PREVIEW—ROUND 8

Round 8 of the Hunter Haval Black Diamond AFL competition will be played this Saturday, with a number of teams looking for a win to improve their chances of playing finals in 2018. The Round will also see the BADFL celebrate Indigenous Round with a number of clubs wearing specially designed guernsey's for the **BLACK** day. In the Match of the Round, Warners Bay enter a season-defining seven days this Saturday, with Terrigal Avoca at home followed by Newcastle City at No.1 Sportsground. The return from long-term injury of follower Jake Roach was a massive boost last week, and Saturday will give Bulldogs Coach Marty Reiman his first opportunity to select from a full squad all season, after Jack Hardman and Ben Hunter missed last Saturday's solid win over Gosford at Adcock Park. Warners Bay sit a game and 70 percent in front of Wyong Lakes and Singleton, and an upset win over Terrigal Avoca would see them draw level with the Panthers on 5 wins apiece. This game will be won and lost in the midfield. Coach Chris Bishop has a multitude of players able to rotate through the middle, and Sam Ellis' battle with improving Bulldogs ruckman Tom McDonell will be important to both sides chances. Warners Bay may elect to put a tag on the influential and wily Bishop,



with Nick Turner an option to play on the Panthers coach. The Bulldogs backline, in good form of late, will have their hands full with Pete Van Dam, small forward Brandon Thomas and Ellis when he rests up forward. Kavne Gibbs will start in the goalsquare and may have Will McKellar for company from the get-go. This game should be a cracker and BARTV coverage commences from Feighan Oval at 1.55pm. Nelson Bay, last start losers away to City, return to Dick Burwell, where they are normally a six goal better team than when they are on the road, when they host Gosford in a game they need to win if they are to keep in touch with the top 7. Reliable backmen Joel Erickson and David Wood always give coach Sean McGrath their very best efforts in support of stars Rymer, Adam Grinyer, Chris Eddy and rugged big man Andrew Last. McGrath will be hoping for the return of consistent ruckman Billy Barton to boost their chances. Gosford sit in sixth place on the ladder and must find their best away form to challenge the Marlins. Tigers coach Josh Barty was outstanding last week against Warners Bay and will need a continuance of that good form as the Tigers seek to quell the influence of star Nelson Bay follower Jayden Rymer. With an injury cloud over centre-half back Scott Burkinshaw, Barty must get four quarters of consistent football from Tristan Carter, Daniel White and gun forwards Tim Eather and Adam Lyons, Newcastle City have been in scintillating form since a close Round 1 loss to Cardiff. Patrick Gillingham's extraordinary 11-goal haul last Saturday during City's 100-point victory over Nelson Bay capitalized on great work up the ground from representative backman Conor Haswell, burly ruckman Cam Keast, Mitchell Knight and the speedy Jackson Crawford. Wyong Lakes badly missed Chris Koop-Folkes (fractured cheekbone) last week and will be without the experienced follower for at least another five weeks. Ruckman Brendan Charlton, rover Leigh Moore, rangy fullback Carter Jones and Brayden Tos were in fine form against the Roosters last week and coach Michael Tos will need an improved performance this week if the Magpies are to upset a very confident City outfit. Maitland has won just the one game this season, and welcomed back star forward Patrick McMahon for host game of the year last week. McMahon's immediate good form was a big lift for the struggling Saints, who are still coming to terms with the absence of Wade Beard, Jim Taranto, Tim Sheldon and Ben Stewart. Mitchell Greaves has been a standout this year for the Saints who have improved through the acquisition of veteran midfielder, Andrew Wilmott. The Saints will be confident of upsetting Killarney Vale however to do so will need to put in the same effort they displayed against Cardiff in the first half last week, however they will need to do it for the full four guarters. The return of veteran full-forward Bryce Singleton has been a real shot in the arm for Scott Reed and his Bombers. Singleton kicked ten goals against struggling Lake Macquarie last week, and Maitland coach David Ross will have sleepless nights on deciding a match up for the dynamic forward. Centre Josh Mifsud is just about back to full fitness and form after a debilitating leg injury ruined his 2017 season and 2018 pre-season. Club legend Dane Amidy continues to close in on 300 First Grade games for his beloved Killarney Vale, and his experience provides great leadership for the youthful Bombers outfit. Singleton produced a solid defensive display last week in their win over Wyong Lakes, but undefeated Cardiff present the Roosters' biggest challenge of the season so far. Brandon Quinn provided run and carry last week for coach Andrew Scott and will have a huge battle with Cardiff's midfielders Simon O'Brien. Jack Lennon and Matt Vukovic. Scott and Alex Mitchell moved between the half-back line and the centre at will last week, with gun ruck-rover Sam Brasington showing the benefits of playing in Gippsland last year. Brasington's expected battle with Marcus DeLeur will be a highlight this Saturday. Veteran full-forward Travis Bates, fresh from a polished five goal effort last week, will have his hands full with Zac Metcalfe this week. Cam White may be the initial matchup for gun small forward Lachlan Price, with Price's blinding speed sure to be a problem for Singleton's back six. In the GE Women's Competition, The Entrance Bateau Bay host Cardiff; undefeated Nelson Bay welcome third-placed Gosford to Dick Burwell Oval; the top of the ladder Newcastle City Stars venture to Tacoma to play Wyong Lakes; Warners Bay are at home to Terrigal Avoca; Port Stephens host the Newcastle City Novas; Killarney Vale head to Rutherford to play the Maitland Saints; Singleton are at home to the Lake Macquarie Dockers and Muswellbrook have a good chance at their third victory of the season when they host Wallsend-West Newcastle at Weeraman Field. In the Black Diamond Plate, Muswellbrook host Wallsend-West Newcastle at Weeraman Field; Gosford make the long trek to the Tomaree Peninsula to play Nelson Bay; Newcastle City will present a huge challenge for Wyong Lakes at Don Small Oval in Tacoma; Warners Bay welcome Terrigal Avoca to Feighan Oval; Maitland host Killarney Vale at Max McMahon Oval; Singleton are at home to Lake Macquarie and in a big Top 7 clash, third placed Cardiff play The Entrance Bateau Bay at the Bateau Bay Sporting Facility.

