

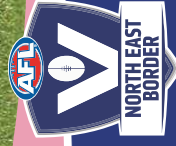

It's been a great start to the AFL North East Border Female Football League (NEBFFL) season with some nail-biting results as well as the occasional blowout in the six rounds played so far.

We would like to acknowledge the work of all our clubs in developing an opportunity for females to play AFL in our region. With the introduction of the Women's Open Competition and the continued growth of our Youth Girls has enabled clubs to register new players in both age groups who are thrilled to get their chance at playing footy.

Over the coming weeks clubs will also be presented with opportunities to participate in Life Skills programs to better equip and educate our players on a range of social issues of which many young players are being faced with and will need to make positive choices. In partnership with AFLNEB, the Health and Wellbeing Seminars are delivered as part of the social responsibility football has to developing individuals off the field. All clubs will be notified of dates and venues in the coming weeks and we encourage all clubs to participate.

Some reminders to Clubs and Spectators as we approach the second half of the season:

- You cannot enter the ground during play unless acting in an official capacity for your club and are named on the team sheet.
- Club Coaches and Benches must stand at least 2 metres back from the boundary line.
- The league takes very seriously its duty of care towards players, umpires and spectators and therefore request all members take the time to read over the League Codes of Conduct as negative behaviour will not be tolerated. This includes but is not limited to the abuse of Umpires, Players, Coaches, the condoning of violence on and off the field etc. 'If you walk past it you accept it'. Every week across the country, people attend football and netball with the intent to participate, compete, support, barrack, socialise and most importantly, enjoy themselves and have fun.

With hundreds of people at any one venue at any one time, not everyone will see eye to eye, one person's high is another's low as the competitive nature of sport takes over, however no one's behaviour should negatively impact on the experience of others or on that match day environment.

So, who is responsible for the match day environment?

On any given weekend, a range of incidents are being reported back to league management which suggest the match day experience of players, spectators, parents, club officials and coaches is being compromised by behaviour. Ultimately, how any individual conducts themselves on or off the field is a reflection on themselves and the club in which they are associated.

Individuals need to accept responsibility for the manner in which they conduct themselves and should consider that their actions don't go unnoticed and may be impacting on other individuals. The conduct of match day officials, specifically the coaching staff is critical to ensuring the game is played in the right spirit.

Currently, too many games across the region are being negatively influenced by the conduct and over exuberance of coaching staff and supporters which is then reflected in the behaviour of players. Not every incident is reported on the match day paperwork or by the umpires and subsequently a range of issues are being relayed to league

management which parents, clubs and coaches expect to be resolved after the event.

This is counterproductive, minimising the time available to administrators to have a positive impact on developing the game and supporting volunteers, in essence, it is a negative investment of time and energy at many levels.

Match Day issues which are behaviour related by players, coaches or spectators are best resolved on the day by individuals recognising the consequences of their actions and adjusting their behaviour. Whilst a positive Match Day environment will have positive influences on player retention, volunteer recruitment and a range of other matters, a poor environment will negatively influence a club's fortunes in the same areas.

Ultimately, each individual is responsible for their behaviour but there are key individuals who have the capacity to influence others in both a positive and negative way.

What football needs is more individuals to accept responsibility for their behaviour and acknowledge what influence they can have on the environment and experience of others high as we look to minimise the number of issues we are currently experiencing, some trivial, others more concerning.

So, who is responsible for the match day environment? All of us.

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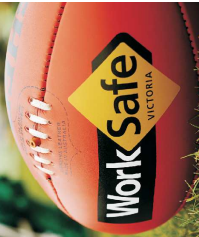
