PREVIEW—ROUND 14

Round 14 action of the Black Diamond Cup sees Nelson Bay host a confident, resurgent Newcastle City; Wyong Lakes welcome Terrigal Avoca to Don Small Oval and the Lake Macquarie Dockers head to Rose Point Park to play fifth-placed Singleton. Maitland, Warners Bay, Cardiff, Gosford and Killarney Vale all have the Bye this weekend.

Nelson Bay have had a tough season and it doesn't get any easier this week, with the visit of Newcastle City to Dick Burwell Oval.

The Marlins have had some good performances this season, but a lack of depth and injuries have hurt them considerably. Ruckman Billy Barton has been in their best players every week and would be favourite for the Nelson Bay Best & Fairest award, such has been his consistency. Jarryd Rymer's continuing development has been very pleasing for coach Sean McGrath, as has the form of reliable backmen Joel Erickson and Chris Eddy. McGrath will need plans this week to combat the powerful 1-2 City forward combination of Cam Keast and Patrick Gillingham.

City have beaten Warners Bay and Cardiff over the past two weeks and will enter this fixture in great form and confidence. Keast and Gillingham are benefitting from excellent midfield work from Mitchell Knight and Conor Haswell; whilst Ethan Durbridge and Mac O'Malley have been rock-solid across half-back.

Wyong Lakes have the biggest task in the BDAFL at the moment; hosting a hugely confident Terrigal Avoca at Don Small Oval in Tacoma.

The Magpies, after a promising start to the season, have struggled through the middle part of the season, with key injuries exposing a slight lack of depth. Chris Koop-Folkes and Justin McPhan, so important to the Magpies structure, have missed several weeks each and this has hurt coach Michael Tos' ability to play his best players in their correct positions on a weekly basis. Lee Moore has been in the Magpies players each week, and the welcome return of Koop-Folkes gives Moore and ruckman Brayden Tos another quality follower to work with. Carter Jones and Peter Drzal have also been very consistent for Wyong Lakes, but the Magpies need to find a way to kick winning scores, a massive task against the superb Panthers back six.

After the Bye last week, the Panthers enter the final 5 rounds of the home and away season in full fitness and in wonderful form. Terrigal Avoca finish the season away to both Cardiff and Newcastle City, so they will want to perform well this Saturday in the lead-up to Rounds 17-18, where their aim will be the Minor Premiership and a week off in the Finals.

Coach Chris Bishop has welcomed back Kurt Fleming, an ideal replacement for Lachlan White (ankle). James Webster has moved into top gear in recent weeks and that spells danger for the Magpies and the rest of the competition. Jayson Van Dam, Will McKellar and Corbin Bond form part of a frugal and well-drilled Terrigal Avoca back six, whilst rover Jack Grimmond has been one of the form rovers in the Black Diamond Cup, alongside representative teammate Matt Spinks from Warners Bay.

Singleton are set for finals action after several tough wins in recent weeks, highlighted by thrilling wins, all away, at Nelson Bay, Wyong Lakes and Maitland. The Roosters will look for a solid performance when they host Lake Macquarie this Saturday at Rose Point Park.

Scott Moore, Jacob Welsh and Alex Mitchell have been in very good form for the Roosters of late, providing great support for Singleton's trump cards Andrew Scott and Sam Brasington, with Brasington expected to return to the field this week after missing the Hunter Valley derby at Rutherford last week.

Lake Macquarie will be boosted by a solid performance at home last week to Gosford. Damon Tually was superb at centre-half back last week for the Dockers, combining well with long-kicking fullback Damien McIntyre and Ben Taylor. Riley Janissen and burly Sean Clune produced four-quarter displays for coach Tom Croft last week on the ball, Clune using his solid frame to great effect at the stoppages.

Daniel Zuzek and Jakson Bertoli also played well in the centre and may expose the Roosters with the speed and agility on the wide-open spaces of Rose Point Park. Croft needs to find an avenue to goal, with regular forward Tually seemingly locked into centre-half back. Chris McKay provides a target for the Dockers, and they need to work off McKay more effectively to pick up opportunist goals this week.

In the Annual Womens Round being staged at Tulkaba Park in Teralba, the Dockers host Singleton; Port Stephens are up against Wallsend-West Newcastle; Killarney Vale and Wyong Lakes have a huge clash; League newcomers Terrigal Avoca and The Entrance Bateau Bay do battle; the Newcastle City Stars have a tricky fixture against Warners Bay; Muswellbrook play Cardiff; Maitland play Gosford and in the final fixture under lights at 6.00pm, first-placed Nelson Bay have a massive clash with the third-placed Newcastle City Novas.

