside the forward 50 in particular, and in the first part of the third quarter, we ramped up our intensity and pulled off some great tackles, which we were rewarded for. We continued on in the second half and I was pleased with the way we ran the game out. AFL Canberra coach, Tony Bourke was very complimentary of the BDAFL, however also admitted their run was the difference in the game. "We thought we had an advantage with our run given the size of the ground and this proved to be the case however when the game was played in the corridor the BDAFL boys were very good". BDAFL Football Operations Manager, Garry Burkinshaw summed up the match as follows: "We were disappointed to lose as we want to win every game we play. Today AFL Canberra showed why they are the best league in the State and for the BDAFL we got the opportunity to give 22 players the opportunity to test themselves against quality opponents on an AFL ground and I am sure they all learnt something which they will take back to our competition. We will lick our wounds back come back bigger and stronger next year". Following the match Scott was presented with an award as the BDAFL's best player, the second time he has win this award having also received it in the BDAFL 2016 win over Farrer FNL.



VUKOVICH HAS FOOTBALL IN HER BLOOD

Growing up watching her father and grandfather playing Australian Football on Saturdays in the sporting-mad far western town of Broken Hill, Cardiff skipper Sheree Vukovich had a great upbringing for when she turned to football in 2017.

Vukovich, who has a Basketball and Netball background, and has been watching her husband Mattie play for the Hawks for many years. "I thought, now it's my turn to play footy. I am just under six-foot tall, so I played in the taller positions in both Netball and Basketball. When I took up footy, I hadn't played team sports for a while, I did a marathon and got into triathlon, more the individual types of sport. I thought I missed the team atmosphere way too much.

I had watching Mattie play for nine or ten years, I had been on the Committee, and I decided to change the Committee role into a playing role. It was good to do all of those individual sports but you really can't beat team sports."



The Hawks have had a tough start to the season but recently chalked up their first win over near-neighbours Lake Macquarie. Vukovich explained "I think

we have been building every week. There was a feeling of confidence before that game and we put it all together on the field, coming away with a very satisfying win."

Vukovich, who is an Occupational Therapist at John Hunter Hospital, explained that the Cardiff Football Club is very much a family club; "I think that the work that has been done by the Committee over the five years, it's been a gradual build to where we are now, but also all of the people coming back to the club. In the Womens side, we have two Cardiff legends in Paul Cooksley and Peter Yeomans coaching the LadyHawks. They have both played over 300 games each for the Club. This has helped create the family culture, and more and more people are coming back to the club. We also have a strong link with our Juniors, who are going gangbusters. The LadyHawks train with our Under 17 Girls side every week, and this is just an example of how we are trying to (and have) built our club."

Vukovich stated that all of the hard work done in recent seasons has really come to fruition in 2018; "this is the season where we ready to go on the field and we definitely have realistic chances of winning a couple of premierships this year. Our Womens side could sneak into the Top 7 with some consistent play. We have 18 new girls that have never played Australian Rules football before, we have elite juniors that have made representative squads (Arizona Cross and Eloise Peterson) and three or four others that have come back to football from other sports. The belief is really starting to happen, and you never know – we could put it all together in the second half of the season."

Vukovich is very proud of Cross and Peterson making the NSW/AFL Under 16 Representative Squad; "We see it as our job to provide a solid club and a pathway for talented young players like Arizona and Eloise. They have done a great job to get where they are and the whole club is justifiably proud of them and their achievements."

When asked about Cardiff's impending move to the brand new Pasterfield Complex at Cameron Park, Vukovich explained "we love our Nest at Hillsborough, it has a real country footy feel about it. Looking at the future, it has been over 10 years since we had our own senior home ground, and to finally have our own ground, where juniors and seniors can come together, with a great function centre, the anticipation to playing out there is huge. It shows where the club has got to, with the fact that Cameron Park is now a reality."

Sheree Vukovich is a real leader of not just Cardiff AFC but of Womens Football in general and we wish her and the LadyHawks all the best in the future.


