PREVIEW—ROUND 12

In the Black Diamond Cup, Gosford host Maitland, Wyong Lakes are at home to Singleton; Warners Bay host Nelson Bay; Killarney Vale have a massive test at East Gosford against hosts Terrigal Avoca and in one of the matches of the season so far, Newcastle City host undefeated Cardiff at No.1 Sportsground. Wyong Lakes have a must-win game at home, hosting sixth-placed Singleton at Don Small Oval. The Magpies, sitting eighth on the ladder, one game behind Gosford but with a superior percentage have struggled in recent weeks as a large injury list has taken its toll. The Magpies have consistent performers in ruck duo Brendan Charlton and Brayden Tos, with Tos in great form over the past six weeks. Utility Peter Drzal, fullback Carter Jones, rover Leigh Moore and key forward Justin McPhan will be very important for the Magpies, particularly if they can shut down the Roosters gun midfielders in Sam Brasington, Andrew Scott and Alex Mitchell, and in McPhan's place, possibly exposing an undersized Singleton back six. The Roosters will be looking to bounce back after a disappointing loss last Saturday at home to Killarney Vale. Youngster Cody Carroll brings speed and agility to the forward line, whilst burly backmen Daine Cowburn and Richard Wilkes provide rebound off the half-back line. Scott will be sweating on the fitness of big man Brenton Potter and backman David Hicks, whilst Andrew MacPherson is expected to miss this crucial game with a hamstring injury. Gosford simply must win at home against Maitland. The expected return from injury of coach Josh Barty and backline general Scott Burkinshaw will give the Tigers a much-needed boost after a tough day at No.1 Sportsground last week. Calan Montgomery, agile ruckman Tristan Carter and Daniel White will need lots of touches as Gosford tries to hang on to a place in the Top 7. Maitland have had some great fixtures against the Tigers over the past two seasons and will hope for the return of key pair Patrick McMahon and Rob Eddy as they look to recover from a bad day at Feighan Park last Saturday. Andrew Willmot and Riley Newstead have been amongst Maitland's best players every week, with veteran rover Dustin Spriggs proving a rare highlight last week. Warners Bay, almost back to a full squad and with Oscar Anderson's return from an arm injury imminent, will look to continue their recent form when they welcome Nelson Bay to Feighan Park. Rover Matt Spinks has been one of the Bulldogs best all season, and Jack Downing's form up forward has been a bonus for coach Marty Reiman, especially with the recent absence of key forward Kayne Gibbs. The maturity of Luke Roach this season has been noticeable, whilst the Bulldogs rebounding in defence, featuring Lachlan Deverell, Josh Nicol and Nick Metcalfe, has featured prominently in a two-match spell where the Bulldogs have conceded one behind. Nelson Bay must give their coach Sean McGrath headaches at times; the Marlins are capable of kicking six goals in fifteen minutes when they get momentum, then at other times, they too often let other teams get over the top of them. McGrath will be very pleased with the direction in the forward line provided by Mark Spencer and Kieran Lamond, benefitting from great work in the midfield provided by Billy Barton, Jayden Rymer and Joel Erickson chiming in from half-back. Killarney Vale, after a slow start to the season, are flying after four wins in a row (and 12 in succession across three grades). The Bombers make the short trip to East Gosford to face a massive test of where they are at right now; a buoyant Terrigal Avoca at Hylton Moore Oval. The continuous improvement of ruckman Tim Oosterhoff has seen him rapidly developing into the best tall man in the competition, alongside Cam Keast and the emerging Brayden Tos. Scott Reed has Oosterhoff playing as a seventh man in defence, to devastating effect. Oosterhoff's battle with Jasper Davis, Pete Van Dam and Sam Ellis will be pivotal to the result of this match. Centre Josh Mifsud is finally back to his best after a serious ankle injury threatened to derail his career. Backmen Lachlan Waters and Ryan Coughlan have been shining lights over the past month for Reed and will face a big test from the skillful and well-organised Panthers. The Panthers, like League leaders Cardiff, base their playing structure on an excellent defence and a myriad of midfield options. With a question over the fitness of small forward, Van Dam & Dan Heuston will need a bag of goals against a disciplined but slightly undersized Bombers back six. Panthers coach Chris Bishop may elect to man up Oosterhoff when the big man sits in his defensive 50m arc, making him accountable for a man and nullifying the effects of Oosterhoff's intercept marking. Jack Grimmond, Bishop and James Webster are the equal of any midfield in the competition right now, and Killarney Vale, who managed Andrew Scott & Sam Brasington very well last week, must thwart these three if they are to upset the Panthers and announce themselves as a viable fifth option for the Premiership. Newcastle City and Cardiff, long-term traditional rivals and perennial grand finalists this century, provide a huge clash in the late game at No.1 Sportsground. City bounced back from a tough day at East Gosford with a convincing win over under-manned Gosford, Pat Gillingham kicking seven goals in another superb display in his new role deep in the forward line. City will be focussing on kicking a winning score against the miserly Cardiff back six, after being systematically shut down by the Panthers 14 days ago. Cam Keast, freed up to play forward with the return of ruckman Chris Jackson, will look to engage Zac Metcalfe to keep the destructive Cardiff backline general accountable and stop his run off half back. Conor Haswell, one of the top five players in the League, just loves running off half-back at the relatively short No.1 Sportsground, linking with Mitchell Knight, Ethan Durbridge and wily backman Mac O'Malley. Cardiff, after an ordinary first half against a game and committed Wyong Lakes last week, woke from their slumber in the second half, kicking ten goals in an impressive second half display in the absence of skipper Simon O'Brien. Jack Lennon has been simply outstanding for Nathan Harkness this season, over-shadowing his impressive midfield teammates Marcus DeLeur, O'Brien and Tom Yensch. The Hawks has managed the loss of Lachlan Price (concussion effects) comfortably, but City provide their toughest test in many weeks, especially at No.1. Bryce Graetz is a consistent performer, both in the midfield and across half-back, forming a lethal combination with the classy veteran Nick Tomlinson. In the GE Womens Competition, the Newcastle City Novas host Singleton at No.1 Sportsground; Maitland are away to Gosford; The Entrance Bateau Bay host local rivals Killarney Vale; Warners Bay host undefeated League leaders Nelson Bay at Feighan Park; Wyong Lakes head to Medowie to take on Port Stephens; Muswellbrook are away to Terrigal Avoca; Lake Macquarie are at home to Wallsend-West Newcastle and the undefeated Newcastle City Stars host Cardiff at No.1 Sportsground.