STEWART IS GETTING BETTER WITH AGE

Warners Bay custodian Lincoln Stewart is a living example that you are never too old having made his representative debut at the ripe old age of 36 in the recent fixture between the BDAFL and AFL Canberra at UNSW Canberra Oval.

Playing representative football at 36 years of age is a wonderful achievement for Lincoln Stewart. "I thought I was in the mix for the squad, and when I was advised that I had been selected, I was thrilled. Being at rep training was amazing, the skill level was outstanding. The camaraderie amongst players that you play against each week was excellent, everyone got along so well. It was an absolute honour to be selected."

"The game itself was a tough day at the office. You learn a lot in games



like that. You have run so much more to play at that level, their speed in the forward 50m arc was amazing. The BDAFL will be a lot better off for having played against AFL Canberra and when they come up here next year, it will be a lot closer".

Stewart earnt his debut after an excellent start to the season in his normal fullback role for the Warners Bay Bulldogs.

"I have been happy with the way I have been playing this year and it has helped that our backline is pretty settled with designated roles".

Stewart definitely feels that Warners Bay will be contenders at the end of the season. "It's definitely the most depth we have had in the club for a long time, probably since I have been there. We have always struggled if people were injured or had work commitments, but this year we have got that depth and we are just about at full strength now. We have a couple of big weeks coming up, Terrigal Avoca then Newcastle City at No.1."

Stewart didn't come to the game "until quite late, which, haha, explains a few of my skill issues, especially kicking the football. I played a lot of hockey as a younger person, and before that I was a swimmer. I went to school at Marist College in Canberra, the same school as the Wallabies' Joe Roff."

