



Scoretable & FIBA Sheet

This information has been compiled to assist parents to perform Scoring duties required at representative level. It is extremely important that everyone know the current timing and regulations. Scorer Officials are required to assist the Referees in the smooth running of the game. NO barracking or questioning of referees decisions are allowed or show reaction to the game. Always conduct oneself in a professional manner

and do not become involved with the bad behavior of others.

The keys to being successful on the score table

- Correctness Rule Knowledge
- Concentration Personal Ability
- Communication Professionalism
- Co-operation Team Work

Without these four elements the scoretable will not work efficiently

The person doing the score-sheet should also act as chairperson, signaling to the referee, or acknowledging the referees calls. The other person, should do the timing of the game, check the scorer and operate the scoreboard.

The official Score sheet for representative level is the FIBA vertical sheet.

VC use a four quarter

VJBL and North West use a Two 20 minutes Halves

It is recommended that the scorer use a pen with 2 colour pen Blue & red are recommended, and never finish in red.

THE SCORER - will complete the official Score sheet.

The Scorer is responsible for:-

- Recording all successful baskets scored and calling the score (of the scoring team only) to the Visuals Operator.
- Recording all Personal Fouls and Team Fouls and calling these to the Visuals Operator e.g. 3rd personal 2nd team.
- Immediately informing the Referee if a player has committed their 5th Personal Foul or 2nd Unsportsmanlike Foul.
- Recording Coach (bench) fouls and informing the Referee when the Coach has reached two fouls of his own or three accumulated from his bench
- Recording all Time Outs used in each half for each team and informing the Referee when a Coach has used all Time Outs available

PRE GAME

At least 10 minutes before the beginning of the game, the team manager shall obtain the relevant Score sheet

- First named Team is the "A" team.
- Second Named Team is the "B" team.
- Fill in Date, Time, Court Grade and sex.
- Fill in names of Teams, and player's names and number – in numerical order. Player's surname in upper case first name lower case.
- Fill in Coach name

SCORING

There are four columns for this running score on the score sheet. Each column contains four vertical spaces. The twin spaces on the left are for team "A" and twin spaces on the right are for team "B". In the centre space is running score (160 points) for each team.

Write the number of player who score

next to the total for the team. To mark the score use:-

A diagonal line for successful field goals

A dot for successful free throws.

Missed free are NOT recorded.

A diagonal line for successful 3 points shots Circling the players

END OF EACH PERIOD

At the ends of each period, circle ("O") the last Score for both teams. Using one thick line underlining both the score and the number of the player who scored those points

Enter score of that period in the designated box at the Bottom of the Score sheet.

Scores A B
First Half ⑥ ⑦

Second Half ⑥ ②

Box around player's fouls at the end of each period

Place 2 parallel lines = for unused time-out of each half

At the beginning of each period the score shall continue the process (as per above) from the point of interruption

END OF GAME

At the end of the game, circle (O) the last score for both teams using thick lines = underline both the score and player number.

Draw a diagonal line to the bottom of the column (running Score)

Place 2 parallel line= through unused time outs and team fouls

Place 1 line - through unused player & Coach fouls boxes

Enter the final score and the name of the winning team.

The scorer shall then sign the score sheet and shall have it countersigned by the timekeeper, the umpire and the referee.

The referee shall be the last to sign the Score sheet and this act terminates the administration of the game

FOULS

Record all personal, team & coach fouls committee and calling to the timekeeper 3rd Personal 2nd Team foul

Personal fouls are recorded beside the player's number

- P Personal foul (Side Ball)
- P₁ Personal foul- One Free Throw
- P₂ Personal foul- Two Free Throw
- P₃ Personal foul- Three Free Throw
- T₂ Technical Foul against a player
- U Unsportsmanlike Foul (number of free throws)
- D Disqualifying Foul (number of free throws)
- c All fouls against both teams involving penalties of the same gravity and cancelled are indicated by adding small 'c' beside the 'P', 'U', 'D', 'T', 'C' or 'B'

Time-outs are recorded in the boxes below the team's name.

One set of boxes per half and extra time if required.

The game elapsed time (whole minutes) is recorded inside the box indicates a time out has been taken