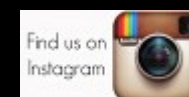

THOMAS A MENACE FOR OPPOSITION BACKMEN

Terrigal Avoca forward Brandon Thomas, in his third season of footy with the Panthers, has been producing consistently for the club this season, leading the club goalkicking and proving a menace for opposition backmen.

When asked about how he ended up playing on the Central Coast after playing all of his football in Victoria, mainly with the Essendon Dousta Stars AFC, Thomas advised; "there were no plans to move up here, it just happened. I was travelling on holidays in Bali, and ended up meeting a girl over there, and we ended up going out for a while. I came to the Central Coast for a holiday, I got a bit bored and took a job interview, I wasn't meant to get the job but I ended up getting it, went back home to Melbourne, had a think about it and took the job, and that left me up here."



Thomas played all of his junior and most of his senior football with the Essendon Dousta Stars, "where my old man Wayne has the played the second most games for the club, over 300 games."

Thomas spent some time in 2014-15 playing in the AFL Victoria Development League with the Coburg footy club. "I was on the brink of not playing at all. I played Under 18 Rep footy, which is when I really gave football a red-hot crack. I went down to Coburg for a trial with about 160 other people, and I ended up doing really well in the running side of things, and that got me on their list for about two years. I played a few games in the seconds for Coburg, and then I picked up some injuries, but it was still a good level of footy to play at."

When asked about his identified strength in running, Thomas advised "I was always into running. On Friday Nights, I would play Tennis, then I would get up on Saturdays mornings and Boundary Umpire, and then play footy on Saturday or Sunday afternoons. This gave me a really good fitness and running base, I got extra running in through all of the running I did whilst attending Boundary Umpire training."

