

## PREVIEW—ROUND 13

With just six rounds remaining in the Hunter Haval Black Diamond Cup competition all matches have a bearing on the prospective finishing positions come finals time and Round 13 is no exception this Saturday. The Match of the Round is at Feighan Park where Warners Bay play host to Newcastle City with both clubs **BLACK** looking to claim the Neil 'Plunger' Dunn Trophy. It will be the first meeting of these two teams this year after their earlier meeting was washed out. Newcastle City recovered from a disappointing loss to Terrigal Avoca in Round 10 by ending Cardiff's unbeaten start to the season last week and are currently within striking distance of the coveted top position. The Blues will be looking welcome back star ruckman, Chris Jackson to compliment what is a strong on-ball brigade which includes Mitch Knight, Macaulay O'Malley, Stephen Batten and Conor Haswell. Up forward Pat Gillingham has had an excellent season which has him leading the competition goalm kicking table whilst Cameron Keast and Reed Van Huisstede have also troubled opposition defences. The return of the experienced duo, Luke Rawnsley and Matt Enright provided great leadership down back



along with Ian Baker. Warners Bay enter this clash on the back of big wins over Lake Macquarie and Nelson Bay, however coach Marty Reiman is under no illusion of the challenge in front of his charges on Saturday. He is expected to be able to call on the services of star players in Jake Roach and Lincoln Stewart whilst key defenders Oscar Anderson and Ben Crawley are also a chance to return. The Bulldogs this year have found scoring easier than in previous years with a multi pronged forward line headed by the reinvigorated Jack Downing and the mercurial Jack Hardman. Exciting youngster Isaiah Olsen has also been creating scoring opportunities. To overcome the Blues, Warners Bay are going to need a big game from young ruckman, Tom McDonnell who must at least nullify Jackson to give his midfielders, Nic Turner, Matt Spinks and Ben Hunter the opportunity to win their fair share of the football. This should be an engrossing contest. Another big game will be at Adelaide St Oval when Killarney Vale host Wyong Lakes. The Bombers currently sit in sixth position of the ladder and will enter the game on the back of a big loss to Terrigal Avoca, however they will welcome back some of the clubs biggest names including Scott Reed, Josh Mifsud and Brendan Lewis. Tim Oosterhoff has been a power of strength in the ruck this year whilst the acquisition of Bryce Singleton has given their forward line an extra dimension. The Magpies suffered their second heartbreaking loss in three matches when they went down to Singleton last week, a result that sees them sitting outside the finals at present. Coach Michael Tos, will be hoping that key forward Justin McPhan is available as his presence is vital to his sides cause. Gun midfielder, Chris Koop-Folkes, who ironically was injured in the first round meeting between these two clubs, is another who is a chance to return which would be a big boost to Magpies chances. Lee Moore, Brayden Tos and Tim Hillman have been consistent performers for Wyong Lakes whilst Nathan Doyle continues to impress in his debut season. Wyong Lakes upset Killarney Vale in their last meeting so a close contest is anticipated. Singleton will be looking to consolidate their finals position when they travel to Max McMahon Oval to take on near neighbours Maitland. It was heartstopping stuff last week as Singleton hung on to defeat Wyong Lakes by just four points a win that saw them move into fifth position on the ladder. Coach Andrew Scott continues to lead from the front with excellent support provided by Sam Brasington, Alex Mitchell and Scott Moore. The Roosters will be hoping for the return of some of their injured brigade in the lead up to finals. Maitland were well in the contest against Gosford before fading in the final term and coach David Ross knows that if they can put four quarters together they can match most sides. Pat McMahon's return along with the mid year acquisition of Andrew Willmot has improved the Saints and provided good support for Mitch Greaves and Dustin Spriggs. If the Saints can get a lift out of their mid tier players a victory is not out of reach. Gosford will be looking to take one step closer to an unlikely finals berth when they travel to Lake Macquarie on Saturday. Expected to be the 'whipping boys' at the beginning of the season, Gosford under new coach, Josh Barty have surprised many and currently sit in seventh position on the table. The Tigers had to work hard to defeat Maitland last week with the return of Barty, Tom Hunt and Scott Burkinshaw proving pivotal. Lewis Baker, Daniel White, Alex Remy and Mark Haywood have been consistent performers whilst Gosford look to have unearthed a talent in 16 year old Adam Miller who stepped up and kicked two important goals late last week. Up forward veteran forward Tim Eather continues to provide an excellent target and has 30 goals to his name this year. Lake Macquarie enter the match on the back of a bye and defeat the scoreboard not showing it put in a strong performance against Terrigal Avoca last start. Their youngsters in Rory Sleeth, Damon Tually, Tom Standford continue to show improvement whilst Terry Balchin and Sean Clune have been providing excellent leadership. This game could be closer than most people think. At Dick Burwell Oval, Cardiff will be looking for a quick rebound when they take on a struggling Nelson Bay outfit. Not only did Cardiff suffer their first loss last week they also lost top spot to Cardiff and they know a win on Saturday will see them return to the coveted position with Terrigal Avoca having the bye. Cardiff were close to full strength last week and coach Nathan Harkness will be looking for his charges to put in a good performance with matches against Warners Bay, Terrigal Avoca and Singleton still to come. It has been a tough year for the Marlins which was made even tougher when star midfielder Jayden Rymer went down with a knee injury in Round 11 which has him in doubt for the remainder of the season. It is difficult to see anything but a Cardiff win. In the GE Women's competition, Newcastle City Stars host Gosford in the Match of the Round, Lake Macquarie are at home to Port Stephens, Wallsend-West Newcastle travel to Nelson Bay, Killarney Bay host Muswellbrook, Cardiff and Singleton do battle at Hillsborough Oval in a must win match for both teams whilst Warners Bay are at home to Newcastle City Nova's and Maitland host Terrigal Avoca. The Hunter Haval Black Diamond Plate matches Killarney Vale play host to Muswellbrook in the Match of the Round whilst The Entrance Bateau Bay travel to Wyong Lakes and Wallsend-West Newcastle host Terrigal Avoca.