This Saturday the Hunter Haval Black Diamond AFL (BDAFL) will celebrate women's round as an acknowledgement to the contribution that women have made not only in the BDAFL but football in the region as a whole. The celebrate the occasion all eight GE BDAFL Women's football matches this Saturday will be played at Tulkaba Park, Teralba. For many years women were seen as unsung heroes of football clubs fulfilling many roles behind the scenes but in recent years these roles have been brought to the forefront as Women's AFL competitions have evolved and none more so than in the BDAFL. Megan Farrell is currently the Vice President of the BDAFL Board of Management, having joined the Board in 2016, becoming just the second female to hold a Board position. Erin Cotter was the first in 2005. Currently the BDAFL have three women Presidents. Annette Garland (Muswellbrook), Mel Nelson (Port Stephens) and Nadene McBride (Singleton) whilst Kate Handley stepped into a shared Presidency role with Newcastle City in 2017. Christine Burrows has held the position of BDAFL Umpires Coach since 2013 and is responsible the development of the umpires in the region for which she is doing a fine job. Christine is a Level 3 Umpire Coach, one of only three in NSW to hold this accreditation. Tracey Baker currently is Women's Coach at Warners Bay, whilst Lauren Anstey (Cooper) previously held the same role at Nelson Bay including leading the club to a premiership in 2016. Increasing the number of women in both umpiring and coaching is a key focus of the BDAFL. On-field is the area that has created significant surprise amongst long term AFL followers in the region. Once considered to be a male only bastion the BDAFL now runs a fully fledged AFL Women's competition consisting of 16 teams. The competition commenced in 2015, when Gosford, Lake Macquarie, Nelson Bay, Newcastle City, Warners Bay and Wyong Lakes competed in the inaugural competition, which was won by Newcastle City. 180 women played in the inaugural competition. 2016 saw the competition expand to ten teams with the addition of Cardiff, Killarney Vale, Maitland and Singleton. Nelson Bay were undefeated premiers that year and participation numbers had increased to 329. 396 women played in the 2017 competition which had increased to 12 teams following the inclusion of teams from Muswellbrook and a second team from Newcastle City (Nova's). Newcastle City dominated the competition to claim the premiership with an unblemished record. In 2018, four new teams, Port Stephens, Terrigal Avoca, The Entrance Bateau Bay and Terrigal Avoca, joined which enabled the competition to expand to 16 teams, So far 489 women have played a game in 2018. Overall 941 women have played a game of AFL in the BDAFL over the past four years. This has included players who have played previously, players who have never played before, sportswomen from other codes (including elite), players transitioning from the Youth Girls competition, mother playing with daughters, sisters playing together and girls who have grown up kicking the football with the brothers in the backyard. All with a common goal, to experience the excitement and challenge of AFL football. BDAFL Women's football has received great support from GE Industrial Solutions who have been the naming rights sponsor for the GE BDAFL Women's competition since it's inception. Women players from the BDAFL are starting to also make their mark in the talent space as well with Nelson Bay's Pippa Smyth becoming the first local player to be drafted into the AFLW competition with GWS Giants this year. Just recently Smyth was joined in the GWS Giants Winter Series squad along with Lisa Steane (Nelson Bay), Sarah Halvorsen (Newcastle City) and Meaghan MacDonald (Newcastle City). All these girls commenced their AFL careers in the BDAFL and were able to progress to higher honours from the local competition. Alison Parkin (Gosford) has also represented the GWS Giants in the Winter Series, albeit she transferred to Gosford in 2016 from the AFL Sydney competition. In addition to the above a number of our talented youngsters have made an impact in the AFL NSW/ACT Youth Girls competitions namely Coram Matisse-Parker (Cardiff), Dixie Butler (Killarney Vale), Eloise Petersen (Cardiff) and Arizona Cross (Cardiff). Women's football has made a significant change to the BDAFL landscape, all for the better and have rejuvenated a number of stale football clubs. The fact that all women's club are part of an overall club structure (i.e. men's and women's together) is unique. Port Stephens is the obvious exception being the first club to join the BDAFL on the back of having women's team only .As one President said recently said if all men footballers were like women footballers running a football team would be easy, they register on time, pay on time, attend training (rain, hail or shine), are available for games, hang around and assist other teams and not only do they organise and attend functions, but they also bring their friends.

To all the women involved in football both in the BDAFL and across the country, we thank you !!!

BOHAN, FIRST LADY PIE TO 150 GAMES

Last Saturday, Emily Bohan became the first female in the 43 year history of the Wyong Lakes AFC club to play 150 games.

Bohan celebrated the win in style with the side not only recording a big win over The Entrance Bateau Bay but she also kicked ten goals herself in a dominant display.

Emily began playing AFL for Wyong Lakes in 2003 in the U10 side having been encouraged to give it a go by her Uncle Jamie Pinner. Emily played 107 junior games for the Magpies until, when due to play U16's, the then AFL rules prohibited girls playing in male sides. With no female competition in existence at that time the club got an exemption for Emily to play one more year in the U14's in 2008.

In her junior career Emily was picked to play representative football, was nominated for the highest award the club presents, the Pratt/Ede Award for Outstanding Performance, and won numerous player of the match awards.

When the Black Diamond AFL announced the inaugural Women's Competition in 2015 Wyong Lakes Magpies was the only Central Coast based club to enter a team. Emily was one of the first players to register. Emily was picked as the inaugural Captain of the team that came to be known at the Ladypies and has been an inspirational leader ever since. Emily has since played 41 senior games for the club, has been picked to represent the BDAFL and Central Coast and was named in the BDAFL Women's team of the year in 2016.

Emily has also been selected in the Central Coast Women's Representative team that will compete in the inaugural GE BDAFL Women's Representative Challenge to be held at Medowie on 21 July.

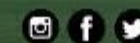



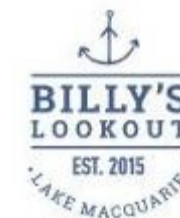