Thomas, playing as a small forward for the Panthers in 2018, was asked which position he played whilst with the Dousta Stars and Coburg; "I mostly played on a wing, and then when I started playing with Terrigal Avoca, I had an opportunity to go forward, and I sort of fit in well there."

Thomas explained the culture at the Terrigal Avoca footy club; "the boys are great, they always get around you, it's a great family club. It has been unbelievable being part of the club. When I came to the club, not knowing anyone at all, the boys took me under their wing and treated me like family. There's no better place to be than Terrigal Avoca. The culture there is excellent, the whole club thrives on being part of one big family, and it's just great to be part of."

Thomas premiership in 2017 with the Panthers was his first since under 16s with the Dousta Stars; "I missed a premiership with the Dousta Stars in 2013 with injury, I picked up a broken finger towards the end of the season and couldn't get back into Firsts for the Finals."

Thomas advised that the Panthers back six has adjusted very well to the loss of key backman James Hart, who is travelling in 2018. "The boys have done a great job, Jimmy has been a big loss, but the boys have done really well, they teach you a lot about how to stand up in big games."

Thomas is managing some niggling injuries this season, picking up a rib strain early on, then picking up a leg strain at Rep training, which unfortunately led to him missing the BDAFL's game at Manuka Oval against AFL Canberra. "I am getting some niggles right now so I can be right to go come finals time."

Thomas is trade-qualified in Air-Conditioning and Electrical and works for local firm Central Coast Air-Conditioning. We thank Brandon Thomas for his time and wish him and the Panthers all the very best for this season and beyond.

BULLDOGS BUILDING ON AND OFF THE FIELD

Warners Bay Football Club President Todd Sheldon says that the Club is performing well on and off the park, a highlight of which is the planned new female-friendly Amenities Block at the south-western corner of the Bulldogs home, Feighan Park.

“An update on the new Amenities Block is that we have been advised by Lake Macquarie Council that the Amenities Block will be built by the commencement of the 2019 Black Diamond AFL season. Council has advised that the starting date will probably be in October 2018. They have clearly stated that it will be ready by the start of next season, which is great news for us.



The Amenities Block is being constructed with four changerooms, with the idea being that, with the old changerooms being there almost 50 years, and with rapid rise of Womens football and Junior Girls football, it is very important to have the facilities that cater for female players, i.e., separate changerooms and separate shower cubicles. The new rooms will also include a room for Umpires/Officials. Once the new Amenities Block is up and running, Council has indicated to me that the Old Rooms will be demolished, possibly to be replaced by a purpose-built Green Space.”

Sheldon also explained the redevelopment of Feighan Park No.2. “Also, by the start of the 2019 season, our No.2 will be fully operational after it has been fully resurfaced and had extensive drainage put in, the same as No.1 was in 2017. No.2 will also have lighting as well, so we will actually have two grounds to BDAFL standard, giving us the opportunity to host gala days or even night football earlier on in the season when it still warm weather. Having two grounds with high-quality surfaces, we feel that it opens up the opportunity to people to look at us to host representative football, finals, Gala Days, Junior carnivals, etc.”

When speaking about the club’s Black Diamond Cup side, Sheldon advised that “obviously, we still have a significant injury list at present, which is certainly testing the depth of the club, but, fingers crossed, we will have a full complement of players come the end of the season and into Finals time. I feel that when we have a full squad to choose from, we are going to be very hard to roll.

Losing to Terrigal Avoca as we did a few weeks ago, with no fit men on the bench, was just one of those things, but we are entrenched in fourth spot, which is great, and we have a pretty good run home, so a Top Four finish is the aim and then we hope for a big Finals Series. We have missed out on Finals Football over the past couple of seasons.

It has been a real rebuild, based mainly on our Juniors coming through. We have so many good Warners Bay Juniors coming through, there was an excellent article in the paper the other day about our Juniors Isaiah Olsen and Dillon Walsh-Hall (who have represented NSW/ACT this season), there’s Jack Hardman and we are due get Ky McGrath back soon from the Sydney Swans as well We are lucky to have some real young talent in our club.”