When asked about how he started playing football with the Woden Blues in 2012, Stewart explained that "I was always a fan, and I wanted to play a contact sport, as the sports I had been playing are not really contact sports. Swimming is an individual sport and Hockey, there is very little contact. I craved playing a full contact sport, I just wanted to test myself and see if I could do it."

Stewart was born and bred in Canberra, "I spent 30 years of my life there. I only came up to Newcastle in the last five years. Making my representative debut at Manuka was like a home ground in many ways. I don't miss the cold down there, it certainly became chilly in the last quarter. We did our team walk at about 11.00am and it was still foggy, but you know it's going to be blue sky when there is fog like that in the morning."

Stewart and his then partner (now wife) Suzanna decided to move to Newcastle "as it is actually very expensive to live in Canberra, with so many people in Government and in Parliament having good salaries. Housing is quite expensive, so we just wanted to try something different. We had some friends up in Newcastle, we travelled here quite a bit, and wanted a sea change, and knew that housing would be more affordable. We packed up and came on up.

When we initially came up here, we were living in New Lambton, which isn't really close to Warners Bay. I had a look at the ladder, and I wanted to go to team that were in the middle of the ladder. At that time, 2013, I think that the Bulldogs were on the fringe of the Finals. I contacted the club, came down to training and off I went. Lincoln Stewart is an integral part of the Warners Bay backline and we wish him all the best in the future.

ANOTHER SCOTT HAVING AN INFLUENCE AT SINGLETON

Influential Singleton half-back flanker Lynan Scott has been in great form this season, following on from her first season playing Australian Rules Football in 2017.

The Roosters are sitting comfortably inside the Top 7 and are looking toward their first Finals Series this year. Scott described how the Roosterettes are going right now; "Everyone's playing really well together, we are getting excellent numbers to training every night, it's a good feeling right now."

Scott is the wife of Singleton's Black Diamond Cup Coach Andrew Scott. When asked about rivalry in the household, Lynan Scott laughed and advised "It's always fun to challenge each other, and also to support one



another as well. When I first started playing Australian Rules, he was always out there running water and helping me out, he's been very supportive of me. He's a good man."

Scott has an interesting sporting background; "when I moved down here, I played League Tag, which I still play now on Sundays. Other sports I enjoy are Tennis, Golf, Touch Footy and I used to play OzTag in Brisbane. When I moved down here, I wanted to join a team, which is how I became involved in League Tag. Then I started watching Andrew play Australian Rules, after which I started turning up at footy training. I was training with the Mens team to start off with just for fitness, then started training with the Womens side, then commenced playing. This is my second year playing the game and I am absolutely loving it."

Scott is playing across half-back this season in a bid to capitalize on what she believes is her greatest asset; her speed across the ground; "I always play on the wing in League Tag to use my pace, I got into the Hunter Rep Team for League Tag this season but missed out because I tore my hamstring recently, which has also knocked me out of playing for the Roosters. I am hoping to get back on the field in the next week of two as I am not enjoying being in the sidelines. I did my hammy last year as well, so I am looking after it and making sure that I do not come back too early."

Scott also indicated that she would love to be involved with the Hunter team at the BDAFL Womens representative three-way carnival to be played at the home of the Port Stephens Power, Ferodale Park in Medowie, on Saturday June 21.

Scott, who was born in Melbourne, "spent most of my school-age years living in Grafton in northern NSW. I then went up to Brissy for Uni and that's where I met Andrew." Scott advised that she has a Mining and Geotechnical Engineering Dual Major, part of the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) program at the University of Queensland. Lynan Scott is working as a Mining Engineer at Bengalla Mine, just west of Muswellbrook and about 40 minutes from Singleton. "It's a good job, I work Monday to Friday which is great as it allows me to play sport on weekends. Andrew is also working in Muswellbrook, as a Physio Assistant at Muswellbrook Hospital."

Lynan Scott stated that the Singleton Roosters are a great club with an excellent culture. "We all come together and support one another, we have great supporters in Singleton that provide extra sets of hands at our games, purely for the love of the game. The club has a good vibe and is great to be part of."






