## Football Report

### **Senior Report**

The year started with the appointment of joint coaches in AJ Bourke from the Beaufort Football Netball Club, and Damien Scott from Stawell as our joint senior coaches. Our mid-season cabaret ball is always a popular night on the social calendar and this year's theme “A night on Broadway” was well attended at the Town Hall.

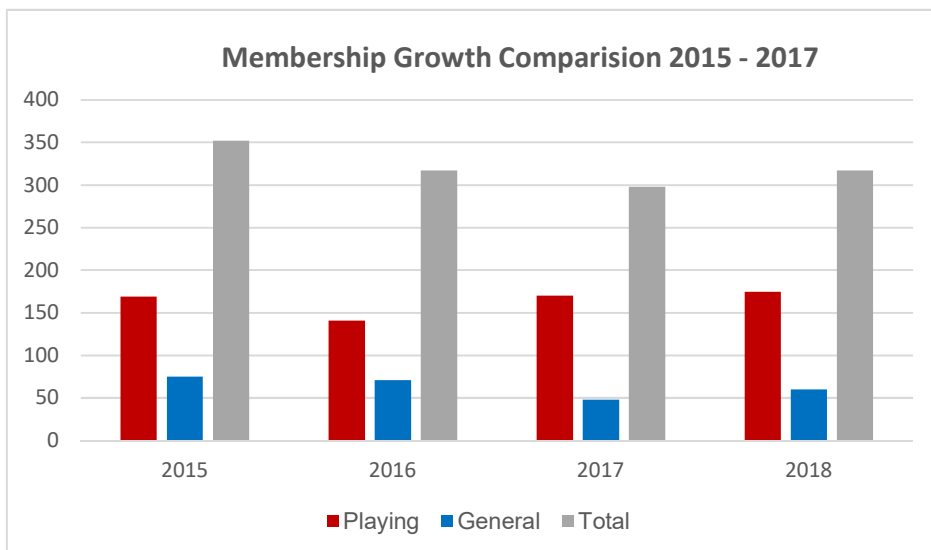
We rounded the year out with a Lip Sync Dance Battle which was a fantastic, funny night to celebrate another great season at the kennel.

### Policy Development

The AFNC take risk management very seriously and is continually monitoring and assessing its activities to make sure that it is adequately managing its risk and protecting its members. The Club has also spent time drafting a new Constitution that will be implemented from 2019. The new Constitution replaces all previous documents and is a robust set of rules to help govern the Club. Other policies that the AFNC has endorsed include, Child Safe, Illegal Drugs, Social Media, Alcohol Management, Vilification, Smoke Free and Sun Smart. The Club also follows a detailed Grievance and Disputes process to manage any breaches of the Code of Conduct.



### Walking the Talk

We are proud participants in a number of accredited programs including the Goods Sports Program, VicHealth Healthy Sporting Environments Program and we are a Bronze Level AFL Quality Club. Through participating in these programs we are committed to looking after the health and wellbeing of our members and to managing our volunteers in the best possible way. The Club also undertook Bounce Australia’s Leadership Training this year for its coaches and club leaders. This training will be built on in the coming years.

## Financial Report

The Club continues to practise excellent financial management, thanks to the diligent work of our dedicated treasurers Kylie Gollop and Stephanie Wardlaw. With a very robust recording system now solidly in place, the Club has been able to monitor income and expenses and make adjustments as required. This season was extremely positive in terms of business and financial growth with sponsorship, memberships and canteen income. The most significant financial growth came from the bar which is a credit to Rob Rayner who manages the bar. The Club has achieved a net profit of \$19,431.53. The Club has also experienced another full twelve month contribution of GST payable.

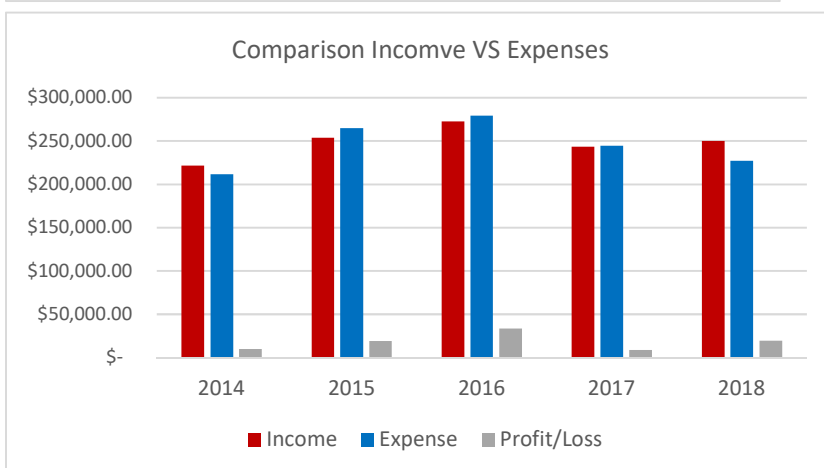
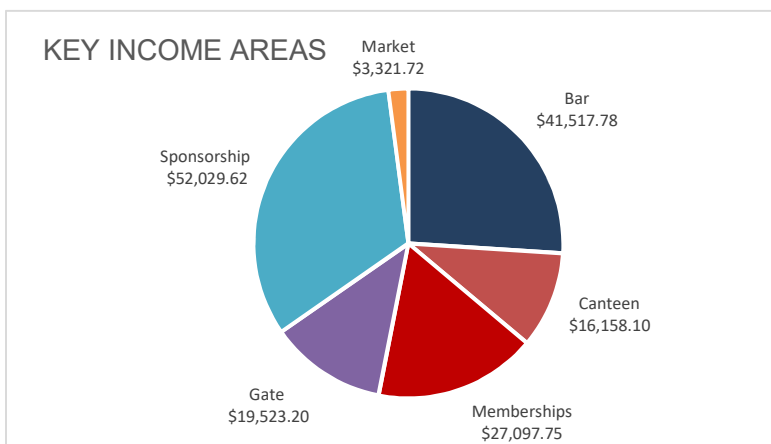
