

PREVIEW—SEMI FINALS

It's down to the business end of the season this weekend as Week 1 of the Hunter Haval Black Diamond Cup Finals Series takes place in Muswellbrook and Maitland on Saturday and then Tacoma on Sunday. Warners Bay and Singleton head to Weeraman Field in Muswellbrook for the 4 v 5 clash in the Top 7 structure. The Roosters had the Bye last week, and the opportunity of getting over niggling injuries at this time of year won't have been wasted by Coach Andrew Scott and his men. Scott and his men got over the top of the Bulldogs early in the season at Rose Point Park, so the Roosters won't have any fears about what the Bulldogs offer. Scott and star on-baller Sam Brasington have been superb in the second half of the season as their fitness and experience have started to make a major impact. The Roosters know they have to kick 12 goals or more to trouble the Bulldogs. The Roosters' defence is well organized, but it is up front where Singleton must make an impact if they are to make the Preliminary Final. The enigmatic, mercurial Jackson Kolatchew must have a big game, possibly matched on Oscar Anderson or Luke Roach. Veteran full-forward Travis Bates will probably have League backman Linc Stewart for company, whilst




speedy youngster Cody Carroll will be needed for at least two goals in the small forward position, possibly rotating with Alex Mitchell. The Bulldogs, who went hard at Cardiff last week in a solid preparation for the Finals, will have League Rover Matt Spinks back after missing the last two games with a minor leg injury, Spinks' combination with Ben Hunter and Jake Roach will be pivotal in this semi-final, up against the simply outstanding duo of Brasington and Scott. The idea of centreman Hunter and Scott on one another, both very strong over the ball, will be worth the price of admission below. Bulldogs Coach Marty Reiman may elect to have one of his taggers perform a run-with role on either Brasington or Scott. Jake Roach looms as an important part of Bulldogs arsenal. Roach works extremely well with Hunter, often benefitting from Hunter's contested ball gets. When he is on, Roach's long kicking and delivery are dangerous, with Luke McKenna, brother Luke Roach and the lightning-quick Jack Hardman presenting match-up issues for the Roosters. Newcastle City & Killarney Vale, the 3 v 6 clash, travel to Max McMahon Oval in Rutherford for their clash. City have been excellent in the second half of the season, and produced a reasonable performance against high-flying Minor Premiers Terrigal Avoca last week. Clty have a core of vastly experienced players in the midfield and across half-back, with their back line sure to enjoy the wide open spaces of the revamped Max McMahon Oval. Conor Haswell, one of the top 5 players in the League, has spent time in the centre and across half back all year, adding the midfield to his already impressive resume. Veterans Matt Enright and Mitchell Knight will provide lots of contested ball, and their match-up with Josh Mifsud will be a beauty. Ruckman-forward Cam Keast, a star all year for City, gives Bombers ruckman Tim Oosterhoff "my biggest challenge, he is very strong and uses his body really well." Oosterhoff, taller and leaner than Keast, will look to avoid contact in ruck contests with the burly City follower, with Killarney Vale needing quality ball if they are any chance of upsetting their long-term rivals. Keast will also spend time up front in cahoots with Patrick Gillingham, the 2018 BDAFL leading goalkicker, who has had his best year in Navy Blue and White. Bombers Coach Scott Reed has some interesting decisions midweek as he makes plans for Killarney Vale's welcome return to the finals. Bryce Singleton will play at full-forward, freeing up Reed to spend time on the ball in combination with Mifsud and Oosterhoff. Much will depend on Killarney Vale's back six, led by Brendan Lewis, Lachlan Waters and Ben Simpson, if the Bombers are to shut down City and produce a big upset on a hard and fast Max McMahon Oval. Cardiff and Wyong Lakes have the 2 v 7 Sunday Semi Final clash at Don Small Oval in Tacoma. Cardiff have struggled in recent weeks, going down to Terrigal Avoca and Newcastle City and being pushed all the way by Warners Bay. The Hawks have quality across the park and will need to be at their best up against a revitalized Magpies outfit, who have flown into the finals with wins over the Dockers and Tigers and who will also being playing in front of the faithful at Don Small Oval. Match-ups in this clash are huge, particularly in the midfield, Cardiff's Tom Yensch and Wyong Lakes' Brayden Tos will have a massive battle in the ruck. Yensch has a consistent second half of the season and, like Tos, plays as an extra ruckrover. Tos was sublime against Gosford last week, putting the ball on a platter for the experienced Lee Moore and Tim Hillman. Yensch provides a huge challenge for Tos, with both men not afraid to get in an under, their hard tackling a feature of their games. Moore's battle with Simon O'Brien and Matt Vukovich will also be significant. Moore is a wily customer with great foot skills and excellent hands, whilst O'Brien roves very well to Yensch and has a very quick first 10 metres to enable him to create clearances. Centres Marcus DeLeur and Tim Hillman provide the final intriguing match-up. Both men are tall followers, with DeLeur able to provide back up ruck duties to his already impressive skill set. Hillman is rated highly by the Magpies gives Tos a great second option to Moore. Hillman will need to be marked closely when he moves forward, as he delivers very well to Justin McPhan and Jared Cross. McPhan had a great tussle with Scott Burkinshaw last week and whether Liam Gibson or David O'Donnell are tall enough to counter McPhan provides an interesting quandary for Hawks Coach Nathan Harkness. Terrigal Avoca has the week off after finishing the Home & Away season as Minor Premiers. In the GE Womens Competition, Killarney Vale, now very much in the Premiership mix after a series of injuries suffered by Nelson Bay & the Newcastle City Stars, head to Muswellbrook to take on first-time finallists Singleton; the Newcastle City Stars play hosts Maitland in Rutherford; and on Sunday, Wyong Lakes welcome the Newcastle City Novas to Don Small Oval. In the Black Diamond Plate, great rival Muswellbrook and The Entrance Bateau Bay do battle at Weeraman Field; Newcastle City enter their match against Warners Bay as strong favorites at Rutherford; and on Sunday, Killarney Vale makes the short trip to Tacoma to take on Cardiff.