Sheldon explained that the relationship between the club and new major sponsor, the Warners Bay Hotel, is extremely strong. “One of my goals as a President was to get us back to the Warners Bay Hotel, publican Andrew Davis has done a wonderful job, they are very supportive and look after us wherever they can, nothing is ever a problem.

The proximity of the Hotel to Feighan Park is another huge plus, especially with the Warners Bay Old Boys Club. A big effort has been made to get former players and officials back to the club, and having our Hotel so close to the ground, it is easy to get our Old Boys back to the Warners Bay Hotel was a great idea.”

Sheldon paid compliments to his strong Executive team at the Warners Bay Football Club; Vice-President Jeremy Buckley, Treasurer Steve May and Secretary Louisa Buckley. “A goal for any strong organization is to have good people around you, and that was also our goal to have a strong Executive Committee and a very hands-on Club Committee. Every person on our Executive Committee has real strengths in their position, which is exactly what we want and need.”

We thank Todd Sheldon for this time and we wish the Warners Bay Football Club all the best in the future.

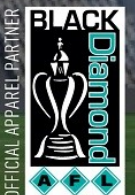

WALLSEND EMBARCING THE FRENCH CONNECTION

Wallsend-West Newcastle's entry in the Black Diamond AFL has many interesting stories, including their first ever win in the GE Womens Competition last Saturday in a one-point thriller at Bateau Bay, but none are as left-field as that of first year player Lisa Morales.

21-year-old Morales, who hails from the Bordeaux region of south-western France, explained how she ended up in Australia and playing Australian Rules; "I am travelling in Australia and playing many sports, playing Football (Soccer) and Rugby Union. I talked to myself and said I need to try Australian sports whilst I am over here, so I found Australian Rules.

I sent my resume to many clubs, and I found this new team Wallsend-West Newcastle, and I rang the coach Darren, and he said you can come and train & play with us. I said, yeah, why not, I was happy with that."

Morales explained that she played "two years of Soccer back home and then three years of Rugby Union, which has helped me with my tackling in Australian Rules."

Morales stated that she has had a great time in Australia. "I have really enjoyed my time here, as I love hiking and biking. I have also had a wonderful time training and playing with Wallsend-West Newcastle. When I miss training, I feel like I have done something wrong. My feelings are that I can't miss training or playing, it is not possible for me."

When speaking about the peculiarities of kicking a Sherrin football as opposed to a Rugby Union ball, Morales laughed and stated "I don't actually kick the ball like most Australian Rules players, I kick around the corner like a soccer player, the ball seems to spin the opposite way to the way my teammates kick the ball."

Morales goes back to France next week, and together with Wallsend-West Newcastle, is looking to set up an AFL project in France. "In France, there is a 5-team AFL competition based out of Paris. When I go home, I have built a project in conjunction with my coach Darren here at Wallsend-West Newcastle to develop Womens AFL in France, so I am intent on building a big project around this."

Morales spoke highly of the culture at her new club, the Wallsend-West Newcastle Swans. "My coach and my teammates have given me so much confidence to play the game, and this team is now like my second family. They have been great to me and I am so happy to be part of the club."

Morales graduated from university in Bergerac, just east of Bordeaux, with a Sports Teaching Degree in 2017. "I have a job ready to go at a fitness club close to Bordeaux when I go home, which I am looking forward to very much. I would love to get back to Australia one day to play football once more, I have had such a great time learning the game."

Lisa Morales' story is fascinating, we wish her well with her project to develop our great game back home in France, and we thank her for her time.

It was a rough weekend for the club last week being ravaged by injuries and coming up against a strong Newcastle City outfit.

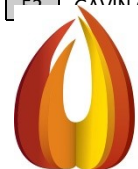

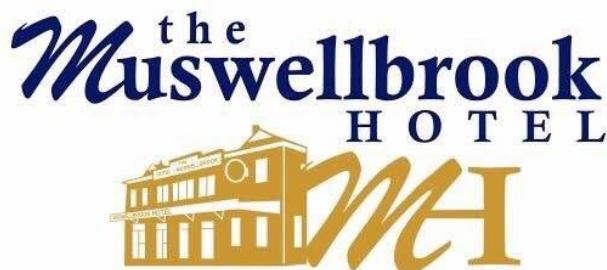
