- 3. Be available to attend player selection trials for Magic WABL teams and State Championship.
- 4. Continue to seek knowledge and enhance your skills as a coach and attend any coaching programs that the association may provide from time to time including development training sessions
- 5. Attend all coach's meetings held during the course of the season, pre and post season.
- 6. Be open and willing to the advice of others including but not limited to the development committee with respect to team development.
- 7. Actively be involved in the MBA's Domestic Summer Competitions and identify potential representative players.
- 8. Be responsible for ensuring the team is prepared as best as possible for the competition throughout the season.
- 9. Focus on improvement and development of all players under your guidance.
- 10. To coach in line with the philosophies of MBA
- 11. Follow the MBA dress code for players, coaches, assistant coaches and managers.
- 12. Produce a current "Working with Children Card".
- 13. Undertake to uphold MBA values and ethos of the club as an example to others
- 14. Agree to the MBA Coaches Code of Behaviour and sign the Coaches Code of Conduct (attached for signing to be included with this application)
- 15. Provide a brief profile on your background to be used for communication purposes to the club's members.
- 16. Assist the Club in abiding by and enforcing all Club Policies whilst supporting the Club's Strategic goals.

This includes but is not limited to:

 ∞ I understand that Basketball is for enjoyment.

Ensure that activities are carefully planned, well-constructed and varied to provide opportunities for individual and team development. Never ridicule Athletes for making mistakes or losing a competition. See errors as opportunities to learn in a constructive way. Comment in a way that is positive and designed to create interest, involvement and development.

 ∞ I will be reasonable with my demands.

In scheduling training times and days, be reasonable in your expectations for athletes' time, energy and enthusiasm taking into account their age, level of play and other commitments such as school and employment.

∞ I will demonstrate and develop team respect for the ability of opponents including their coaches.

This includes congratulating them whether they win or lose and accepting loss gracefully. Teach them that the opposition coach is there trying to do the best for their team and is also entitled to respect.

∞ I will demonstrate and instil in my players a respect for officials and an acceptance of their judgement

Athletes should be taught that officials have a difficult task. They are there to enforce the rules of play but they cannot always be right. Teach your players to accept bad calls graciously. Abuse of referees is unacceptable behaviour that should not be tolerated.

∞ I will demonstrate and guide the athletes in their interaction with the media, parents and spectators.

Coaches have an important role to play in teaching athletes to maintain concentration on the game plan when spectators become over-enthusiastic

 ∞ I will be prepared to lose sometimes

Losing can be an important learning experience for your wider goals. Guide you athletes to accept a loss in this spirit.

∞ I will act responsibly when athletes are injured or ill.

Follow the advice of a physician when determining when a player is ready to recommence play.

 ∞ I will demonstrate and promote desirable personal and social behaviour.

What you say and how you act can be most important in modelling behaviour of athletes. This should include refraining from physical and verbal abuse, harassment, swearing and illicit drug use and intoxication (while representing the club).

∞ I will endeavour to keep my knowledge current

Seek to keep abreast of changes in the sport. Ensure that the information used is up to date, appropriate to the needs of the athletes and takes into account the principles of growth and development of children.

 ∞ I will ensure that any physical contact with a player is appropriate.

Avoid unaccompanied and unobserved activities with persons under 18 years of age. Be mindful that well-meant gestures may be considered acceptable to some but unacceptable to others. Sometimes physical contact can be misinterpreted.

✓ I agree to respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

All persons connected with basketball are entitled to equal treatment.

∞ I will respect the use of facilities and equipment provided

Ensure that you and your athletes do not abuse anything provided for use. Discourage athletes from hanging from hoops or 'slam dunking'. These practices are banned in most venues and serious injury can occur.

∞ I will Arrive on time to training and games

This sets the standard for expected behaviour.

✓ I will wear the Mandurah Magic WABL Team uniform as outlined within the Mandurah Magic WABL handbook, at all occasions when acting within the capacity of Mandurah Magic WABL Team Official

This includes all training and games

- ✓ I will not engage in any Social Media Communication (including texts, email, photos and video) that:
 - may offend, intimidate, humiliate or bully any players, members, parents, staff or coach
 - may be misleading, false or injure the reputation of players, members, parents, staff or coaches.
 - ❖ May not protect the privacy of players, members, parents, staff and coaches
 - ❖ May bring the sport, players, member, parents, staff or coach into disrepute.
- I understand that my appointment as a team official of Mandurah Magic WABL and representative teams requires that I act, in all things, as a supportive representative and promoter of the club and its values. I will not use my position to speak out against or deride the organization in any public forum (including texts, email, social media and verbally)

Where you find you are disappointed and disgruntled with decisions or directions from the association management you should follow the appropriate protocols for addressing those concerns via the communication and grievance protocol (flow chart/s). You are valued and your concerns are important and we must address those needs while still protecting the Mandurah Magic brand for its wider membership.
